



Walter John Bo, Ph.D.

Dr. Bo was born on August 12, 1923 in Chrisholm, Minnesota. After graduating from Chisholm High School in 1940 and spending two years at Hibbings Junior College, he attended Marquette University from 1943-47 where he completed both his Bachelor of Science and his Master of Science degrees in Zoology with a minor in Chemistry. Dr. Bo then spent two years as Instructor in Zoology at Xavier University prior to matriculating in the Anatomy Ph.D. program as a Graduate Fellow at the University of Cincinnati School of Medicine in 1949. After receiving his Ph.D. in Anatomy in 1953, Dr. Bo accepted a position as Assistant Professor of Anatomy at the University of North Dakota School of Medicine, and in 1958 he was promoted to Associate Professor of Anatomy.

It was in 1960 that Dr. Bo took a faculty position as Associate Professor of Anatomy at Bowman Gray School of Medicine of Wake Forest University, and in 1963 he was promoted to full Professor of Anatomy. Since arriving at Bowman Gray, Dr. Bo has supervised & Ph.D. candidates and 9 Master of Science candidates and authored or co-authored 7 books and 66 scientific journal publications in addition to being Course Director of Gross Anatomy. Other teaching responsibilities have included graduate and elective courses in Gross Anatomy, Obstetrics and Gynecology, TMJ course for dentists, Medicine as a Career, Sports Medicine, and a Law and Forensic Medicine course at the Wake Forest University School of Law. Dr. Bo has served as President of Sigma Xi, Vice Chairman of the Medical Education Committee and Chairman of both the Academic Affairs Committee and the Student Discipline Committee in addition to serving on numerous committees, including the AIMS Council, Faculty Promotions Committee, Unit 1 Committee, Parallel Curriculum Committee, Faculty Forum Committee, Admissions Committee and Medical Student Advisor Program. Among his many honors and awards, Dr. Bo has received the Dedication of the 1967 Gray Matter, the Excellence in Teaching Award in 1974 and 1985, and the Basic Science Teaching Excellence Award in 1981 and 1983. In addition, Drs. Bo, Meschan and Krueger have received the following awards for the book entitled Basic Atlas of Cross-Sectional Anatomy: Award of Excellence from the Association of Medical Illustrators, Certificate of Award from the Philadelphia Book Clinic and Honorable Mention from the Association of American Publishers.

The Bowman Gray School of Medicine Class of 1990 has chosen to dedicate the 1990 Gray Matter to Dr. Walter Bo because of his sincere concern for and commitment to students in his roles as teacher, student advocate and friend. Each of the members of the Class of 1990, regardless of which area of medicine we pursue, will continue to utilize information, skills and values that he taught us on a daily basis. He has truly won a special place in our hearts, and we will remember Dr. Bo whenever we recall our days at Bowman Gray.

In Memorium



Ivan W.F. Davidson, Ph.D. (1926-1989)

Dr. Davidson, a native of Canada, was a graduate of the University of Manitoba and received both his M.S. and Ph.D. from the University of Toronto. He was a research fellow at the renowned Banting and Best Department of Medical Research where he developed a long-term interest in insulin resistance and the role of heavy metals in diabetes. Dr. Davidson joined the Bowman Gray faculty in the Department of Physiology and Pharmacology in 1961. For the last decade he was director of the medical school's Pharmacology course. He twice received the Basic Science Teaching Award and was also recipient of the Lederle Medical Faculty Award. Dr. Davidson died October 3, 1989.

Charles R. Jerge, D.D.S., Ph.D. (1929-1989)

Dr. Jerge received his B.S. from the State University of New York and both his D.D.S. and Ph.D. from the University of Pennsylvania. He served eleven years on the faculty of the University of Connecticut's School of Dental Medicine, including six years as its dean. Prior to arriving at Bowman Gray, he was professor and chairman of the Department of Dental Care System at the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine. In 1978 Dr. Jerge accepted the position of chairman of Bowman Gray's newly formed Department of Dentistry. During his chairmanship he developed a highly respected residency training program. Dr. Jerge died December 7, 1989.



Angus C. Randolph, M.D. (1924-1990)

Dr. Randolph originally hailed from Lexington, Virginia. He received his B.A. from Princeton University and his M.D. from the University of Virginia. Dr. Randolph served five years as a flight surgeon in the U.S. Air Force and received both the Air Medal and the Soldiers Medal. In 1946 he was a fellow at John Hopkins University; and a few years later he served as chief resident in psychiatry at Bowman Gray's Graylyn Hospital. He joined the Bowman Gray faculty in 1948 and ten years later became director of the Department of Psychiatry and Neurology. Dr. Randolph was named professor emeritus upon his retirement in 1987. He died January 31, 1990.

