## NOTE.

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Three years ago, when I published the *History and Genealogies of Ancient Windsor, Conn.*, I was induced, if not compelled, by a super-abundance of material, to give my subscribers, without additional charge, over 300 pages more than was promised them—an act of generosity which, as it is easy to see, was much more advantageous to them than to me. And when, at last, relieved from the burdens of authorship and financial cares, I felt that I certainly had fully paid (both principal and interest) *my* share of the debt of love which I owed to the old town of Windsor; and little dreamed that I should ever again put myself in harness for her historical benefit. But, unfortunately for my “sweet dream of peace,” I found myself *inwrought* into old Windsor’s history and interest. I could not henceforth be an uninterested looker on, and found myself still tracing out the lines of her ancient families, and that—shall I confess it—there was an indefinable charm, for me, in all that pertained to Windsor history. Many errors I detected in the printed volume—some of clerical, others of typographical origin—some evident faults of commission, and not unfrequently a fault of omission. These were to have been expected; the utmost circumspection could not have guarded entirely against them, in a work of such size, and containing so many dates, names, etc. Correspondents also constantly furnished me new suggestions, ingenious elucidations, “missing links,” and “unknown quantities,” which threw new light and value upon my printed page. New sources of authority also came to light, by the discovery of ancient records in unthought-of hiding places. What wonder is it, then, that the *notes* which gradually enriched the margins of my library copy of the Windsor History, soon grew so voluminous as to suggest the idea of a Supplement? For what Genealogist or Historian, who, when he has found a new fact, or a “nugget,” is not willing, like the woman in the parable, to call his friends and co-laborers together, saying, “Rejoice with me; for I have found the piece which I had lost?” Therefore, I have compiled this Supplement; if it convicts me of shortcomings in my former work, it will, at least, assure my friends of my desire to make good any deficiencies, and to add to their pleasure and profit.

I have not blown my trumpet long and loud about this Supplement (for honestly, I was afraid of awaking the *echoes*), but have compiled it simply of the new material which has come to hand since the publication of the History.

I am under especial obligations to H. SIDNEY HAYDEN, Town Clerk of Windsor; to the Town Clerk of Windsor Locks; MRS. HIRAM B. CASE, wife of the Town Clerk of Bloomfield; Rev. GEO. B. NEWCOMB of Bloomfield; D. WILLIAMS PATTERSON of West Winsted; CHAS. J. HOADLY and Hon. J. HAMMOND TRUMBULL of Hartford; and to SAMUEL H. PARSONS and EDWIN STEARNS of Middletown, for favors received in the compilation of this volume.

And now, as I lay down my pen from correcting the last proof of this Supplement, I feel that my "labor of love" for Ancient Windsor is *finished*. If the citizens of that venerable town have need, in the future, of the services of a historian, they need not apply to their true friend,

#### ABBREVIATIONS USED IN THIS VOLUME.

In addition to those used in the *History of Ancient Windsor*, and which are probably familiar to its readers, we have employed the following :

- E. W. C. R.*—The Record of Baptisms in the 2d Church of Windsor, afterwards the 1st Church of East Windsor, and now the 1st Church of South Windsor, from 1761-1845; sometimes called the *Cook Record*, from the family by whom it was commenced and kept for many years.
- R. Mss.*—An ancient private record of Births, Marriages and Deaths in Wintonbury parish (now Bloomfield township); furnished to us by Eliza Mills Rundall of Seneca Falls, N. Y.
- N. S. R.*—The Pastoral Records of the North Society of Windsor, under the ministry of the Rev. Theodore Hinsdale, 1761-1794.
- W. C. R.*—The Records of the First Church of Windsor, commenced by the Rev. D. S. Rowland. Marriages, 1777-1846; Baptisms, 1790-1855; Deaths, 1790-1857.
- Wby. C. R.*—The Records of the First Church of Wintonbury parish (near Bloomfield, Ct.), Births, Marriages and Deaths, 1738-1850.
- Mss. Col. Rec.*—Three volumes of ancient Colonial Records, recently discovered by C. J. Hoadly, State Librarian of Connecticut, and deposited in the State Library at Hartford. These volumes contain transcripts of the Land Records, and of the Births, Marriages and Deaths of Windsor, Fairfield, Wethersfield, and some other towns, recorded by order of court, and thus forming duly authenticated and reliable records.

*Bap.*, Baptized.

*Prob.*, Probably.

*Poss.*, Possibly.

*Ment.*, Mentioned.

N. B.—Genealogists will hardly need my recommendation to examine *Trumbull's Col. Rec. of Connecticut*; *Hoadly's Records of the New Haven Colony*, and *Savage's Genealogical Dictionary*, in connection with any investigations which they may make into Windsor families. In the latter grand and valuable work, some corrections will be found for my *Windsor History*—discrepancies between the works must be settled by patient investigation—yet no one can feel sure that he has exhausted his subject unless he has compared my volume with the three works mentioned above, and which are inexhaustible treasuries of genealogical information.

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Page 5, line 23, for *Medforth* read *Medford*.

P. 20, l. 13, for *Elisworth* read *Ellsworth*.

P. 22, l. 41, add the same Edward Preston probably, who settled afterwards at New Haven.

P. 22, l. 42, Edward Pattison, seems not to have been a land holder at Windsor, but to have early removed to New Haven, where (according to *New Haven Col. Rec.*, II, 18) he signed the fundamental agreement, June 4, 1639. *New Eng. His. and Gen. Reg.*, IX, 362, shows that sister Pattison, wife of Edward, had two children baptized, John, January, 1644, and Elizabeth, July 12, 1644, at New Haven. John probably died young, as Dodd's *East Haven Register*, p. 149, shows, that in 1662, Thomas Smith m. Elizabeth only child of Ed. Pattison, and gives their descendants. He also shows that Pattison d. Oct. 31, 1669. D. W. PATTERSON of West Winsted, Conn., in communicating the above facts concerning his ancestor, says: "I suppose your authority for saying that he was in the neighborhood of Hartford as late as 1670, is (*Conn. Col. Rec.*, II, p. 130) the grant of land to him by the General Court at its May session, 1670, and this puzzled me when taken in connection with Dodd's record of his death in 1669. But his petition was very likely prepared for the October session in 1669, and not acted upon until May, 1670; for in *Conn. Col. Rec.*, III, 116, is a notice from Thos. Smith (his son-in-law) that he had procured the grant of land to Edward Patterson to be laid out to himself, and the court approved it, 'he being the heire of sayd Patterson;' this last you see reconciles the whole."

