The preparation of the Clewell Family History has been undertaken by me as a "Labor of Love." Whatever diffidence I have felt in executing this trust, it has been undertaken as a posterior duty and esteemed to be a great privilege. My daily duties made the work burdensome at times, so that it would have been my choice to have had more leisure for accomplishing our purpose, but the patience of our patrons and subscribers has been sufficient.

The history has been a work of no small magnitude. Rising from obscurity and the humblest beginnings, our forefathers builded better than they knew. Little did they think as they mingled with men, fulfilling their missions, that their deeds were to be known by later generations and that their posterity should be so numerous. Our generation is indebted to the authors for their enthusiasm they displayed in their undertaking. We regret that one of them could not see his work while to the other we bow in gratitude and adoration.

We trust that our kinsfolk will receive this volume as a book of information and before harshly criticising it, contemplate the circumstances and perplexities in recording the families in their proper order. It may contain errors, due to wrong reports or in transcribing or even in calculating the dates since we have found obituary records differing with the records on tombstones thus making it impossible to avoid inconsistencies. But we believe the mistakes are few and unimportant.

We now submit the work to our readers with a feeling of confidence that it is worthy of success and hope that they will find it a source of entertainment and interest, and that it will help to promote in the hearts of all that sympathy and respect for higher aspirations and closer fellowship.

AUTHORS' PREFACE.

Regrets have been expressed repeatedly by members of the Clewell family, that so little is known of the genealogy and history, coupled with desires that some one might be moved to snatch it from oblivion. With this object in view, we, Lewis B. Clewell, a descendant of Franz, and Lewis P., of George Craft Clewell, undertook the task: the former, to collect and tabulate the genealogy, the latter, to compile a brief history.

The former proved the more difficult task; the family, already in the seventh or eighth generation, numbers thousands and are widely scattered over the American Continent, of some all traces are lost; others, indifferent as to whence and whom they are, neglected to furnish the needed dates, etc., so that, in spite of the patient and painstaking efforts to make the record as complete as possible, some branches of the family remain incomplete.

The historical part proved more satisfactory. The writer had ready access to the valuable archives of the Moravian congregations at Schoeneck, Nazareth and Bethlehem. He also came into possession of valuable family records.

It is a laudable undertaking; if you find that you belong to an honorable family, it is a strong incentive to lead an honorable life; for while nobility is not in the blood, but in the character, it still remains a fact that blood will tell.

"The history," as Dr. Stapleton well says in his Memorial of the Huguenots "is a story of suffering for the sake of the 'faith once delivered to the saints.'"

With the two-fold objects, to rescue from oblivion the memory of our honored ancestors, and impress upon the minds of their numerous descendants the fact that theirs is an honorable descent; that it may prove, as well, an incentive to all who read, "to so run, that they may likewise obtain," we have undertaken the task. If these desired objects are gained, even in part, we shall feel amply compensated for our efforts.

THE AUTHORS.

This book goes forth as the history of the first seven generations of the Clewell Family in the United States. As its pre-

paration has been connected with several other names from whom some assistance has been derived, the extent of such aid will be fully acknowledged. The particular connection of Mr. Wilson D. Seyfried with the publication, deserves special mention, which is now given.

When the history was first proposed, such was the condition of my health, that in view of contingencies, we sought the aid of a competent person to assist us in the work. We induced Mr. Seyfried to join us in the work and he has been identified with us in every stage of the book's progress, until its conclusion. My co-laborer, Rev. Clewell, was confident of his part and soon after the first Reunion favored the publication of the data then collected but the Angel of Death intervened. He had his manuscript prepared while I had collected between four and five hundred families but no end in sight. Thus ended our joint labors.

After the death of my colleague and through the ill-health of myself, the work rested mainly on him. The large increase in the genealogical part of the history made it necessary to revise the history and when it is known that he has performed his duties in the school room, during the whole period of his connection with the work, it will be acknowledged that he has acquitted himself to the history with fidelity, especially in view of the fact, that there was no pecuniary reward in sight. He is the Editor and as such we honored and recognized him.

Whatever defects or omissions may exist in the volume, they will find an ample excuse in the circumstances under which it was written. The whole book so fully expresses my personal views, that I accept the surviving authorship without reserve, and for its contents assume the sole responsibility. My part has been to collect and suggest. So far as frail humanity would permit, it is a truthful and complete history of the Clewell Family. To insure the correctness of our manuscripts we mailed over a thousand of them to people who were competent to approve them.

It is a very pleasant duty to acknowledge the assistance that I have received from Rev. George F. Bahnson, of the Schoeneck Moravian Church; Bishop J. Mortimer Levering, of Bethlehem, Pa.; Rev. William H. Oerter, of Lebanon, Pa.; Bishop Charles L. Moench, of Philadelphia, Pa.; Dr. P. F. Laugenour, of States-

ville, N. C.; Mr. J. O. Knauss, of the Department of Public Instruction, of Harrisburg, Pa.; and the Pastors of the Nazareth Moravian Church; for their research of records. To them a frank acknowledgment of obligation is cheerfully accorded. I, also, wish to express my sincere thanks to Mr. Lucius E. Ricksecker; Mr. Oliver L. Fehr; Capt. Frank C. Stout; Mr. Stephen A. Trein; and Mr. Ephraim Loux, for their self-sacrificing labor.

And now, my dear kinsfolk, having assigned to all concerned proper credit, my task is about to close. One word more and I have done. My days of practical usefulness are passing away; I can not much longer mingle in the Reunions of the family. This doubtless is my last effort to serve my kindred. It is my last tribute to my ancestors,—my farewell to that loving band of friends and kinsmen, the sons and daughters of Franz and George Craft Clewell.

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INTRODUCTION.

Motive lies back of every effort. The honoring of one's parents and ancestors of a remoter degree, the transmission to our posterity of permanent, reliable, and easily accessible family records, the promotion of better acquaintance with one's own and stronger ties of love and kinship, and a general interest in biography, constitute the motives and furnish the justification for the publication of a work like this.

Interest in one's ancestry, as distinguished from family pride, is natural, and not always born of vanity. Your own child, that wishes to be told a story of when you were a little boy, is only manifesting a natural interest which all of us possess. Benjamin Franklin in his inimitable "Autobiography" expressed the same interest.

Honoring one's ancestors, without worshipping them (as the Chinese do), and without attempting simply to honor ourselves (as the wealthier or more famous families might be disposed to do), is always commendable. One of the purposes of this book is the proper recognition of the sterling qualities of our forefathers.

The Clewell descendants have not the same temptation to family pride that might be supposed to exist in families whose founders, though not more honorable from a moral point of view, had yet achieved greater things in literature, politics, or finance.

The life history, in its early stages, of the first Clewell ancestors in America, reads, as does Lincoln's, to use his own quotation, like the "simple annals of the poor." When the widowed "stamm-mutter" and her two boys, Franz and George, arrived in Philadelphia, in the year 1737, they were in worse plight than Franklin was when he arrived at the same place just a few years previous, with a single dollar in his pocket.

While many of the Clewell family were schooled in the same

school as were Lincoln and Franklin, and though the Clewells are now represented in every calling and profession, it is not yet of record that they have produced shining lights of such magnitude as Franklin and Lincoln. But there is hope, possibly, in rising generations.

Family pride is, in most aspects, a contemptible thing. It is not the purpose of this book to foster any of it. The achievements of our ancestors are not our own. The Joneses have other blood in them besides Jones' blood, and if we trace our lineage back far enough will we not all arrive at a common origin?

Family pride is proper only when it deters one from wrong doing. But even then, to do right for love of right is better. It is a proper interest in our ancestry, then, rather than family pride, that prompts the publication of this book.

"One half of the world does not know how the other half is getting along." Just as true is it that "One generation knows very little about the other." It is a pitiable fact that many children do not know the time and place of birth of their parents, to say nothing of remoter generations. It would puzzle a good many to give their grandmother's Christian name. But children are not always to blame for ignorance of matters which transpired before their advent into this world. Hence, the necessity and duty of transmitting in some form, whether by autobiography (not necessarily printed), or diary, or in family Bible, or, in case of large families a work like this, accurate family records.

If such records had been kept, one might have the satisfaction of ascertaining who his ancestors were on all lines, for some generations back. As before indicated, no Clewell is a Clewell only. Where there is no marriage into one's own family, every person has or had two parents, four grand parents, eight great grand parents, sixteen great great grand parents, and so on, the number increasing by a geometrical ratio of two with every generation. How many of these ancestors can we name? This question again suggests the importance of transmitting proper records to our children.

It is the absence, in many cases, of such records, that makes the compilation of a family history such a laborious task. The

amount of labor involved in the production of such a work as this is much greater than imagined by most readers. Great credit is due the compilers for the patience, self-sacrifice, labor, and skill bestowed upon this work.

The form of the present record and the method of using it, as explained in the "Preface," will be found to be most satisfactory, as it enables lineage to be traced in either direction with the least possible effort. It comes as near perfection as any to be found in our day. The Jewish system of family records differed from others in that each family record carried names of male descendants only, the female descendants, unless unmarried, being reckoned as of the family into which such married, and celibacy being at a discount then, as it ought to be now. This system, if universally adopted, would have the immense advantage of saving all duplication of record, at the same time affording perfect record of female descendants, as well as male, by reference from one family record to another.

Any record is better than none. A large portion of the Clewell records was preserved in some form or other, for which due credit is to be given. With many other families such a compilation as this is utterly impossible for lack of reliable data.

The present compilers had an advantage possessed by comparatively few American families, in that there was but one founder of the name Clewell (two, if you consider the family as beginning with the brothers Franz and George). The Smiths, the Millers, and thousands of other names, have been reinforced by repeated importations from other countries; and thus, whoever attempted to compile, for instance, a Smith family history would deserve the profoundest commiseration of everybody.

The Clewell family is of Huguenot origin. And, no doubt, much of the sterling character of our ancestors was developed in the school of affliction and persecution. Other countries have gained what France has lost. For a more complete history of the family, the reader is referred to the reports of reunions and to the biographies.

"If you would train a child aright, you must begin with his grandmother." There is much food for reflection in that saying. The laws of heredity never ceased to operate upon man-

kind, and one generation helps or hinders succeeding ones according as it transmits good or bad qualities to the next generation. Our race is a fallen one, to be sure, but it is an undisputed fact that some have suffered more from the fall than others. Who will say that it's not in some measure due to the piety of our persecuted ancestors that there are to-day so many among their descendants preaching the good tidings of redemption the only Way whereby man can be saved?

Beyond the period of Huguenot persecutions, the Clewell family cannot be traced. Very few families can be traced as far even as that. The farther back we go beyond that period, the greater the darkness and general ignorance, until we again reach the first centuries of the Christian era. Surnames were not in common use prior to the tenth century. It was no doubt providential that family records should be broken at this point. Had they not been thus broken, how many would still be priding themselves as being of the "seed of Abraham" according to the flesh instead of seeking to be united to the true "Seed" by faith.

On account of the liberal sprinkling of biography in this work, and the interesting statistics found in the reports read at reunions, the book, we trust, will be of considerable general interest, an interest shared by many who are not of the Clewell lineage. The biographies represent life as it really is,—its struggles, its successes, its sorrows, its joys, its every-day duties, and some of its extraordinary tasks.

But, of course, the work will be of special interest to those of the kin covered by the title of the book. To the unmarried, it might be well to suggest that they first consult the index of the book, as the laws forbid marriage within certain degrees of consanguinity. The Jews, in whose favor some of our laws make an exception, have sometimes so intermarried that one could figure himself out as being his own grandfather,—probably an undesirable result.

In looking through the book, the reader (if he be a Clewell descendant) will undoubtedly find names of persons of whose kinship with him he was entirely unaware. He needs to be "introduced" to them, and this book will do it. Thus the book will enlarge his acquaintance and ought to promote love and

sociability, and if it accomplishes these results only, the book will be doing a good work.

The Clewells evidently believe in "race *preservation*," as there are now more than four thousand of them, although the eighth generation is just beginning to "sprout," as it were. This shows well by comparison, considering that families ordinarily grow by geometrical ratio. The family of Roger Williams, several generations older, numbers about eighteen thousand.

May this book be a worthy memorial of those ancestors of ours that have fallen asleep. And as to the living ones, so widely scattered, and many of them so little acquainted with one another, may this book itself be between them a genuine and most cordial "Introduction."

A GENERAL HISTORY

—OF THE—

CLEWELL FAMILY.

As to whence the Clewells are is a matter not easily determined. All the records in our possession, however, assure us that the grand-parents of Franz and George Clewell were French Protestant or Huguenots. They lived in the southern part of France in the province of Dauphiny (Dauphiné) in the

WHENCE. town of Grenoble, and from this place they fled to Auerbach in Baden. No attempt has been made to trace our ancestry in Europe for reasons which are almost self evident. One might wish to know more about them and without doubt could discover much interesting data bearing upon their ancestral lineage or affiliation.

Dauphiné was formerly a frontier province in the south-eastern part of France, now comprising the departments of Drôme Isère and Hautes Alps. It is a mountainous district with beautiful and fertile valleys. It borders on Italy and Switzerland on the east with the lofty Alps mountains as its bound-

DAUPHINY. ary. Its chief city was Grenoble. It has a strong fortress and even at present is an important city. It was originally a city of the Allobroges and later was fortified by the Romans who had conquered the province, 121 B. C. and the people became loyal subjects of that empire. In the 5th century it was conquered by the Burgundians who were originally a German tribe, and for a short period was a part of an independent kingdom. From 1032 until the middle of the 14th century, it was a possession of Germany when it was presented to France by the last lord of the old rulers who had the

title of "Dauphin" from which the province received its name. Among the public buildings of Grenoble is the "Palace of Justice" which was originally the palace of the Dauphin.

Such is the history of the country from which the grandparents of Franz and George Clewell fled. Whether the history sheds any light upon their ancestors or not, is left to the judgment of the reader but the environment in which people live is a great factor in their lives and the laws of heredity can neither be disavowed.

There are those in the family who regard it very probably that they originally came not only from this frontier province of ancient Gaul, but from the frontier of the frontier, namely, Spain.

DERISIVE Two plausible reasons are given: First, there is an old saying among the older Clewells that they were sometimes, in derision, called "Schwartzte Spanier,"

TAUNTS. Black Spaniards as well as "Schwartzte Fransoa" Black Frenchmen. Second, that the early members of the family, before they were much intermarried with the fair-haired and blue-eyed Germans, were a very black-haired and black-eyed people, although of remarkable fair skin. Their vivacity of disposition and temper, their versatility and impulsive eccentricities, indicate that they were descended from the Latin or Celtic races, rather than from the fair and more phlegmatic Germans who overran and conquered ancient Gaul, converting it into modern France.

The family must have been quite numerous for the name appears among the exiles of various lands and also among the galley-slaves to which some had been condemned. Michael Clavel who was number 37,246 had been in servitude

THE for three years on the ship "La Fidelle" and another person, Antoine Clavel, who was number 30,789,

FAMILY. had been in servitude for six years on the ship "La Vieille Reale." They were among the galley-slaves that were released by King Louis XIV of France in 1713 and 1714 respectively. Rev. David Clavel, a prominent member of the Reformed Church, was born in 1754, in Genoa. As early as 1628, a John Clavel, a poetical highway-man under Charles I, who after being reprieved wrote a poem on the "Tricks of Highwayman and How to Catch Thieves."

Another branch of the family, the one in which we are directly interested, fled from Dauphiny to Auerbach, Baden, for the sake of "the Faith once delivered unto the Saints."

During the struggles of the Reformation period, the Protestants of France were successful in obtaining a decree which secured for them religious freedom. They enjoyed this privilege to see 760 churches rise but were denied the printing of books on the tenets of their religion, except in such places where it already existed nor were they allowed to ap-

EDICT OF NANTES. proach the heart of the government with their religion and consequently their political strength was gradually crushed and their liberties interfered with. On October 18, 1685, King Louis XIV of France revoked the Decree and more than 400,000 of the Protestants left their country and fled to other countries for protection rather than submit to Popish superstition. Among these refugees were merchants, manufacturers and skilled artisans, the most intelligent and most religious people of the nation. The loss to the French king was immense and the despotic ruler being entrapped through his half-secret marriage to one who was governed by the Jesuits, wreaked vengeance upon the Protestants with sword and fire. With the alternative of Popish superstition and oppression, and the truth as it is in Jesus, they chose the latter. Leaving in quick flight, they left all their worldly goods behind in order to find refuge where they might worship God according to the teachings of His Word and the dictates of their consciences.

There is a well authenticated tradition that an only brother of Francois Clavel became separated from the rest of the family during the flight and was never heard of again. He doubtless, became a victim of the persecution. Their first resting

THE FLIGHT. place in their flight was in Geneva, Switzerland, whither the parents of the future wife of Francois had also fled. How long they stopped in that city we are not told but they continued their journey, perhaps to gratify a desire for greater safety, into Baden from whence their posterity was destined to continue the flight until they landed upon the shores of the New World.

When our ancestors arrived in the Palatinate they renewed their allegiance to the Reformed Church of which they were con-

sistent and zealous members as is evident from the autobiography of Franz Clewell. Francois Clavel was married

FRANCOIS in Auerbach to Louise Frache in 1718. He appears to have been a man of more than ordinary

CLAVEL. intelligence and force of character. He died in the year 1730, leaving a widow and two sons, Franz, aged ten, and George Craft, aged four years.

The widow, Louise Clavel, nee Frache, was born in Geneva, Switzerland, on the 5th of December, 1695. Her parents, as already stated, were among the French Huguenots who were compelled to seek refuge under a Protestant ruler.

LOUISE They were also members of the Reformed Church. She received a very good education as well as a

FRACHE. thorough religious training. Her span in life from her birthplace in Geneva to her last resting-place on Schoeneck's "God's Acre," shows that she played the part of a heroine in many respects.

About a year after the death of her husband, Francois Clavel, she married Johannes G'Fellern, a native of Switzerland. This marriage no doubt, was prompted by feeling the need of a protector for herself and her children in those unsettled times.

HER The religious wars continued and the persecutions of the Protestants was as furious as

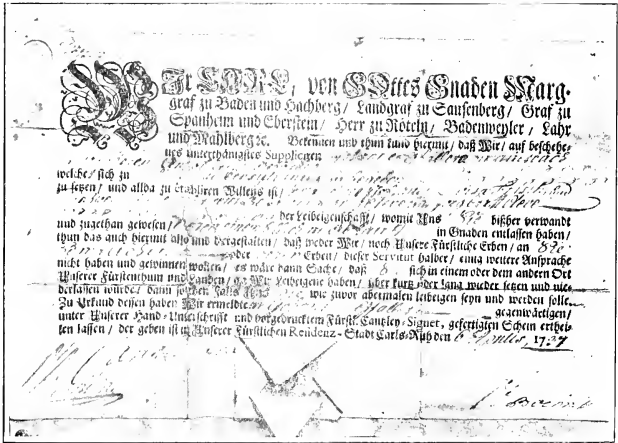
SECOND ever. This union was blessed with one daughter who died in infancy. No further mention is

MARRIAGE. made of her second husband except that his name appears among the immigrants of the Billender Townshead which anchored in the Delaware at Philadelphia on October 5, 1737, from Amsterdam, Holland.

That he assumed the responsibility of a father is evident from the so called *Pass* which he obtained from the officers in whose jurisdiction they lived. The *Pass*, which is the possession of Mr. Jacob Clewell (116) of Philadelphia, Pa., is written in German. WE CHARLES, by the grace of God margrave of Baden, and grave of Sausenberg, count of Spanheim and Eberstein, lord of Roeteln, Badenweyler, Lahr and Mahlberg & cet., by these presents acknowledge and declare, that, upon the humble petition of John Gefaeller from Auerbach, in our bailiwick of Stin, who desires to betake himself to the island of Pennsylvania and to make his home there; together with his wife, Louisa Frasch and her two children from her first husband, John Franz Cleve and George Craft Cleve;—we have, for a suitable consideration, graciously released them from servitude by which heretofore they have been allied and belonged to us; and we do this with the understanding, that neither we nor our princely heirs will have to obtain any further claims on them or their heirs on account of this servitude, unless they should sooner or later again settle in one of the other places within our principality and territory, where we have serfs, in which case they shall again be and become serfs, as before.

In testimony of this we have ordered the present document to be executed for the aforesaid John Gefaeller, given under our

own signature and imprinted seal of the princely chancery, at our princely residence, the city of Carls-Ruh, April 6. 1737.

It was generally understood that the above secured for them the passage on the ship but it is not exactly that except in an indirect sense. It will be noticed that the tenor of the instrument is the releasing of the man as well as of his wife and the two children from servitude and when we read of their being held as serfs we may become overwhelmed with astonishment. But our descendants will not only find relief in their mortification, if any there should be, in the history of the times and the sense in which the word was used but also, the fact is settled forever that the descendants of Franz and George Clewell have elevated their position in society and that they lived that positive life which had the assurance of being rewarded while the blood of the nobility has degenerated in many instances.

The term serf must not be construed in this document as meaning a slave and must also be distinguished from the serfs or vassals of the early middle ages. These were subjugated by the conqueror and consisted of the population of the earlier races. There are also instances of persons selling themselves by reason of famine or other pressing causes to the lords for the sake of protection and still others who surrendered themselves to churches and monasteries for the sake of the benefits to be derived from the prayers of their masters. Different as was the condition of the serfs in different countries and at different periods, his position, on the whole, was much more favorable than that of a slave and by the customs of France and Germany the serfs were only bound to fixed payments and duties in respect to their lords. It is this latter condition from which our ancestral family seeks release, and, like true and loyal subjects they petitioned their lord for their freedom and by paying their respects, were privileged to take advantage of their purpose in a very honorable and creditable manner. Whether the island of Pennsylvania as it was then conceived, could afford them greater protection in the vicissitudes of life than this lord who was unable to cope with the difficulties of the times, must have been a serious problem to them but their sturdy spirit of independence and their christian zeal over-shadowed all such thoughts. Moreover the wise have said, "There are no gains without pains" and the journey was be-

gun. According to tradition the voyage was a stormy one. Storm after storm overtook them and during one of these storms Johannes G'Fellern was drowned.

