16	This matter comes before the Court upon consideration of Plaintiffs' ex parte motion for			
17	a temporary restraining order and order to show cause re issuance of a preliminary injunction.			
18	The allegations supporting the motion are set forth in the Complaint and the memorandum in			
19	support of the request that the Court issue a temporary restraining order, and shall not be			
20	repeated here. In brief, among other alleged wrongs, Plaintiffs assert that defendants are

22	Plaintiffs are HEREBY ORDERED to serve a copy of this Order, the Complaint, the ex			
23	parte Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order and its Supporting Papers on Defendants by			
24	no later than 3:00 p.m., Monday, February 11, 2008 (if not already served). Plaintiffs must			
25	file a proof of service by no later than 3:30 p.m., Monday, February 11, 2008.			
26	IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants shall file and serve any opposition to			
27	Plaintiffs' motion for a temporary restraining order by 3:00 p.m February 12, 2008. Plaintiffs			
28	may file and serve a reply by	no later than 12:00	p.m. on February 13	5 , 2008.

United States District Court For the Northern District of California It is FURTHER ORDERED that hearing on Plaintiffs' motion for a temporary restraining order shall be heard on **Thursday, February 14, 2008 at 10:00 a.m.**

The Court has set this schedule in light of the fact that Plaintiffs move for a temporary restraining order. The Court, however, is amenable to any stipulations or requests to modify this briefing schedule and hearing date. Thus, if any of the parties wishes to modify the briefing schedule or the hearing date, they may submit such a request to the Court demonstrating good cause for such modification.

The Court finds it advisable to expressly remind all parties that now that litigation has commenced, the parties, each of their officers, agents, servants, employees, and all persons acting in concert with them, or on behalf of them, owe a duty to preserve what they know or reasonably should know will be relevant evidence in the pending lawsuit, including any electronically stored information, even though no discovery request or order to preserve the evidence has yet been made. If relevant evidence is destroyed, a party may move for sanctions pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 37(c)(2).