P. 37, l. 9, for *Noretton* read *Norton*.

P. 39, l. 25, for *Edward* read *Thomas*; for *David* read *Edward*.

P. 62, l. 22, for *Daniel* read *David*.

P. 68, l. 13, add as an illustration, "Thomas Stoughton for his unnecessary withdrawing of himself from the publique preaching of the Word on the Lord's day, is fined 5s. *Pt. Ct. Rec.*, vol. II, April 18, 1654.

P. 75, l. 30, for *infringed* read *impinged*.

P. 113, line 2, add the following extract from the recently discovered 2d vol. of Ct. Records in *Conn. Archives*: At a Particular Court, held at Hartford, May 13, 1662. "This court orders that William Heyden of WyndSOR, shall for future cease to improve the lands at Nameleck that belongs to Spaniunk wch is by the Bounds of John Bissel's Lottments. And y<sup>e</sup> neither the said William nor any other shall any way hinder, or directly or indirectly prevent John Bissel's compounding with y<sup>e</sup> Indian for that land."

Pp. 124 and 125. Addenda to description of *The Town House*. MR. JABEZ H. HAYDEN of Windsor Locks, to whose surveys we are mainly indebted, as before stated, for this plan and distribution of Ancient Windsor, has, since the publication of the foregoing, sent us the following note, relative to the Palizado: "I am not quite satisfied with Matthew Grant's figures yet; the Palizado *does not prove* exactly, though pretty near it. I am more and more confirmed in the opinion that the present 'parsonage' stands on the 'Town House lot,' which gives the north bounds of the Palizado, and there is no question about the other three sides."

P. 137, l. 9 and 10. Addenda to remarks on *Broad Street*, by J. H. Hayden: "I do not now remember the earliest date at which the present Broad Street is noticed, but it was, at first, but six rods wide where the present traveled road is. I find that when Mr. Warham and his wife Abigail (April 1, 1664), made over the dwelling house and land of John Branker, deceased, it bounded 'east by the highway on the bank against the Little Meadow, and westerly, against or by the highway *as it is appointed* to range;' proving that at that date the highway on the east had not been changed to its present place, and one would infer that what is now Broad street was then only appointed or set out, and not in use. Broad street was at first but six rods

wide, and was probably widened by the owners on the east side, when the highway on the upland against Little Meadow (on which they built) was removed to its present location, that they might bring the street nearer their houses. When they rebuilt, they of course, placed their houses behind their barns, and facing the new Broad street."

P. 159, l. 41. This "setting in the yard," was in other words, guard or sentinel duty in the meeting house yard during divine service, a precaution quite necessary in those days of savage invasion and surprises. The following item from the records (*Windsor Rec.*, II, p. 13) explains the matter somewhat more clearly: "The townes[men] meet, and Ephraim Strong and Nathaniel Pinne demanded paye for setting in the yard, and they are allowed to be payed 2s. apiece out of y<sup>e</sup> towne-rate, and so likewise others that stand in like account with them as have set in y<sup>e</sup> yard without their  $\frac{1}{2}$  lb. of puder [powder] a man payed to them, but was promised 12 pence a man to each man, in lieu of puder."

P. 160, after l. 30, insert the following interesting incident, extracted from the *Remarkable Providences* of Rev. Increase Mather, a book which, from its extreme scarcity, has been almost unknown to our authors hitherto, and has only recently been made available by its re-publication in London, under the editorship of George Offer, Esq.

Mather says (p. 24 of the above London edition): "In the next place we shall take notice of some remarkable preservations which sundry in Windsor in New England have experienced; the persons concerned therein being desirous that the Lord's goodness towards them may be ever had in remembrance, wherefore a faithful hand has given me the following account: Jan. 13, 1670.—Three women, viz: the wives of Lieut. Filer, and of John Drake, and of Nathaniel Lomas, having crossed Connecticut river upon a necessary and neighborly account,\* and having done the work they went for, were desirous to return to their own families, the river being at that time partly shut up with ice, old and new, and partly open. There being some pains taken aforehand to cut a way through the ice, the three women abovesaid got into a canoe, with whom also there was Nathaniel Bissell and an Indian. There was likewise another canoe with two men in it, that went before them to help them, in case they should meet with any distress, which indeed quickly came upon them, for just as they were getting out of the narrow passage between the ice, being near the middle of the river, a greater part of the upper ice came down upon them, and struck the end of their canoe, and broke it to pieces, so that it quickly sunk under them. The Indian speedily got upon the ice, but Nathaniel Bissell and the abovesaid women were left floating in the middle of the river, being cut off from all manner of human help besides what did arise from themselves, and the two men in the little canoe, which was so small that three persons durst seldom, if ever, venture in it. They were, indeed, discerned from one shore,

but the dangerous ice would not admit from either shore one to come near them. All things thus circumstanced, the suddenness of the stroke and distress (which is apt to amaze men, especially when no less than life is concerned), the extreme coldness of the weather, it being a sharp season, that persons out of the water were in danger of freezing, the unaptness of persons to help themselves, being mostly women, one big with child, and near the time of her travail (who also was carried away under the ice), the other as unskilled and inactive to do anything for self-preservation as almost any could be, the waters deep, that there was no hope of footing, no passage to either shore in any eye of reason, neither with their little canoe, by reason of the ice, nor without it, the ice being thin and rotten, and full of holes. Now that all should be brought off safely without the loss of life, or wrong to health, was counted in the day of it a *remarkable Providence*. To say how it was done, is difficult, yet, something of the manner of the deliverance may be mentioned. The abovesaid Nathaniel Bissell, perceiving their danger, and being active in swimming, endeavored what might be the preservation of himself and some others; he strove to have swum to the upper ice, but the stream being too hard, he was forced downwards to the lower ice, where, by reason of the slipperiness of the ice, and disadvantage of the stream, he found it difficult getting up; at length by the good hand of Providence, being gotten upon the ice, he saw one of the women swimming down under the ice, and perceiving a hole or open place some few rods below, there he watched, and took her up as she swam along. The other two women were in the river till the two men in the little canoe came for their relief. At length all of them got their heads above the water and had a little time to pause, though a long and difficult, and dangerous way to any shore, but by getting their little canoe upon the ice, and carrying one at a time over hazardous places, they did (though in a long while) get all safe to the shore from whence they came."

