Goodbye Great Man

Joshua Hausman '05 in concert with the Economics Faculty

A great man was lost to us this year, just after Thanksgiving while visiting his daughter's family. Professor Bernie Saffran -- committed and engaged intellectual, devoted friend to all who relished his compassion, mentor par excellence to students and colleagues alike, and intensely dedicated husband, father, grandfather. This and previous generations of Swatties knew him as a uniquely, charismatically inspiring scholar and nurturing teacher. For many of those before us, Bernie's sustaining engagement in their lives continued long after graduation, a privilege we are denied. But like them, we have known an exemplar of a life meaningfully lived and enjoyed, albeit not without tragic familial loss, to the fullest.

Learning supply and demand from Bernie was not about memorizing graphs and equations, it was about understanding the unintended consequences -- sometimes personal or amusing -- of interference with market forces. Usury laws prevent risky borrowers from getting loans, but they also permitted Bernie to afford his Swarthmore home. New York rent control leads to poorly maintained buildings, but also to unusually valuable couches -- landlord to prospective tenant: "we can't move out the sofa, you'll have to buy it... for \$10,000."

Bernie reveled in demonstrating the self-destructive role of profits. Profits signal firms to enter the market, but entry erodes profits. Clarifying what is counter-intuitive was one characteristic passion, another was illuminating the fundamental conundrum inherent in the pursuit of self-interest as the organizing principle for economic activity. It simultaneously tends toward the greatest good for all and leads to abject market failure. But even market failures have a positive role. Consider, it was the market failure of monopoly profits that enabled the R&D (by AT&T's Bell Labs) resulting in the transistor and thus, ultimately, information technology. Bernie's forte was finding the right balance of theory and reality.

Lessons about life were no less Bernie's *métier*. They were imparted more as co-traveler and friend than as teacher. One rarely engaged with him without being asked about things like as summer or post-college plans, outside interests, sports activities, food preferences, sleep habits, and the like. More often than not the answers led to spirited, instructive conversation and advice -- ranging from what job to take after graduation to where to eat in Media. That Bernie cared deeply about the lives of his students is clear from the influence he has had on many of their lives.

Across the generations, "Bernie stories" abound. They all convey an essence -- Bernie was a profound presence in the lives of many. Modes of thinking were changed, career paths affected, critical choices clarified, lasting insights of general significance gained. Many must now make their way without Bernie's sage counsel, armed only with memories suggesting how he might have reacted. But we are far richer having those memories. Thank you great man, would that you were here to share our graduation.
