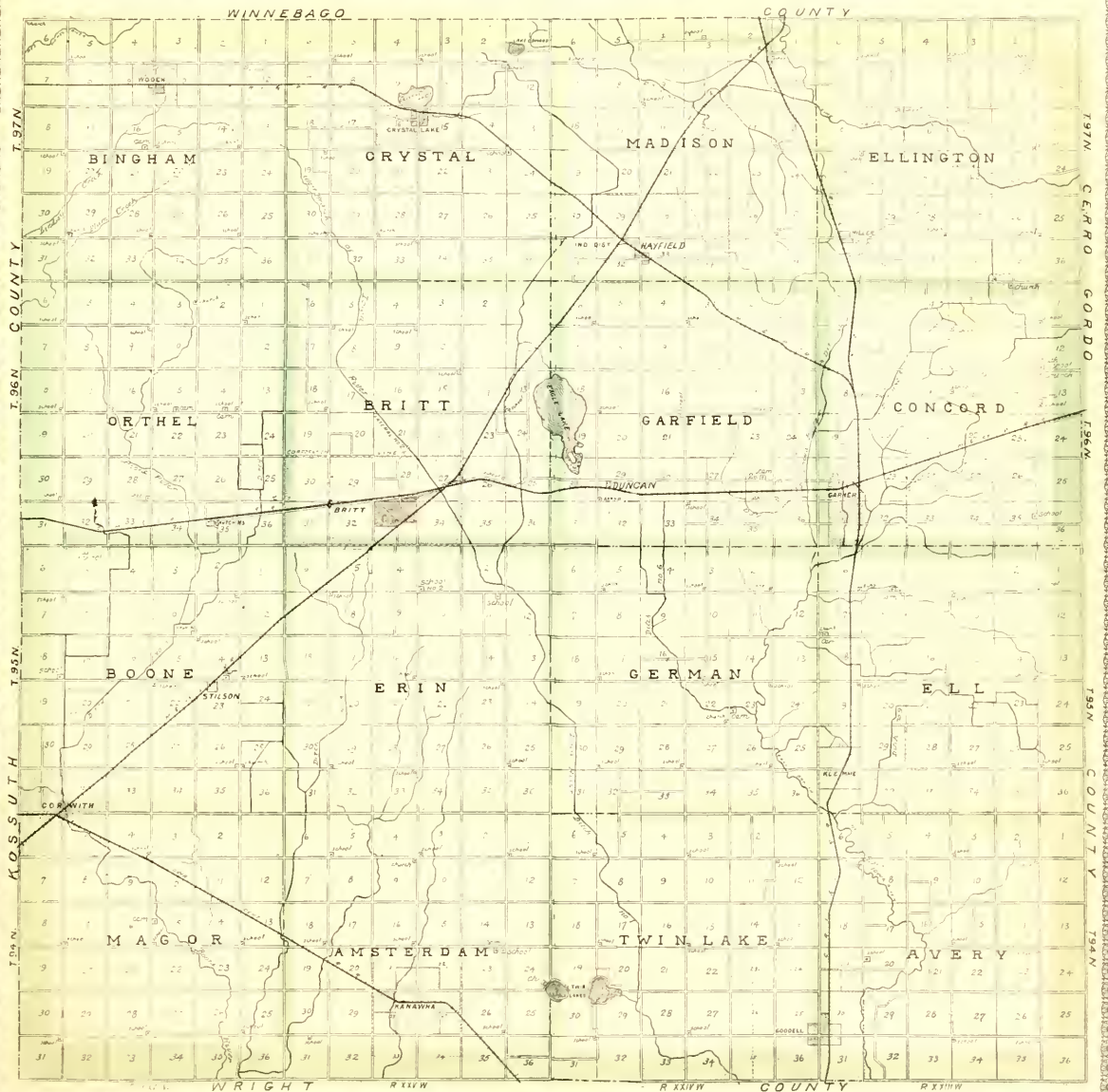

