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SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be on supervised release for a term of:

5 Years. This term consists of five years on each of counts 1 and 2, to be served concurrently.

The defendant must report to the probation office in the district to which the defendant is released within 72 hours of release from the custody of the Bureau of Prisons.

The defendant shall not commit another federal, state or local crime.

The defendant shall not unlawfully possess a controlled substance. The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, as determined by the court.

- 3) the defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer;
- 4) the defendant shall support his or her dependents and meet other family responsibilities;
- 5) the defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation, unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons;
- 6) the defendant shall notify the probation officer at least ten days prior to any change in residence or employment;
- 7) the defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any controlled substance or any paraphernalia related to any controlled substances, except as prescribed by a physician;
- 8) the defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered;
- 9) the defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
- 10) the defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view of the probation officer;
- 11) the defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer;
- 12) the defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court; and
- as directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

- *1) As a condition of supervision, the defendant shall serve 29 consecutive Sundays to commence on May 6, 2012 at Montgomery City Jail. Defendant shall report to the Montgomery City Jail each Sunday no later than 8:00 am and be released each Monday no later than 8:00 am. The Montgomery City Jail is designated as a federal bureau of prisons facility for purposes of this jail time.
- *2) The defendant shall participate in the home confinement program for a period of 6 Months to begin at a time designated by the probation officer. During this time, the defendant will remain at his place of residence except for employment and other activities approved in advance by the probation officer. At the direction of the probation officer, the defendant shall wear an electronic monitoring device and follow electronic procedures specified by the probation officer. The defendant shall pay the cost of electronic monitoring as directed by the probation officer.
- 3) The defendant shall participate in a program approved by the United States Probation Office for substance abuse, which may include testing to determine whether the defendant has reverted to the use of illegal drugs or alcohol. The defendant shall contribute to the cost of any treatment based on ability to pay and the availability of third-party payments.
- 4) The defendant shall not incur new credit charges or open additional lines of credit without approval of the Court unless in compliance with the payment schedule.
- 5) The defendant shall submit to a search of his person, residence, office and vehicle pursuant to the search policy of this court.
- 6) The defendant shall provide the probation officer any requested financial information.