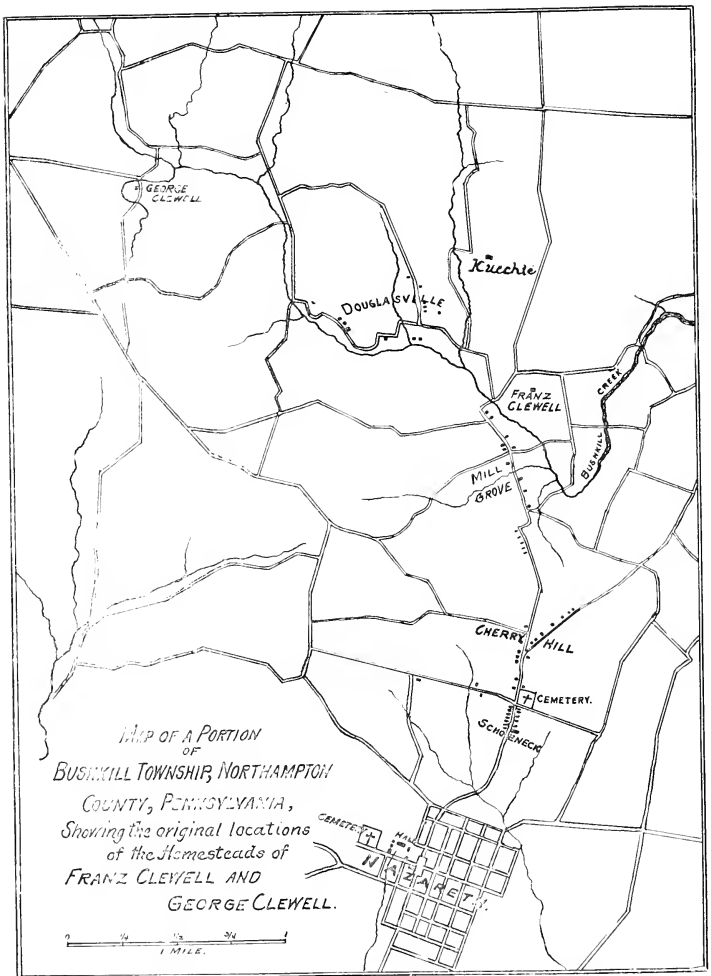
Thus we see that Louise Clavel G'Fellern landed at Philadelphia, a widow for the second time and now it seems the worst time of her trials was at hand. It may be taken for granted that they had some account of the surpassing advantages that were to be realized in this new country before they left the Fatherland, but now the one on whom they had depended

THE LANDING. was missing. They had left a home but where were they to find one here and who would support them. The colony with which they came resolved to try their fortunes in the Schuylkill Valley but what incentive did the forests of that valley offer to a woman in her position and to be separated from her acquaintances or even kindred and stay in the city, was equally odious to her. Just what made her to follow the colony into the Schuylkill Valley we are not told but after she had handed her two sons, Franz and George, over to their future masters as "Redemptioners" she traveled alone in her bereavement and anxiety.

The family was among the thousands whose pecuniary means were very limited but this was no insurmountable obstacle for a chance to try the fortunes of the new world. Therefore, they generally entered into contracts with the shipmasters for their passage to the New World. By the terms of these contracts, the person agreed upon the arrival of the ship at the designated port that he would allow himself to be sold into

THE REDEMPTIONERS. service to the highest bidder for a term of time sufficient to liquidate their indebtedness to the ship. Consequently upon their arrival, such persons who entered into such a compact were exposed for sale at auction or privately and their services sold for a period of from three to five years whichever might be found necessary to defray the expenses of the passage.

The price paid for them varied according to age and physical condition but ordinarily they brought ten pounds, equal to about \$26.67 in the old money of the province of Pennsylvania, or about \$50 according to the money standard of to-day.



The sales of these unfortunates were chiefly made to the comparatively wealthy residents in the south-eastern part of the province of Pennsylvania, near Philadelphia, because there the greater need of such service was felt and the people had also more ability to pay for such services. But the time came when the market for these servants in the city became overstocked and it was necessary to dispose of them at places more remote.

The guardian of our ancestors saw both her sons sold into such servitude as well as that of their future wives. Franz Clewell became the servant of a planter in the Schuylkill Valley while George found his master in the city and served his term as a "button-maker." Such was the introduction our ancestors received but this stroke proved to be their fortune as well as to many others, for it laid the foundation of a material prosperity, which resulted frequently in the possession of their hundreds of acres of fertile land, their barns and granaries filled, besides means by which they could have been the happy possessors of bonds and stocks. After George had served his time as a redemptioner, he also joined his friends in the vicinity of Oley in the Schuylkill Valley and the dawn of a brighter future became apparent. His brother, Franz, had acquired his own possessions and soon afterwards married Salome Kuechley and George followed the example a few years later by taking her sister, Anna Maria Kuechley and making her his wife.

Whether the mother of these two maidens died in Oley or a few years after they had left that place we are not certain but the fact remains that their father Johaimes Kuechley became a widower and some time before the year 1750 had

HER married their mother-in-law, Louise Clavel

THIRD G'Fellern or the mother of their husbands. The

MARRIAGE. three families lived closely together for the rest of their parents' lifetime as their possessions or plantations were contiguous which they purchased from the Provincial government and which were situated north of Nazareth.

Here on the frontier, between the plantation of Franz Clewell on the east and the plantation of George Clewell on the west they, in the declining years of their lives, lived under the protection of their sons and daughters, breaking words of wisdom

to them and guiding them until all seemed to have been fairly begun when they again were summoned to suffer a great loss. In the year 1756, not many years after their marriage, she became a widow for the third time through the death of her husband. This being before the organization of the church at Schoeneck, or about a year after they had petitioned the Moravians for a minister and while they occasionally had religious services in Franz Clewell's house they, for some reason, buried his remains on his own possessions.

She remained a widow for about eleven years in which she prepared for her final summons. The Gospel as preached by the Moravian ministers, convicted her of her sins and shortcomings and reminded her of the instructions she had received in the days

HER the communion of the church at Schoeneck it impressed her deeply and she eagerly longed

WIDOWHOOD. for the same privilege. After much prayer and many trials, she was received into the church on January 23, 1763, according to the customs of the Moravians and on August sixth of the same year she was permitted to partake of the Holy Communion. She was thereby much humbled and exclaimed "Moncher Sauveur m'a pris mon coein" —"My loving Saviour has come very near to my heart."

During her last years she was unable in consequence of advanced age and infirmities to leave her home and she was almost totally deaf, making it very difficult to converse with her and during the last few months of her life she could hardly be understood.

She died of a violent and sudden hemorrhage from an attack of pleurisy at six o'clock on the morning of October 5, 1767, aged

HER 72 years less two months. She was buried at Schoeneck on the Moravian God's Acre where her resting place is marked by a white marble slab and

DEATH. bears the following inscription:

"Louisa Kuechley, geborne Frache, geboren December 1695 zu Geneve in der Schweiz: Mutter von Franz and George Clewell. Sie war die Stamm-mutter von der zahlreichen Clewell's familie: Gestorben October, 1767."

and ancestress of the numerous Clewell family. Died October, 1767.

It may not be amiss at this time to digress for a while from our direct subject and give a few general points or hints on their experiences as members of the Moravian church, then generally known as the Brethren's Church. It appears that it was a more serious matter to belong and have the privileges of a church than at present. The fact that our ancestors became refugees and sought religious freedom is a thing that can hardly be appreciated to-day, and when they had the opportunity

CASTING of uniting with a church here in America it was seized and its precincts were approached with deep

LOTS. piety. The guiding hand of Providence in the affairs of men was recognized by those persecuted people while they humbly submitted to Divine Will. The custom of deciding questions by *lot* among Moravians was uncommonly prevalent, both privately and in the control of church affairs. It was used in various ways, in making selections, in seeking guidance in perplexity and in deciding questions and was usually conducted by drawing names or numbers or slips on which were written the words "yes" or "no." It was not, however, an exclusive Moravian custom but rather as a Providential ruling. After our ancestors, Franz and George Clewell, as well as their mother, were admitted into the Society of the Brethren, the question whether they were fit subjects to partake of the Lord's Supper was decided by lot. In the case of Franz it was favorable at once but unfavorable to that of his mother and brother and therefore they did not become full members of the church until some time afterwards. They submitted to the decision without murmuring and prepared for the next chance.

Previous to 1818, lot was applied to many marriages. This, perhaps, was to carry out lofty ideals in the selection of consecrated associates and as a matter of complete subjection to Divine guidance. However, the law of love took its course—and as a result the system was generally disapproved. There were also such among our descendants who were Moravians that desired to marry some one not of the church and they would not submit to the system and again dissatisfaction arose. In one particular instance when the hand of a descendant widow with her

three children was sought in marriage by one who belonged to the church, he made his intentions known to the officials of the church who wanted to proceed with lot when he told them "the widow or none." Lot was favorable and the marriage was a happy one as many among our descendants could testify.

Many of our readers may dispute the correctness of the orthography of the name *Clewell* and no attempt will be made to decide that question but rather to present the various forms of the name which came to our notice while gathering the data for this book. It will be noticed that in the baptismal certificate of George Craft the name is spelled *Clavell*

THE while in the passport the name is spelled *Cleve*. That NAME. the latter is a clerical error is almost self-evident, perhaps confounded with the duchy, Cleves, in Westphalia while the former may have been the form used by the people in Europe. In the recital of the deed by the Commonwealth to Franz, the name is repeatedly spelled "Klewell" alias "Clavell" while Franz writes his own name with a K and about a year afterwards, under the same circumstances, he writes *Clewell*. This may be explained by comparing the so-called hard sound of C with the German K.

The form "Clewell" appears on the legal documents that were executed by both Franz and George as their signatures and the same form is used by their children in the execution of documents in the settlement of the estates with the exception of Abraham (20), the youngest heir of George, who signed his name Klewell. The reason for this was explained by his son, Abraham (97), who was still living at the time of the first reunion. Abraham, son of George, had his family in Philadelphia and when the children entered school the teacher persisted in spelling the name with a K and the whole family yielded.

In the list of taxable people of Northampton County, in 1780, the name is spelled "Clewelder" and "Cleweld." In each case the name begins with a C and the spelling of the rest of the word is simple to anyone who understands the Pennsylvania German dialect. This instance goes to prove the erroneousness of official records which may have also been the case with the name on the passport.

In the genealogy it will be noticed that Joseph William Clewell

(300) spells his name "Cavelt." The history of the man will explain the orthography of the name. While being yet a mere lad he became separated from his parents and was raised in a Pennsylvania German family who had not only neglected their own education but failed to do their duty to the boy and consequently when the time arrived that he had occasion to write his name, he spelled it according to the pronunciation of the word among those people.

Another form of the name is that of John F. (253) and James D. (254) Clawell. But this form is similar to those already explained. Local pronunciation often changed the spelling of the name.

We were often attracted by the similarity of our family surname to that of others, like Clayville, Clavill and Clavell. The first two as far as we have investigated have a history peculiar of their own while the latter are inhabitants of Canada and claim to be descendants of the pioneers of the colonial days as well as of French nationality. We have reason to believe that they are a distinctive branch of the family and that their form of the name which is *Clavell*, bears the greater resemblance of the original form. We leave the duty of finding the connecting link to the future family historian.

The history of that small village about one mile north of Nazareth called Schoeneck and which means "Pleasant Corner" does not strictly belong to our Family History but it is so closely allied with our early ancestors that it may find a proper place among these pages.

It was in the year 1754 that a number of dwellers in Bushkill Township then a part of Plainfield Township, wrote a petition to the Synod of the Brethren now commonly known as Moravians, who were holding their sessions in Bethel on the Swatava, asking that body to send a minister, who could proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ to them pure and unadulterated like the Apostle of old. The letter thus addressed was signed by Franz Clewell, George Clewell, John Peter Stoudt, a brother-in-law of the above named and John Kuechle, father-in-law of the aforementioned, Henry Kostenbader, Walter Mueller and-----Bleily.

Among these seven persons, Franz Clewell, who had been awakened by a sermon of Rev. Eschenbach in Oley, was the prime author of this movement, influenced principally by his concern for the salvation of his children.

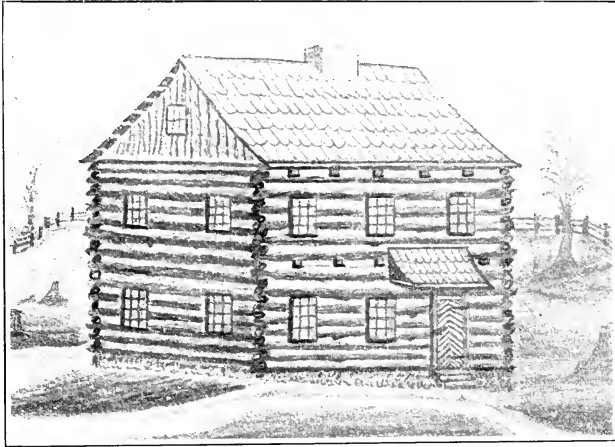
It was resolved by that Synod to send a minister to them who met the seven petitioners in the house of Franz Clewell. Here in this house, services were held from time to time by Moravian ministers who came on request, during the year 1755 and each meeting attracted more of the neighbors and thus continuing until 1756 the question of building a place of worship and a school-house was earnestly discussed.

All of them felt the need but the obstacles that had to be overcome seemed like mountains because of their limited number in building and supporting the same.

About the year 1756, the Moravian Synod again came to their aid when they passed a resolution that a congregation place

should be established on the Nazareth Tract a short mile from Nazareth Hall in the direction of the Blue Mountains. This place so established, received the name Schoeneck, named after a place in Austria which belonged to Count Zinzendorf's family.

In 1760 George Clauss who later became the father-in-law of Elizabeth Clewell (12), oldest daughter of George Clewell (3), built the first house in the place. In the spring of 1762, the building of the proposed place of worship and school-house was commenced and so steadily and vehemently was the work pushed that the third of October of the same year was set apart for its consecration.



THE BUILDING OF ¹⁷⁶²~~1760~~ USED AS A CHURCH, SCHOOL HOUSE AND DWELLING.

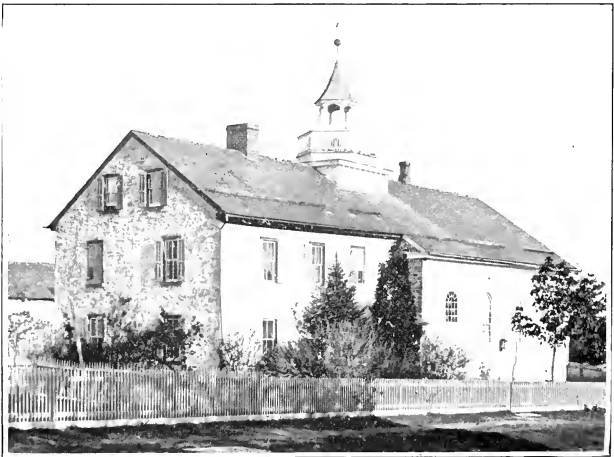
This was the first church which evidently stood a few rods north of the present church. On August 12 previous to the consecration of this church, Rev. Daniel Neibert and his wife Hannah, arrived as the first regular pastor.

In the year 1763, the grave-yard was laid out and it was so destined that the builder of the first house, George Clauss, should also be the first one whose remains were interred in the cemetery.

At the dedication services held October 3, 1762, it was announced that all those friends who had aided in building the place of worship would be considered "Societaets-Members" that is, such who have mutually banded themselves together, not to live for themselves in the world but to live for Him alone, and also on this occasion a daughter of Franz and Salome Clewell was baptized and received the name Christina (See biography).

Many people from Nazareth, Christian Springs and Gnaden-thal came to Schoeneck to witness the dedication of the church and see the new settlement.

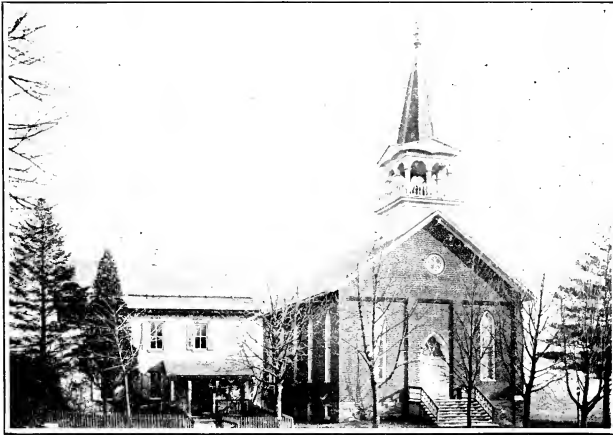
On November 28, being the first congregation Day, Franz Clewell and his wife Salome became members of the congregation while more were added to the "Society." The congregation flourished while many of its members began to look for a place nearer to the church on which they would settle and so one by one the houses were erected in the village. In less than thirty years the necessity of a larger church became apparent. At the celebration of the Congregational Festival on the Third of October, 1792, the lack of room brought the subject up in

an earnest manner. It was proposed by some to enlarge their old church while others favored the building of a new church and this was finally accepted by a majority.

The matter was then referred to the General Helpers' Conference, a body of the Moravian Church, which expressed their approval that a new church, to be build of stone, forty-two feet long, thirty-six feet wide and sixteen feet high, should be erected south of the old school-house and to be connected with the latter by a passage way. During the winter of 1792-93, the stones and timbers were hauled together by the members who were also faithfully and without remuneration assisted by the Moravians from Nazareth as well as the whole neighborhood and all other preparations prior to the erection of the building



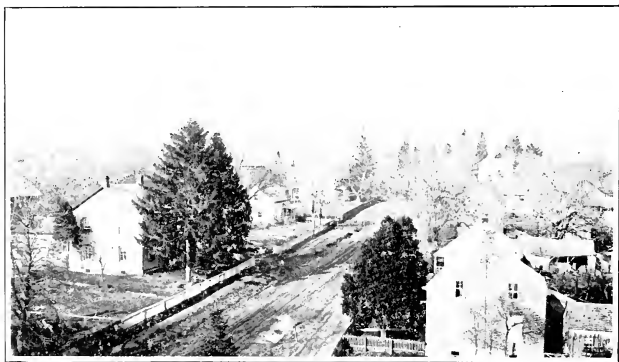
CHURCH BUILT IN 1888

made, so that the 17th of June, 1793 was fixed as the date for the corner-stone laying. On the following 27th day of July the roof was placed into position and the work progressed so rapidly that October 20, 1793 was set apart for the "consecration and dedication" services.

Franz and George Clewell were again among the members of the building committee of the congregation which consisted

of 58 married men and women, 1 widower, 4 widows, 4 unmarried men, 9 larger boys, 9 unmarried women, 7 larger girls, 30 boys and 35 girls.

The first church and school house was torn down in 1826 to make room for the present parsonage which was built on to the north wall of the church built in 1793 and this church in turn was torndown in 1888 and the present edifice erected and dedicated on October 6th, 1889. Among the members of the building committee for the erection of this church was Lewis B. Clewell, a descendant of Franz, while the bell in the tower of the church was a donation to the congregation by the descendants of Philip Clewell through the instrumentality of Rev. Lewis P. Clewell, a descendant of George, and bears the following inscription: "In memory of Philip and Anna Maria Clewell, by their children and grand-children, 1889." Rev. Lewis P. Clewell made the presentation address.

Thus, around the history of this church clusters much of the history of many a descendant of Franz and George Clewell. There was seldom a time that not almost half of the members of the congregation were descendants of the Clewells, and nearly half of the unique and beautiful custom of the flat marble slabs, mark the resting place of the remains of a Clewell descendant on the grave-yard. Every generation except the eighth has

left its vestige in the village while many have received their first lessons in moral and religious duties in that village church. The village proper lies between the grave-yard on the north and the church on the south consisting of about one dozen dwellings and were at one time nearly all inhabited by Clewells. Here also many scenes of childhood are laid, but in later life left their homes and journeyed towards the four quarters of the globe. With them went pleasant memories of festival occasions while the weeping-willows in front of the church seemed to mourn their departure. For twenty or more years the voice of Rev. John J. Regennas who was married to a Clewell descendant proclaimed the Gospel of Peace and the necessity of a happy and righteous life which was emphasized later by a Clewell descendant who was born in the village in the person of Rev. Lewis P. Clewell.

The village has always been a quiet, pleasant, residential spot, with a serenity hovering over it that suggests to the intelligent mind the trials on the one hand and on the other, happy and comfortable homes of our parents and grand-parents.



AUTOBIOGRAPHY
OF
FRANZ CLEWELL.

TRANSLATED BY REV. LEWIS P. CLEWELL FROM THE
GERMAN CHURCH RECORDS OF SCHOENECK, PA.

Our departed Brother communicated the following of his seventy-seven years of earthly pilgrimage.

"I was born on September 24, 1720, in Auerbach, Baden, Dur-
lach. My Grand Parents were French Potestant (Hugue-
nots), who during the time of the great religious persecutions
fled from Dauphin, France, with their children, leaving all their
possessions behind. It was quick flight or sure death for them.
They became members of the Reformed Church at Auerbach,
where I was born and baptized and in my fiteenth year, after
careful instruction in Holy Writ and the doctrines of the Re-
formed Church, confirmed and admitted to the Holy Commu-
nion. In my tenth year, I had the misfortune of loosing my
father by death, who, in the full and blessed assurance of Faith
in the Lord Jesus Christ, passed from time into eternity.

After the lapse of a year, my mother married again—John
G'Fallerns (Feller) who was born in Switzerland. But owing
to the long continued French wars at that time, which brought
ruin, desolation and poverty to the country, we saw nothing but
ruin and poverty in store for us and hence resolved to emigrate
to North America, arriving in Philadelphia, (the City of
Brotherly Love) in the Fall of 1737.

On our arrival in the vessel, my dear mother handed me over
to my future master, and she begged him earnestly to see to it,
that I attended church regularly, as well as attend to my private
devotions and admonished me to continue in the fear of the
Lord and trust his aid and assistance.

In the home of my master in the vicinity of Oley, Pennsylvania, during the five years of my service, I fared remarkably well but there was little opportunity to attend religious services anywhere as my dear mother had requested, because at that time there was no church far or near. It happened on one occasion while out on business for my master that I passed a house where there was a large gathering of people so that many had to stand on the outside; thinking that it was a public sale, I rode up and tied my horse and forced myself in, but soon realized my mistake. From the little that I could catch I inferred that it was a Roman Catholic Seminary. On reaching home, I inquired further of my master about it. He informed me that they were "Herrnhuter" Moravians, who, a short time ago, came to this country and preached a new doctrine. This aroused my curiosity in what this new doctrine consisted and I found that it was the same to which my sainted father held fast and in which he instructed me. The doctrine of the merits of His atoning death. The teaching of these precious, saving truths had already made a deep impression on my heart and served as a good seed in my heart while through the grace of God and the mercy of the Lord, they sprang up in due time and bore fruit.

In September, 1744, I married my dear wife, Salome, maiden name Kuechley (a daughter of his mother's third husband) and we moved into the Oley Hills. The next year we sold our possessions there and moved with our first born child, daughter Magdalin to this place where we have since resided. (By "this place" is meant the old homestead, see cut, which was located about one and a half miles north of Nazareth near the village of Millgrove now Aluta, and commonly known as the Gold Farm.) We had a hard time at first. Many trials from within and from without confronted us. The country was very sparsely populated and frequent Indian wars menaced us. We were obliged to endure many privations with all our hard work. When I think of those times and see how richly I have been blessed with temporal things I feel that I cannot be grateful enough.

Our greatest sorrow was however that we had no opportunity of attending Religious services anywhere in the neighborhood. My neighbors and I made repeated attempts to secure a minister who would serve us with the Word and Sacrament but without avail. Later we asked a Dunkard minister to preach to us oc-

asionally and he promised and made an appointment but never came and thus ended our second failure. In all these experience I see the wise and gracious guidance of the Lord.

In the course of time we sent a written request to the Synod of the Brethren held at Bethel on the Swatava, (now Lebanon County) telling them of our spiritual needs and requested them to send if possible a Lutheran minister to us. In all this I was very much concerned, lest the Brethren (Moravians) might turn us away from the true faith which we thought we had. I freely expressed my fears to Brother Rev. Henry Rauch who was deputed by the Synod to confer with us. Then I heard for the first time clearly and distinctly what constituted "true Faith"—To know ourselves as poor sinners and Jesus Christ as our only Saviour. I realized, at once, that I as yet lacked this saving faith. But the loving spirit in which the Brother directed us in the way of life made a deep impression on me and my neighbors and our confidence in the Brethren who served us since February, 1755, with the Word and Sacrament, preaching and baptizing our children, grew gradually.

