



PREFACE

HE compiler of this genealogy has during much of his life-time taken considerable interest in noting incidents and data relative to family history; but not until six years ago, when having been accorded the distinction of Historian for the Hess-Higbee Family Reunion, was any especial effort put forth. But since that time a systematic research has been conducted, and upon suggestion of interested parties a year ago the author decided to enter into the laborious and quite endless undertaking of publishing this work, the data and records of which have been obtained largely from direct correspondence with the families. Much credit is due many who co-operated with a zeal that manifested much interest. Considerable record was obtained from encyclopediae of recognized authority, and also indirectly from official records, which were provided the author through kindness of friends, of whom modesty forbids personal mention; nevertheless the author entertains a deep sense of gratitude toward such; for, being obliged to perform a daily toil of nine hours each, the author could in no wise have secured this collection of family record without such assistance.

Relative to the statement that the author is a salary man, and that his hours for labor being in demand, let no one think that the Christian Sabbath was utilized for the accomplishment of this work;

"WILL A MAN ROB GOD?"

That is a pointed interogation in the third chapter of Malachi and should be recognized in all its meaning. We, in a country which prides itself as being Christian, certainly should maintain Christ's standard as set forth in Matt. 19:17; Luke 11:28; John 14:23. God's word warns and directs and we should take heed thereunto. Hence, the author's attitude desiring not that the possessors of this compilation need have the blush of shame because of any such desceration.

It is proper that the cord of sympathetic condolence be caused to vibrate in recognition of the forbearance and submissiveness on the part of the immediate members of the author's family, who have been, through these years of compilation, deprived of much of the social attitude which becomes a husband and father to bestow upon her whom he has vowed to care and protect, and to those whom the Creator has given him the charge of launching upon the active wave of social, commercial, political and religious life, in which each individual becomes an important factor.

Instances where one's record is incomplete should not be considered as neglectfulness on the part of the author, but rather an inability, after repeated efforts to obtain such. Some of the kin were impossible to locate; while others perhaps considered it "graft" and some were seemingly indifferent.

Often dates and places would conflict with statements rendered by others, and sometimes even by themselves, and thus this work may be questioned by some, although the author has spent many a midnighthour in painstaking efforts to verify dates and statements as submitted. Trusting that unavoidable errors will be excused without further apology, this volume is now submitted to the Hess-Higbee families, with a hope and trust that a charitable attitude may be accorded the author, because of any incompleteness, realizing that an error may be due to a wrong interpretation of our modern day penmanship.

When reading these genealogical records the reader will note that many of the accounts are quite incomplete. Should anyone wish to furnish a more perfect record of any portion, the author will gladly receive and file such that at some future date someone interested in the Hess-Higbee genealogy might use the same very advantageously in securing a more perfect record.

INTRODUCTION



N introducing this volume to its readers, some may be surprised that the Hess-Higbee families do not come forth with a gilded coat-of-arms, or other significance denoting distinction and notoriety for past bravery or heraldry. The fact is, such an emblem they have not; and in this age of American progress and leadership why need they any? The time was when military men went forth to battle clad in a coat of mail upon which was displayed their respective coat-of-arms, and that such were recognized by both friend and foe. But in this age of advanced civilization (may we never deteroate) they appear before us merely in the historical past. And so may it continue to be, just so far as is necessary for the promotion of republican diplomacy.

"Deus Spes mea."

And may each descendant of these families prove himself such a Knight of Heraldry, not so much in military combat, but rather in every day contact as a citizen in the commercial, social and political world, presenting a charitable attitude, remembering that true charity covereth a multitude of sins.

Had the author privilege of means and time to travel possibly he could trace the Hess ancestry farther back, but neither of such are at his command. Exceedingly fortunate was he in the securing of so extended a lineage of the Higbee family, though the reader will take notice that preceding James Higbee, Sr., in the ninth generation, the line of ancestry is not Higbee but dates backward from the maternal side of the family. Thus it is that the first eight generations are the progeny of William I., Prince of Orange, while the remaining generations, although the same lineage, yet the Higbee strain is followed on down to the present.

EXPLANATORY

HE numbers at the left of the page indicate the generation, and precede the name of the descendant, or, if married, precede the head of the family. Those names which have no generation number preceding are of the same generation as the preceding one that is numbered.

A number in bold type succeeding the person's name indicates that party to be a descendant, and is used for reference.

At the right hand side of the page, and opposite the record of hcsband and wife, are placed in succession the names of the children of that respective family; the number preceding the child's name, indicating approximately its numerical order in the lineage. Although for reasons unavoidable, these numbers are not strictly consecutive.