Henry Rothberger, M.D. (1943-1989)

Dr. Rothberger was a native of Detroit, Michigan. He received both his B.A. and M.D. degrees from the University of Michigan. He specialized in Rheumatology, participated in research at Scripps Institute, and in 1974 became board-certified in Hematology. Since 1977 he had been an Associate Professor of Medicine in the Section of Rheumatology at Bowman Gray School of Medicine. Dr. Rothberger died April 30, 1989 and he had been an avid supporter of many conservation and environmental groups.





Wake Forest College School of Medical Sciences — Organized in 1902. The faculty numbers 16 professors, and 29 assistant professors, instructors, assistants and lecturers, making a total of 45.

Ninety semester hours of collegiate work are required for admission. The B.S. degree is given after the completion of the first year in the School of Medical Sciences. Each annual course extends over nine months. Tuition for each year is \$300. The registration for 1939-1940 was 60. The next session begins Sept. 10, 1940, and ends June 2, 1941. The Dean is C.C. Carpenter, M.D.

After a healthy ten-week break all us second years threw away our pathology text and took a series of pathology quizzes en route to forgetting the subject forever. We knew this was a delay tactic to allow the clinical instructors an extra week to vacation while we ground out graffiti in the stacks. By the time second year got going we were ready to roll. The familiar classroom setting (just one floor higher) and faces lulled us back into our old ways. There were fewer labs and lectures seemed more palatable. Was it due to the fact that some of this material would be useful one day or that we had become duller people over the summer? We struggled through short two and three-week courses and took bite-sized tests that were much easier to swallow than our first year entrees. In addition to being veteran academicians we were senior to the incoming first years. Suddenly we were holders of the truth, respected by one-fourth of the medical school and sneered at by the rest. We were also tentative travelers into the clinical side of medicine. We could draw blood and wear sharp-looking white

jackets. We could conduct afternoon-long history and physicals (to the chagrin of our breathless patients) and we could look forward to the boards.

MS III: This is the year that started with boards. . . And ended with scut upon the wards

In terms of where we are . . . And from our peepholes in the stacks we fantasized about life on the wards, whether we were meant to be doctors and how long we could retain the mounds of minutiae. After filling in the last bubble (or after the time expired) on the second day of the boards in the waning hours of that June afternoon, we all collapsed in a heap.

The boards were a culmination, purification, a mental flossing that supposedly showed us the breadth and depth of medical meandering that could be avoided by going into clinical medicine.



After ten days we replanted ourselves in comfortable walking shoes and began the ploding, erratic march of a third year: sometimes racing along the halls glancing cautiously at the vital signs in fear of a febrile temperature, sometimes forever staring at the hieroglyphics smeared across the ICU/IMCU day sheets. In the beginning our physical diagnostic prowess was based on Dr. Philp's plethora of dictums. We knew the "normal" patient and how to repeatedly ask questions to a sober, comfortable patient. Suddenly we were faced with the psychotic patient, the intoxicated patient, the burned patient, the anginal patient, the leukemic, the patient with a chart of past admissions thicker than our combined biochemistry text, the patient with symptoms that do not fit in any category whatsoever. Our ability to shuffle and scramble became more important than our ability to contemplate deep diagnostic thoughts. A succinct combination would have been ideal, but our contributions as ward monkeys soon overrode our feeble attempts at thought. Physical input dominated. We raced up and down flights of stairs, stood hours on end holding retractors, waited by silent phones embarrassed for losing the rounding team, and stood at elbowside with pen poised for orders to be written.

And third year contained a joyful five to ten-week hiatus that contrasted brilliantly with the wards as well as clinic work at RHC in peds and OB/GYN. All in all third year was a 40+ week adventure which could never be replaced with mere events. It was filled with extremes of emotion, clinical realization, academic challenges, professional interaction, independent motivation, classmate

camaraderie and multiple shelf board exams. Many of us experienced death and life first hand and learned of the subtleties of patient-physician interaction. Disease and mysticism paradoxically walked hand in hand down the sulci of our minds.

And we interview and become sharp and independent. Then we return a little less glued to the principles in which we were basted during third year and a little more anxious about acceptance, hiring, matching.

It is generally a happy event sprinkled with occasional strains of woe, strains that tug at hearts of those affected and dampen their spirits. On the whole it is a final glorious moment that surpasses the pumped up ''Pomp and Circumstance'' of graduation, a mere ritual surrounded by passive achievement. The Match accomplishments are earned.

Then we graduate. We finish our time at BGSM and point ourselves in different directions aiming at destinations in time and place. But while we are on the launch pad with spirits poised and hearts heaving loudly we can feel the hot breath of our mates who are waiting in rapt pleasure, anticipating the fast-approaching storm of medical involvement, independence and responsibility. With the support of our friends, family and faculty we are weaned from the womb of medical school to the harsh world of reality and given an opportunity to grow, to establish oneself and to practice.