Another experience that I had about this time that I wish to record here for the benefit of my children and others of my neighbors and friends who might have similar perplexities is—that I was deeply impressed with the fact that children were a *gift of God* and that He held us responsible for their proper bringing up, etc. This occasioned me many anxious hours lest I might come short in this duty. On one occasion while gathered with them around the table, watching them and listening to their conversation, such a terrible fear came over me lest one or another of them might go astray, that I could not refrain from tears. In this distress of heart I left the table and went out into the woods where I expected to work but my feelings overcame me when I fell on my knees and earnestly besought the Lord that He might take them into His own hands and guard them from all evil and since I lacked the needed wisdom and understanding to train them up in His fear, He should in mercy grant it to me.

Then and there I experienced such a blessed assurance that He had heard my prayers that I have ever since felt that they were safe in His hands.

I know from blessed experiences that if we commit our child-

ren into the hands of the Lord and ask him for guidance to bring them up in his fear and service, he will grant it. But it has also humiliated me at times when I recognized that I came short in my paternal duties or when through haste in work or in deed I became a stumbling block to my children. Oh, how much the dear Lord has to forgive me in this!

These and many similar experiences which the dear Saviour made plain to my poor sinful heart beside the testimony of the blessed Gospel by the Brethren who preached stately in my house, brought me gradually into closer fellowship with Him whom I formerly knew with all my imaginary true faith only as the great and true God and now, I had learned to know my Friend and only Saviour.

Since the year 1760 when they ceased to hold services in my house, we attended the services at Nazareth until in October, 1762, when the first chapel in Schoeneck was dedicated. On that day I was admitted into the Society and on the first anniversary day of the congregation in November admitted into full communicant membership. On the sixth day of August, 1763, I was permitted to partake of the Holy Communion for which I had long anticipated.

I often longed for this privilege but in our isolation it was denied me for these many years past. (The reader is here asked to contemplate and contrast this incident with the time when he partook of the Lord's Supper for the first time after his confirmation in Auerbach. Ed.)

But here I had another experience and I had to be convinced that I could be saved only through the free and undeserved grace of the Lord Jesus Christ. I had missed it in the past by not permitting this free grace to have free course in me. I received the Bread and thought—"This is the Body of the Lord Jesus given for me." Now I must experience deep feelings, great ecstasy, etc., but failed to have them. In like manner I received the Cup, my feelings continued the same, and now my faith commenced to waver and I cried out in my heart that the dear Lord would have mercy upon me and help me, a poor, helpless sinner. O the blessed assurance I received at that moment! I cannot describe. Heart and eyes overflowed with thankful, penitential tears. Here I experienced fully what free grace really is. On this Grace of my dear Saviour I will steadfastly lean until mine end."

HIS ACQUISITIONS AND HIS WIFE SALOME, NEE KUECHLEY.

Thus ends his own recital of his seventy-seven years of life but by his obituary, preserved in the archives of the Schoeneck Moravian Church, and old documents handed to us, we may learn a few more valuable things of the elder of our early ancestors.

We have no record of his boyhood days, but the allusions in his autobiography. Apparently, his early days were spent amidst the religious strifes of the early part of the eighteenth century under the protection of a devoted father who instilled the principles of liberty and perseverance into his two boys which made for them success in later life. The death of his father must have added to anguish and perhaps hastened the responsibilities of manhood. He makes no reference to his step-father but leaves Europe for America in company with him and his mother. On arriving at Philadelphia, it was his mother who handed him over to his future master who lived at Oley, Berks County, Pa. Tradition has it that his master was a Dr. Heister, a planter. The fact of his serving five years as a "Redemptioner" shows plainly that the family was poor in worldly goods since it became necessary for his mother to sell the services of her son in return for the payment of his passage.

We are not told in what he fared well while with his master, but it may be a fair conclusion that it was financially since he had his own possessions for the short time he lived there. After his five years of service, in September, 1744, he married Salome Kuechley, who was born in Neureuth, in Baden-Durlach on January 15, 1728. She also came to America in 1737 and with her parents settled in the vicinity of Oley, Berks county, Pa., where she also served for a time as "Redemptioner." After the death of her husband she moved to Nazareth and took apartments in the Sister's House where she rested for the rest of her life and one of her daughters constantly waiting on her. She died May 18, 1812, and is buried in the Nazareth graveyard. She was always concerned about the welfare and happiness of her children and especially about their religion. She was a woman of sterling

virtues and an affable and peaceable disposition and greatly esteemed by her friends and acquaintances.

They began housekeeping on their possessions in Oley but for some reason soon sold it and moved to the north of Nazareth where he bought a tract of land from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania containing one hundred and sixty-seven acres plus six per centum allowance for roads, etc., and paid for it, twenty-eight pounds, one shilling (28£ 1s) in English money or about \$136.50. The tract was called *Indostan*. The patent is written on parchment and specifies that the above grant is free and clear of all restrictions and reservations as to mine royalties excepting and reserving only the one-fifth part of all gold and silver ore for the use of the Commonwealth to be delivered at the pit's mouth, clear of all charges.

The patent was granted and signed by His Excellency, Thomas Mifflin, Esq., President of the Supreme Executive Council and the seal of the State affixed the Twelfth day of February, 1790, and the Commonwealth the fourteenth year. This patent contains four Warrants, dated January 31, 1746, for fifty acres; December 11, 1770, twenty-four and one-fourth acres; December 8, 1774, forty and one-eighth acres, and May 13, 1789, thirty-five acres; a total of one hundred and nine and three-eighths acres. Comparing this acreage with that granted in the patent, the reader may form a fair idea of the liberality of the Commonwealth in its allowance for roads.

We are not able to explain who granted his first Warrant, it being before this Commonwealth had received the name Pennsylvania, but it establishes the fact that he moved to the frontier as his tract was bounded on the north, east and west by lands of the Commonwealth and on the south by Demuth's possessions. We regret that we are not able to relate the details of his privations and Indian insurrections but the history of frontiersmen has been so ably and vividly described that our school children are fairly familiar with it. However hard his struggles may have been during his manhood, his labors were crowned by no mean reward. According to the history of Northampton County the taxable inhabitants of Plainfield Township in 1780, numbered one hundred and thirty-three and the name of Franz Clewell appears eleventh in amount of assessed value, it being 357£. The real estate

which was sold by his executors after the death of his wife amounted to 2942£. 13s. 9d. and the personal property to 143£. 5s. 4½d. The total being equal to about \$15,000. During his life time he had acquired about 323 acres of land which, according to the above amount, was sold for about \$50 an acre.

In his Last Will and Testament, recorded at Easton, Pa., there are also a few items of interest which in contrast with what is regarded valuable to-day will help to appreciate his circumstances all the more. He says "I have been richly blessed with temporal things and which is hereinafter more fully described. My beloved wife, Salome, is to have the one-third of all the summer and winter grain and of hay both the first and second crop to be delivered into the barn and full possession and use of the house I now live in and of the stable, garden and grass lot and potatoe patch and the use of one-third part of the barn and six rows of apple trees and her cow shall go in pasture with the tenants cattle and the tenant shall haul her fire-wood to the house and her grain to the mill and home again free of any charges, and my said wife shall have the use of all my household furniture during her natural life. After her death all property is to be sold at public sale except my clothes, which I bequeath to my son, John. All moneys are to be divided equally, share and share alike, after all just debts and expenses are paid, except a preference of ten pounds to my son, John, and of thirty pounds to my daughter, Julianna." The executors named in the Will were his sons, John and Francis and dated October 20, 1792, and witnessed by Jacob Eyerly, Jr., and Joseph Levering.

While thus engaged with the temporal affairs of life we must not lose sight of the fact that he was very anxious about his salvation. His name appears first among the petitioners for a preacher of the Gospel and for several years religious services were held in his house. If we consider the size of his house and his large family, one may feel the inconvenience and be at a loss to see where the neighbors and other friends found room to listen to a sermon. On Easter Sunday in the year 1755, Rev. Lille, a Moravian minister, preached in his house and baptized a son of Franz and Salome Clewell with the name Francis and a son of George and Anna Maria Clewell with the name John. The occasion, having been announced previously, was largely

attended. He was a member of the building committee of both the first church in Schoeneck and also of the second.

During the time that services were held in his house an incident happened which may illustrate the anxieties and dangers of those times. In 1759 an infant son of Franz and Salome Clewell died and the graveyard at Schoeneck not being laid out they were obliged to bury in the graveyard of the Nazareth Congregation. This graveyard is located on the highest point in the vicinity of Nazareth and is generally, although a misnomer, called "the Indian Graveyard." On the day of interment the men deemed it prudent to carry their arms on account of possible attacks from hostile Indians which often threatened the people on funeral occasions. To these same dangers the worshippers exposed themselves while services were held in Franz's house and during more critical times. The Indian insurrection of 1755 was general throughout the country and the name of Franz Clewell with his family appears among the refugees at the Rose Inn and also at the Whitfield House, Nazareth.

In his younger years, he was steward in the Schoeneck Congregation and enjoyed the fullest confidence and respect of all the members as well as of the entire community in which he lived. His married life of more than fifty-two years was full of happiness, mingled with great cares and anxieties. He possessed a vigorous constitution and good health until old age but in the autumn of 1797 he began to fail visibly, being affected by dropsy. He lingered until January 24, 1798, at four P. M. when he died. He is buried in the Schoeneck graveyard.

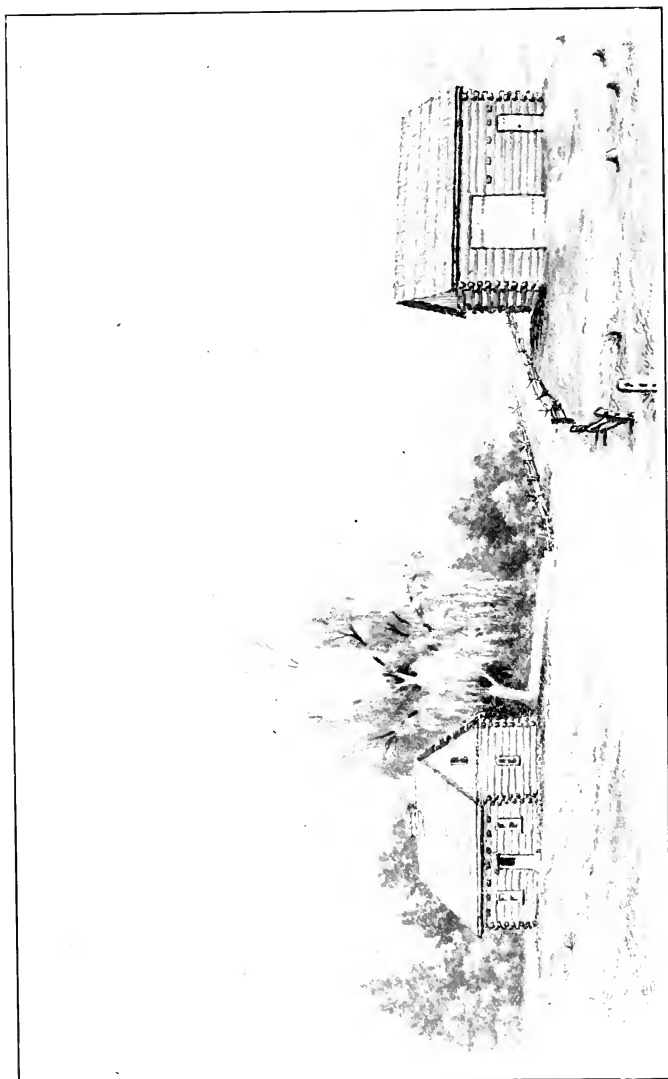

Langensteinbach, April 30, 1737.

The foregoing is a literal translation of the baptismal certificate from the German of George Craft Clewell. He was born at Auerbach, Durlach, Baden, and baptized and raised in the Reformed Church. In his fourth year his father died and in his eleventh year, he, in company with his mother and older brother, Fanz, made the journey across the Atlantic to America, landing at Philadelphia, October 5, 1737. On their arrival he likewise

became a "Redemptioner" to pay for his passage across the ocean and served about five years in a button-factory in the city. After his term of service he became a member of the colony which had settled in the Oley Hills where his mother and older brother and future wife lived. We are not told what he did while he lived in the colony. He was married on the sixteenth of October, 1750, to Maria Kuechley, who was a sister of the wife of Franz Clewell. She was born in Neureuth, Durlach, Baden, on the twenty-sixth day of August, 1726. She came to America with her father and sisters on the ship William, John Carter, master, and landed at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on October 1, 1737. The voyage being considered a calm one, yet one of the sixty-six Palatinates which embarked at Rotterdam was drowned while two were sick. Upon landing in Philadelphia they proceeded toward Manatany and settled in Oley. Here she also served as "redemptioner" for nearly five years—(Wo sie gegen funf jahre fur ihre fathrt diente). She was brought up in the Lutheran church. After their marriage they moved to the frontier of the Moravian settlements and for two years lived with Franz Clewell, where the two brothers met the two sisters for the third time and every time in different and new conditions or environment. First as children in Auerbach, second in Oley as immigrants and third as married people in the place which was destined to become the battle-grounds of their careers.

While they were living with his brother, he was busily engaged in building a house on a tract of land which he had acquired by patent, dated December 31, 1766, called "Nombra-de-Dios," containing 118 acres and 126 perches and situated about four miles north-west of Nazareth and about one mile east of the present village of Moorestown. To this tract he added another of $200\frac{3}{4}$ acres, called "Antigna" for which he paid 5£ 16s. The patent is dated April 12, 1790, and the tract lies along the Bushkill Creek, adjoining his brother's tract toward the east.

This plantation was occupied by them for more than forty years and their privations may easily be imagined when we consider the fact that they were on the extreme frontier. In connection with his farming he did considerable trading with the Indians and having acquired some knowledge of medicine and surgery he was frequently called upon by his neighbors as well as the Red

Men to relieve them of their bodily ills. Tradition has it that at one time a big stalwart Indian came to him with a toothache while out upon his fields, and, sending for his hook with which he extracted the teeth, he told the Indian to sit upon a stump and then and there performed the operation while the Indian screamed for pain. Thus it may be noted that George was more a man of affairs which trait, no doubt, was largely acquired during his youthful days which he spent in the city as a redemptioner. On several occasions his brother intended to give him his fraternal advice in regard to the best methods of farming, etc., to which he made reply: "You farm as you like best; I prefer to trade with the Indians; that pays better than the best of farming." But with all his intercourse with the Indians which would make it seem possible to securely gain the friendship of the Indians, he considered himself a common foe in the time of insurrections. He and his family were among the refugees on several occasions at the Rose Inn about a mile north of Nazareth and during the insurrection of 1755, they had fled to the Whitfield House, Nazareth, where his son, Daniel, was born. It certainly must have been a unique sight to see the men go out in companies at the break of day each morning during these times to look after their homes and cattle. They were fully armed and never knew how they might be ambushed by the Indians.

Although being a busy man on his farm and trading with the Indians, he did not neglect his religious duties. When, in 1754, a petition of the settlers was sent to the Moravians, the name of George Clewell appears second and he attended the services of the Moravian missionaries in the house of Franz Clewell regularly and was also active in assisting at the building of the churches at Schoeneck. On October 3, 1762, the day of the dedication of the first church and school-house, he became a member of the Society and the following year a full member. He partook of the Holy Communion for the first time in 1765 having been denied the privilege sooner because "lot" being against him. On the Easter Sunday of 1755 while worshipping in the house of his brother, their son, John, was baptized by Rev. Lille, and in 1762 they buried a son, Abraham, on the old Nazareth cemetery when the men went with their rifles on account of the dangers from the Indians.

His obituary adds—that he was permitted in the Providence of

God to become identified with the Brethren's (Moravian) Church which he regarded as a special mark of grace from the Lord, expressing himself most gratefully during his last illness.

He lived in married life for forty-three years, and at the time of his death had thirty-one grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. Although the family had already spread considerably, he expressed his great pleasure that all of his children were united with the church, the welfare of whom he always had at heart and was anxious that they should walk in the foot-steps of their Lord and not in the ways of the world. He was highly esteemed and well-beloved by all who knew him and was noted for his industry and uprightness and as a peace-loving citizen. He died from the effects of dropsy at 7 A. M., on May 6, 1793, at his homestead. His sufferings were greatly overshadowed by the tender care of his wife and children and he appreciated the sympathy of his neighbors and friends.

He, like his brother, Franz, was also successful in his acquisitions. The value of his property together with his occupation in 1780, according to the list of taxables of Northampton County, was 335£, being only 22£ less than that of his brother, and his estate was appraised at a little more than nine thousand dollars. In his last will and testament, he left to the use and management of his wife, Anna Maria, for life, all his real and personal property excepting only so much personal property as would be sufficient to pay his just debts and funeral expenses; that after her death, all his property should be sold at public auction and equally divided, share and share alike, among his eleven children deducting out of the shares or parts of Elizabeth Clauss the sum of twenty pounds which was to be divided among the ten. The will is dated May 24, 1791, and named his two sons, Jacob and George, as executors and was witnessed by William Henry, Melchoir Christ and Joachim Wigman. Later there was a codicil to the will in which he precludes and bars George Clauss from receiving any part of the estate thus placing the share of Elizabeth in trust. This action was taken not because of any particular ill-feeling against his son-in-law but rather in justice to his children since he had aided George Clauss through the unfortunate times while in partnership in business and which, it was understood, should be paid back but death intervened too soon.

A release of Elizabeth Clauss, wife of George Clauss, to the Executors shows that she released the Executors for her share by settling the account and receiving 100£ for her share. The share of each of the other ten children was 170£ 2s.

The widow having possession and control of all of his possessions during her natural life, remained on the farm for about four years after his death when her children built a house for her at Schoeneck and on August 9, 1797, she moved into it. Her daughter, Salome, going with her and attending her during the rest of her life. On April 22, 1805, the widow released her rights in the Will to the executors and the estate could be divided. On August 26, 1808, the occasion of her birthday anniversary, her children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren gathered at her home which pleased her very much and for the last time she saw her whole family together. The infirmities of old age were clearly manifested, particularly her hearing made it difficult to speak to her and she was fast declining. In the following spring, on March 19, 1809, she died at 9 A. M., at the ripe age of 82 years, 6 months and 20 days. She had 69 grandchildren and 19 great-grandchildren.

Biographical
Sketches.



NOTE.

The wisdom of preserving in some form or another the deeds of one's life has been exemplified by many a historian. Through it, many persons saw the means which others employed to raise themselves from poverty and obscurity. The simple story of "when you were a boy" is not likely to have a bad influence on future generations. With these objects in view, we requested the descendants of Franz and George Clewell in a circular letter, to submit their story.

It should be understood that no attempt has been made to write a biography of those deceased, in the second and third generations, since in many cases, we only had the obituary records.

By way of explanation it may be proper to say that the numbers in parentheses refer to the family in the geneological part of the history, where in many cases the dates of birth and death and to whom married, have to be found.

BIOGRAPHIES.

JOHN CLEWELL.

John Clewell (13), a son of George and Anna Maria Clewell, was born in Bushkill Township on his father's plantation. He received the rudiments of his education in the Parochial school at Schoeneck. After his marriage to his first wife who died in 1800, they moved on a farm near Bethlehem. His second wife, Lea Heil, died in 1819. He was the happy grand-father of thirty-three children at the time of his death. He is buried on the Moravian graveyard at Bethlehem.

DANIEL CLEWELL.

Daniel Clewell (14), a son of George and Anna Maria Clewell, was born at the Ephrata House, Nazareth, whither the family had fled during the Indian Insurrection in 1755. He was married to Susan Klein on December 11, 1782 and thereafter lived at Schoeneck. He was a life-long member of the church there and was active in building the church of 1793. He was a linen-weaver by trade and his industry made it possible for him to retire in 1818. His wife died in 1829 and both are buried at Schoeneck.

JOSEPH CLEWELL.

Joseph Clewell (16) was born on the pioneer settlement of his father, George, near Moorestown, Pa. He received the rites of baptism in the Moravian Church at Schoeneck and on July 8, 1781, was received into the church and in 1785 became a communicant member. His father taught him to weave and to farm. Besides his, now uncommon, schooling, it should be remembered that he experienced the fleeing of the family to places of safety on account of Indian Insurrections. He was married in Bethlehem, Pa., on July 7, 1790, to Magdalena Knauss who was born at Emaus, on September 3, 1761. After his marriage he moved to Emaus, Pa., where they began housekeeping, he following his trade. On July 10, 1803, his wife died and on May 27, 1804, married for the second time. He continued to live at Emaus where he died and is buried in the Moravian graveyard. He reached the ripe age of nearly seventy-two years.

LEWIS B. CLEWELL.

Lewis B. Clewell (140) was born in Millgrove now Aluta, Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. His boyhood days were spent in attending the district school and assisting his father on his farm and in the weaving shop. On arriving at the age of youth he became an apprentice of his trade, namely, cabinetmaking. He learned his trade with Messrs. Luckenbach and Belling in Bethlehem.

While in Bethlehem he took advantage of his opportunities and added to his schooling which he had received in his childhood. He also continued his music, the rudiments of which he had acquired at Schoeneck. Being studious, he naturally strengthened those qualities of mind and character which made for his success in later life.

At the outbreak of the Civil War, he left the comforts of home and went forth as a defender of his country. He enlisted as a private in Company I, One Hundred Fifty-third Regiment, Pennsylvania Infantry. At the battle of Chancellorsville he was captured by the Confederates and taken to the Libby War Prison in Richmond, the capital of the Confederacy. After a few weeks of confinement he was paroled and brought to Camp Convalescent near Washington, D. C. He was First Corporal of his Company.

On his return from the war, he made his place of residence in his native village and followed carpentry. He also became the organist of the Plainfield Church which position he held for several years and then resigned only to accept a similar position in the church at Bushkill Center whither he had moved. He was connected with that part of church work for 26 years.

He was married in 1865, and while living at Bushkill Center, he became a partner with his brother-in-law, Julius C. Friebele, in the general merchandise business for five years. He organized a Sunday School in the congregation of his village and the flourishing and prosperous condition in which he relinquished the superintendency of the school after nineteen consecutive years, is evidence of his efficiency.

In 1887, he conceived the idea of uniting the church choirs of Northampton County for the purpose of promoting church music, especially the chorals. He met with a hearty response.

and has been honored with the presidency of the Association since its organization.

In 1802, he moved with his family to Bethlehem, where he still resides. As a means of employing his time which he always considered valuable he began "tuning" pianos and organs. He, at once, became popular in that art as the eagerness of the people to employ him would show.

Among his many works of "love," but not the least, is the Clewell Family History. The undertaking was a stupendous one, which, if realized at the beginning might have proven fatal to the history. But, like his co-laborer in this work, Rev. Lewis P. Clewell, he felt that his ancestors were worthy of honor, besides being prompted by the feeling that many of the descendants were unconscious of their kinship. He suggested the idea of a history, which was promptly accepted and the work begun.

At times, the outlook of the history was anything but encouraging. The voyage of the two progenitors was only typical of the course of the history. But with a determination and resolution which are characteristics of its author, he pressed forward, without a shadow of hope of a pecuniary reward, but to accomplish his coveted end. In this he deserves the applause of his kinsfolk.