HANCOCK COUNTY, IOWA



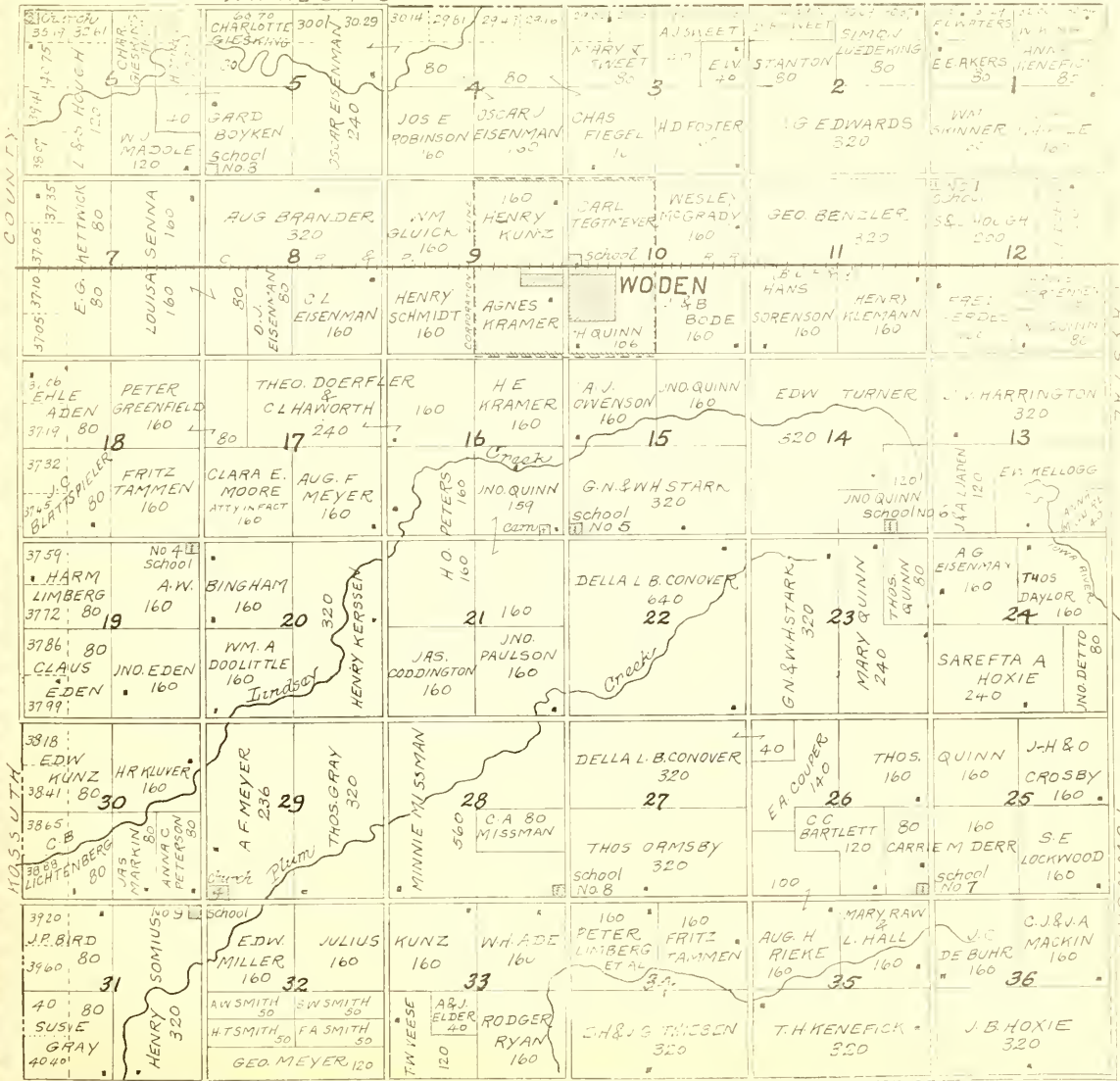