P. 162. At the end of the chapter, add the following from p. 223 of the above quoted work:

"July 20, 1683, a considerable flood unexpectedly arose, which proved detrimental to many in that colony [i. e., Connecticut]. But on August 13, a second and more dreadful flood came. The waters were then observed to rise twenty-six feet above their usual boundaries; the grass in the meadow, also the English grain was carried away before it; the Indian corn, by the long continuance of the waters is spoiled, so that the four river towns, viz: Windsor, Hartford, Wethersfield, Middletown are extream sufferers. They write from thence that some who had hundreds of bushels of corn in the morning, at night had not one peck left for their families to live upon."

P. 190. In regard to the Rev. Mr. Woodbridge, we have the following from Mr. John Ward Dean of Boston, in a letter to the author:

"My ancestor, Rev. Benj. Woodbridge, appears to have had opponents (and

adherents, too), wherever he was. After he left Windsor, he preached in Bristol, now in the state of Rhode Island, and after that in Medford, Mass. One curious circumstance concerning him was related to me recently by the Rev. Mr. Page of Cambridge. There was trouble between him and a portion of his flock at Medford, and the matter was carried before the General Court or Legislature, who ordered that the town should pay Mr. W. the amount due him, amounting to a considerable sum, and that the church should then proceed to choose a pious and learned minister for their pastor. The money was paid, and the church called together to choose a pastor, and the choice fell upon the Rev. Benjamin Woodbridge, the old pastor. There was some wincing, but the opponents could not deny that he was a pious and learned minister, and the General Court had not ordered the church to choose another man."

P. 202, l. 4, for *Crane* read *Crow*.

P. 208, l. 25, for *Tyler*, read *Fyler*; same on 28th line.

P. 211, after line 34, insert the following item: "December 8, 1709, liberty was granted by the town to Jonathan Ellsworth, Thomas Marshall and Thomas Moore, to erect a mill on the mill brook on the south side of the rivulet, provided it be built within two years."

P. 221, l. 35, for 1757, read 1657.

P. 225, note, for *Ebenezer*, read *Elijah*; same on page 323.

P. 252, l. 23, for *west*, read *east*.

P. 253, after l. 34 add "Zebulon Seymour, carp'r began work on meeting house, July 6, 1761, ceased Nov. 7." The "seating" of the new edifice was completed on 15 of October, and in the old record of baptisms, is the following entry: "November 22, 1761, that was the first sabbath [we] met in, our new meeting house, there was four children baptized that day "

P. 255, after l. 8, insert the following: Mr. A. S. Kellogg of Vernon, Conn., has kindly called our attention to the fact that, in the year 1760, a part of the Second Society in Windsor, was set off to help form the Society of North Bolton. He says: "Something respecting this may be found in the *Records of the Colony*, vols. viii and ix, but most of the papers are in the State Library," *Ecclesiastical*, vol. xii. "They are under the title North Bolton, which accounts for their not having attracted your attention. My notes are very brief and incomplete, but, if I made correct abstracts, the Assembly, in May, 1750, appointed a committee upon the memorials of Benj. Stoughton and others, of Windsor, for an Ecclesiastical Society, with certain limits; and of Isaac Jones and others, of Bolton, for an Ecclesiastical Society, with certain other limits. In each case it was reported that they were "too few." February 12, 1754, Isaac Jones, Moses Thrall and John Hills of Bolton, David Smith, John Searl and Joseph Steadman of the South [or Second] Society of Windsor, and John Craw and Samuel Hills of the Parish of Ellington, petitioned for an Ecclesiastical Society. April 23, 1760, a final petition was granted, and in Oct. 1760, North Bolton was made a society, its north and

west boundaries being thus defined in the resolution: (Starting from the northeast corner of Bolton) thence turning westward in the line between Bolton and Ellington, to Bolton northwest corner, and still continuing the same course into Ellington about a mile and a half and forty-two rods; thence turning and running southwardly at the west end of the second tier of lots to Hartford line; thence turning eastward in said line to Bolton or the T ditch; thence turning southwardly one mile in the line betwixt the town of Hartford and Bolton; thence eastward to the first mentioned bounds."

These "Hartford lines" are the present boundaries of Manchester, and the T ditch is at the N. E. corner of Manchester.

The part taken from Windsor seems to have been a rhomboid, its longer sides being the present west line of Vernon, and a parallel line running from the *re-entrant* angle in the S. W. corner of the town. The line of Windsor, and afterwards of East Windsor, used to pass within 60 or 80 rods of the site of the present meeting house at Vernon Center.

P. 255, at bottom, add the following document—which explains itself—relative to the respective salaries of Messrs. Edwards and Perry.

Rec.*, 102.

P. 262, l. 30, for *Wadworth*, read *Wadsworth*.

P. 349, l. 2, for *Fuxley*, read *Huxley*.

P. 351, l. 2, Parsons d. Oct. 1762, Cook d. Dec. 1762. All these deaths occurred in the year 1762.

P. 353, after l. 32, add, "East Windsor was declared a distinct town by the Governor and Assembly, at their session at Hartford on the second Thursday in May following."

P. 354, 355, *addenda*. Extracts from Parson Hinsdale's (North Windsor) *Church Records*. "Aug. 13, 1768, Mary and Elizabeth, daughters of David Thrall, and Jerusha, daughter of Charles Thrall, were all, at once, unhappily drowned in Pequonnock river, as they went in for their diversion," and, "no longer after than August 17, Mr. Henry Chapman, in the dusk of the evening, climbing a scaffold in a barn, fell and received a wound in his head of which, in a few hours he died. How hard God calls to a hardened people!"

P. 399, after l. 7, add Lieut. SAMUEL WING, d. at Danbury, in the service, July 1777. Hinsdale's (No. Windsor) *Church Records*. See pages 429 and 825. Also "Jan. 1777, LUTHER CENTER, returning from captivity in New York d. at Wintonbury." (*Wby. Ch. R.*)

P. 400, after l. 5, add the names of SAMUEL COY (see also page 409,) and JOEL DENSLOW (see also page 420,) both of whom died in camp, June, 1778.

P. 417, after l. 26, add name of THOMAS BARBER in same Co. with Lemuel Drake, which see for further particulars.

P. 420, after l. 30, add name of LEMUEL DRAKE, his services as recorded in his affidavit before pension agent (Samuel H. Parsons, of Middletown, Conn.), were as follows: About the 15th of August, 1776, he enlisted, at Windsor, under Maj. Roger Newberry, in a company of which Benj. Allen was first lieutenant, and Austin Phelps second lieutenant; remained in service until latter part of October, '76, when he was dismissed, being at that time at, or near, Valentine's Hill, N. Y. After his enlistment he was marched to Wethersfield, and from thence sailed to New York city, where his company was stationed in Little Dock street, near the East river, and at the time of the battle on Long Island his regiment were paraded near the wharf, but were not called into the action.