Mr. Clewell has been a lifelong and zealous Moravian. In his youth he was confirmed in the Schoeneck Moravian Church and held membership there until he moved to Bethlehem, when he had the same transferred. Being useful in any part of church work, and having the confidence and respect of the people he was asked to become a member of the Building Committee in the erection of the church at Bushkill Center, which is a Union Congregation and when the church at Schoeneck was to be built he was also chosen. Many other positions of trust might be named, but they would only add to what has already been said.

MARIA MAGDALENA CLEWELL.

Maria Magdalena Clewell (2) was born in Oley. While in her infancy her parents moved to their possessions near Nazareth. She was never married, living mostly in Sisters' Houses among the Moravians and nursing the sick. She was noted for her kindness. She is buried at Lititz, Lancaster County, Penna.



REV. LEWIS PHILIP CLEWELL.

Rev. Lewis Philip Clewell (284) was born at Schoeneck, Penn. He received his early education in the public schools and was confirmed a member of the Moravian Church in Schoeneck. He at first, proposed to devote his life to a business career. Accordingly, in 1857, he entered a dry goods store at Reading, Pa., as clerk but after a few years gave up his position in order to accept a position in the Weltburger office at Easton, Pa.

He was making good progress in this new situation, for besides attaining proficiency as a compositor, he was beginning to do acceptable work as a writer for the papers connected with the office. The conviction, however, which he had long felt that he ought to preach the Gospel was all the while growing deeper

and led him in the autumn of 1861, to leave Easton and enter the Theological Seminary at Bethlehem.

After a two years course in this institution, in the summer of 1863, he enlisted as a member of the Thirty-fourth Pennsylvania Militia. His military service was brief. After receiving an honorable discharge, he entered upon the duties of teacher in the Nazareth Military Academy at Nazareth.

While at the Nazareth Hall he offered his services to the governing board of the Moravian Church to go to some foreign place as a missionary. His services were accepted and he was assigned to go to the West Indies. But the needs of the church at home were pressed upon him to which he yielded. On November 19, 1865, he was ordained a Deacon in the Moravian Church and soon afterward started for his first charge which was i. Moravia, Iowa. That he had not mistaken his calling, the success which attended the work in his various pastorates is sufficient evidence.

During the thirty nine years of his ministry, he served eight different charges, built seven churches, three parsonages, organized six congregations, extensively repaired four churches and three parsonages, besides being instrumental in bringing many into the membership of the church. He was a man of great determination and untiring energy. His appointment to a charge was generally regarded as a signal for a forward move in that charge.

On May 16, 1867, he was united in marriage to Miss Sarah Backensderfer of Gnadenhutten, Ohio, who proved in every way well qualified to uphold his hands in his chosen calling.

He felt that he had just cause to be proud of his ancestry, and for years had cherished the hope of some day being able to produce a history of the Clewell family. While located at South Bethlehem, circumstances seemed to adjust themselves for carrying out his long deferred plan.

Lewis B. Clewell (see 140) had in the meanwhile located in Bethlehem who also entertained similar intentions. (For further account see Preface and Account of Reunions). The circumstances of his death were characteristic of the energy and determination displayed throughout his entire life. Although suffering with a heavy cold he persisted in conducting the services for

New Year's Eve as is customary among Moravians. Two days later, he was taken with a chill, which speedily developed into pneumonia and on January 9, 1904, he died. The funeral services were conducted by bishops Levering and Oerter and he was buried in Niskey Hill Cemetery, Bethlehem, with full military honors as a member of Robert Oldham Post, G. A. R. of which he was chaplain.

SIDNEY A. CLEWELL.

Sidney A. Clewell (108) was born at Schoeneck, Pa., opposite the church. He acquired the rudiments of an education in the public schools and in the Nazareth Parochial schools. During his youth he inclined to the business life which he entered after his marriage in 1836 to Cecelia Haman. He conducted a general merchandise store in Centreville and Stockertown, Northampton County, Pa. Later, he was prominently connected with the charcoal blast furnace in Jacobsburg generally known as the "Forge." This enterprise was established in 1808. In 1852, he moved to Philadelphia where he held the position of Agent for the Lehigh Transportation Company for a number of years. In his advanced age he relinquished his duties with that company and engaged in the cement and plaster business which he followed until his death. He is buried at Philadelphia.

ARMINA EMILIE BOERSTLER.

Araminta Emilie Boerstler (112) was born in Nazareth, Pa., and was raised in that town. On reaching maturity she married James Boerstler. They moved to Philadelphia, Pa., where he was employed on the street-railroads. She died in that city and her remains were brought to Nazareth and interred in the Moravian graveyard.

ALEXANDER B. STEINER.

Alexander B. Steiner (269) was born in Filetown, a village near Schoeneck, Pa. He received his education in the Schoeneck Moravian Parochial School. Later, he became a member of the congregation. He learned the lock-filing trade with his father and followed it until old age. He was married to Clarinda E. Snyder who preceded him into eternity after which he made his home with his son, Tilghman. He is buried at Kreidersville on the Zion's Stone Church cemetery.

WILSON D. SEYFRIED.

Wilson D. Seyfried (1862) was born at Millgrove, now Aluta, a small village not far from Schoeneck, Pa. His education began with work on his father's farm and attending the public schools during the winter months. At thirteen, he was employed in his uncle's general merchandise store and later clerked for C. H. Mohn and Son. At sixteen he entered the teaching profession which he followed ever since and is now employed in the Bethlehem Public Schools as teacher and Principal of a building.

The religious instructions that he received in his boyhood were not in vain. He is greatly interested in Sunday School and Church work, having been instrumental in organizing two Sunday Schools and has held various church offices.

Socially, he is connected with the I. O. O. F., of which he had the honor of being the installing officer of his District for several years, and a member of Star Encampment, I. O. O. F., of which he has the Grand Patriarch Degree, and a member of Lehigh Council, Royal Arcanum.

ELIZABETH CLAUSS.

Elizabeth Clauss (12) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. She, being the oldest daughter of George Clewell (3) whose plantation was not far from Moorestown, received her first lessons for life on the frontier. She was married to George Clauss, Junior, of Schoeneck in 1773, whose father built the first house in that village. George Clauss, Senior, was an emigrant from Bohemia. After their marriage, they began housekeeping at Schoeneck where he was a prosperous shoemaker. About the year 1780, Mr. Clauss, with a partner, entered into the business of buying horses and selling them in the markets of Philadelphia. His partner proved to be dishonest and he lost heavily through the operation so that he was forced to begin life anew. He became an immigrant of Stokes County, North Carolina, in 1783 and later she followed him with the children, making the journey from Schoeneck, Pa., to Stokes County, N. C., on horse-back according to well founded tradition. After being settled in their new home, he worked at his trade as shoemaker and with the assistance of his sons tilled a small farm in the suburbs of what is now the city of Winston-

Salem, N. C. Misfortunes, however, pursued them and the bright sun of success which they evidently saw at the beginning of their married life never appeared again. Being but a middle aged man, he died in 1806, leaving a widow with her nine children to meet the struggles of life. Her troubles must have seemed to her endless as two of her children had died of smallpox and now was left alone far away from her immediate relatives.

But the sterling qualities of her character manifested themselves in action. Elizabeth Clauss outlived her husband many years and always being homesick, visited her relatives in Schoeneck, Pennsylvania, in her old age probably 75 years or more, making the journey both ways on foot and alone.

She was generously received by her brothers and sisters who shared with her in the division of her father's estate (See Will of George Clewell) receiving several hundred dollars which she kept intact against her funeral expenses. She was married a second time, to Jacob Frederick Lagenauer in 1807 with whom she had no children. She died at the ripe old age of 81 years, 6 months and 3 days and is buried at the Friedland Moravian Church, N. C. At the time of her death she had 53 grand-children and 31 great-grand-children.

CHRISTINA FULKERSON.

Christina Fulkerson (38) was born in Schoeneck, Penna. She united with the Moravian Church there in 1816. In 1818, she married Philip Fulkerson with whom she lived till 1824, when he died. They always resided in her natal village. Both were active in the welfare of their church.

ELIZABETH MIKSCH.

Elizabeth Miksch (71) was born in Schoeneck, Penn. On April 11, 1820, she was married to Joseph Miksch who built the first iron foundry in the Lehigh Valley in the Spring of 1824. After a brief married life of a little over four years, her husband died, Aug. 17, 1824, before he had started the newly built foundry. She sold her interests in Bethlehem and moved to Nazareth where she lived for nearly seventy years a widow. She died at Nazareth and is buried there. She reached the age of 95 years, 3 months and 17 days.



CHARLES WILLIAM LOUX.

Charles William Loux, Esq., A. M. (1864). Nothing is left now of the old tannery at Millgrove where the subject of this sketch learned, perhaps reluctantly, his first lessons in industry. The half day fishing trips to the Bushkill that alternated regularly with the monotonous task at the bark mill furnished the necessary relief, and afforded an opportunity for an appreciation of nature, which had a lasting effect on his life.

The training of Christian parents, the influences of the old red school house, and of Sunday school, in boyhood, prepared the subject of this sketch for a rather early start in the graver duties of life.

At the age of thirteen, Mr. Loux learned the trade of dressing roofing slate, which he followed for two summers, and also later during his college vacations.

At fifteen, he began to teach, and taught four years in the public schools of Northampton Co., also one spring term at Steinsville, in Lehigh County.

His vacations and spare time, evenings, during this period were spent in preparing for college, under the direction of private tutors.

In 1888, he entered Lafayette College, Easton, Pa., from which institution he graduated with honor in 1892, receiving the degree of A. B. The degree of A. M. was conferred upon him in 1895.

After graduation, Mr. Loux was principal of Path Valley Academy, Franklin Co., Pa., for three years, after which, in 1895, he removed to Erie, Pa., where he became teacher of classics and mathematics in Erie Academy.

In 1896, as a result of a civil-service examination, Mr. Loux was appointed a stenographer in the Steamboat-Inspection Service of the Government at Pittsburg, Pa., and two years later was promoted and transferred to a similar position at Providence, R. I., which position he still holds.

Mr. Loux has shown considerable activity in the line of literature. He began to write verse at an early age. Some of his verses have appeared in *The Moravian*, *The Easton Free Press*, *The Lafayette*, *The Golden Rule*, and other publications.

He was editor-in-chief of his college paper, *The Lafayette*, and contributed to that magazine both prose and verse, some of his verse being extensively copied in the college exchanges. He also contributed most of the verse found in his college year book, *The Melange*, and at the commencement exercises was the class-day poet.

In 1902, there were published two small volumes of verse from his pen: "White Ribbons—Temperance Verse," and "Carmineella—College and Other Verse."

In October, 1904, he was admitted to the bar of the State of Rhode Island.

A firm believer in the whole Bible, a lover of all Christians, though an opponent of creeds and churchianity, he is no longer connected with any denominational body, but worships regularly with, and ministers to, an undenominational congregation of believers, at Auburn, R. I.

To a faithful wife (also a Clewell, as the History shows), to whom he was married in 1893, he credits much of his attainments and happiness in later life. Already a rather numerous posterity of the Clewell variety is rising to call her blessed.



ANNA CATHERINE LEVERING EBBECKE.

Anna Catherine Levering Ebbecke (18) was born in Plainfield Township now Bushkill, Northampton County, Pa. The Indian insurrections during her childhood made lasting impressions upon her and in many ways prepared her for later life. On January 5, 1791, she married Joseph Levering with whom she had three children when he died. She moved into the Widows' House in Nazareth with her children where she lived for a few years when in 1799 she married John Christian Ebbecke. Mr. Ebbecke was born in Moeringen, Germany. His father who was a soldier expected his son, John, to follow military life but this was unfavorable to his mother who taught him the beauties of civil life; he, therefore, was allowed to learn tailoring. While in his youth his mother died and on the return of his father from the mother's funeral he lay down, complaining ill, and within a few hours died leaving the young man an orphan.

Shortly afterwards he became acquainted with the Moravian Church in Casel and joined the same in Niskey, where he remained for five years as tailor in the Single Brethren's house. He

came to Nazareth, Pennsylvania, in 1795 and lived in the Brethren's House and took charge of the tailoring. In 1799, he applied to the Moravian Church in Nazareth for a wife, it, then, being the custom of that church to make the selection by "lot." The name of some single sisters were suggested to him but he replied, "I would have none except the widow with the three children." The wish was granted and after their marriage they moved to Schoeneck but in the Fall of the same year built a house in Friedenthal now Niskey which he named. Their wedded life was a happy one until her death. She is buried at Schoeneck and the widower was married a second time.

Christian Clewell (19) was born in Bushkill Township. His wife was born in Lancaster and came to Nazareth in 1798 and married that same year. After their marriage, they moved to Niskey, a village near Nazareth. He was a farmer and linen weaver. Both are buried on the Schoeneck Moravian graveyard.

NATHANIEL CLEWELL.

*Nathaniel Clewell (2) a son of Franz and Salome Clewell. died in his infancy and at the interment in 1759, the men went with their rifles on account of the dangers from the Indians. The child was buried on the old Nazareth cemetery, commonly known as "Indian Cemetery."

JULIANNA CLEWELL.

*Julianna Clewell (2) second youngest daughter of Franz and Salome Clewell was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. She united with the Moravian Church at Schoeneck in 1781. In her thirteenth year she lost her right hand through an accident at a cider-press. In 1798, she moved to Nazareth with her mother, whom she nursed until her death. She then moved into the Sisters' House in that town. Although having lost her hand, she was very skilful in knitting stockings and mittens or gloves. She was noted as a friend of small children. Her nephew, Thomas Clewell, began playing the church organ at Schoeneck when a mere boy and the congregation worshiped in those times during the winter months without fire, whereupon the boy complained of cold hands when, out of sympathy, she made for him a pair of fine silk gloves. In 1831, she met with another accident, this time breaking her left arm. She suffered an apoplectic stroke in 1844, from which she never recovered. She is buried in the Nazareth Moravian graveyard.



CHRISTINA CLEWELL.

Christina Clewell (17) was born at Schoeneck, Penna., and was the youngest child of a prominent pioneer Moravian family. She attended the school established in the house that was built by the founders of the first church in that village. Both her parents died of typhoid fever during the same week, leaving her an orphan at the age of nine years. She was taken by her aunt Mrs. John Christian Ebbecke of Niskey and after their death she resided with her sister, Rebecca Hoeber, of Nazareth and later with Augusta O. Ricksecker of the same place. In 1902, she took apartments in the Moravian Sisters' House, on Church Street, Bethlehem, where she spent her last years. She retained a remarkable degree of physical strength to within a few years of her death when she was virtually helpless but her mental faculties remained remarkably clear to the end. She lived to see the great progress that our country made and because of her retentive memory and fluency in speech, she proved very interesting to

company. She was the last of the third generation to depart from this life and with Abraham Klewell (97) of Philadelphia, were the only of the third generation to see the beginning of the Clewell Family History and both were amazed at the size of the family and manifested great interest in the work.

A week before her death she was taken ill and the infirmities of old age began to tell on her constitution and keen senses. Her life ebbed away calmly at the venerable age of 99 years, 5 months and 13 days. She is buried at Nazareth.

ROSINA CLEWELL.

Rosina Clewell (2), a daughter of Franz and Salome Clewell, was born in Bushkill Township. She was affiliated with the Moravian Church all her lifetime and after the death of her parents she moved into the Sisters' House at Nazareth. She never was married. She is buried in the Nazareth Moravian graveyard.

SALOMA CLEWELL.

Saloma Clewell (2), a daughter of Franz and Salome Clewell, was born in Bushkill Township and died at Nazareth where she is buried on the Moravian graveyard. She was never married and lived in the Sisters' House, Nazareth.

ABRAHAM CLEWELL.

Abraham Clewell (3), a son of George and Anna Maria Clewell, was born in Bushkill Township and died in infancy. The child was buried on the old Moravian cemetery commonly known as "Indian Cemetery." At the interment the men went with their rifles on account of the dangers from the Indians.

SALOME M. CLEWELL.

Salome M. Clewell (3), was born in Bushkill Township. She was confirmed in Schoeneck, in 1780 and became a member of that congregation. She moved into the Sisters' House, at Nazareth in 1809, where she lived until her death. She was never married and is buried on the Nazareth Moravian graveyard.

ELIZABETH KOEHLER.

Elizabeth Koehler (4), second daughter of Franz Clewell was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Penna. She was married to Leonard Koehler, of near Bethlehem, on the 21st of April, 1772. Soon after their marriage, they moved to Leban-

on, Pa., where he was engaged in the wagon-making business. They made frequent visits to her parents. On September 10, 1812, he died in his 67th year, leaving her a widow for about six years. Both were members of the Moravian Church and are buried in the Moravian Cemetery, at Lebanon, Pa.

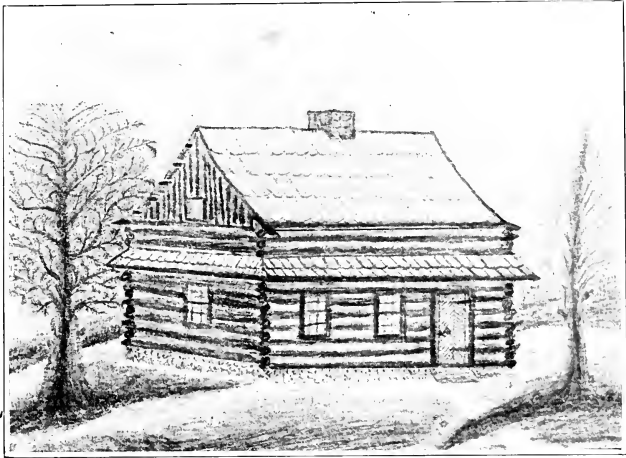

Abraham Clewell (20) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. Of his youth very little is known. He was a cabinet maker by trade and after his marriage lived in Philadelphia where he carried on the business very successfully. He is buried at Philadelphia.

CATHARINE HECKEDORN.

Catharine Heckedorn (5), was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. After her marriage, they moved to York, Pa., where she died and is buried.



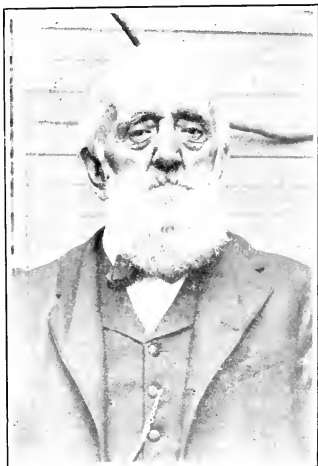

FRANCIS CLEWELL.

Francis Clewell (8) was born in Millgrove, now Aluta, Northampton County, Pa., and attended the Parochial school at Schoeneck. In 1776, he erected a house for himself on the hill on the west bank of the Bushkill Creek known as the Swiss House. It stood about a fourth of a mile to the south-west of his father's house. He was married to Anna Elizabeth Weinland in the year 1785, who was born in Gnadenthal. He was a weaver by trade but after his marriage he followed farming and cleared much of his farm of the woods. He was a life-long member of the Schoeneck Moravian Church and much respected among his friends and neighbors. He was talented and skillful. He died in his 64th year and is buried at Schoeneck. His wife is buried at the same place.

ARTHUR GEORGE CLEWELL.

Arthur George Clewell (732) is employed by a grocery firm in Waverly, Iowa, but possesses considerable property in Oklahoma, where he lived for several years and then returned to the above place.

HIS WIFE, ELLEN.

Abraham Klewell (97) was born in Philadelphia. After leaving the pay schools, he served apprenticeship with his father as a wood-turner but never followed that trade. He became a stationary engineer which he followed all his life. He is buried at Philadelphia. [He was one of two of the third generation that was privileged to hear of the beginning of the Clewell history and also of the first reunion. Although, at first doubting that he belonged to the family since he spelled his name with a K instead of a C, but upon investigation he found that his father had written his name with a C in his marriage certificate. Ed.]

NATHANIEL CLEWELL.

Nathaniel Clewell (9) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. He spent most of his youth in the family of his sister, Elizabeth Koehler, at Lebanon where he learned the wheelwright trade. He returned to Schoeneck where he labored diligently and met with success. He was married on May 24, 1790. He was a life-long member of the Moravian church at Schoeneck and very active and influential in the affairs of the congregation, especially so, in building the second church, that of 1793.

He secured an organ for that church and organized a trombone choir. He educated his sons in music with the intention that they should carry on, after his death, what he had organized. He was the organist of the church for many years without remuneration. He met death through an accident while on a trip to the north side of the Blue Mountains for planks and while on his way home on a moonlight night in descending a hill a part of his wagon broke which threw him under the wheels and he expired soon afterward. He is buried on the Schoeneck Moravian graveyard.

ANNA DOROTHEA KREUSER.

Anna Dorothea Kreuser (10) was born in Plainfield Township now Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Penna. She was a pupil of the Moravian School at Schoeneck. She was married at Nazareth on Nov. 10, 1799 to Conrad Kreuser, who was born March 14, 1763 in Holzmaden near Kuchheim in Wurtemberg. He emigrated to America in 1795. In the year 1800, they left Nazareth and moved to Winston-Salem where he became the overseer of the finances of the Moravian Church. He was a widower for nearly five years. Both are buried in the Moravian Cemetery at Salem, N. C.

JACOB CLEWELL.

Jacob Clewell (11) was born in Bushkill Township, while his parents George and Anna Maria Clewell were living with Franz Clewell. After his marriage, they moved on a farm near Bethlehem where he prospered. He is buried on the Moravian graveyard at Bethlehem.

ANNA JOHANNA ECKENSBERGER.

Anna Johanna Eckensberger (26) was born at Schoeneck, Pa., where she resided up to her seventh year when her parents moved to Nazareth, Pa.

On Easter Sunday, April 7, 1817, she was married to John Jacob Eckensberger, a widower with whom she lived for forty two years. For thirteen years she was a widow and lived in the Sisters' House, Nazareth.

The day before her death, she spent in working at her accustomed employment but felt somewhat ill in the evening. That

night she slept little and complained the next morning and died that same day at 9 A. M.

She was of a quiet disposition, not making much ado about anything, and of a contented mind which had its origin in her love to her Saviour. A particular trait of her character was that she always wished not to be troublesome to others by and through her own troubles.



F. THOMAS CLEWELL AND WIFE.

F. Thomas Clewell (36) was born in Schoeneck, Pa., and received the customary education of the Moravian Church. In his youth he learned the wagon-making trade with his father and after his death conducted his father's business with equally good success. He married on December 13, 1818, and soon afterward bought the homestead of his father and lived in Schoeneck throughout his lifetime. At the end of forty-five years of married life in 1863, his wife died. Both of them belonged

to the Schoeneck Moravian Church and he was organist for more than forty-six years without any remuneration. He was compelled to relinquish his place at the organ on account of his failing eye-sight which continued until he was almost blind. In June 1863 he had an operation performed on his eyes which restored partial sight but never to such a degree that he could see well. On one occasion when quite an old man, he attended Thanksgiving Day services and hearing the choir render a selection he could not restrain himself and made up his mind that he would sing with the choir during the following holidays. He died of pneumonia and is buried at Schoeneck.

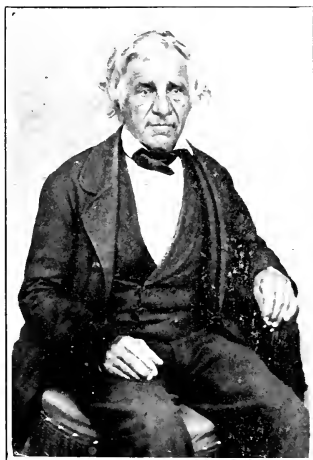


PAUL SIEGFRIED AND WIFE, JOHANNA.