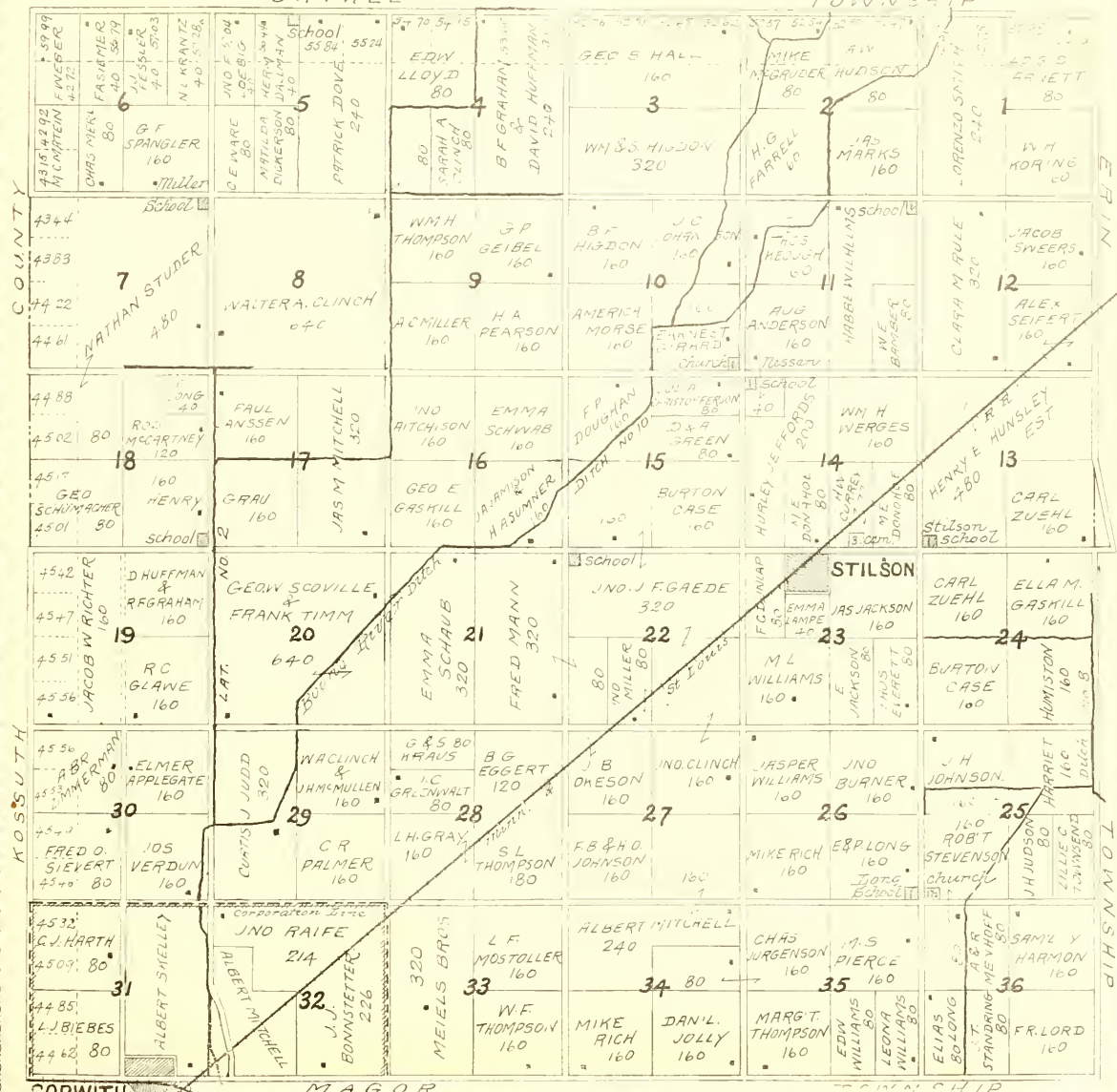

