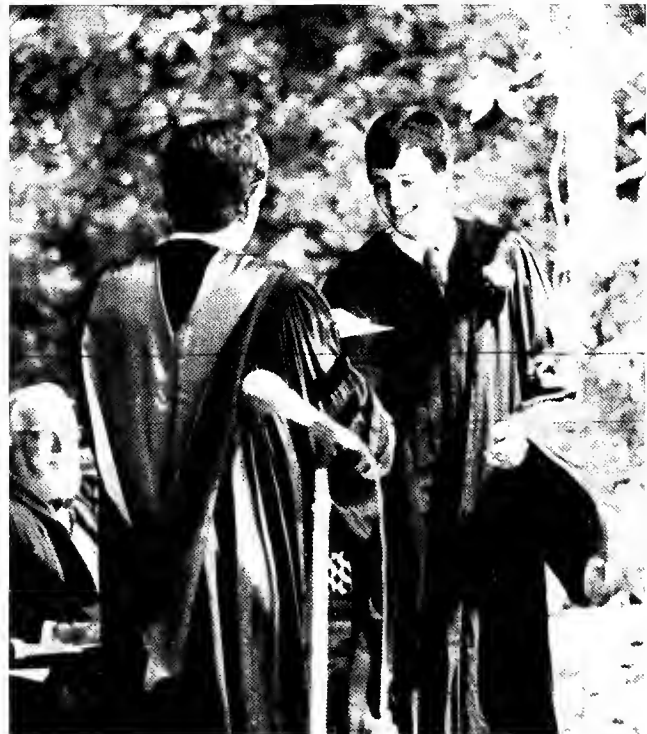

Erin: Have faith . . . only 45 more pages to go.



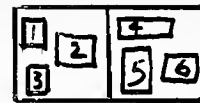