Illustrating the preceding, turn in the Hess portion of this volume to numbers 912, 913, 914, which appear on the right hand side of page 55, and represent these as the children of Ralph and Blanche (George) Calhoon—507. Now turn back to where No. 507 appears, and you find Blanche as one of the children of William and Margaret (Torrence) George—213. Turn back again to No. 213 at right of page where Margaret appears as one of the children of Andrew and Mary (Spahr) Torrence—127. Turn back to No. 127 and you find Andrew to be one of the family of children of Mathew and Judy (Hess) Torrence—68. Back now with No. 68 and Judy appears as one of the family of William, Sr., and Mary (Waltour) Hess. Thus you have traced the lineage of Marc, Lynn, and Howard Calhoon.

In the arrangement of the generation numbers, also the reference numbers in the Hess lineage, the author does not begin with No. 1 for the reason of having the generation and reference numbers relative to George W. and Mary A. (Higbee) Hess one and the same in both records. For reasons, see "Historical", page 10.

Much of the data in this volume was copied from family records often inscribed in the family bible, yet different dates were given by different members of the same family. Sometimes through a long course of correspondence these entanglements could be solved. Some could not. Hence errors are unavoidable regardless of the author's persistent efforts to secure facts.

In some instances the spelling of names has been different, even by members of the same family, and often the only way the compiler could adjust the difficulty was through a sense of inspiration and instinct as well as knowledge.

The reason for A, B, C succeeding the number 333 in the Higbee section is that this family of children's names were secured after the long line of successive numbers had been arranged for the press, and it was difficult to do otherwise.

In a few instances the author may have used the terms Jr. and Sr. when these expressions were not in usage by the parties applied to, but it seemed necessary to avoid complications; for instance, George W. Hess, Jr., grandson of George W. Hess, Sr.

When a reference number is repeated it signifies a second marriage. In the index portion where the surname follows the christian name of a lady it signifies that such was her maiden name.

The usage of a <u>indicates</u> that the data was not furnished even when urgently requested. Hence, the author could scarcely do otherwise, as the following may 'illustrate: "I have three children. Charles, Julia, and Sarah; each married. Charles has four children, and each of the girls three children." It is a difficult undertaking to produce an interesting family record from such. Upon the second request the author is considered a "crank", or perchance it is regarded as needless; perhaps no response at all, being due to carelessness, or, maybe, a hesitancy of self-publication. Nevertheless, the compiler of such a record is really "up against it" and knows no recourse.

HISTORICAL

F records were accessible from which one could glean authentic information relative to ancestry, it would be both interesting and gratifying; but inasmuch as we have very little of such regarding the departure of our ancestry from the fatherland and advent into the new and undeveloped wilds of America, it is necessary to depend largely upon traditional history which is handed down to us in substance, that about fifty years prior to the American Colonies' struggle for independence, three Hess brothers decided to bid farewell to loved ones in their native German home, confront the dangers and hardships of an ocean voyage, sacrificing many joys and kindred affections at the shrine of the new, yet adored, America. And because of the sinewy nerve, determined pluck, manly courage and love of independence of such as these, do we of this age and generation enjoy that which we do, and only too often depreciate our inheritance. About the same period of time (according to the traditions that various branches of Higbee posterity have) three Higbee brothers from England landed at New York, and, like the Hess brothers, pressed out into the hills of Pennsylvania, from whence they migrated; some into Kentucky, some into Virginia, some into Iowa and some into Ohio, the latter branch being the nearest kin to this genealogical record. One James Higbee, Sr. Appears to have lived in Orange County, N. Y., which is quite adjacent to New York City. Here it is that the Higbee lineage became united with the Anneke Jan lineage which latter one can be traced back eight generations farther.

Passing through Pennsylvania and eventually into Ohio with this lineage we find one Mary Ann Higbee, a granddaughter of James Higbee, Sr., uniting her future prospects with one, George W. Hess, in Crawford County, Ohio, which union materializes the Hess-Higbee combination.

The author is pleased to state that two other branches of Hess descendants, viz: the Andrew Hess family, and the Judy (Hess) Torrence family, neither of which are kin to the original Higbee family, yet are as distinctively and properly a portion of this Re-union organization and genealogy as any of the branches of lineage, have been traced with considerable accuracy.

A large percentage of these families emigrated into southwest Michigan about three-fourths of a century ago, resulting in a large circle of kindred ones whose mutual acquaintance and fellowship has been made to be more intimate through the influence of the Hess-Higbee Family Reunion, which was first held and organized at Millburg, Mich., June 20, 1903, at the home of Mary J. (Hess) Babcock, whose mother was a Higbee. The place of this first reunion was on historic ground, having been the farm of George W. Hess, who, a half century previous planted the lusty apple trees under which this first reunion assembled.