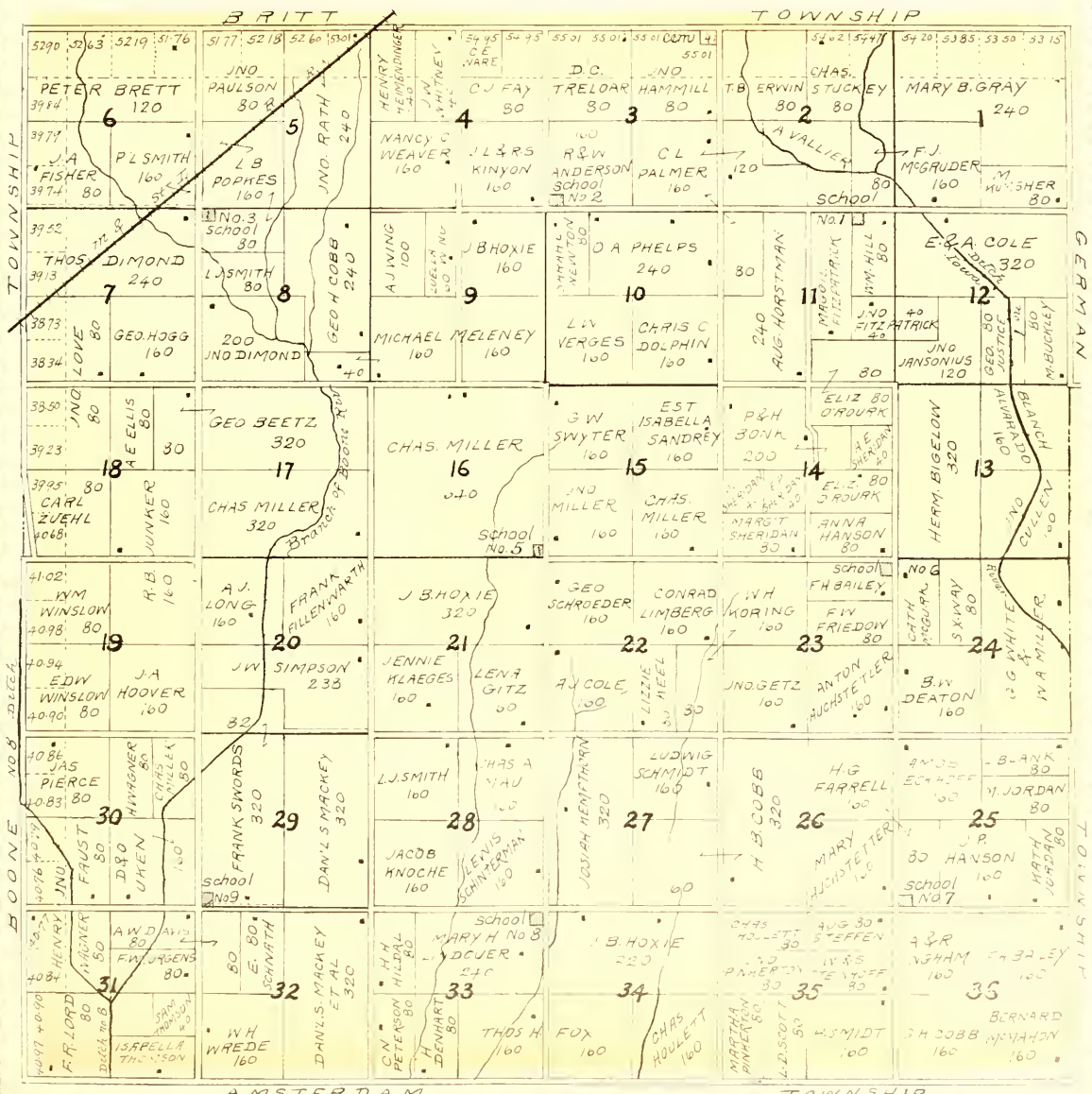