He had a second tour of duty, from August to the latter part of October, 1777. This time he was *drafted* at Windsor, in a company commanded by Jonathan Wadsworth of Hartford, captain, Phelps of Windsor, lieutenant, and Owen, ensign. This company belonged to a regiment commanded by Col. Cook of Wallingford, Lieut. Col. Woodbridge, Maj. Kent. They marched from Hartford, to Stillwater, N. Y., where he was in the battles under Gen. Gates, was present at Burgoyne's surrender at Saratoga, N. Y., marched to Albany, was there detailed as one of a guard (under Capt. Blake, Austin Phelps, lieutenant, and Reuben Wadsworth, orderly), to escort 100 prisoners to Hartford. Again, in September, 1778, he was drafted, at Windsor, to go to New London, where he served between two and three months in the militia, commanded by Capt. Allen of New London, and — Bissell of East Windsor, sergeant, mostly on guard service.

P. 424, l. 25, the following particulars concerning GEORGE LATIMER's services, are gathered from the same source as the above: He enlisted as wagoner in Capt. Daniel Jones' company, July 15, 1777, for three years, his term expiring July 15, 1780. He then enlisted again, at Hartford, went to Pomfret, where he was one of a company of ten men in charge of ammunition wagons, returned to Hartford, went to New York state, at Red Hook and Fishkill.

He was drafted for three months in summer of '76, was at New York at the

retreat from Long Island. In or about March, 1777, was drafted for three months, and went to Whiteplains, where he was at the time Danbury was burned.

P. 425, l. 21. Additional particulars from same sources as the preceding : INCREASE MATHER enlisted at Windsor in early part of April, 1775, in the company of Captain or Major Roger Enos, Lieuts. Willys and Blodget, and Converse, sergeant, for 8 months. He then enlisted while at Roxbury, for 12 or 14 months; was there when the battle of Bunker's Hill was fought. About the middle of November he enlisted, with consent of his captain, in another company, commanded by E. F. Bissell, Capt.; Lieut. Humphreys and Ensign Richard Goodman, in Col. Jedediah Huntington's regiment, from which he was discharged January, 1777.

During this service he was on Long Island, in August, 1776, was in several skirmishes there, and was in the army in its retreat from Long Island through Westchester. From July, '76, to January, '77, he acted as sergeant.

P. 426, l. 13, insert the name of ROSWELL NOBLES born Oct. 24, 1758. He enlisted for one year, as a drummer, at Simsbury, May, 1776, in a company commanded by Capt. Noah Phelps, Lieut. Carver and Ensign Benj. Holcomb, belonging to a regiment commanded by Col. Andrew Ward, Lieut.-Col. Johnson and Major Isaac Cook; was dismissed from the service near Morris-town, N. J., May, 1777.

P. 426, l. 34, insert name of AUSTIN PHELPS, see deposition above of Lemuel Drake.

P. 427, by an error of arrangement, three colored soldiers are entered under the head of the Prior family.

P. 433, after l. 22, add, in Rev. Mr. Rowland's *Records of Baptisms* in Windsor Church, the following entry occurs: "1795, Baptisms in *new* meeting house, and *united* parishes." Then follows under this, a record of the baptism, January 4, of a daughter of Samuel Allen.

P. 438. The First Congregational Church and Society of Windsor has a Church Fund, concerning which we have not been able to learn much. It probably had its beginning in the bequest of Jane (Fooks), the widow of William Hosford of Windsor, who returned to her home in Old England after her husband's death. On the 15th of January, 1671, being the 23d year of Charles the 2d, Mrs. Hosford, described as "of Tiverton, in the county of Devon, widow," made her will, of which her son Stephen Gaylord, John Witchfield and Walter Eyles of Windsor, were appointed the executors. She devised certain moneys to Esther (or Stephen), Samuel and Sarah Gaylord, and to their children; the rent of a meadow to her sons-in law, John Hosford, and the three above named, during the life of the testator. After her demise, the meadow, comprising about 20 acres of meadow and swamp, was to go and belong to the "Old Church of Windsor" forever. (*Lands, vol. 1, p. 90, Conn. Arch.*) On 13th of Oct., 1692, complaint was made to the General Court, by petition from the Windsor Church, that they

were kept out of the right and use of the aforesaid land, it being yet in the hands of her heirs, who say she is not dead. And the Court, considering that she was aged when she returned to England, and has been there 40\* years or so, and not heard from lately, declared her to be *dead in law*, unless it could be *proved* that she was alive or had been heard of within 7 years past. (*Docs. in Conn. Arch.*) The land was fully confirmed to the Church, Sept. 3, 1695.

The Rev. Joseph Marsh, also, the third minister of this church, devised his property, after his wife's death, to the Windsor Church, for gospel and school purposes.

P. 439, l. 24, after *separatists* insert *alone*.

P. 451, after l. 32, insert the following item from Timothy Loomis' common-place book: "1714, April 5. The school house was raised on t'other Hill." Taking Loomis' residence as our standpoint, we infer that he had reference to Stoney Hill, by the expression "t'other hill."

P. 480, under head of Stores, Trade, Commerce, etc., insert the following item from Timothy Loomis' common place book, as illustrative: "1739, I sent 221 weight of tobacco to Barbadoes in the sloop, The Windsor, whereof 20 pounds was my son Timothy's."

P. 493, l. 10, for (*Windsor Locks*) read (*Suffield*).

*Sheep*.—In olden time there were more sheep raised than at the present day. These sheep were all turned into one large flock, and herded by a shepherd, either in some large field or in the streets.

In June, 1733, the people of Windsor voted, "that the sheep in this town shall be put in *three* flocks, that is to say on the north side of the Rivulet, to be one flock, and on the east side of the Great River to be one flock, and on the south side of the rivulet to be one flock." It was also decided that each flock could be divided if it was deemed best.

In 1735, the east side Windsor people voted that there should be put one flock on that side of the Great River, and Messrs. Lient. Joseph Loomis, Mr. Joseph Rockwell and Mr. Abiel Abbott should be a committee "for ordering the prudentials of the flock this present year or summer." By the term "ordering the prudentials" was meant as is elsewhere seen, the hiring of a shepherd and folding the sheep.

After the Revolution, one "Old Hendricks" as he was called, a Hessian, was the shepherd. The old fellow had married a Windsor negro wench as black as a stove-pipe, and afterwards became quite disgusted with his bargain, affirming that he would cheerfully "give all of forty shillings," if he could get quit of her. He once in a crazy mood, tried to hang himself with a nice cord which he used for ditching, but was cut down in time to save his life. He became very indignant, not because his life was saved, *but because they had cut his nice ditching cord!*

## CHURCH COVENANT OF WINDSOR, CONN., A. D. 1647.\*

[Dated Windsor, Oct. 23, 1647.]