The historian here diverges by stating that those who placed him in this official capacity are responsible for the production of this volume, as without this incentitive to spur him on, even though it was somewhat the goal of his ambition, he never would have accomplished the work in this period of time. Furthermore he desires to state that although the records are somewhat traditional, yet much care and pains have been exercised to maintain a high degree of accuracy. And while we review with pride and pleasure the achievements of our ancestry and would deplore any incident that might place a blot of unwanted reputation upon these pages of record, it behooves each of us to reflect that daily we are living and recording history for our posterity; therefore,

Let honor be a gem in the crown of thy life; and, Let no man take thy crown.

The following poem, which was written for and read before the First Hess-Higbee Reunion, is given a place here because of its historical setting:

SYNOPSIS

Hess-Higbee Re-Unions Since Their Inception.

URING the spring of 1903, Mrs. Mary J. (Hess) Babcock and daughter, Mrs. Ona Irwin, favored the holding of a family picnic in the apple orchard surrounding the home of the former, near Millburg, Mich. Desirous of showing no disrespect, the nearby relatives were invited to participate. It seemed difficult to draw a limit, whereupon the conclusion was that a general invitation be extended to all relatives. Let it be understood that at this period in the arrangements the senior promoter of this enterprise suffers an affliction in the decease of her daughter, Mrs. Ona B. Irwin. Yet with the undaunted courage, and a will submissive to the rulings of a Supreme Father, the mother Babcock proceeds in the carrying out in detail of the plans for this family gathering and enterprise. Accordingly, though somewhat informally, this was done, the hostess wondering whether this assemblage would be 60 or 70 personages. On the 20th day of June, as anxious ones awaited the arrival of friends, wonderment changed to astonishment as the company enumerated 135 relatives. At the after-dinner social hour, expressions were made regarding the enjoyment and benefit of such an occasion, which resulted in organizing a Hess-Higbee Re-union to meet annually, arrangements for which were vested in an executive committee, then and there chosen.

The Second Re-union was pleasantly entertained by Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Hess, near Eau Claire, Mich., July 23, 1904, in their maple grove yard.

The Third Re-union convened July 22, 1905, at the home of J. G. and Tola (Higbee) Phillips, a former home of the venerable J. F. Higbee, east of Benton Harbor, Mich. This re-union was remarkable for many of the attendants having come long distances to participate in this social event.

The Fourth Re-union assembled July 21, 1906, at the residence of Dr. and Altavene (Hess) Weir, Millburg, Mich., which had been the home of George W. and Mary A. (Higbee) Hess from 1838 until the time of their decease. The participants in this reunion numbered 190 relatives.


The Fifth Re-union met in a beautiful grove at Eau Claire, Mich., July 27, 1907, attendance at which was somewhat restricted owing to agricultural conditions. Yet our venerated grandma and aunt, Emily (Higbee) VanVranken, whose locks are four score and ten, as in the past was present, and she still expects to attend the coming event.

The Sixth Re-union was entertained by W. H. and Amanda (Higbee) Hill August 8, 1908, at their residence in Bainbridge, Berrien County, Mich., where an elaborate show tent was erected and seated, enhancing the comfort and happiness of this large assemblage.

The Seventh Re-union convened August 21, 1909, at Eastman Springs Resort, near Benton Harbor, Mich. A social was enjoyed renewing kindred acquaintances in this one of nature's beauty spots. At the business session the following officers were elected:

Germany concluded to chance their future in America. Fearing the depredations of pirates, which infested the ocean waters of those days, these young men planned that in the making of their shoes (for they were shoemakers by trade) they would remove circles of leather from the inner shoe soles, placing therein gold coin. Accordingly while enroute they were captured by pirates, and, after some time in bondage, they succeeded in securing a price upon their freedom, whereupon they removed their shoe-soles, paid the ransom, and proceeded towards the land of promise, though meeting with obstacles of which we know not.

The decease of Mr. Hess, which occurred while his son, George, was yet a small lad, entailed many hardships upon the widowed mother, who diligently strove to and did maintain the family home circle. Incidents are related how this mother toiled in the field with her babes under the protection of nearby trees, while she endeavored to bear the burden of both father and mother.

Nancy Jane Gowing, daughter of Andrew and Mary Hess, was born March 14, 1844, and died at Sulphur Springs, O., Oct. 7, 1888, aged 44 years 6 months and 23 days. The bereaved husband and four children mourn the loss of a good wife and kind mother. The aged mother, Mrs, Hess, with five sons and two daughters,

mourns the death of three daughters and one daughter-in-law within the year 1888. Margaret Sweney died March 29, 1888; Mrs. Frank Hess died April 16, 1888; Delilah Crall died April 30, 1888. The bereaved are comforted by the assurance that their departed loved ones now rest in Heaven. H. S. R.