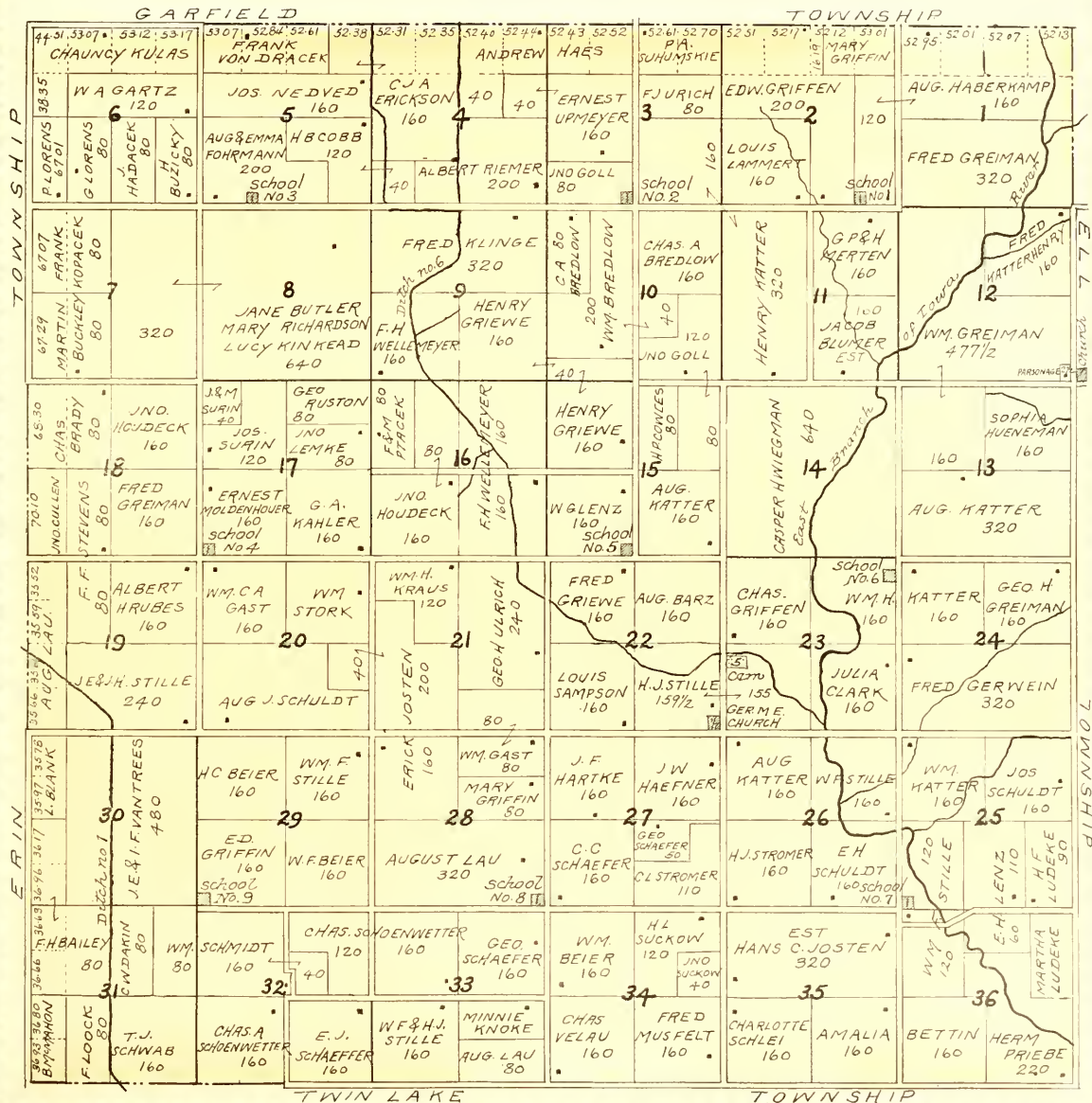