Johanna Maria Siegfried (35) was born in Millgrove, Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Penn. She attended the Moravian Parochial School at Schoeneck. In her youth, she was confirmed and became a member of the church there. On

March 20, 1814, she was married to Paul Siegfried, who was born in Berks County, Pa. He was a soldier in the War of 1812 against Great Britain. He was a musician in the Third Company, First Rifle Regiment, Northampton County Volunteers.

They were popular and prosperous farmers in her native township, besides doing considerable work as a millwright and carpenter. He was a charter member of the Mutual Fire Insurance Company of Northampton County and held several county and township offices. They lived in matrimony for more than fifty-two years. Both are buried at Schooneck.

J. Philip Clewell (70) was born at Schooneck, Pa. He attended the Parochial School at Schooneck, which was discontinued during his school days, and he went to Nazareth. On arriving at the proper age he was given his trade that of a locksmith which he followed during his entire life. He married Anna Maria Roth, a grand-daughter of a missionary among the Indians, on the 13th of October, 1816.

They lived for the greater part of their lives on the hill north of the grave-yard. They lived in matrimony for over fifty-five years. Both were members of the church at Schooneck. He took an active part in the affairs of that church and as a member of the church orchestra played a French horn, as well as a trombone. Both are buried at Schooneck.

J. SAMUEL CLEWELL.

J. Samuel Clewell (34) was born at Millgrove, now Aluta, Northampton County, Pennsylvania. He received the rudiments of an education in the Moravian Parochial school at Schoeneck. In 1814, he enlisted as a private soldier in the First Rifle Regiment, Third Company, Northampton County, Pennsylvania Volunteers, in the second war with Great Britain generally known as the War of 1812. The company was stationed at Marcus Hook, south of Philadelphia, on the Delaware River, to protect that city from the menace of the British Lion. When the war receded to other parts, the company was mustered out of service and our subject returned to his parents. In the year 1816, he was married to Catharine Hahn and began house-keeping and farming on his father's farm. After his father's death he bought a part of his father's tract and erected a dwelling house and other necessary buildings and continued farming. He was a linen-weaver by trade. He made it his principal livelihood and followed it to within a few years of his death.

He became a widower through the death of his wife, leaving to his fatherly care a large family of children. In 1851, he married Mrs. Susan Brinker, nee Wilhelm, a widow. He was a life-long resident of his native village and of a quiet disposition. He was affectionate but firm to his children and endeavored to impress them with the beautiful in life. After his children had left his roof, it was his custom to pay them regular visits. He visited his son, Francis, then living near Bellefonte, Center County, Pa., several times, making the journey on foot a distance of about 150 miles. He was a life-long member of the Schoeneck Moravian Church, the welfare of which he watched with tender care. He and his first wife are buried at Schoeneck.

PHILLIPPINE MILLER.

Phillippine Miller (33), the oldest child of Francis Clewell, was born in Millgrove, now Aluta, Northampton County, Pa. She was brought up under the instruction of the Moravian Church. She married George Miller who was of German descent and a weaver by trade. Later they moved nearer to the Schoeneck Moravian Church of which they were active members. Both are buried in the graveyard at Schoeneck.



HENRY G. CLEWELL AND WIFE.

Henry G. Clewell (93) generally known among his neighbors and friends as "Swamp Henry" to distinguish him from the other Henrys, living in the vicinity of Schoeneck, lived on a small farm in Bushkill Township, and conducted a nursery. He was a lock-filer by trade. He was a devout Christian and a zealous member of the Moravian Church at Schoeneck. In his younger days, he was a member of the church orchestra. He and his wife are buried at Schoeneck.

ANNA ROSINA BECK.

Anna Rosina Beck (85) was born in Nazareth, Pa. She was educated in the Moravian schools and on February 18, 1816, was married to Ferdinand Jacob Beck. Both of them were devoted members of the Moravian church and life-long residents of Nazareth. Both are buried at Nazareth.



ELIZABETH WHITESELL.

Elizabeth Whitesell (24) was born in Plainfield, now Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Penn. She was baptized and confirmed in the Moravian Church at Schoeneck. On July 20, 1817, she was married to Andrew Whitesell, a widower, who came from Hope, N. J. For a short time, after her marriage, they lived at Mount Bethel, from whence they moved to Nazareth, in 1818. Both were members of the Moravian Church at Nazareth and are buried there.

JOHN CLEWELL.

John Clewell (6), was born in Plainfield, now Bushkill Township, Northampton Co., Penna. His boyhood was spent on his father's farm, clearing land, etc. He united with the Moravian Church at Schoeneck. On April 25, 1780, he married Anna Johanna Klein, who came from Saucon Township with her parents to Bushkill and where she became acquainted with the Moravian Church. In 1793, they took possession of a farm at Nazareth and there spent the rest of their pilgrimage. Of their nine children, eight survived their parents. Both parents died in the same year. He was known among his neighbors and friends as "Hannes" to distinguish him from the other John Clewells.



SARAH CLEWELL.

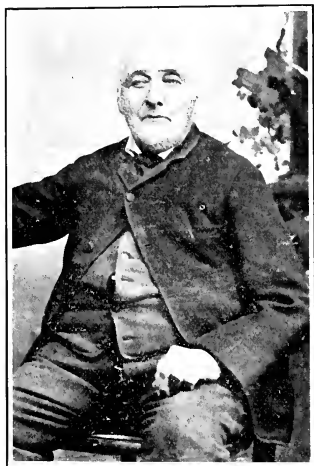
*Sarah Clewell (6) was born in Nazareth, Pa. She was a life-long member of the Moravian Church and for many years lived in the Sisters' House there. She is buried in Nazareth Moravian Graveyard.

ANNA MARIA DANKE.

Anna Maria Danke (7), a daughter of Franz and Salome Clewell, was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. She became a member of the Moravian Church at Schoeneck in 1773. She was married on October 12, 1779, and thereafter lived at Nazareth. Her husband died April 18, 1793. She was a widow for more than forty years. She is buried in the Nazareth Moravian graveyard.

JOSEPH CLEWELL.

Joseph Clewell, Jr., (75) was born at Emaus and was mostly engaged in farming near his native town. He enlisted in Company C, Forty-seventh Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers for the Civil War. He was captured by the Confederates and held as prisoner in Shreveport, La., where he died of a chronic disease contracted in the war.



HENRY J. CLEWELL.

Henry J. Clewell (167) was born in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. He received the rudiments of an education among the Moravians of his birthplace but at the early age of ten or twelve years, through the loss of his father by death, was forced to look about for his livelihood. A few years after the death of his father he went to Philadelphia, making the trip with the stage-coach, and there learned tailoring. After he had finished his term of service, he went to Mauch Chunk and there continued his trade in that flourishing town, engaged in the shipping of coal. In 1835, he was married to Susan Mobarter of that city. Soon after marriage they moved to Cunningham, Pa., and from thence to Columbus, Pa., remaining six years and then to Berwick where he began to work in the car-works and continued until after the death of his wife on Sept. 20, 1883. As a widower he lived among his children until 1899 when he died of gangrene at the old age of 87 years. He united with the Evangelical Church after arriving in Columbia County of which he was a consistent member at the time of his death. He was a kind-hearted man, always ready to encourage and extend the hand of sympathy to aid another in the

struggle of life, which traits he acquired largely from his experience. He was accustomed to make regular visits to his relatives in and about Nazareth and made the journey from Mauch Chunk to Nazareth on foot.



ALEXANDER CLEWELL.

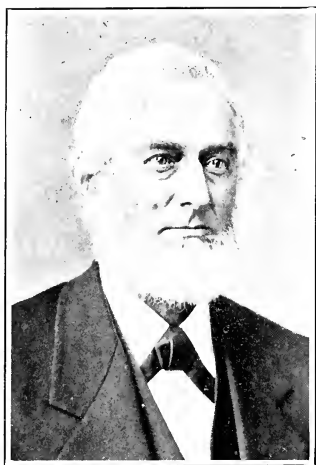
Alexander Clewell (281) was born at Schoeneck, where he spent his boyhood and youth. He emigrated to the West and died in the State of Kansas.

JOSIAH CLEWELL.

Josiah Clewell (625) was a private in Company B, 188th Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers, during the Civil War. He was with the Army of the Potomac during Gen. McClellan's peninsular campaign in Virginia and also with Gen. Grant's campaign against Richmond. At the battle of Cold Harbor he was wounded twice. He fought in no less than eight battles.

HANNAH SHELDON.

Hannah Sheldon (729) resides on a large farm in South Dakota.

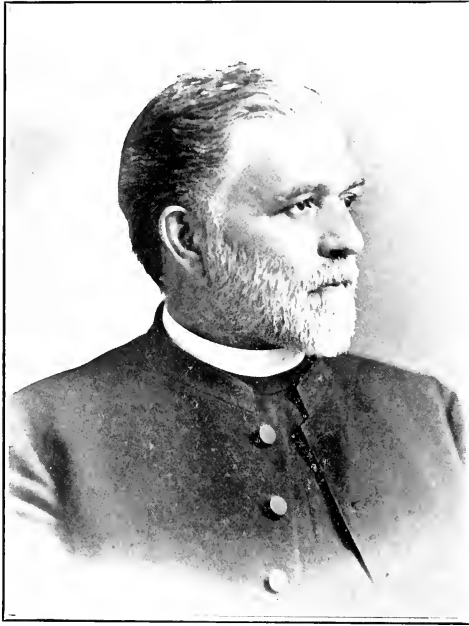


S. HENRY A. SIEGFRIED AND HIS WIFE, AMELIA.

Samuel Henry August Siegfried (144) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Penn. He attended the public school in his district, but on arriving at the age of youth, had to leave to learn his trade, a millwright. After his marriage to Caroline Gold, they moved on his father's farm, which he conducted and during the winter months he taught the village school. In 1857, he was married to his second wife, Amelia Plattenberger, and they continued farming and teaching. He served his township for many years as assessor, and in general was the "people's man" in his community.

His popularity in his township was further rewarded by being elected to the office of Register of Wills of Northampton County. Shortly after his election, he moved to Easton, where he made many friends and was re-elected at the expiration of his first term. He was known throughout the entire county as a man whom you could trust and his advice was eagerly sought by his friends.

He was a life-long member of the Moravian Church at Schoe-neck. Both he and his widow are buried there.



BISHOP JOSEPH MORTIMER LEVERING.

Joseph Mortimer Levering (932) was born at Hamburg, Hardin County, Tennessee. Shortly after his birth his parents returned to Hope, Ind., from whence they had moved. In 1851 they moved to Illinois, living at West Salem and then at Olney, where, in 1870, our subject left home to prepare for the ministry of the Moravian Church.

In his youth he had taken advantage of the best educational facilities within his reach, having been aided by several scholarly clergymen in his private study, after completing the public school course.

In September, 1870, he entered the Moravian College and Theological Seminary at Bethlehem, Pa. He graduated in

the class of 1874 after which he taught in Nazareth Hall, Nazareth, Pa., until the close of the year. He was ordained as a Deacon of the Moravian Church on December 20, 1874, and in the following month assumed charge of a new Mission at Uhrichsville, Ohio.

He was ordained a Presbyterian on May 21, 1876, during the sessions of the Moravian Synod at Nazareth, Pa. On June 6, 1876, he married Miss Martha Augusta Whitesell, a teacher in the Moravian Parochial School at Bethlehem, Pa.

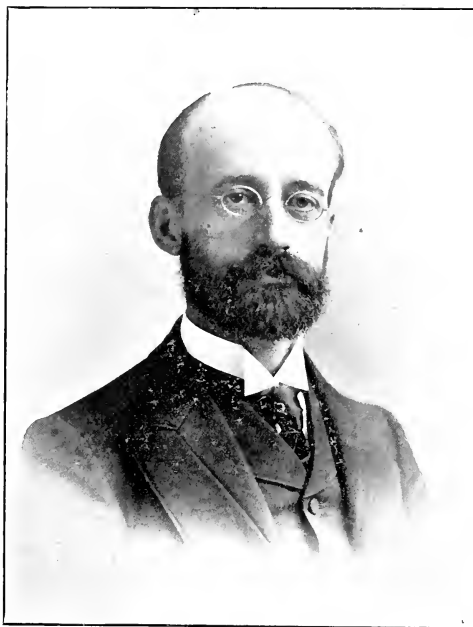
He was transferred from Uhrichsville, O., to Lake Mills, Wisconsin, in April, 1879, and after four years of service in this pastorate he was called to Bethlehem, Pa., where, in October of 1883, he became one of the two pastors of the oldest and largest Moravian Congregation in America with a membership of about 2000.

He was consecrated a Bishop of the Moravian Church on the 30th day of September, 1888, having served a brief term in the Provincial Elders' Conference, the Executive Board of the Northern Province of the Moravian Church in America, to which he was elected in February of the same year. In 1889, when the General Synod of the Moravian Church of America and Europe was held at Herrnhut, Saxony, Bishop Levering was a representative of the American Branch in that body and was chosen a Vice-President.

Numerous other official duties devolved upon him besides his pastorate and the little leisure left to him he employed in historical research. In 1895, he was elected president of the Moravian Historical Society. He was also the custodian of the Provincial Archives of the Church from 1888 to 1901. Among his historical works is a History of Bethlehem.

On July 17, 1901, he resigned the pastorate of the Bethlehem Moravian Church, having served for nearly eighteen years (the longest continuous pastorate in the history of that congregation) and removed with his family to Nazareth to recuperate his health. The Provincial Synod which convened in Bethlehem in 1903, called him again into active service, electing him a member of the Provincial Elders' Conference of the Church. He now (1907) holds the position of president in that body.

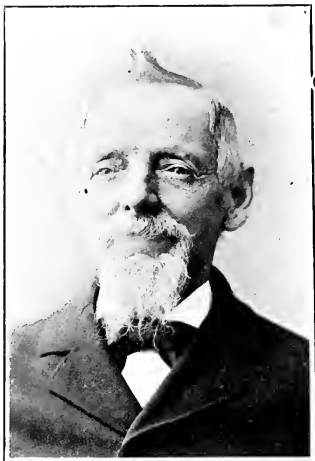
ANGELICA L. WOLLE.

Angelica L. Wolle (286) was born in Bethlehem, Pa. She spent her childhood and youth in Nazareth, whither her mother moved after her father's death. She was educated in the Moravian Parochial School and became a teacher in the same school, and later taught at Linden Hall Seminary, Lititz, Pa. In 1846, she married Nathaniel Wolle, who was a merchant at Lititz. On June 29, 1896, they celebrated their golden wedding and three years later, her husband died. Mrs. Wolle was a life-long Moravian and very active in church work, being connected with the Woman's Christian Temperance Union as president, and with the Moravian Home Association, and with the Woman's Missionary Society of the Moravian Church. She is buried at Lititz.

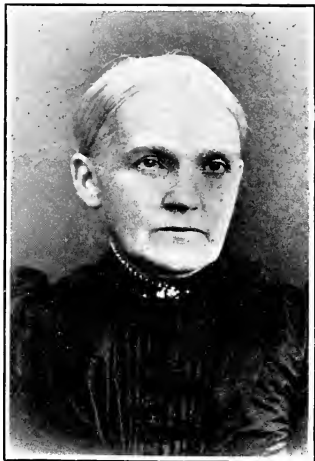


REV. ROBERT E. CLEWELL.

Rev. Robert E. Clewell (849) was born at Harmony, Iowa. He entered the Moravian College and Theological Seminary at Bethlehem in the fall of 1886 and was graduated in 1892. During the summer of 1891, previous to his graduation, he served the congregation at Utica, N. Y., as pastor. After his graduation, he took charge of the Moravian congregation at Port Washington, Ohio, which he served for two years and then accepted a call from the Bethesda Union, Bethesda, Iowa. He stopped on his journey thither at Watertown, Wisconsin, and was married to Miss Mamie Gille. On the evening of the day of their marriage, they continued their journey to his appointed place, arriving there the next morning. He became the pastor of the Moravian Congregation at Hopedale, Penn., in 1897. Of his children, Edgar L. was born at Bethesda, Iowa, and Margaret G. at Hopedale, Penn., in 1897. He now resides at Scranton, Pa.

HIS WIFE, ELIZA.

Henry C. Clewell (114) was born in Nazareth, Penn. He received his education in the Moravian Parochial School, and in his youth became a confirmed member of the Moravian Congregation. On April 15, 1851, he married Eliza Peisert, of Bethlehem. He was a cabinet-maker by trade and added the undertaking business. As such he buried 1189 persons. He served his congregation for twenty-seven years as Head Sexton, and four years as Trustee, and was a member of the Parochial School Board. His borough received his services in Town Council and in the Public School Board.

WILLIAM FULKERSON.

William Fulkerson (153) was born in Schoeneck, Pa. His parents died when a small boy and he had his home with Jacob Clewell who taught him cabinetmaking. Later, he learned the carpenter's trade. At the outbreak of the Civil War he enlisted in the Union Army and was captured by the Confederates and imprisoned at Andersonville, Georgia, for seven months. After the war, he emigrated to Franklin County, Kansas, where he engaged in farming. He died at Ottawa, Kansas.

HENRY SAMUEL CLEWELL.

Henry Samuel Clewell (139) was born in Millgrove, now Aluta, Northampton County, Pennsylvania. He attended the village school although limited as the advantages then were he received impressions which opened his eyes to the outside world. Leaving school, he learned the blacksmith's trade and later began to do business for himself in his native village where he had bought several acres of land and erected a house and other buildings. On November 27, 1859, he married Fayette Steinmetz and immediately began housekeeping, living in his house only a few years when he sold his property and bought in Nazareth. Here he carried on his trade until the spring of 1878 when he again sold his possessions and moved with his family to Blairstown, Benton County, Iowa. He lived here for about ten months when he moved farther westward, having bought eighty acres of land in Sterling, Rice County, Kansas. On reaching the new place, he commenced to build a house and improve his newly acquired possessions when he suddenly died having lived only two months in his new house. He was buried on his own possessions just across the street where he lived, in a cemetery adjoining the school-house. Later, the widow sold the property and returned East with her family.

The following is an extract from an obituary of a Kansas paper. "He had just commenced improving his new home when the Master called him to the home above. His sudden removal was a severe stroke to his family and friends. Mr. Clewell was a member of the Moravian church from his youth up; but that church not being represented here, he was a regular attendant of our service. He was beloved by all who knew him. Two weeks before his death I visited him and found him in good spirits."

HENRY J. OERTER.

Henry J. Oerter (151) was captain of Company C, One Hundred Fifty-third Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers. He was wounded in the battle of Gettysburg and captured by the Confederate troops and recaptured by the Union forces. He was born in Bethlehem, Pa., and in 1853, he moved with his family to Moravia, Iowa, but returned to his native state in 1860 and settled near Freemansburg. In the night of November 29, 1864, he was killed by persons unknown and his body thrown into the Lehigh Canal. He is buried at Bethlehem.



REV. THEOPHILUS G. CLEWELL.

Rev. Theophilus G. Clewell (280) was born at Schoeneck, Pennsylvania. In his boyhood, he attended the Moravian Parochial Schools, receiving instruction both in the German and English languages. Later, he entered Nazareth Hall Military Academy. Early in youth he entered practical life as a clerk in a general merchandise store in Nazareth, Pa. In his desire for greater opportunities, he left his native town and went to Allentown and thence to Catasauqua. After spending several years at these places, he became acquainted with the proprietor of a general merchandise store in Pottsville, Pa., who induced him to enter into his employ. He spent about three years at that place being very successful, but his reading of religious works had awakened him to higher duties. He severed his connection with his employer, forsaking a promising future and began the preparation for the ministry. After several years of earnest work he

offered himself as a candidate to the East Pennsylvania Conference of the Evangelical Association and was accepted in February of 1853. He was sent to Lebanon circuit as the junior preacher with Rev. W. L. Reber in charge. His services in this circuit won the confidence of Conference and that body sent him to Philadelphia to establish an English church. While engaged in organizing a church, he became a contributor to the *Evangelical Messenger*. He was next sent to Schuylkill Haven where his labors were crowned with the erection of a new place of worship and a parsonage and by an invitation from the Ohio Conference to the editorship of the *Evangelical Messenger*, which was published in Cleveland, Ohio.

He accepted the post and on March 18, 1857, entered upon his duties. He served in that capacity for about 16 years, being re-elected three times. During hours of leisure from his editorship of the weekly *Messenger*, he translated a German Medical Work on Exanthema and Methods of Cure. The translation was received with great satisfaction, whereupon Adrian College, of Michigan, conferred upon him the degree of A. M.

He served his church faithfully in the capacity of deacon, elder, editor of the *Messenger*, and for four years as Presiding Elder in the Pittsburg Conference when he was forced by the needs of a rising family to withdraw from all clerical work and devote himself to business. He engaged in a general real estate business and now in advanced years is quietly conducting a store and farm in South Park, Ohio.

On May 6, 1859, he married Anna Maria Miller, whose parents had emigrated to Ohio from Virginia. She died on November 19, 1881, of malarial fever at their home in Cleveland, O. Three years later on May 12, he was married to Hannah Louisa Hoffman.

LAVINA A. KELLER.

Lavina A. Keller (145) was born in Millgrove, now Aluta, Northampton County, Pa. She attended the public school in her village. On December 19, 1847, she was married to William Keller. They lived for the greater part of their lives on a farm in her native village. They were life-long members of the Schoeneck Moravian Church and are buried in the graveyard adjoining.

OLIVER L. FEHR.

Oliver L. Fehr (507) was born at Millgrove, now Aluta, Northampton County, Pa. During his childhood, he attended the public schools of his native township and also the Moravian Parochial School at Nazareth and the Freeland Seminary. When twelve years old he began to learn his trade, that of a lock-filer, which he followed until his twentieth year. He then became the teacher of the school in which he was once instructed, for three terms, and later accepted a position as teacher in Nazareth Hall, where he remained for two years.

He then entered the general merchandise store of William Beitel in Nazareth and remained there until 1868 when he was the first one to be elected as Commissioner's Clerk of Northampton County, which office he held for three terms or nine years. He was afterwards chosen to settle up the affairs of the Saucun Savings Bank at Hellertown, which had failed.

In 1879, Mr. Fehr became interested in the *Easton Weekly Argus*, a newspaper printed in the city of Easton, Pa., and the *Northampton Correspondent*, a German publication. In September of the same year, they began the daily edition of the *Argus*. In 1882, he became the sole proprietor of the publications, which he continues, with the exception of the *Correspondent*. It was notable as being the oldest weekly newspaper in the state outside of Philadelphia, having been founded in 1800 and published for one hundred and two years.

In a personal way he served his community as school director, as town clerk and treasurer of the borough of Nazareth and as a director of the Northampton County Building and Loan Association and as vice-president of the Northampton County Agricultural Society. Fraternally, he is connected with Dallas Lodge, No. 396, A. F. and A. M. He was married in March, 1866, and is a member of the Lutheran Church in Easton. He held the office of Elder.

JAMES A. PFEIFFER.

James A. Pfeiffer (1568) was born in Bethlehem, Pa. He attended the Moravian Parochial School. During his youth he became a book-binder, which trade he followed for life. He went forth as a defender of his country at the outbreak of the Civil War and was with Sherman's Army in his Campaign to the Sea. He is buried at Bethlehem.

CARRIE E. SCHNEEBELI.