1. We believe though God made man in an holy and blessed condition, yet by his fall he hath plunged himself and all his posterity into a miserable state. Rom. iii, 23 ; v. 12.

2. Yet God hath provided a sufficient remedy in Christ for all broken hearted sinners that are loosened from their sins, and selves and world, and are enabled by faith to look to Him in Christ for mercy, inasmuch as Christ hath done and suffered for such whatever His justice requires to atonement and life; and he doth accept His merits and righteousness for them that believe in Him, and imputeth it to them for their justification, as if they had satisfied and obeyed themselves. Heb. vii, 25; Mat. xi, 28; xxii, 24; v. 4, 6; 1 Cor. i, 30; Rom. iv, 3. 5; v. 19.

3. Yet we believe that there is no other name or means to be saved from guilt and the power of sin. John, xiv, 6; Acts, iv, 12.

4. We believe God hath made an everlasting covenant in Christ with all penitent sinners that rest on him in Christ, never to reject, or cease to do them good. Heb. viii, 6; vii, 22; 1 Sam. xii, 22; Jer. xxxii, 40.

5. We believe this covenant to be reciprocal, obliging us to be his people, to love, fear, obey, cleave to him, and serve him with all our heart, mind and soul; as him to be our God, to love, choose, delight in us and save and bless us in Christ; yea, as his covenant binds us to love him and his Christ for his own sake, so to love our brethren for his sake. Deut. x, 12; Hos. iii, 3; ii, 21; Deut. xxvi, 17-19; John, iv, 21.

6. We believe that God's people, besides their general covenant with God, to walk in subjection to him, and christian love to all his people, ought also

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\* For this interesting document we are indebted to the kindness of Hon. J. H. Trumbull of Hartford. Mr. T., says, "I found it a few weeks since in the MS. Note Book of one of the Deacons of that church (Matthew Grant), along with full notes of a sermon by Mr. Warham, Aug. 15, 1647 (two months before this covenant was adopted), 'on the matter and form of a church and of baptizing children.' I was pleased with the discovery, as the covenant is of much earlier date than any I have seen or known of in Connecticut. Mr. Warham was at the Cambridge Synod, in June, 1647; out of which, apparently, grew the sermon; and the sermon prepared the way for the adoption of the Covenant. I may observe, however, that the sermon is, in great measure, a digest of Hooker's *Survey*, which Mr. W. must have not only perused, but thoroughly studied in MS. for it was not printed till the next year."

The Windsor Church was formed at Plymouth, England, in March, 1630 [there is a mistake in Sprague's notice of Warham; *Annals*, i, 10; Hawe's Note in *Ecl. Cont. Conn.*, p. 86; and McClure's *Hist. Windsor, Mass. Hist. Coll.*, 1st series, v, 166; all of whom name *January*, 1630, as the date, owing to a neglect of the fact that the year O. S., began with *March*, so that the "beginning of the year" would be March 1, and not January 1], by people from the counties of Devon, Dorset and Somerset: and Warham and Maverick were ordained its pastor and teacher. They arrived at Dorchester, Mass., about the 1st of June, where they first settled. But hearing from the Dutch of a valuable tract of land on the Connecticut, they concluded to remove, and went in a body in the summer of 1635: carrying their church organization and Mr. Warham with them—Maverick dying in Dorchester. This creed and covenant (for it partakes of both elements) seems to have been adopted eleven years after the settlement of Windsor. Warham died in 1670, and Cotton Mather says, he was the first minister in Connecticut who preached "with notes."

to join themselves into a church covenant one with another, and to enter into a particular combination, together with some of his people, to erect a particular ecclesiastical body, and kingdom, and visible family and household of God, for the managing of discipline and public ordinances of Christ in one place in a dutiful way, there to worship God and Christ, as his visible kingdom and subjects, in that place waiting on him for that blessing of his ordinances and promises of his covenant, by holding communion with him and his people, in the doctrine and discipline of that visible kingdom, where it may be attained. Rom. xii, 4, 5, 6; 1 Cor. xii, 27, 28; Ephes. iv, 11, 12; Acts, ii, 47; Exod. xii, 43, 44, 45; Gen. xvii, 13; Isa. xxiii, 4.

7. We for ourselves, in the sense of our misery by the fall and utter helplessness elsewhere, desire to renounce all other saviours but his Christ, and to rest on God in him alone, for all happiness, and salvation from all misery; and do here bind ourselves, in the presence of men and angels, by his grace assisting us, to choose the Lord, to serve him, and to walk in all his ways, and to keep all his commandments and ordinances, and his Christ to be our king, priest and prophet, and to receive his gospel alone for the rule of our faith and manners, and to [be] subject to the whole will of Christ so far as we shall understand it: and bind ourselves in special to all the members of this body, to walk in reverend subjection to the Lord to all our superiors, and in love, humility, wisdom, peaceableness, meekness, inoffensiveness, mercy, charity, spiritual helpfulness, watchfulness, chastity, justice, truth, self-denial, one to another, and to further the spiritual good one of another, by example, counsel, admonition, comfort, oversight, according to God, and submit or [selves] subject unto all church administration in the Lord.

DEACON THOMAS,\* brother of Samuel and Col. Matthew, came first to Cambridge, Mass., from England in 1632; was freeman, 1635. He removed to Hartford with his brother Matthew, 1635; in 1650 had much difficulty with his brother Matthew about some contracts and bonds, when several law suits ensued, and the court ordered Matthew to pay over to Thomas his dues and release his "specialties." Thomas Allyn was twice m.: 1st wife was Isabella —, who d. about 1678; when Mr. Allyn m. 2, Martha Gipson or Gibson, widow of Roger Gipson of Saybrook, Conn., about 1780-1. Mr. Gibson d. Dec. 6, 1680, leaving 3 sons and 1 daughter: 1, Samuel, a. 8; 2, Jonathan, a. 6; Martha, a. 5; Roger, Jr., a. 1½, who all settled in Middletown. Thomas Allyn removed from Hartford to Middletown in 1650, "with the first planters of Mattabesek" where he became a prominent man of the town, was chosen Deacon of the 1st church, March 16, 1670, was a representative to General Court, Selectman, &c. Having no children, he adopted his nephew Obediah Allyn, 4th son of his then deceased brother, Samuel Allyn of Windsor, who lived with him during minority and received a large share of his estate. Deacon Thomas Allyn, d. Oct. 16, 1688; his will dated Oct. 15, 1688, and proved Feb. 5, 1689. His widow Martha (Gipson) Allyn, d. Nov., 1702, her will was dated April 30, 1690.