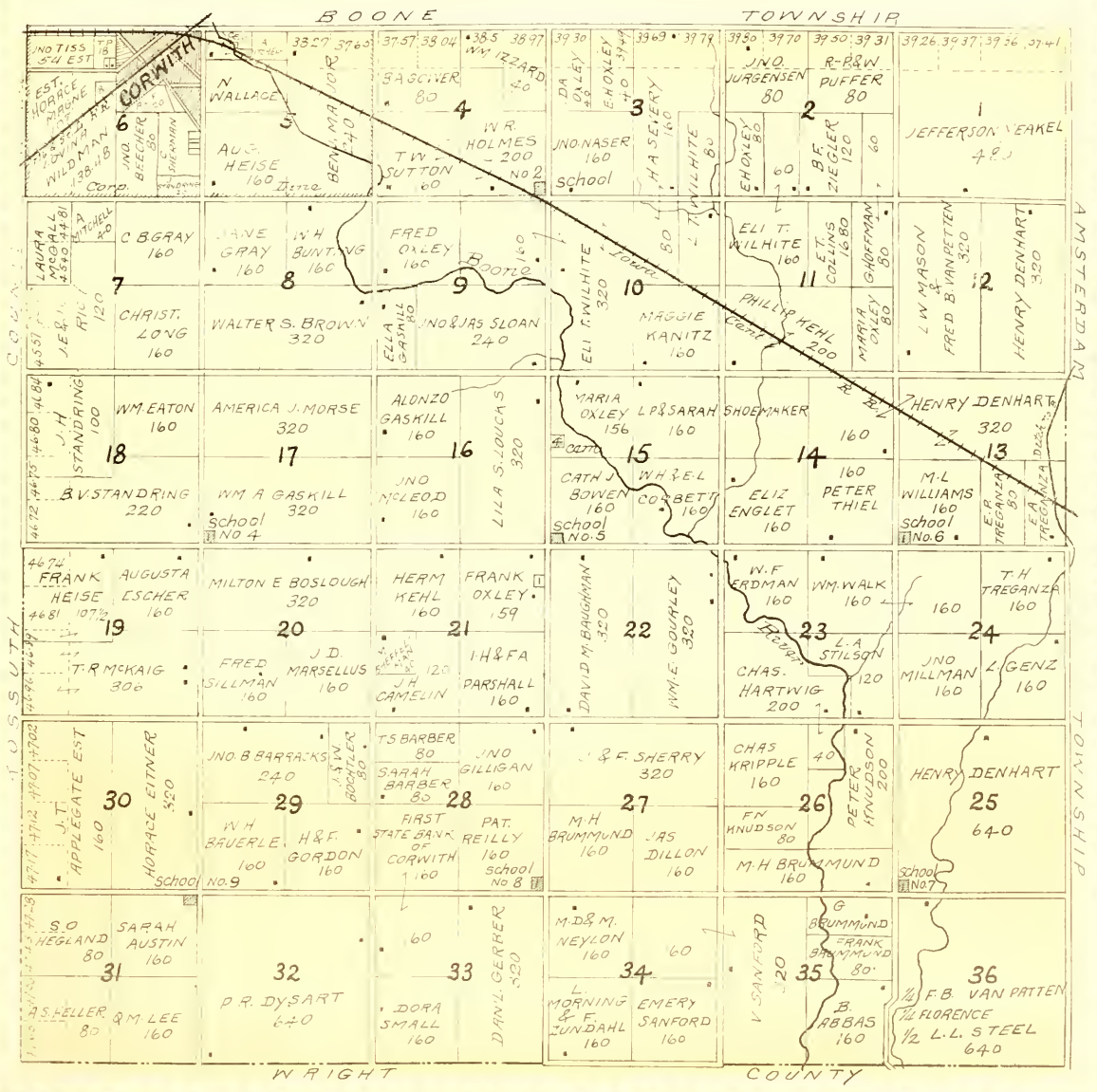
Scale 14 Inches