Following is the obituary of Mrs. Andrew Hess:

At seven o'clock yesterday morning the tolling of the church bell at Berrien Centre conveyed to us the sad intelligence that a long, happy, useful and well spent life was ended and that the pure spirit of Grandma Hess, as we were wont to call her, had passed from earth to the joys of life eternal, the last battle fought, the victory won, the cross exchanged for the crown. She died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. J. K. P. McCullough, in Berrien Centre, April 12, 1897, aged 82 years, 5 months and 26 days. Mary Hemry was born in Harrison county, Ohio, Oct. 16, 1814. and was married April 9, 1833, to Andrew Hess, who entered the upper and better world Dec. 28, 1875, aged 69 years. To Mr. and Mrs. Hess were born six sons and six daughters, all of whom were baptised in infancy and brought up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. These parents were members of the Lutheran church and their children, with perhaps one or two exceptions, became members of the same or some other church. Five sons and two daughters, Wm. A., Henry, Isaac, John A., Frank, Mrs. McCullough and Mrs. John Bower survive the mother. Besides these, thirty-four grandchildren and twenty-one great grandchildren mourn their loss. which was being obliged to abandon their wagon in mid-stream when fording the broad St. Joseph river at its mouth, mount the horses and ride ashore thence five miles into the forest, where amid the Indian trails were finally located the parents of this young wife, who had preceded them a few months. Mr. Hess was of an industriously progressive nature, being a carpenter, cabinet maker and farmer, thus materially developing this virgin state, which had just became one of the union. Being of German descent and retaining the language, he proved to be of great use officially as an interpreter. He it was who planted the apple orchard just south of Millburg wherein was held the First Hess-Higbee reunion. Volumes could be written relative to the experiences of these frontiers-folk, but suffice to say that they became the proud parents of 12 children, and, with the exception of one who deceased in girlhood, all are living and enjoying a goodly degree of health at this writing, the oldest being 72 while the youngest is 52 years of age. Ten of the eleven children became school teachers, all being reared in the village of Millburg, while the farm was across the waters of the deep gorged Blue creek.

At the advanced age of 84 years, Mr. Hess, while hauling rails, suffered a stroke of paralysis rendering him quite helpless the remainder of his life.

He was laid to rest in the beautiful Union church cemetery, Friday afternoon, April 10, Rev. E. A. Hoffman, of Benton Harbor, and the Rev. Harshman of Berrien Springs, officiating. By the "Pacification of Ghent" in 1576, William united the provinces in one confederation much to the displeasure of King Philip II. of Spain, who now set a price upon the Prince's head, and, after repeated attempts, succeeded in causing his betrayal and assassination at Delft, South Holland, July 10, 1854. The church contains a monument in memory of the Prince.

Roeloff Jans was a man of official and political distinction, and a stream of water in that locality still perpetuates his name.

Rev. Bogardus, as a minister of the Dutch Reformed church, was a man of deep convictions and indominatable courage, often precipitating him into serious controversies. In the fall of 1647 he bid farewell to his wife and children, taking passage in the ship, Princess, for a visit to the fatherland. But the kinsfolk in Holland were deprived of enjoying this visit, for off the coast of Wales the vessel mistook the chanel, shipwrecked upon a rock and the Dominie perished Sept. 27, 1647. No doubt a long period elapsed before the family in New America learned of the sad news. The Dominie's piety was manifestly illustrated in all the business details of his life. His character and attributes are vividly portrayed through the annals of the semi-ancient colony.

Mrs. Bogardus, generally known as Anneke Jans, was of Holland birth, coming to America in childhood and living her girlhood in New Amsterdam on and about the present site of Trinity church.

Twice married, rearing a family by each union; twice widowed, surviving the last husband 16 years, she through it all displayed business tact and ability that was enviable. Having come into possession of considerable property, and realizing her advanced age, she arranged for the disposal of her belongings by a will which displayed a touch of her spiritual attitude, for in part it recommended her immortal soul to Almighty God, her Creator and Redeemer, and consigning her body to Christian burial. Thus she soon afterward closed a notable career.

The Bogardus heirs claimed their share of the estate known as the Trinity church property in the city of New York, which latter corporation had secured possession of by a 99-year lease, but had been given by will of Anneke Jans (Yans) Bogardus, bearing date of Jan. 27, 1663, and recorded at Albany, N. Y., to her children and grandchildren. At present date this estate is valued approximately at \$60,000,000.00.

For five centuries prior to 1531, Orange was an independent principality ruled by its own sovereigns. Now the estates and title pass to the Count of Nassau and thus to the princes. Though Orange was ceded to France in 1713, yet the title of Prince has descended by the younger Nassau line to the kings and stadtholders of Holland."