COL. MATTHEW,\* brother of Samuel and Thomas, was one of the original Braintree company that emigrated to Cambridge, Mass., and afterwards joined Rev. Mr. Hooker's company that settled the town of Hartford, and subsequently removed to *Windsor*. Matthew Allyn was in Cambridge, Mass., 1632, and had 45 acres divided to him at the "Common Pales (much the largest share of any settler). 1633, had 1 acre for a cow yard, and 3 acres planting ground granted "on Neck." 1635, he had *grants or purchased* 5 acres at "Wigwam Neck;" 6 acres at "meadow near Watertown," and 5 acres at "Charlestown Lane." He owned 5 houses on the Town Plot of Cambridge, 1635, lived near the meeting house and was by far the largest landholder in Cambridge.—*Cambridge Records*.

OBEDIAH,\* 4th son of Samuel and Ann Allyn of Windsor, nephew of Col. Matthew, was adopted by his uncle Thomas Allyn of Middletown, soon after the decease of his father (Samuel), where he resided, and after his uncle's death inherited most of his estate. He was admitted to the 1st Church, Middletown, by certificate from the church in Windsor, May 2d, 1669, but owned the covenant, Nov. 9, 1668, and was chosen Deacon May 31, 1704, when the church was first organized. He m. 1, Elizabeth Sanford of Milford, Conn., Oct. 23, 1669, by whom he had 8 children, viz.: 1, Obediah, b. Nov. 20, 1670; 2, Thomas, b. Sept. 20, 1672; d. Nov. 8, 1672; 3, Thomas 2d, b. Sept.

He resided in Middlefield Society and was Deacon of the church in that parish, May 26, 1743 ; he was a descendant of Samuel Allen, who d. in Windsor, 1648 ; Dea. Jonathan Allen's 1st wife Elizabeth, d. Oct. 19, 1762 ; when Mr. Allen m. wid. Rebecca Wetmore, July 6, 1763 ; he d. Dec. 23, 1783, a. 80 ; his widow Rebecca d. Feb. 6, 1791, a. 88 yrs. John Bissell, on a morning, about break of day, taking nails out of a great barrel, wherein was a considerable quantity of gunpowder and bullets, having a candle in his hand, the powder took fire. Thomas Bissell was then putting on his clothes, standing by a window, which, though well fastened, was by the force of the powder carried away at least four rods; the partition wall from another room was broken to pieces; the roof of the house opened and slipt off the plates about five feet down; also the great girt of the house at one end

broke out so far, that it drew from the summer to the end most of its tenant. The woman of the house being sick, and another woman under it in bed, yet did the divine Providence so order things as that no one received any hurt, excepting John Bissell, who fell through two floors into a cellar, his shoes being taken from his feet, and found at twenty feet distance, his hands and his face being very much scorched, without any other wound in his body."

P. 541, Mr. A. S. Kellogg of Vernon, Conn., sends the following note: "I am satisfied that you have *not* 'given the right fathers' to the families of the *John Bissells*. Of the three Johns named in your foot note, I think it was the *first* (John,<sup>6</sup> b. 1661) who had the family you assign to John.<sup>14</sup> At any rate, the Coventry settler, whom you call 'John 3rd,<sup>6</sup>' was the son of your John,<sup>14</sup> p. 543, l. 1 (*White Memorials*, p. 30). For your *third* John, son of Thomas,<sup>3</sup> see Trumbull's *Col. Rec. of Conn.*, III, p. 450. Of your *second* John, son of Samuel,<sup>4</sup> I can say nothing. It is *possible* that he is the one who had the family of John.<sup>14</sup> Your Lt. John,<sup>18</sup> was an influential citizen of Bolton, where he d. March 8, 1771, a. 87, 'one of the first settlers.' He cannot, therefore, be son of Capt. John of Coventry, for he was *older*. It is very probable that he *was* the son of Abigail Filley, and the grandson of Samuel.<sup>47</sup> The Bissell genealogist would do well to consult the *Hartford Probate Records*.

"We first knew the deceased in the fall of 1817, in Geneseo, Livingston county and state of New York, to which place he came from the city of New York a young man 20 years of age, to commence business as a merchant. By those who knew him he was thought to be a young man of more than ordinary promise, full of vitality, of good habits, great industry, and having entire confidence of a successful life.

"He continued in Geneseo until the spring of 1828, when he removed to

Lockport and engaged in the business of milling, having erected one of the most extensive mills at that time in Western New York. As a merchant and miller he was very successful, and as a man of integrity we never heard the least charge against him. Indeed, we know and are sure he stood deservedly high, and by his great industry and energy, guided by intelligence, succeeded in accumulating quite a large property, sufficient even at this time to satisfy most men's ambition, but not so with him, having set his mark very high.

"In the spring of 1833, when the tide of emigration began to set west, he with another gentleman made a western tour, and among many places visited came to this point, then known as Port Lawrence and Vistula, containing at that time less than 100 inhabitants; and so impressed was he with the commercial importance and value of this point, that he made a large purchase of real estate in what is now known as Upper and Lower Toledo, and soon began to make liberal expenditures in various improvements. From the first he seemed to consider this place as his home, where he expected and intended to stake his all and to spend his days.

In 1836, associated with a few others, he began to make the Erie and Kalamazoo Rail Road to Adrian, 33 miles, at a cost of \$300,000. The road was so far completed in July, 1837, as to commence the running of cars with horses, and at a time when not a barrel of flour or pork came over the road for the first year, but the same was in daily use to carry provisions to Adrian to feed the population of Southern Michigan. It was this road that in after years proved to be the lever that finally settled public opinion in favor of Toledo as the only commercial point of any great value at the south end of Lake Erie, and we now see and know that the final results of making this road at a time when all knew that as an investment 'it would not pay, has been to concentrate at this point six important railroads, costing not less than \$50,000,000, and perhaps it may be said with truth, also, the 700 miles of canal, the business of which, connected with Lake Erie, is done at this point.

We think that these are no common monuments to the credit of EDWARD BISELL, being the logical results of the opening of the road to Adrian, for which the people of Toledo are more indebted to him than to any ten other men. He lived long enough to see that his early opinions were confirmed, but not long enough to enjoy all the benefits that he anticipated. The commercial storm that swept over the whole country in the spring of 1837, carried him with others upon the breakers, and of course left him at the mercy of the wreckers; since which he has been most laborious to remedy the losses of that destructive year, and it gives us unfeigned pleasure to hear that he did succeed in some measure in leaving his family with such means as in the end, if taken care of, will prove a very rich inheritance."