to the Mile

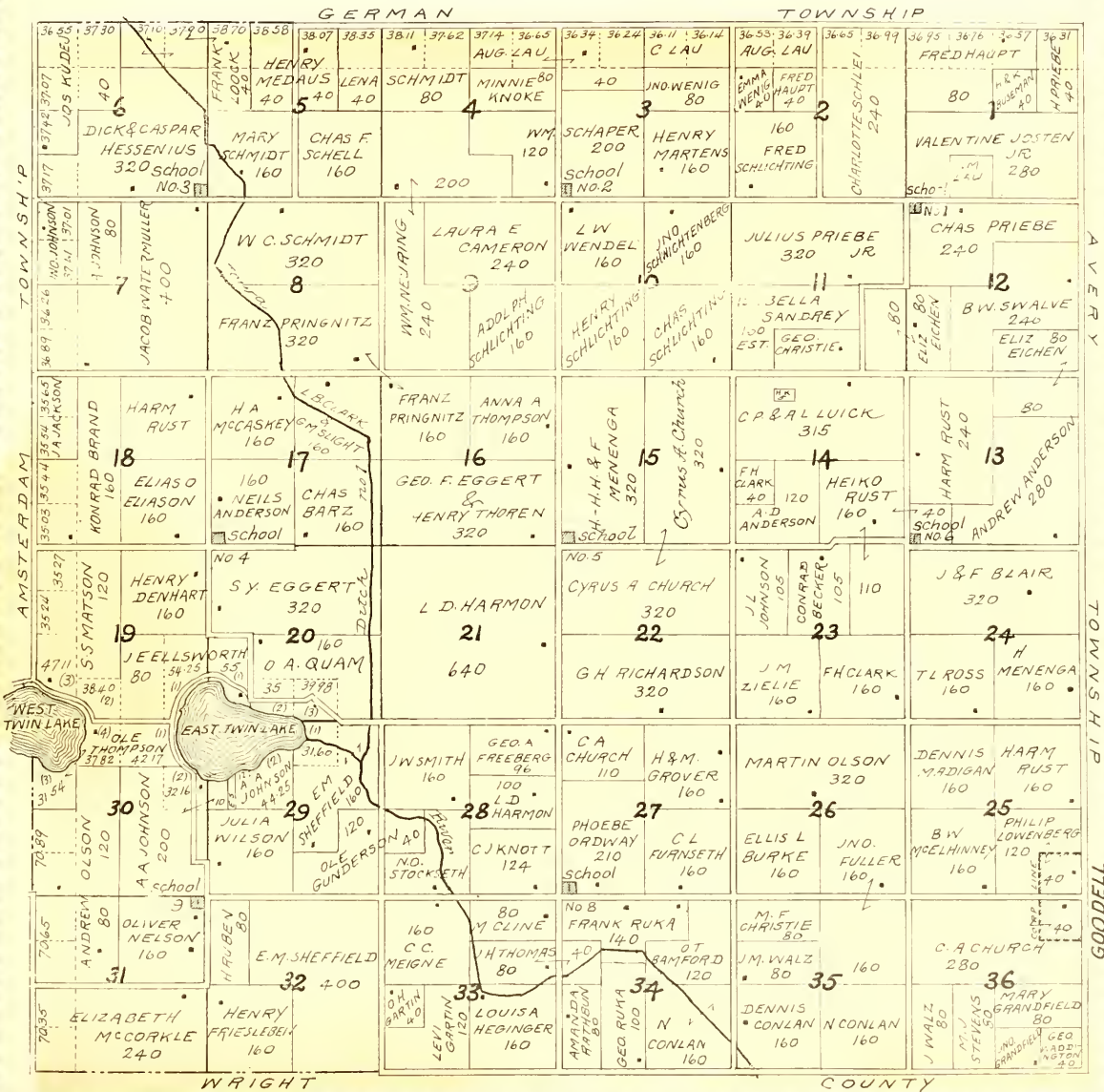