Carrie E. Schneebeli (837) was born at New Hanover, Montgomery County, Pa. The early years of her life were uneventful aside from her preparation for the ardent duties of life. On September 10, 1878, she was married to Gustav A. Schneebeli, who was then a clerk in a coal office at Audenried, Pa. Two years later, Mr. Schneebeli began traveling in the western states on business and they moved to Gnadenhutzen, O., and two years later, to New Philadelphia, O., from whence they moved to Nazareth, Pa., in 1884. He, being an energetic man and spurred on by the encouragement of his wife, established the Nazareth Hosiery and Knitting Mills, the products of which became known in foreign lands as well as at home.

He takes great pride in the welfare of his town. He organized several companies which connected his town with Bethlehem, Wind Gap, Pen Argyl, Bangor, etc., by a system of electric railways and was instrumental in the organization of a National Bank.

On November 8, 1904, Mr. Schneebeli was elected to the office of Congressman of the United States from the 26th District of Pennsylvania, and served one term.

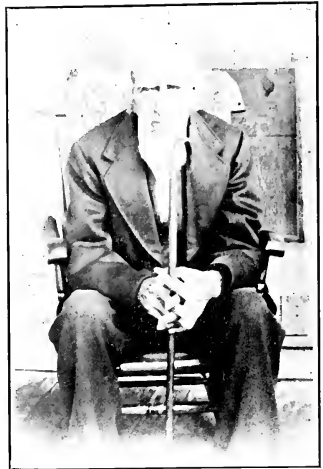
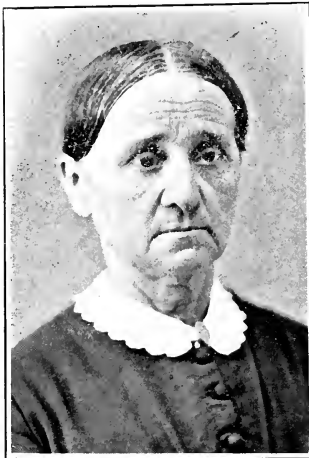
Mrs. Schneebeli is interested in charitable societies and is a member of the Nazareth Moravian Church Choir.

AARON N. CLEWELL.

Aaron N. Clewell (147) was born at Schoeneck, Pa., and during his childhood attended school and later was enrolled as a student at Nazareth Hall. In his seventeenth year, he began to learn the wheelwright trade with his father at Schoeneck, and after serving his appointed time began life for himself. He found employment at Turbotsville and later at Freemansburg, Pa., where after his marriage on November 2, 1854, he settled. While residing in this town he followed his occupation and became partner in several other business enterprises. In 1889, he moved with his family to Bethlehem, Pa., where he now resides in retirement. During his early years he was a member of the Moravian Church but now belongs to the Evangelical church.

OTTO M. HOCH.

Otto M. Hoch (1429) lives in Steelton, Pa., where he is employed by the Pennsylvania Steel Company as draftsman. He was married on June 14, 1904.



LOUISA C. TREIN AND HER HUSBAND, DAVID.

Louisa C. Trein (133) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. She was born in the house built by her grand-father, Francis Clewell, known as the "Swiss House" and spent her childhood and youth with her parents. In March, 1839, she married David Trein, who came as a currier into her community from Long Swamp, Berks County, Pa. Soon after their marriage they bought a farm in Millgrove, on which a few years later, he built a tannery, known as Trein's Tannery and also entered the butcher's business. Industry and economy marked their career until they moved into retirement. He held the office of Justice of the Peace in his township for many years and during the Civil War took active part in public affairs.

She served as sacristaness (diener) in the Schoeneck Moravian Church for more than thirty years, of which she was a life-long member. Both are buried in the grave-yard at Schoeneck.

OWEN J. CLEWELL.

Owen J. Clewell (303) was a Corporal in the Eightieth Regiment, Ohio Volunteers, during the Civil War. He died at Cornith, Miss., of Tuberculosis on August 17, 1862.

JOSEPH CLEWELL.

Joseph Clewell (27) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Penna. Of his boyhood and youth nothing specially interesting is known. During the Second War with England in 1812, he served as a private soldier, and a horse was exacted from him by a band of mustering officers. After his marriage he was employed as manager of the Friedensthal Grist Mill for a number of years after which he moved to Nazareth and took possession of the Nazareth Hall farm. Later he bought a farm, a part of which is now in the heart of Nazareth and from this place he moved to the West in 1852, whither their only son had gone a few years previously. Before making their home in Ohio and while still living in Nazareth, they made preparation, to pay a visit to their son. In May, 1851, they started on their journey across the Alleghenys in a carryall, greatly to the amazement of their friends in Nazareth and arrived at their destination three weeks later without any mishap, having traveled a distance of 500 miles. After spending a few weeks with their son and friends, he concluded to purchase a farm for himself near Wadsworth. In August of the same year they started on their return trip and reached Nazareth in September without any startling adventure. During the following winter preparations were made to move to their new farm. In the spring, the same carryall took once more the lead followed by a large conestoga filled with bedding, provisions and horse-feed on a journey to their new home. Towards the end of the fourth week they arrived at their destination. About the year 1860, he sold his farm and kept a boarding house but on account of impaired health moved to the city of Cleveland where he lived in retirement until his death. His wife was a widow for a few years. Both are buried in Monroe Street Cemetery, Cleveland, Ohio.

THOMAS CLEWELL.

Thomas Clewell (29) was born in Nazareth, Pa. He was a pupil in Nazareth Hall, where he received the rudiments of his education. After leaving school, he learned the cabinetmaking trade which he followed throughout his life. He was a noted musician in his community, performing principally on wind instruments. He belonged to the Nazareth Cornet Band and to the Moravian Church Choir for more than thirty years. He was of a quiet disposition and very much attached to his family. He is buried on the Moravian graveyard, Nazareth.



J. REUBEN CLEWELL AND FAMILY.

J. Reuben Clewell (136) was born in Millgrove, now Aluta, Northampton County, Pa., and during his childhood attended the public schools. At the age of eighteen he learned tanning and for many years was employed by his brother-in-law, David Trein. On August 3, 1851, he was married to Henrietta Kaske. After the death of his father, he bought the old homestead and began farming and at times went with the carpenters with whom he had worked for several years. He was a thrifty farmer and after the death of his father-in-law, he bought that farm also which was near Daniel's Slate Quarry, where he died. His wife died at the same place on September 24, 1897, being a widow for about four years. He was a life-long member of the Schoeneck Moravian church and served the congregation for many years as trustee. Both are buried in the Schoeneck graveyard.

WILLIAM FRANCIS CLEWELL.

William Francis Clewell (455) was born near Bellefonte, Pa. When a boy of seven months old his widowed mother returned to Millgrove now Aluta, Penn'a, where he attended the public school and was brought up in the religion of the Moravian Church at Schoeneck, Pa. In the year of the outbreak of the Civil War, although only sixteen years old, he enlisted in Company I, One Hundred Fifty-third Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry for nine months' service and took part in the battles at Chancellorsville and Gettysburg. He was in the signal corps during three years of the War. On the second day of the battle of Gettysburg he was severely wounded in the leg by a shell, a part of which remained in his limb up to the time of his death.

After the war he went to New York City and was a broker there for several years. Then to Boston, Mass., and in 1892 to Medford, Mass., where on March 31, 1883, he was married to Miss Mary E. Forrest of Dorchester.

He was in the brokerage business in Boston and at the time of his death. He was a bond broker with Barnard and Gibbert. He was a past commander of Post 66, G. A. R., and a member of various prominent clubs. He was a member of the First Universalist Church of Medford where he resided and is buried in Oak Grove Cemetery.

From a Medford paper we quote the following: "As a man, he was popular among his associates and one who could be relied upon to fill every position in which he was placed to the best of his ability. His faithful and energetic work as commander of Post 66 will always be remembered by his comrades. As a husband, he was kind and devoted; and as a friend, he was generous and true."

EVE ROSINA ROMINGER.

Eve Rosina Rominger (47) was born in Schoeneck, Pa. When a child she made the trip from Schoeneck to Stokes County, North Carolina with her mother. During her youth she was compelled to obtain work away from home. She was married on December 15, 1796. She became a member of the Friedberg Moravian Church on October 27, 1804. She is buried on the graveyard there.



JOSEPH W. SIEGFRIED AND HIS WIFE, MARIA.

Joseph W. Siegfried (146) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pennsylvania. He received his education in the public schools. He was a millwright by trade and worked for Schank and Younken, Easton, Pa. He was married May 6, 1854, and soon afterwards launched into business, buying a grist-mill in his native township. In 1876, he sold his mill property and bought the general merchandise store at Cherry Hill, which he conducted to the time of his death. He was a Director in the Farmer's Mutual Fire Insurance Company of Northampton County and a manager of the Northampton County Agricultural Society. He also served his native township in several offices. He was a life-long member of the Moravian Church at Schoeneck and served as trustee of the congregation for nearly fifteen years. He was a delegate to the Moravian Synod which convened in Indiana. Both he and his wife are buried at Schoeneck.

MINNIE B. MAHAFFEY.

Minnie B. Mahaffey (1249) was born in Bartholomew County, Indiana. She was married to Arthur M. Mahaffey on December 25, 1892. Her husband is an instructor in the department of science in the Columbus, Ind., High School.

ALEXANDER CLEWELL.

Alexander Clewell (76) was a private soldier in the Civil War. He enlisted in Company I, Thirtieth Regiment, Ohio Volunteers. He was wounded in the battle of Antietam. His regiment was engaged in the siege of Vicksburg where he joined it after his wound was sufficiently healed and while fighting in the battle of Missionary Ridge he was killed.

FRANCIS CHRISTIAN CLEWELL.

Francis Christian Clewell (84) was an Adjutant in the First Missouri Cavalry, Confederate Army and was taken and held as prisoner by the Federal Army for nineteen months on Johnson's Island. He was released and captured a second time and held as prisoner on Ship Island, Gulf of Mexico, until the end of the War.

EUGENE FERDINAND CLEWELL.

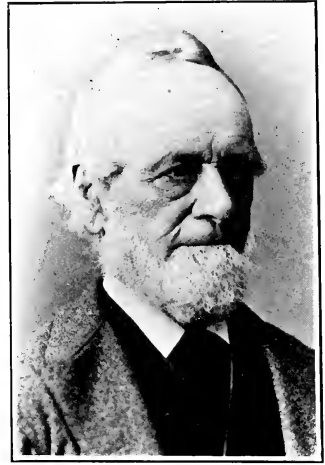
Eugene Ferdinand Clewell (84) was a soldier in the Confederate Army during the Civil War and died while in the army at New Orleans, La.

AUGUST H. CLEWELL.

August H. Clewell (64) was born at Schoeneck, Penna., and received a meager education. He learned the wheelwright (waggoner's) trade at an early age near Lebanon, Pa. After his apprenticeship, he worked in Allentown but later went back toward Lebanon now called Womelsdorf. When that trade became over-taxed with workmen he came back to Schoeneck and manufactured guitar cases for the C. F. Martin Guitar Manufacturing Co. He was married to his second wife on Nov. 29, 1835. He was married for the third time on May 26, 1829. He was a member of the Schoeneck Moravian Church and was the organist for more than thirty years. He died from injuries by a fall on the ice. He was noted for his congeniality. He is buried at Schoeneck.

JAMES BENJAMIN CLEWELL.

James Benjamin Clewell (65) was born at Schoeneck, Pa., and was raised under the shadow of the Moravian Church. Later in life he moved to Philadelphia where he married. He was a gunsmith by trade but was principally engaged in making locks and springs. He died and is buried at Philadelphia.



LOUISA C. UHLER AND HER HUSBAND, JOHN.

Louisa C. Uhler (105) was born in the town of Nazareth, Pennsylvania. Her parents being members of the Moravian Church, she received a fair education. The days of her youth were spent in Nazareth. On August 27, 1837, she was wedded to John Uhler, who was born in Durham, Bucks County, Penn., on July 17, 1817. Mr. Uhler was a blacksmith by trade and was also engaged in the lime business. Finding the latter more profitable he left Nazareth and acquired large limestone quarries along the Delaware River, near Easton, Pa. Here in 1853, he was severely injured by the premature explosion of a blast which greatly impaired his sight. That he escaped with his life was nothing short of a marvel. He died on February 26, 1892, in his 75th year leaving his widow at a ripe age who was comforted by her children. They were devout members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church.

SUSAN C. STOCKER.

Susan C. Stocker (88) was born at Niskey, Pa. She received the customary education of her day in the Moravian Parochial schools. She married George D. Stocker on August 22, 1823. She was excluded from the church on account of her marriage to a non-Moravian but rejoined in 1830 and her husband followed in 1831. They settled in Niskey where they lived until September 14, 1840, when her husband died. Both were zealous and ardent members of the Schoeneck Moravian Church and are buried in the graveyard adjoining.

CHRISTIAN L. EBBECKE.

Christian L. Ebbecke (89) was of Moravian parentage who looked after his early education and training. He acquired skill in tailoring and for two years was employed at Winston-Salem, North Carolina where he became acquainted with his future wife. But it was no case of "love at first sight." He returned to his native village of Niskey, in Pennsylvania, and worked at his trade for another year, meanwhile making preparations to begin housekeeping and when all seemed ready he started with a team for Salem, N. C., where he was married and later returned to Niskey, making the round trip with his team. Both became members of the Moravian church at Schoeneck, where they are buried.

CHRISTIAN RENATUS CLEWELL.

Christian Rénatus Clewell (94) was born in Niskey, near Nazareth, Pa. He was educated at the Nazareth Hall. He was married on October 31, 1837. He was an excellent musician, performing on various instruments. He went to Philadelphia in 1851 as teacher of music and organist. He died suddenly while playing the piano at a friend's house. He is buried on the Nazareth Moravian graveyard.

AUGUSTA AMELIA (STEINER) HAY.

Augusta Amelia (Steiner) Hay (428) was married to Franklin Steiner on November 29, 1857. They lived together for five years when he died. In 1869, she was married a second time, to Charles E. Hay and afterwards resided in Easton where she died of consumption. She is buried at Schoeneck.



JOHN HARRY CLEWELL.

John Harry Clewell (107) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. He was a gun-smith by trade and learned it in Philadelphia. He moved to Canfield, Ohio, in 1835 but returned to Philadelphia in 1849. About the year 1845, he was postmaster in Canfield. While in Philadelphia he kept a hotel but went back to Canfield in 1852 where he managed a saw mill and lumber yard almost up to the time of his death. Under Lincoln's administration he was, for a while, assistant internal revenue collector.

ALBERT B. CLEWELL.

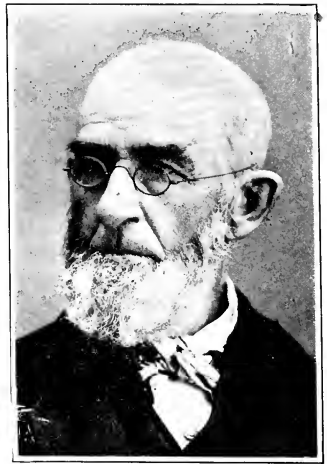
Albert B. Clewell (565) was born at Rossville, Indiana. During his infancy his parents moved to Carroll County, Ind., where he was raised. At the age of 14 years he left his parent's home and was employed on the farms in that vicinity until the spring of 1883 when he joined a party to Arkansas. He continued his traveling through the states, west of the Mississippi, working on farms and in the forests of Wisconsin and in the mines of the Rocky Mountains. He also visited the State of Pennsylvania. He was married on November 4, 1897, at Flora, Ind.

AMOS C. MIKSCH.

Amos C. Miksch (310) was born at Easton, Pennsylvania. His parents moved to a place in Ohio now called New Philadelphia when he was about four years old. Here he attended school during the winter months and received the rudiments of an education. While still a youth, he emigrated into Iowa and in 1861 to Colorado and here on July 30 of the same year he enlisted in Company B, First Colorado Volunteer Cavalry for the term of three years. Later his company was merged with Company C and named Company E. On January 2, 1864, he re-enlisted in Company E, Veteran Battalion, F. C. V. C. He was a corporal in his company from July 1, 1864 to November 18, 1865 when he was honorably discharged at Leavensworth, Kansas. He now visited his mother in Ohio and after spending a few months, returned to Colorado where he soon afterwards married Miss Mary Cook and they settled on a farm on the Platte River. In 1873, they moved to Cherry Creek and engaged in stock raising. After five years, they traveled by wagon to Weston, Oregon. Here they lived for about a year and a half when they started on a tour through southern Oregon and northern California and in 1891 returned to Colorado where he died of heart disease.

OLIVIA AUGUSTA RICKSECKER.

Olivia Augusta Ricksecker (285) was born in Bethlehem, Pa. When only three years old her father died, and soon afterwards the widow with her children moved to Nazareth where our subject attended the Moravian Parochial schools and later united with the church. She was married on March 12, 1840. She was very active in the church for many years, serving as one of the "dieners." Her husband, Edmund Ricksecker, was a watchmaker and later carried on the nursery business. He was elected as the first Burgess of the Borough of Nazareth and was the treasurer of the Nazareth Moravian Congregation for many years. He died April 19, 1888. Both were highly respected in their town. Both are buried at Nazareth.



HENRIETTA L. BRUNNER AND HER HUSBAND, HENRY.

Henrietta L. Brunner (325) was born at Salem, North Carolina. She attended school at Nazareth, Pa., and later became a member of the Moravian Church there. In 1844, she was married to Henry J. Brunner who was a carpenter by trade. Among the many buildings erected by him is the Moravian Church in Nazareth. They moved to Illinois in 1862 but returned to Nazareth where he built a foundry and machine shop and did a prosperous business. Later they moved to Bethlehem, Pa., and in 1877 to Osborn County, Kansas, where they lived until her death in 1894. She is buried there. Mr. Brunner came east and died in Bethlehem, where he is buried.

HARVEY F. BAUDER.

Harvey F. Bauder (1033) of Oreland, Penn., served in the Spanish-American War from December, 1898, to December, 1900, in Company E, Eighth U. S. Infantry. He served in Cuba and later in the Philippine Islands.

HARRIET CECILIA BATES.

Harriet Cecilia Bates (126) was born in Nazareth, Pa., and received a rudimentary education in the Nazareth Moravian Parochial schools. Later in life, she married Harvey Bates on September 1, 1844. She moved with her husband to Wilkes-Barre, Pa., where he died in 1873. After the death of her husband she returned to Schoeneck, Pa., and took apartments with her brother, Alfred Danke. She was a very faithful and earnest Christian. She is buried in the Nazareth Moravian grave-yard.

ALFRED DANKE.

Alfred Danke (127) was born in Nazareth and was educated in the Moravian Parochial Schools and later entered the Nazareth Military Academy. He was compelled, on account of his health, to relinquish his studies and then learned the blacksmith trade which he followed during his life-time. He was married on October 27, 1850 and lived in Schoeneck where he is buried. He was for many years a trustee in the Schoeneck Moravian church and a member of the trombone Choir.

HENRIETTA W. DAILY.

Henrietta W. Daily (119) was born in Nazareth, Pa., and spent most of her single days in that town. After marriage, on Nov. 15, 1869, they lived at Bethlehem until her death. She was a life-long member of the Moravian Church. Mr. Daily was a soldier in the Civil War, being a private in Company C, 46th Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers. He participated in many battles among them being Antietam, Chancellorsville and Gettysburg. In the fierce battle of Cedar Mountain he was badly wounded in the left arm, breaking the bone. In this battle he was also taken prisoner and confined to the Libby Prison, his wound not being dressed for three weeks. After four weeks in prison, he was paroled and exchanged and in 1863 honorably discharged by reason of his wounds. He is a member of J. K. Taylor Post No. 182, G. A. R., Bethlehem.

Mr. Daily found his wife to be a devoted helpmate and always ready with encouraging words in times of trial while her influence on her children is marked. While he was the superintendent of the Niskey Hill Cemetery she died and is buried there.



MATILDA E. SEYFRIED.

Matilda E. Seyfried (456) was born at Millgrove, now Aluta, Northampton County, Pa. She attended the public schools in her township and in her youth became a confirmed member of the Moravian Church at Schoeneck, Pa. On October 20, 1867, she was married and soon afterwards they began farming which they pursued to this (1907) time. Mr. Seyfried served as sacristan (diener) in the Moravian Church for more than twenty years.

MARTIN H. CLEWELL.

Martin H. Clewell (544) was born on his father's farm near Bethlehem, Pa. He attended the school of his rural district, but very early was put to learning the trade of blacksmith. When in his youth, he left his home and became a railroader being employed in different parts of the country chiefly as locomotive engineer. After his father's death, he returned to his home and soon afterwards married, after which he bought the farm and with it worked upon his trade. Later in life, he sold his possessions and moved his family to Allentown, Pa., where he was employed as a switchman on a railroad. He is buried at Allentown.

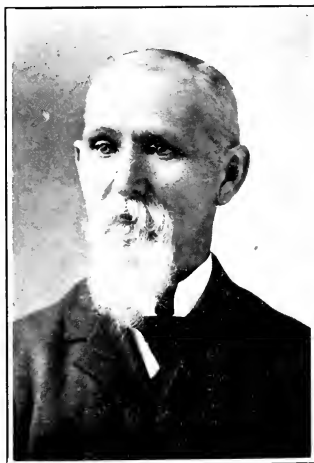


HER HUSBAND, EPHRAIM.

Sabina M. Loux (457) was born in Millgrove, Northampton County, Pa. She received the customary schooling of her time and later was confirmed a member of the Moravian Church at Schoeneck, Pa. In 1866, she was married to Ephraim Loux, who was born in Bucks County, Pa. Soon after their marriage, they began housekeeping in her native village where he conducted a tannery for many years. About 1884 they moved to Nazareth, Pa., where he engaged in the slate business for a few years and afterwards established a cigar-box factory. He is an active member of his chosen church at Schoeneck, being superintendent of the Sunday School and Bible Class teacher for many years.

AMANDA TOLEDO CLEWELL TINKLE.

Amanda Toledo Clewells Tinkle (564) was born in Rossville, Indiana, on August 29, 1861. She was married on September 6th, 1882, to William H. Tinkle. They carry on farming and are residing at Bolivar, Missouri.



WILLIAM H. CLEWELL.

William H. Clewell (575) was born in Cunningham, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania. At the early age of ten years, he was "bound out" by his father to a Mr. Rodgers, a cloth manufacturer, receiving for his services his board, clothes, and schooling as was the custom in those days. After following this trade for five years, Mr. Rodgers moved to the western part of the state while he returned home and was employed on the Pennsylvania Canal for six seasons which was then an enterprising business. In 1862, he was married to Miss Huddleson and in the same year drafted into the Union Army. He served for nine months as a private in Company H, 178th Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers. At the expiration of his term, he was mustered out of service and on returning home, located his family in Berwick, Pennsylvania, where he still resides. His first wife died on March 31, 1877. He managed to keep his family together and on February 28, 1878, he married a second time, a Miss Smith. On October 11, 1884, his second wife departed this life leaving him again with three small children. His eldest daughter now assumed the household duties until her marriage and then em-

ploying a house-keeper until his marriage to Mrs. Frederici in 1886, but whose days were numbered, she dying May 10, 1894. In 1903 he broke up house-keeping and is now boarding with his daughters, having through perseverance and economy, saved enough to live independently. He was employed mostly at the car-works in that city, until rheumatism in his arms forced him to stop. At the age of twelve years he joined the Evangelical Church of which he is still a member and held various offices for over thirty-five years.

ALBERT KAMPMAN.