His son Henry, is now Sergeant-Major of the 111th Ohio volunteer regiment in the civil rebellion. His dau. Julia W., is now the wife of Asa Backus of Norwich, Conn. His son, Edward, Jr., m. Miss Secor of Toledo, Dec. 25, 1862.

He also adds his opinion "that the name should be spelled with a final e.

Burke, in his *Armory*, and in his *Landed Gentry of England*, etc., etc., spells the name *almost uniformly* with a final *e*; in one place he spells the name *Holcombe* or *Holtcombe*, and remarks in a note, "Holtcombe is compounded of *Holt*, a Saxon word signifying woody, and *cum*, or, *as written in Devonshire*, *combe*, a valley between two hills." The W. Holcombes, coming from the west of England, would naturally have retained the final *e*, and there are some families of the name in the Southern States which so spell it.

and in Matthew Grant's old church record is a list of those church members who "were so in Dorchester and came up here with Mr. [Warham] and still are of us." You have the name of "[Dea. M]oore," and "Dea. Moore's wife," in that list. Now can the John Moore of Dorchester, in '37, be the Dea. John of Windsor? May it not have been that he either returned to Dorchester (if it was the same individual), and tarried a while, and, in 1643, or before settled permanently in Windsor? Or, that he went to Windsor a few years after the immigration of the church and pastor, and that Mr. Grant in his summary, years after that, put him down among the early comers, as he might have been, if he had gone thither subsequent to the first immigration. Or, this John Moore of Dorchester, 1637, may have been another individual, if so, I should like to know what became of him. I have not had time to make an investigation as to whether he is mentioned on the records subsequent to '37."

The first, written to her upon her husband's death, and the second written years after, in the sweet confidence of married life, give us a better view of his character, than pages of description could do. They are copied *literatim et verbatim*, from the originals :

To Mrs. Eunice Ely, Springfield :

Madam—I know not how to Content myself not to appear in the Ranks of y<sup>e</sup> many hearty Mourners, whose Sympathy would fain Contribute some Release to y<sup>e</sup> Uncommon weight of affliction that a Holy God has seen meet to bring upon you. I fear my trembling pen will too much Renew y<sup>e</sup> Grief, which I know is very pressing. I am loath to Stir up the wound which so tenderly affects you—But would fain be Instrumental to administer some Consolation in this hour of y<sup>e</sup> tryal.

I know when y<sup>e</sup> tender Branch of y<sup>e</sup> house was Crop't by Death (as a sweet flower in summer) it touched you in a very tender part—But it seems y<sup>e</sup> God saw best to lay still a weightier stroak upon you—& the Desire of y<sup>e</sup> Eyes Must fall a Victim to Relentless Death, tell me, Mad. Did not these lovely Injoyments take up too much room in y<sup>e</sup> heart. Was n't you Ready to think y<sup>e</sup> Mountain stood strong, and y<sup>t</sup> you y<sup>e</sup> self should Dye in y<sup>e</sup> Resi, i. e. have a tranquil life or not meet with those providences that would Imbiter Life to you. But it May be you expected an Easier passage to it—Well, Remember this is y<sup>e</sup> Dissepline, that God saw best to use with you for some holy Ends—Who will be with & support you in y<sup>e</sup> furnice of y<sup>e</sup> tryal, if you still make him y<sup>e</sup> all—I know Nature Unassisted Cant subsist under such heavy stroaks—but Remember y<sup>e</sup> promise, all things shall work for good to y<sup>m</sup> y<sup>t</sup> love God—this Carries y<sup>e</sup> prospect Beyond time & all its flatering prospects & all its thretning aspects—You know a little time will sit you Beyond y<sup>e</sup> Care of this transitory life, & it will Be no Grief to you when view'd in y<sup>e</sup> peacefull harbour of Bliss & glory, to take a survey (from y<sup>e</sup> hill of Sion) of y<sup>e</sup> Stormy Ocean on which you have sailed to y<sup>e</sup> Peacefull Reagon of Immortal Rest! this, Md. I Confidentially hope has terminated y<sup>e</sup> utmost Wishes, even in y<sup>e</sup> Days off y<sup>e</sup> Earthly tranquillity, & if this be y<sup>e</sup> case, why y<sup>e</sup> tresure is still secure. Tho' providence has Deprived you of some Desirable Injoyments in y<sup>e</sup> passage there, I hope you will find y<sup>e</sup> tender Consort and loveing offspring in y<sup>e</sup> Relms of paradise Consorting with angelic Beings in hymns of Praise to him y<sup>t</sup> sits upon the throne & to y<sup>e</sup> lamb forever & ever. Well, Md. if y<sup>e</sup> God sees meet to Disapline you with y<sup>e</sup> Rod & by that means, together with other Dispinsations, to prepare you for a participation of heavenly Injoyments, let me intreat you to kiss y<sup>e</sup> Courteous hand that Designs y<sup>e</sup> Best good, & by these methods is preparing you for Joys Immortal, tho' Earthly Streams fail.—this is y<sup>e</sup> Earnest Desire of y<sup>e</sup> unknown Friend, who hath a tender Sympathy with you under y<sup>e</sup> Burthen, & prays that all y<sup>e</sup> Passages of Providence before you may more and more prepare you for

## II.

New Haven, Oct. 19, 1770.