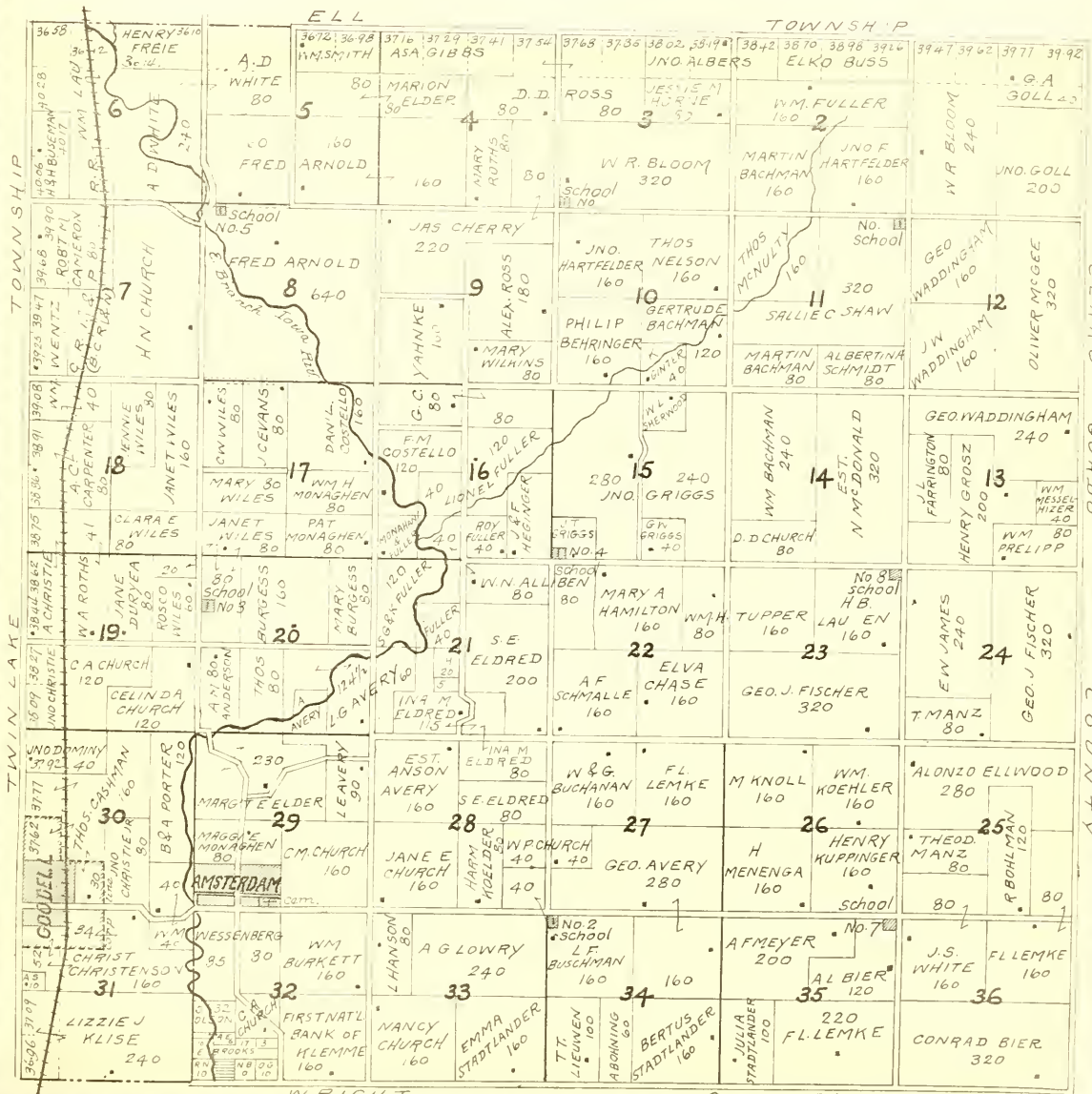