Albert Kampman (524) was a soldier in the Civil War from 1861 to 1865. He belonged to Company A, First Pennsylvania Regiment for three months, then to Company C, Forty-sixth Regiment for three years and finally to Company G, One Hundred Ninety-fifth, Pennsylvania Volunteers. He entered as a private and was promoted to Sergeant. He received wounds in his right leg and in his left arm and was captured by the Confederates and confined in Libby prison for several months. He was reported killed and while confined in prison had the pleasure of reading his own obituary, as printed in a Bethlehem newspaper.

WILLIAM C. SMITH.

William C. Smith (543) was born at Emaus, Pennsylvania. His mother died in his early boyhood. His father was engaged in business and taught him the machinist trade. On leaving his native town, he faced the world as a mechanic and went to Pittsburg where he found employment for two years and then went to Cleveland, Ohio. Here he secured a position as foreman in an elevator factory and after two years became a partner of the firm of the M. J. O'Donnell Elevator Manufacturing Company. In 1894, he sold his interests in the company and formed the W. C. Smith Elevator Company.

Among his achievements are the inventions of safety appliances to elevators, and of a wire fence loom, and the erection of many electric elevators, having the honor of building the first successful electric elevator in Cleveland. He is, at present, a mechanical engineer with the Wellman Morgan Engineering Company. He resides in Cleveland.

Stephen A. Trein (461) was born in Bushkill Township, Penn. He spent his boyhood in his native place and attended the public schools but made the study of music his chief aim. After completing the course in school, he devoted his time to music and became the organist of the Schoeneck Moravian Church at the age of 16, and continued for nearly fourteen years. He married A. Lucinda Ebbecke on Nov. 18, 1884, and moved to Nazareth where he continued as music teacher. In 1890 they left Nazareth and came to Easton, Pa., where he conducted a business and also became the organist of the Easton Moravian Church. Later they moved to Niskey where they still reside.

RUSSELL C. ODENWELDER.

*Russell C. Odenwelder (830) was born in Easton, Penn. He attended the public schools of his native city and while a young man enlisted in the U. S. Navy and at this writing was serving as a Marine on the U. S. S. Wisconsin, which was stationed in the Asiatic waters.

SAMUEL J. CLEWELL.

*Samuel J. Clewell (132) was born near Bellefonte, Center County, Pa., and when a boy of about two and a half years came, with his widowed mother, to Millgrove, now Aluta, Pa. He was reared in the family of John Kostenbader and during the winter months attended the public school. When he was eighteen, he enlisted in Company I, One Hundred Fifty-third Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry and was taken prisoner in the battle of Chancellorsville, May 2, 1863.

After his return from the war he learned the machinist trade and later traveled to Ohio but soon returned to his mother where he died, caused by consumption. He never was married and is buried in the Schoeneck graveyard.

FRANCIS T. CLEWELL.

Francis T. Clewell (132) was born at Millgrove now Aluta, Northampton County, Pa. He received his education in the public school of his native village and was brought up in the religion of the Moravian Church at Schoeneck. He learned the millwright trade at eighteen and was married in the year 1839. In 1841, he moved with his family to Center County, Pa. (near Bellefonte) where he bought a small tract of land. Besides cultivating his small farm, he did carpentering and while engaged in felling trees to build a barn for one of his neighbors, he was struck by a falling tree and killed. His age was 28 years, 11 months and 22 days and is buried in Center County, Pa.

HARRIET MARIA CLEWELL.

Harriet Maria Clewell Ferrier (563) was born in Allentown, Penn. Her parents moved to Clinton, Ind., when she was fifteen months old. She began teaching in the public schools of Indiana at the age of sixteen and continued until the year 1883. On April 5 of the same year, she was united in marriage to Mr. J. C. Ferrier of Bringhamurst, Ind. They conducted a farm for nine years when they moved to Bringhamurst and engaged in the hardware business. They also conducted a hardware store at Kirklin, Ind., for three years. They are now located in Alamogordo, New Mexico. She is a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

WILLIAM H. CLEWELL.

William H. Clewell (120) was born at Nazareth, Pa. He attended the Moravian Parochial School of that town. He was a saddler by trade. He enlisted in Company A, One Hundred Fifty-third Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers, and was a musician in his regiment. His wife, Catherine Trein, also a descendant of the Clewells, was born in Bushkill Township near Schoerneck. Both are members of the Moravian Church. He is buried on the Nazareth Moravian graveyard.

CHARLES M. CLEWELL.

Charles M. Clewell (601) was born in Homestead, Catawissa Township, Columbia County, Penn. His father lived on a farm, and our subject became an active assistant in the work during the summer and worked on a "gravel train" during the winter, thus debaring him of the opportunities of acquiring an education. He was married on October 12, 1873, and began farming near Catawissa, but after a few years moved into that town and carried on teaming. Later, he became a railroader, at first working on the train and then as car-inspector. In 1895, he was transferred to Halls as joint-inspector for the W. & N. B. and P. R. Rys. He disposed of his possessions in Catawissa and moved his family to Halls, where he met with an accident on October 26, 1898. He was removed to a hospital where he died after lingering a few days. He is buried at Catawissa. He was a member of the Reformed Church. He held the office of deacon and elder of St. John's Reformed Church at Catawissa, of which he was a charter member.

JEREMIAH S. CLEWELL.

Jeremiah S. Clewell (602) died at Logansport, Indiana, and is buried there. He died a veteran machinist, having gone to his work in the morning apparently well, but during the afternoon complained to his fellow-machinists of not feeling well and while engaged in placing a piece of machinery fell back on the floor and expired.



HOWARD J. SIEGFRIED AND FAMILY.

Howard J. Siegfried (520) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. He attended the public schools in his native township and later the Moravian Parochial school at Nazareth. He entered the College of Pharmacy in 1889 at Philadelphia and graduated four years later. In 1896, he was married to Annie C. Clewell (500) who was born in Plainfield Township, county and state aforesaid. In her childhood, she attended the public schools and studied music. After their marriage, they settled in Philadelphia where he entered business as a druggist. Both of them withdrew their membership in the Schoneck Moravian Church and joined the Presbyterians.

ALICE C. CARGAY.

Alice C. Cargay (535) was married November 24, 1875, to Rev. B. F. Cargay and about one year after her marriage became an invalid for nine years. After her recovery, she took active part in the pastoral duties of her husband in the Methodist Church.

WILSON S. CLEWELL.

Wilson S. Clewell (544) was born in Hanover Township, Northampton County, Penn., on a small farm near Bethlehem. He received the education that the public school afforded. When a young man, he enlisted and served five years in the United States Army as a cavalryman and was stationed at a military post in Arizona. He returned home after the expiration of his enlistment in the Army, but failing to find employment, he decided again to go to the West. While on his way thither he met a large cattle dealer at Buffalo, New York, and made a contract with him to take a carload of fine cattle to England.

After delivering the cattle, he enlisted in the English Army. He soon found favor with his officers and on account of his fine military bearing and athletic physique he was assigned to the Queen's Guards and was stationed on the Isle of Wight. He was in due time advanced to Corporal and with a company of infantry was commissioned to go to India. Here he was advanced to Quartermaster's Clerk with the rank of Sergeant. His term of enlistment, which was six years, had already expired, but on account of ill-health was confined in a Himalaya Mountain Sanitarium, India, for a long time, but could not be restored. He was brought back to England where he speedily recovered.

After his recovery he was advanced to First or Orderly Sergeant for his gallant services and sent to South Africa on a special mission. He remained there until the close of the Boer War, when he returned to England and received his honorable discharge. He left England at once and returned to his parent's home in Allentown, Pa.

Shortly afterwards he had an attack of Scarlet Fever from which he suffered for about two weeks, when he died. During his sickness he received a letter offering him an appointment in the English Army to drill recruits. He is buried at Allentown.

JOSEPH A. WOLLE.

Joseph A. Wolle (1406) served as First Quartermaster in the United States Navy during the Spanish-American War.



MONROE L. CLEWELL AND FAMILY.

Monroe L. Clewell (479) was born in Millgrove, Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Penn. He attended the village school and in his youth became a clerk in his uncle's general merchandise store. He resigned his position and moved, with his family, to Philadelphia, where he had accepted a position in a grocery store. On account of failing health he was compelled to leave the city, and in consequence, moved to Easton, where he is now residing and is engaged in the grocery business. He is a member of the Moravian Church at Easton.

ELLIS C. SCHNEEBELI.

Ellis C. Schneebeli (1402) was born at Audenried, Pennsylvania. During his childhood his parents moved to Nazareth, Pa., where he received his education. He made music a special study and held the position of organist of the Moravian Church for some years. He is assistant to his father in the different enterprises that he has undertaken.

WILLIAM THOMAS ROMINGER.

William Thomas Rominger (638) was born in Friedburg, North Carolina, and received the rites of baptism of the Moravian Church, of that place. His mother died when he was three years old and his father died four years later. He was reared by his aunt with whom he lived until December 31, 1864, when he was conscripted into the Confederate Army, and on February 24, 1865, while on the picket line in front of Petersburg, Virginia, he escaped and made his way into the Union Army by crawling on hands and knees for about one-half of a mile, surrendering himself to the latter army on the 27th. He was granted amnesty at Washington, D. C., and was allowed three days' rations and free transportation to Hope, Indiana. After a stay of a few weeks, he went to Goldsboro, North Carolina, and there joined Company F, 59th Regiment, Indiana Volunteers, on April 10, 1865. He received an honorable discharge on July 17, of the same year. He was married on August 11, 1870. He was postmaster of Hartsville, Ind., from January 2, 1882, to September 20, 1885, and served his township as assessor for eight years.

J. C. WOMMACK.

J. C. Wommack (640) was born in Lexington, Davidson County, North Carolina. His father, who was a hatter by trade, died when he was a boy three years old and the mother then moved to Clemmonsville, N. C., where she reared her family. He received his education in the public school of that town. At the age of thirteen he left home and began to clerk in a village store. In 1861, he volunteered in the Confederate Army and served during the whole war in the Army of Northern Virginia commanded by Gen. Robt. E. Lee. Beginning with the battle of Manassas Junction he saw nearly all the principal battles fought by that army including the surrender of Gen. Lee at Appomattox Court House. He arrived at his home one week afterwards and rested the following day and then began farming, plowing being his first work. Two weeks after his return from the war he was married and has raised a family of eight children. He is still living on a farm and is able to do a good day's work.

Carrie A. Rice (415) was born in Nazareth, Pa. She attended the Moravian Parochial Schools and became a member of that church in her early days. Her zeal for church work was made manifest in her childhood and she became prominent in her congregation especially in the Sunday school and choir. On June 4, 1891, she was married to Fred J. Rice of Bethlehem, Pa., where they now reside. She was a member of the famous Bach Choir under Dr. J. Fred Wolle and is connected with many church societies. Mr. Rice was a veteran in the Civil War serving as a private in Company D. Thirty-Fourth Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers.

AUGUSTUS ALEXANDER CLEWELL.

Augustus Alexander Clewell (334) was a soldier in the Twenty First, North Carolina regiment, Confederate Army and was a distinguished and daring scout.

JOSEPH FEHR.

Joseph Fehr (318) was born in Plainfield Township, Northampton County, Pa. After his mother's decease, the family broke up and young Joseph with his sister, Angelica, found a home in the family of Jefferson Schweitzer who resided on a farm in Lower Nazareth Township. Here he remained until he was 18 years of age. Naturally diligent, he was easily kept in steady employment as farm servant, so that he secured little schooling. But he made the best of his limited means, and learned well from experience. Possessing unusual native intelligence and sound judgment, he enjoys the esteem of his neighbors, among whom he is known as an honest man and friend. In his youth he received the usual religious instruction and was confirmed by Rev. Dr. Welden, then Pastor of the Dryland Lutheran Congregation. In the beginning of his twenties, he married Miss Caroline Young. They settled at Newburg, and subsequently at Bethlehem, Pa., where their son, William Henry, was born. Later he removed to Lower Nazareth Township and began farming. For eight years he served as Road Supervisor of the township; thereafter for nine years as Tax Collector; at present as Jury Commissioner of his native county. At different times he represented his township as a delegate to the county conventions and once as Judicial delegate. For nearly ten years he was Sexton of the Dryland Church. He lives at Hecktown practically in retirement.

FRANKLIN A. CLEWELL.

Franklin A. Clewell (372) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. He served in the Civil War from 1861 to 1865. He was Fife Major, N. C. Staff, One Hundred Nineteenth Regiment, Pennsylvania Infantry. He was with the Army of the Potomac and was engaged in the battles fought by that army until it received the surrender of Gen. Lee. He resides near Sunny Side, California, where he is engaged in the poultry business.

WILLIAM C. CLEWELL.

William C. Clewell (375) was born in Bushkill Township, Pa. When a young man he emigrated into Ohio of which state he is now a citizen. At the beginning of the Civil War he enlisted in Company B, One Hundred Seventy-ninth Regiment, Ohio Volunteers.



EUGENE ALEXANDER CLEWELL.

Eugene Alexander Clewell (416) was born in Nazareth and was a life-long resident of that town. He was educated in the Moravian Parochial School at Nazareth and was confirmed in the Moravian Church. He learned the trades of cabinet-maker and undertaker in his father's establishment which he afterwards purchased. His integrity in his business made him many friends which made him the leading undertaker in his town and its vicinity. He took great interest in the volunteer Fire Department of his town and for many years was its chief. Amid his many duties he never neglected his church duties. He was a member of the choir and for many years a trombonist of the congregation. He died rather unexpectedly of paralysis after having undergone a surgical operation. He is buried at Nazareth.

REUBEN CLEWELL.

Reuben Clewell (185) was a soldier in the Union Army during the Civil War and was killed in the battle of Antietam on September 17, 1862.

JOHN GAMBOLD.

John Gambold (209) was a soldier in the Civil War. He enlisted as a private in the Sixty-Seventh Regiment, Indiana Volunteers and died in the hospital at St. Louis, Missouri.

ANDREW ADAM LUCKENBACH.

Andrew Adam Luckenbach (212) was born in Bethlehem, Pa. He was educated in the Moravian Parochial Schools and after completing his studies assumed duties with his father in the milling business. After the retirement of his father from active life in 1856, the business was given in charge of David O. and Andrew A. Luckenbach and they conducted the business of the "Old Moravian Mill along the Monocacy" until the time of his death.

At the outbreak of the Civil War, our subject was one in a company, known as the First Defenders, who enlisted for three months. He re-enlisted in Co. C., One Hundred and Twenty-ninth Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers, becoming First Lieutenant and after the death of the Company's Captain, he was promoted to that position. His company was engaged in the battles of Bull Run, Antietam and he was wounded in a charge on Mayres Hill, Dec. 13, 1862. Mr. Luckenbach was interested in real estate and other enterprises of his native town which he saw pass through many changes and improvements. He is buried at Bethlehem.

FRANCES E. CLEWELL.

*Frances E. Clewell (230) taught school for a few years and afterwards spent a few years in California. She returned to Waverly, Iowa, where she now resides with her mother.

JAMES LEWIS CLEWELL.

James Lewis Clewell (230) was married to Catherine Haney, on October 22, 1855, at Dayton, Ohio. They moved to New York and engaged in farming. In 1863 they became immigrants of Iowa and finally settled on a farm near Waverly, Iowa, where he resided until his death.

ANNA ELIZABETH FRIEBELY.

Anna Elizabeth Friebely (141) was born in Millgrove, now Aluta, Northampton County, Pennsylvania. She received the education the public schools then offered while her general habits were formed under her parents' influence and accordingly her religious instruction was not neglected. She was a member of the Schoeneck Moravian Congregation until after her marriage to Julius C. Friebely, on December 10, 1864.

He was a public school teacher in Belfast, Pa. They moved to that place where he later engaged in the general merchandise business until 1871 when they moved to Bushkill Center where he followed the same business until 1885 when they moved to Nazareth, following the slate business up to the time of his death. He died October 24, 1892, being a widower for nearly five years. She was a virtuous woman, kind-hearted yet firm in all that was honest and just. She was of a quiet disposition, pleasant to all whom she knew and a willing help-mate to her husband. Both are buried in St. John's Union Cemetery, Nazareth, Pa.

CAROLINE COGHILL.

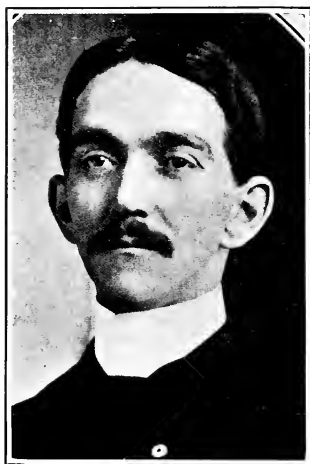
Caroline Coghill (921) was married to Richard Coghill, who came from England in 1859. He was born at Boro Bridge, Yorkshire. After marriage they moved to Philadelphia and thence to western Pennsylvania. While in this part of the state they lived mostly in Pittsburg.

REV. WILLIAM HENRY HOCH.

Rev. William Henry Hoch (922) was born near Moorestown, Pa., along the Bushkill Creek. He attended the public school in the eight-cornered stone school house which stood not far from his home. Later he attended the Moravian Parochial School at Nazareth, Pa., after which he entered the Moravian Preparatory School for college and seminary. He graduated from the Moravian College and Theological Seminary on July 19, 1870, and for the following two years became an instructor in Nazareth Hall, Nazareth, Pa.

On October 20, 1872, he was ordained a deacon of the Moravian Church by the Rt. Rev. Edward A. de Schweinitz, S. T. D., and at a meeting of the Moravian Synod at Lititz, Pa., became a Presbyterian in that church. He served the congregations at Coveville, Pa., Emaus, Pa., Harmony, Ia., Green Bay, Wis., Third Moravian Church, Philadelphia, Pa., South Bethlehem, Pa., and Egg Harbor, N. J. He was married on June 16, 1876, at Reading, Pa., to Miss Fredericke D. Deubler, who died during his pastorate at Green Bay, Wis.

He took rooms in the North Western Orphans' Home with his children, and in 1883 moved with his children to his parent's home in Northampton County, Pa. Early in the year 1895 at his request he received a letter of dismissal from the governing Board of the Moravian Church and connected himself with the Hope of Israel Mission, New York City until May when he was received into the Tohickon Classis of the Reformed Church in the United States. He served the German Reformed Congregation at Plymouth, Pa., until November, 1904, when he had to retire on account of ill-health. At present, he lives with his son at Steelton, Pa., while recuperating.



REV. WILLIAM HENRY FEHR, A. M.

Rev. William Henry Fehr, A. M., (898) was born at Bethlehem, Pa. His parents moved to a farm in Lower Nazareth Township when he was four years old. He received his rudimentary education in the public schools. At seventeen he began teaching and taught for three consecutive terms, attending Nazareth High School and Muhlenberg Preparatory Academy during the Spring sessions after the close of his school terms. In the fall of 1893, he entered the classical department of Muhlenberg College from which he graduated in 1897. In October of the same year he was married. After teaching another term of ten months in the Borough of Tatamy, Pa., he took up the study of theology at the Mt. Airy Lutheran Seminary at Philadelphia, graduating therefrom three years later. He was ordained to the Gospel Ministry June 3, 1901. Some time afterward he received a call from St. John's Lutheran Church, Pittsburg, Pa., which he accepted and of which he is still pastor. While in his senior year at college, he was editor-in-chief of the Muhlenberg, a literary journal. He is the author of a tract on Foreign Missions and a contributor to church papers.

JAMES H. FEHR.

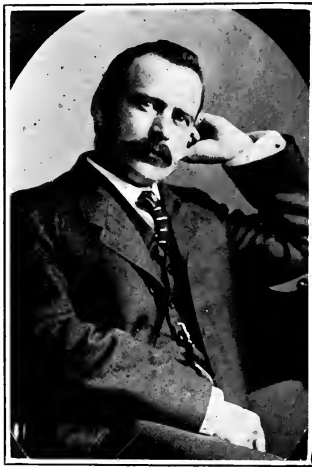

He learned cigar-making and later engaged in the cigar business. After his marriage they began housekeeping on a small farm which he had bought, not far from Sour's Mill where they still reside. He is a man of a quiet and mild disposition and respected by all who know him. He served his township in the capacity of school director and various other minor offices. For many years he was the secretary of Aluta Lodge, I. O. O. F.

FRANCIS G. FEHR.

Francis G. Fehr (465) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Penn. He attended the public schools and later select schools where he prepared himself for the teaching profession. As an accomplishment, he took up the art of music. He taught school in his native county for twenty-two consecutive terms and hopes to continue for as many more. At the age of sixteen, he was elected organist of the Union Church at Belfast, which office he held for six and one half years when he resigned to accept a similar position at the Plainfield Church. After spending ten years with this congregation, he resigned and became the organist of the Bushkill Centre Church. In 1886, he was married to Catharine Frantz. A few years after his marriage he acquired a small farm not far from Nazareth where they still reside.

ISAAC S. FEHR.

Isaac S. Fehr (473) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pennsylvania. During his childhood and early youth he attended the public schools and in 1877 went as far west as Illinois. The following year he went to Minnesota, working on a farm and then traveling until 1880 when he returned to his native state. The next year he was married and began farming, later buying the Douglass Farm on which a fortune was spent in the quarrying of slate. In 1888, he began to work at the carpenter's trade and later became the engineer of the pumping-station of the Nazareth Water Company. In the Fall of 1905, he was elected Poor Director of Northampton County.



SAMUEL D. LUCKENBACH.

Samuel D. Luckenbach (706) was born in Bethlehem, Pa., and in his youth was reared under the careful guidance of his eldest sister. He received his education at the Moravian Parochial School and left that Institution at an early age to face life's responsibilities as an Office Boy for the Old Bangor Slate Company. In 1882 he accepted a clerkship with Linderman and Skeer, Coal Operators, until 1891 when the position of Book-keeper was tendered him by Garrett B. Linderman and Company, Coal Operators. He later became Secretary and Treasurer of the Mount Hope Coal Company and the Georgia Peruvian Ochre Company and Private Secretary to Mr. Garrett B. Linderman of South Bethlehem, which latter position he now holds in addition to the Secretary and Treasurership of several Gold Mining Companies. In May, 1897, he married Olga C. Hesse, who had, the year previous, served as a Missionary among the "Mission Indians" in California.

Mr. Luckenbach is a member of the Moravian Church and has been prominently connected with the Sunday School, Christian Endeavor and Missionary Societies of the Church at Bethlehem. He is also a member of the Moravian Historical Society, National Geographic Society, A. & I. O. K. of M., and P. O. S. of A.

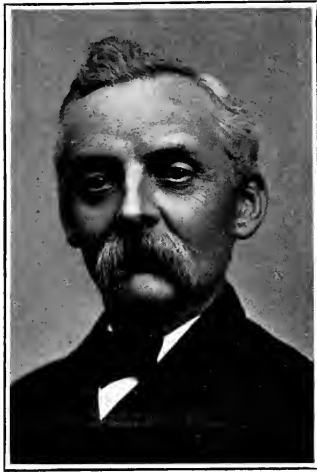
ADDIE PHELPS.

However, the fact that her mother was still living caused her to scheme wisely and she left her father honorably under the pretence of visiting relatives and through the aid of friends journeyed to where her mother lived but arrived a few weeks after she was buried. Heartbroken and almost in despair she visited among her relatives and finally took courage and began to do household duties and learned dressmaking. Her health would not allow her to continue the latter, and in consequence, she went to her aunt to recuperate.

