



H. Frank Forsyth, M.D.

Professor H. Frank Forsyth, Chairman of the Division of Orthopedic Surgery for several years, died in March 1988. He was born September 27, 1914, and was a graduate of the University of Michigan. He received his orthopedic training at the University of Michigan before coming to the Bowman Gray School of Medicine Department of Orthopedics. He succeeded Dr. R.A. Moore, who was the first chairman of that division.

Frank Forsyth was a skilled and knowledgeable surgeon with deep concern for the problems of his fellow man, particularly children. He gave time to listen to people before he sought to solve the many problems presented to him.

He was a skilled, persistent, and determined surgeon who had the proper balance of confidence and humility. He was an author, a teacher and a trainer of many young doctors.

His children, Mary Land and David Forsyth, have established a trust fund to honor his memory, to be used by the Division of Orthopedic Surgery for the benefit of disabled and handicapped children.

Alan Klein, M.B., B.Ch., Associate Professor of Radiology, died suddenly of a heart attack in Cairns, Australia on September 8th, 1988 while on a lecture tour. He was 56 years old and had been on the Bowman Gray faculty for 12 years.

Born in Springs, South Africa, Dr. Klein received both undergraduate and medical degrees from the University of the Witwatersrand, Johannesburg. He received residency training in radiology at the Hammersmith and Guys Hospitals in London, and his special interests were emergency and orthopedic radiology.

Between 1979 and 1988 he won the Bowman Gray Award for Teaching Excellence five times from the Physician's Assistant Program and four times from the Emergency Medicine Residents Program.

Alan Klein's cheerfulness and sense of humor endeared him to all who knew him. At Bowman Gray he was a favorite among faculty, residents, students, and staff.

It is difficult to comprehend or accept the death of one whose personality was so synonymous with life. Alan Klein was such a man, and he is greatly missed.

George D. Rovere, M.D.

Dr. George D. Rovere, professor and head of Orthopedic Surgery and team physician for Wake Forest University died November 24, 1988 after suffering from cancer for nearly two years. He was 55.

Dr. Rovere received his bachelor's degree from Syracuse University and his medical degree from the State University of New York, College of Medicine at Syracuse. He was a resident at the University of Virginia Hospital and the Hospital for Special Surgery at Cornell University.

Dr. Rovere joined the Bowman Gray faculty in 1972 and became a professor in 1983. He was named head of Orthopedic Surgery in early 1988. He was active in the teaching, patient care and research programs at Bowman Gray and Wake Forest. In addition he was nationally acclaimed for his work in sports medicine. The George D. Rovere Scholarship, established in 1987, is awarded each year to a deserving student athletic trainer at Bowman Gray.

Dr. Rovere was a valued and respected member of the faculty, and his strong presence will be fondly remembered and sorely missed.

Special Recognition=



Nat E. Smith, M.D.

Dr. Nat Smith joined the faculty of Bowman Gray as Professor of Medicine and Associate Dean in 1976.

He received his B.A. from Erskine College in 1943 and his M.D. from Medical College of Georgia in 1949. He served as a captain in the U.S. Army Medical Corps in Panama and Korea before completing his residency in Washington D.C. After residency, he worked briefly at the Veteran's Administration Hospital in Columbia, South Carolina. He then joined the Department of Medicine at the University of Illinois in 1957. In 1962 he was promoted to Assistant Dean of the College of Medicine and from 1968-1973 served as Associate Dean and Professor of Medicine. He moved South in 1973 to serve as Dean of Medicine at Mercer University in Macon, Ga., until coming to Bowman Gray.

At BGSM, Dr. Smith's principal responsibility has been the development and implementation of the medical school curriculum. He has been the chairman of the Committee on Medical Education since 1977. While serving the medical school primarily as an administrator, Dr. Smith has continued to be involved with students as a physical diagnosis tutor and as director of the Medical Student Scholar's Program.

Dr. Smith, along with Dr. Fairfield Goodale, was instrumental in the initiation of the Parallel Curriculum, of which he has continued to be an enthusiastic supporter.

This summer Dr. Smith will step down from his position as Associate Dean. He will retain some of his favorite responsibilities which allow him to work with students. He also plans to take advantage of his lighter schedule to devote time to developing new projects. We, the editors of *Gray Matter* 1989, would like to show Dr. Nat E. Smith our appreciation with this special recognition.



June G. May, Ph.D.

Dr. June May has been Registrar and Administrative Assistant to the Associate Dean for Student Affairs since 1983

Dr. May received her Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education from Frostburg State College in Maryland. She worked as an elementary school teacher and in research development until completing her graduate work. She earned her doctorate in education from the University of Houston in 1962

She then served in various capacities at Winston-Salem State University, including professor, director of the Teacher Corps, curriculum planner and grant writer, editor and long-range planner. She has held offices in professional societies at the state and national levels.

Her jobs at Bowman Gray have been many and diverse. She is responsible for scheduling third and fourth year rotations, supervising the school's and students' involvement in the National Residency Matching Program, coordinating student activities and planning the large-scale school programs and ceremonies.

In addition to these administrative duties, Dr. May has accepted and indeed embraced a whole set of personal responsibilities. She serves as counselor, advisor, and friend to many students throughout their medical school careers, and, most fortunately, during times of special need.

In a world of convoluted regulations and multiple frustrations, Dr. May's graciousness, directness and organizational skills are exemplary. We the editors offer her this recognition for those qualities and for her friendship.



We are indebted to Dr. Eben Alexander, David Forsyth and Geri Peavy for their expedient production of biographies of those close to their hearts.


Thanks also to the faculty members who updated their photos in order to cut down on the leisure suits, polyester, and three-inch-wide ties.