My Dear—I rec'd yours and the things you sent by Doct'r Wolcott, and Sincerely rejoice to hear you and our little son are well. I hope shortly to Return home, not exceeding the time proposed, and Possibly sooner—I ever thought the man happy that Could be freed from every bodys Buisness but his own; to live with and enjoy his family, and every day experience shews me I have not been mistaken. Certainly a continual hurry of business must be Disagreeable to the Philosopher Mind—and such is my case—but such is the state of human affairs, especially in this part of the world, that but few if any can live without being Employed in some sort of Buisness to gain a Subsistence—the manner of Life I have chosen Calls too much abroad but at this time of Life a Retreat is Dangerous. I am sure home is agreeable. I sincerely wish to be there more than I am, partly on my own & partly on your account. You say you are alone: I am Sensible of it, and that your being alone must Cause you much trouble, but tho' I am absent, you have my best wishes, and I am not without hopes sometimes or another to be more at home and afford you more of my help than I have hitherto done but how that will be, God knows—Perry you say sends his Duty to his Daddy. I thank the Dear Boy that he does not forget me. He is the object of our Care and of our wishes, but poor boy he is born in a Dark Day when Vice Trumps Government Dealing, the Laws against Immorality lie unexecuted. Wickedness has many advocates, & Religion but few, the Pure Doctrines of the Gospel are Perverted, every one (in this Dark State) attempting to assimilate us to God is call'd a Crime, and Vice the Road to Happiness—hence many fall a sacrifice, and everything dear to us in this Life is threatned, but my Dear there is one that Rules above in whom none ever trusted in Vain, let us make him our Confidence and Teach our Child the same—we have then Done our Duty, and will leave him in the hand of Providence—but our Task is arduous and Difficult—let us then begin early and bend his tender mind to Virtue, that the Road thereof may become habitual—This Task, my Dear, is Principally Devolved on you and may God give success—here may you see the greatest  for Honour although empty as a Bubble, it is courted as a Real substance—and everything sacrificed at its Shrine—but the more I am acquainted with its Votaries and Greatest favorites, the Less it appears and almost Shrivels into Nothing—it is, I confess, agreeable to Receive evidences of the friendship of our fellow men, but mere Titles are empty sounds, and does not alway Discover the Real worth of the wearer and what the Poet says is True

Titles are marks of Honour—and wise  
The Fool or Knave that wears a Title lies.

But my Dear there is an end of Scribbling and therefore shall end abruptly,

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\* REV. JOHN BOOK PINNEY, after the death of his grandfather (Lieut. Abraham,<sup>18</sup>) lived among his uncles in Colebrook and Canaan, from the spring of 1814 until that of 1817, when being 10 years old, he was placed by his father, at school in the Academy at Windsor, Ct., where, to use his own words, "for nearly nine years I was allowed, under the unwatchful, not to say unfaithful care of my guardian, to waste my time among a constantly changing set of incompetent teachers." When nearly 19 years of age he went to Lexington, Ga., where much against his inclination, he was placed at a private school, and during the next season entered the junior class of the Georgia University at Athens, from which he graduated in 1825. While in college, young Pinney became a subject of an extensive revival of religion which occurred among the students, and became a member of the Presbyterian Church. Having studied law considerably while in his senior year at college, under the direction of Jos. H. Lumpkin, Esq., then a leading lawyer, and now Chief Justice of the state of Georgia, he was in that year admitted to the bar under William H. Crawford, Esq., formerly Secretary, then judge of the Supreme Court of Georgia. He however soon quit the law, in order to prepare for the ministry, and by teaching school for a year at Walterboro, S. C., he procured the means necessary for the prosecution of a three years' course of theological study, and in the fall of 1829 entered the Theological Institution at Princeton, N. J., where he graduated in 1835. While there, he decided to become a missionary among the great Negro nations of Bornea and Hausa in the interior of Africa. In the fall of that year he was ordained, together with a companion, the Rev. Joseph W. Barr of Ohio, and started on their intended work. Mr. Barr, however, while they were awaiting the departure of the vessel which was to convey them, was suddenly cut off by an attack of Asiatic cholera, and Mr. Pinney proceeded alone. The hardships and fatigues, however, of a journey from the coast of Africa to the interior

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so completely broke down his health, as to compel his temporary return to this country in 1833. In the fall of that year, he again set out, with nine missionary companions, and landed at Monrovia on the 1st of January, 1834. Just as Mr. P. was leaving the United States, he had been persuaded to become (temporarily) the agent of the American Colonization Society, which constituted him ex-officio, acting governor of the Colony of Liberia. At the same time the early death of certain missionaries so discouraged the American Board of Foreign Missions, that they consented to the proposition of the American Colonization Society to have him commissioned as governor of the colony, and to suspend their mission awhile. Coincident with the above named commission, Mr. P. received another from the United States government as agent for recaptured Africans. His views, however, were not in accordance with those of the two boards, and though by circumstances obliged to retain the authority conferred upon him until he could be relieved by a successor, Mr. Pinney at once refused to accept the appointment permanently.

Finally, the heavy cares and anxieties incident to such duties, together with repeated attacks of African fever, so undermined his health, as to necessitate his return to the United States in the fall of 1835.

Since that time, with the exception of a little over a year, during which he was the settled pastor of the Presbyterian Church at Washington, Pa., Mr. Pinney has been chiefly engaged as Corresponding Secretary of the Pennsylvania and New York Colonization Societies; meantime, however visiting Liberia in 1840, and again in 1855, on special duties. Wilmet (Wilmoth, Wilmarth) Rockwell, wid. of the above John, executed a will on the 12th of May, 1662, wherein she gives "to my daughter Mary, one Bed, that which Simon lies on, with two Blankets, two sheets, one pillow" and, "to my daughter Hannah, one little Bed, which my husband died on, with two blankets, two sheets, one pillow," and "all my wearing clothes to my two daughters to be equally divided to them. And all y<sup>e</sup> rest of my estate I give to my son Simon." She d. May 12, 1662.

But shold you smile on my addresses, I hope to feall ye same Plesure In Doing Every Thing in my Powers to contribute to your Happiness, there is nothing I more Desier than to Give you full Evidence of my sincerity in this and Did I Believe this could not be obtained by so Near and Intimate a Relation with you, I should be farr from Desiring it, But I should Rather still Remaine in a State of Moping Melancholy. I now with Impatiens Waight the Return of the hapy Hour when I hope to have ye Pleasur of Waiting upon you againe. My Days of Prosperity fly with Raysed and Inpetuous forse, but ye hours of Affliction Especially when I have some Prospect of Deliverance and Happiness Before me—how slow Do the minits Roale.

Time seems to stand still and make a Pause, my fortin is all att you Dyspoeis, and how Ever you may Dyspose of it I sincerely Wish you a Long, Prosperous and hapy Life. I add no more except to answer you, I am your

P. 835, 5th line from bottom, for *discovered*, read *considered*.

P. 836, the curious inscription to "B. W." should have been credited to the *Windsor Grave Yard*.

P. 854, *Note to Wine and Bread Accounts of the Windsor Church*—It would seem as if the church in Mr. Warham's day (the first communion in the record is dated before his death), in their zeal to imitate that planted by the apostles, may have made a *regular meal* of the communion service, instead of the practice of the present day. The large quantity of bread\* and wine used—and the data of calculation in the record (the number of members, the number of communions, and quantities of bread and wine, all being given) are unusually full—would seem to indicate a "love feast" on a more hearty scale than is in accordance with the present custom. Still it may possibly be susceptible of some other explanation.