She was married on the fourth of February, 1879, and for five years lived in Crawford County, Ohio, and then moved to Padanaram, where they now reside. They are engaged in farming and operating a saw-mill.

EDWARD H. GAMBOLD.

Edward H. Gambold (671) was born in Hope, Indiana. He attended the public schools and in 1882 entered the Business College at Indianapolis, Ind. At the close of the same year, he entered upon his business career. After serving a clerkship in the Car Accountant's Office for nine months, he was promoted to chief clerk of that department of the Ohio Southern Railway with offices in Springfield, Ohio. In 1894, he resigned his position with the railway company to become a partner of the Morning Daily Newspaper Publishing Company. They organized the company and through perseverance made the business a success, our subject acting as treasurer and manager. In 1904, he sold his interests in the Newspaper, having become interested in manufacturing companies.



CHARLES H. CLEWELL.

Charles H. Clewell (417) was born in Nazareth, Pa. He was a pupil of the Moravian Parochial School and learned the trade of cabinet-making from his father. Soon after his marriage, he moved to New Castle, Del., where he now resides and is engaged in the undertaking business for more than twenty-three years. He is a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church.

CLARENCE O. LUCKENBACH.

Clarence O. Luckenbach (1113) was born in Bethlehem, Pa. He was educated in the Moravian Parochial Schools from which he graduated and at Lehigh University in the class of 1894. After leaving the University he was first employed by the Midvale Steel Company and later secured a position in the Philadelphia public schools as principal and teacher. He was forced to relinquish his connection with the schools on account of failing health and traveled, settling in the Southwest. He spent some time in the hospital at Las Vegas, after which he went to Santa Fe, N. M., where he died. He is buried at Bethlehem, Pa.



HARRY E. CLEWELL.

Harry E. Clewell (114*) was born in Nazareth, Pa., and attended the Moravian Parochial schools at that place. He became interested in office work and conducted several touring parties to Europe. His town honored him with the office of Justice of the Peace and later he was commissioned a Notary Public. He traveled extensively and is now engaged in the real estate business.

ELIZA J. BRUCH.

Eliza J. Bruch (245) was born in Hanover Township, Lehigh County, Pa. She attended the public schools and received the rudiments of an education. In her youth she became a confirmed member of the Lutheran Church at Rittersville, Pa. After marriage to Mr. Bruch about 1855, they moved into the vicinity of Freemansburg, Pa., where they resided but a short time and then to Bethlehem, where she spent the rest of her life. Her husband died October 2, 1902, leaving her a widow for nearly five years. She is buried at Bethlehem, Pa.



EUGENE D. TREIN AND FAMILY.

Eugene D. Trein (1865) was born in Aluta, Northampton County, Pa. He attended the public schools and through industry and perseverance prepared himself for the teaching profession. He taught school for a few years in his native township and then resigned to accept a position in the Nazareth National Bank as book-keeper. He was married, October —, 1902, and resides in Nazareth.

Both he and his wife are members of the Moravian Church at Schoeneck.

Socially, Mr. Trein is connected with the Masonic Order, and the I. O. O. F.



DR. ELMER C. BRUCH.

Dr. Elmer C. Bruch (769) was born in Bethlehem, Pa. He received a rudimentary education in the public schools and after a thorough preparation in Bellevue Hospital, New York City, he entered the Baltimore Medical College, Baltimore, Md., from which he graduated in 1891. He then took a post graduate course in the Jefferson Medical College at Philadelphia, Pa., graduating in 1892. He then returned to his native town and opened an office where he enjoys a large patronage, and bears an honorable distinction among his many friends.

ERWIN J. BRUCH.

Erwin J. Bruch (767) was born in Bethlehem Township, Northampton County, Pa. When about a year old his parents moved to Bethlehem, Pa., where he received his education in the Public Schools. In his youth he learned the baker's trade which he ever afterwards followed. After eleven years experience in the business he established his own in his town and now enjoys a prosperous business making a specialty of the pretzel.



REV. CHARLES S. STEINMETZ AND FAMILY.

Rev. Charles S. Steinmetz (1860) was born in Northampton County, Penn. His parents moved to the state of Michigan when he was four years old and resided there until in the fall of 1878 when the family again took journey westward, arriving at Sterling, Rice County, Kansas, where they settled. That part of the state was then mostly a wild unbroken prairie and game plentiful, such as wild geese, wild ducks, prairie chickens, deer, antelope and the howling coyote. However, the unbroken prairies were soon converted into wheat and corn fields by the enterprising immigrants who also planted fruit and shade trees and erected beautiful houses. School and church privileges were very limited, their nearest school house, being three miles distant. Soon after his marriage he became a member of the Evangelical Association and in March, 1880, entered upon the ministry, having received his license to preach from the Conference in session at Yates Center, Kansas. His first field of labor was in Missouri. He labored in Missouri and Kansas until 1890 when he moved to Colorado. While there he organized two missions, one at Colorado Springs and the other at Ordway.



WILLIAM H. CLEWELL.

William H. Clewell, M. D., (421) was born in Nazareth, Pa. He attended the Moravian Parochial School until 1881 when his parents moved to Philadelphia. Here he entered the public schools, and later was matriculated a student of the Medico Chirurgical College, from which he graduated in 1896. The next year he moved to Summit Hill, where he practices medicine and conducts a drug store. On December 22, 1905, he was appointed postmaster. At the outbreak of the Spanish American War, he organized Company L, Ninth Pennsylvania Volunteers, and was commissioned First Lieutenant.

LUCINDA BALCOM.

Lucinda Balcom (247) was born in the state of Ohio and was a life-long resident of that state. They chiefly lived on a farm until the outbreak of the Civil War where her husband, David Balcom, enlisted in Company F, Ohio Volunteers, Nineteenth Regiment. He was taken a prisoner by the enemy at the battle of Chickamauga, Tenn., on September 19, 1863, and died in the Andersonville War Prison on June 3, 1864.

REV. LEON G. LUCKENBACH.

Rev. Leon G. Luckenbach (1300) was born at Bethlehem, Pa. He attended the Moravian Parochial School for a few years when he was transferred to the public schools from which he graduated in 1890. While attending High School, he left for about a year and a half occupying the position of cashier and confidential clerk of a large dry goods store in Pottsville, Pa. He returned to Bethlehem and finished the course in school and then entered the Moravian College and Theological Seminary from which he graduated in 1896, and was ordained by Bishop J. Mortimer Levering on June 11th of the same year. He accepted the pastorate of the York City mission, entering upon his charge July 1st. During his pastorate several chapels were remodeled and transferred into the Second Moravian Church of York, Pa. He was married on May 4, 1897.

JOSEPH LOVIN CLEWELL.

Joseph Lovin Clewell (257) was a soldier in Company F, One Hundred and Thirty Second Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers and was wounded in the battle of Antietam and taken to the hospital at Harper's Ferry where he died from his wounds and is buried there.

ALBERT A. CLEWELL.

Albert A. Clewell (258) enlisted in the Union Army at the age of seventeen. He joined Company A, One Hundred and Fifty-third Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers on September 15, 1862. He fought in the battles of Chancellorsville and Gettysburg and received an honorable discharge at Harrisburg on July 23, 1863.



JAMES R. CROUSE AND WIFE.

James R. Crouse (557) was born in Ross Township, Clinton County, Indiana. He attended the public schools and after completing the course he entered a Teacher's Training School from which he entered upon the profession of Public School Teacher in his native county. For fifteen years, he has been instructing the young with much success. On June 10, 1897, he was married to Miss Ida Mitten of Rossville, Ind., where they now reside. Their place of residence is a pleasant one, with the *latch-string* of their door always on the outside to their relatives and friends.

TILGHMAN S. P. STEINER.

Tilghman S. P. Steiner (814) was born near Schoeneck, Pa. He attended the public schools and later the Moravian Parochial school then taught by Bishop Henry VanVleck. While here in this school, he took up the study of music and later took lessons of Jacob Haman and Prof. Anton Mattes. In his seventeenth year he was appointed organist of the Schoeneck Moravian Church, and later served as organist at the following churches: at Hecktown, Catasauqua, and Stone Church, a place near Kreidersville. He spent the last twenty-three years at the latter place as organist and music teacher. He was married to Louisa Giersch, who was also a lineal descendant of the Clewells, on the first of September, 1863, but she died one month after their marriage, and is buried at Schoeneck. On December 24, 1866, he married Maria L. Gross. He followed his trade as cigar-maker and move to Catasauqua, Pa. During the Civil War he was employed in the Philadelphia Armory. He is a born Moravian and was a member of the Schoeneck congregation, but later became a member of the Reformed Church.

CHRISTIAN CLEWELL.

Christian Clewell (599) was born near Catawissa, Penn. He received a meager education in the public schools but acquired more through the actual experiences in life. He served as a private soldier in Company H, 132nd Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers, First Brigade, Third Division, Second Corps, of the Army of the Potomac. He fought in the battle of Fredericksburg on Dec. 13, 1862, and at Chancellorsville, May 1-3, 1863. On his return from the war he settled in Catawissa where he has a general merchandise business and enjoys the respect of his fellow-citizens.

FRANCIS G. SAYLOR.

Francis G. Saylor (488) was born in Filetown, near Schoeneck, Pa. He attended the public schools where he displayed business qualities. When a mere youth he became a clerk in his uncle's general merchandise store at Bushkill Centre, Pa., and from thence he went to Philadelphia where he became the chief clerk in a grocery. A few years after his marriage they moved to Easton, Pa., where they now reside.



MARY E. STRAUBEL.

Mary E. Straubel (1317) was born in Bethlehem, Penn. Her childhood was uneventful, receiving a meager education and at the age of sixteen years became acquainted with the then strange people called the Salvation Army. She was raised a Moravian and received many deep and lasting impressions from their teachings, both in church and Sunday-school, and desiring to follow the teachings of the Master she cast her lot with the Army in 1884 after many sad and bitter experiences. Her earnestness and zeal in the work were recognized by her superiors and in the latter part of the same year she became an officer. She married Charles Straubel of Brooklyn, N. Y., also an officer in the Army, on July 8, 1886. They met with bitter oppositions, persecutions, arrests, imprisonments, stonings and beatings at the hands of angry mobs while performing their duties, receiving wounds, the scars of which they will carry into their graves, in the work of reclaiming many drunkards and outcasts, restoring children to their parents and reuniting families. They are at present stationed in Philadelphia, having worked in the city of Cincinnati for a few years previously.

REV. ALLEN EUGENE ABEL.

Rev. Allen Eugene Abel (1872) was born in Nazareth, Penn., and educated in the parochial and public schools of that place. He entered the drugstore of Mr. M. M. Buss of South Bethlehem in May, 1882, continuing as a clerk therein until 1884 when he entered the Moravian Theological Seminary at Bethlehem, Pa., from which institution he graduated on June 10, 1890 and immediately entered the ministry of the Gospel, his first charge being at Hector, Minn. His pastorate here continued for over six years, till August, 1896, when he settled at Chaska, Minn. In July, 1900, he accepted a call to the East Side Moravian Church of Green Bay, Wis., of which congregation he was pastor until the year 1905 when, in the month of February he became the pastor of the Moravian Church at Emaus, Penn.

JOHN DAVIS.

John Davis (707) was born near Bethlehem, Pa., and lived with his grand-father, Clewell, until his death, when he became the adopted son of Samuel McLaughlin of New Jersey, at the age of seven. A few years later he became a member of the family of James Ramsey, Mr. McLaughlin having died. At the age of fifteen, he came back to Bethlehem and lived in its vicinity for three years. In 1870, he went to Fort Wayne, Indiana, where he lived for three years and then journeyed to Illinois, where he lived until 1892. While in the state of Illinois he was married to Miss Ida McMaster, of Gifford. He now resides in Vernon County, Missouri, and is engaged in farming and stock-raising.

MARCUS J. REED.

Marcus J. Reed (724) was born in Bethlehem, Pa., and was educated in the public schools of the town. Later, he took a course in the Eastman Business College of Poughkeepsie, N. Y. After the completion of his business course, he accepted a position as bookkeeper for G. B. Markle and Company at Jeddo, Pa., being employed in that capacity for thirteen years. In 1899, he entered the shoe business in Lebanon, Pa. He was married in 1890.

SARAH ANN JOHNSON.

Sarah Ann Johnson (637) was born near Friedburg, North Carolina. Her parents died, leaving her an orphan at the age of twelve years. She lived with her uncle for about five years and being a member of the Friedburg Moravian Church was privileged to enter the Sisters' House in Salem, N. C. Later, she made her home with her cousin in Clemmons ville and shortly after her marriage moved into Yadkin County, N. C., where she still resides. There being no Moravian Church in that vicinity, she joined the Methodist Church.

LAWRENCE A. CLEWELL.

Lawrence A. Clewell (379) was a private soldier during the Civil War in Company C, One Hundred Twenty-ninth Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers. He took part in the battles of Bull Run, Fredericksburg and Chancellorsville, and was wounded in the army during one of the engagements.

FRANK H. C. CLEWELL.

Frank H. C. Clewell (982) was born in Sterling, Illinois, and was married on March 8, 1902, at Independence, Missouri. He served as a private during the Spanish-American War in Company F, Second Regiment, Nebraska Volunteers. After the war, he was employed by The Cudahy Packing Company in Kansas City, Kansas, in the capacity of paymaster.

CHARLES W. CLEWELL.

Charles W. Clewell (995) took part in the Cuban campaign during the Spanish-American War and was second sergeant in Company F, Eighth Regiment, Ohio Volunteers.

Augustus B. Clewell (573) was a soldier in the Civil War of Company H, One Hundred Seventy-eighth Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers with the rank of Second Sergeant.

REUBEN H. CLEWELL.

Reuben H. Clewell (163) was born a few miles west of Bethlehem, in Hanover Township, Northampton County, Pa. During the winter months he was sent to the rural school and in the summer he assisted his father on the farm. He learned the carpenter's trade when quite young, having served an apprenticeship of several years. On the 9th of March, 1858, he was married to Mary A. Landis of Allentown, Pa. Three years later, they moved to Rossville, Ind. In August, 1867, they located on a farm in Carroll County, Ind., and in 1886 at Bringhurst, where, on August 22, 1895, his wife died. On July 20, 1899, he married Emiline Townsley, *nee* Hanna., and thereafter resided at Burnettville and where he died and is buried. He was a member of the German Reformed Church, but later joined the Methodist Episcopal. He was a zealous church-worker, having served in various offices. He was a soldier of the Civil War in Company G, Indiana Volunteers.



CATHERINE STEINMETZ AND FAMILY.

Catherine Steinmetz (454) was born in Bushkill Township, Northampton County, Pa. She attended the public schools and assisted her parents during her childhood and youth. On January 24, 1858, she was married in Bath, Pa. A few years after marriage they moved to Michigan, and from thence to Kansas, where she experienced much of the hardships of fron-

tier life. Through perseverance they acquired a large farm, which they cleared of its primitive wildness. She was a member of the Moravian Church, but the time of her death belonged to the Evangelical Association. She was a devout Christian, and early taught her family the way of life and right living. She is buried in the Alden Cemetery, Kansas.

JAMES FRANKLIN STEINMETZ.

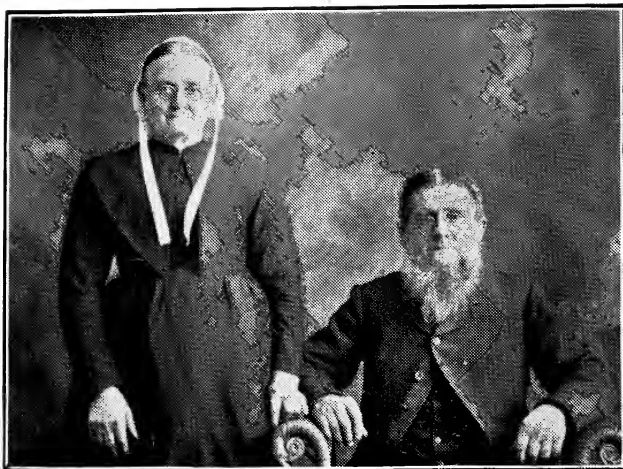
James Franklin Steinmetz (1056) was born in Northampton County, Pa. At the age of fourteen, he left his parent's roof and went to Illinois and worked on a farm. During his youth he traveled much and as far west as Colorado and following various avocations. In the Fall of 1882 he visited his native state for the third time, and was married to Allie Levan of Northampton, formerly Stenton, Pa. He returned to Kansas, and from thence to Colorado, where he was employed in the lumber business. In 1895, he was elected County Treasurer and re-elected in 1897. He now resides at Colorado Springs, Col., and holds the position of Government Forest Supervisor.

REV. MILTON J. STEINMETZ.

Rev. Milton J. Steinmetz (1059) was born in Northampton County, Pa. He went with his parents westward and assisted them on the farm. He entered upon the Gospel Ministry in the Evangelical Church in March, 1888, at Hiawatha, Kansas. He has proven to be a successful pastor and minister. He now resides at Derby, Kansas.

JOSEPHINE A. (TEMPLES) TOLLE.

Josephine A. (Temples) Tolle (667) was born near Hope, Ind., and attended the public schools and later the Moravian Academy at Hope. On December 24, 1866, she married Wiley R. Temples, who was a veteran of the Civil War in Company B, Second Battalion, U. S. Infantry. Soon after marriage they moved to Kansas, where he was killed on October 15, 1867, by a band of Indians. She returned to her native state and lived with her parents until October 15, 1874, when she married Mr. Tolle. While in her widowhood, she taught school as a means of livelihood. They now reside at Dayton, Tenn.



MARIA C. CROUTHAMEL AND HUSBAND.

Maria C. Crouthamel (701) was married in the year 1861. He was an engineer and superintendent of iron ore mines in Lehigh County, Penn. Later he entered the store business with his brother in Line Lexington, Pa. They dissolved partnership after a few years and Mr. Crouthamel established a general merchandise store making the handling of ready-made clothing a specialty and for the last thirty years is engaged in the manufacture of clothing employing seventy-five and more people in his factory at Hatfield. He is also interested in real estate, at one time owning 640 acres of land in Missouri. He was one of the incorporators of his town into a borough, of which he served as one of its first councilmen. Mr. and Mrs. Crouthamel belong to the Dunkard faith. They traveled extensively through the West.

HATTIE BASKINS.

Hattie Baskins (730) lives on a farm near Jeansville, Iowa.

WILLIAM M. CLEWELL.

William M. Clewell (741) is a prominent business man in Dubuque, Iowa.



JACOB L. CLEWELL.

Jacob L. Clewell (28) was raised on the farm, his father being the manager of the Nazareth Hall farm. In his eighteenth year he learned the cabinet-making trade with Andrew G. Kern. After his term of apprenticeship, he began business for himself which was marked for his industry.

He exhibited great constructive powers in building machinery for convenience in his trade. While still an apprentice he built a foot-lathe for Mr. Kern and later one for himself. He also made a horse-power to operate a circular-saw and a veneering-saw of his own ingenuity. The latter saw was then the only one known in the vicinity.

He manufactured chair stretchers and rounds, chair tops and veneering and did much of the veneering himself and sent his products to Philadelphia. He also mined and manufactured what was known as a "Mineral Black Paint" and shipped it by boat to Philadelphia, where it was sold by his agents.

In his youth as was customary with many of the Clewells, he learned music and for many years was leader of a Musical Band which was sometimes called "The Frenchmen's Band (Die

Fransosa Band) because the majority of its members were Clewells. He was a member of the Nazareth Moravian Trombone Choir until his 65th year. Besides serving his chosen church in many capacities, he was a trustee under the lease system of that church for many years and was noted for his punctuality and integrity. He is buried at Nazareth.



JACOB L. CLEWELL.

Jacob L. Clewell (116) was born in Nazareth, Pa. He attended the Moravian Parochial Schools and later was enrolled as a student of Nazareth Hall. At the age of 13, he quit school and learned cabinet-making with his father. At the age of 16, his father taught him to play a trombone and joined the Trombone Choir of which he was a member until he was thirty-two years old. He also was a member of the Church Orchestra and a member of the choir. After his marriage, they moved to Cherry Hill, where they lived for five years, and then moved to Nazareth where he had bought his father's homestead. In 1880, he moved his family to Philadelphia where he is now residing. He is an employee of the Keystone Telephone Company.

JACOB L. CLEWELL.

Jacob L. Clewell (728) was engaged in farming the greater part of his life. About 1896, he moved to Waverly, Iowa, and engaged in teaming.

DAVID O. LUCKENBACH.

David O. Luckenbach (675) was born in Bethlehem, Pa. He was educated in the private school of Ernst F. Bleck. At an early age he became familiar with the milling business, and in 1857, his father took him in as a partner under the name of Jacob Luckenbach & Son. In 1861, his father retired, and the firm of D. & A. Luckenbach was formed, which continued until death interrupted. On January 18, 1864, he was married to Ellen E. Meyers. Mr. Luckenbach was a member of the State Milling Association, a director of the First National Bank of Bethlehem, and also of the Allentown and Bethlehem Turnpike Company. For many years he was one of the Trustees of Lehigh University. He took a great deal of pride in civic improvements and was a member of Town Council. He was a life-long Moravian.

ROSINA LUCKENBACH.

Rosina Luckenbach (23) was born at York, Pa. On September 17, 1813, she was married to Rev. Abraham Luckenbach, a Moravian Missionary among the Indians at Goshen, Ohio, where they resided for several years, after which they moved to New Fairfield, Canada, where they continued their missionary labors for twenty-three years. They retired to Bethlehem, Pa., where they are buried.

CORNELIA REGENNAS.

Cornelia Regennas (168) was married to Rev. John J. Regennas at Lancaster, Pa., in May, 1852. The next year they moved to Emaus, Pa., where he was the pastor of the Moravian Church for seven years. In 1860, he became the pastor of the Schoeneck Moravian Church, resigning in November, 1880, and moved to Hope, Ind., where he died and where Mrs. Regennas still resides.

DR. EUGENE G. REGENNA.

Dr. Eugene G. Regennas (584) was born at Emaus, Pa. He attended Nazareth Hall from 1864 to 1868, and then worked at woodcarving for four years, at Lancaster, Pa. He graduated from the Philadelphia Dental College in 1876 and afterwards moved to Hope, Ind. In 1886, he graduated from the College of Physicians and Surgeons. He is organist of the Moravian Church at Hope, Ind., since 1868.

JULIUS A. GAMBOLD.

Julius A. Gambold (1496) was born in Hope, Indiana, where he lived for 21 years. In his sixteenth year he began school teaching which he followed for 30 years. He came to Veedersburg, Ind., in 1873, where he was married two years later, April 25, 1875. A few years after his marriage he entered the lumber and saw-mill business which he pursued until he moved to Indianapolis, Ind., to become the proprietor of a hotel.

RALEIGH M. PEARSON.

Raleigh M. Pearson (1539) was Captain of Company E., Second Arkansas United States Volunteers during the Spanish-American War. His company was in service ten months, six at Chicamauga, Ga., and four at Anniston, Ala. He is interested in the manufacture of all kinds of artistic signs.

EDWIN FRANKLIN CLEWELL.

Edwin Franklin Clewell (272) was born in Schoeneck. He learned the locksmith trade and later became a tinsmith. He married Julia E. Danke on March 16, 1841, and lived in Schoeneck, opposite the graveyard in which he is buried. He was a noted musician in his community.

CHARLES H. CLEWELL.

Charles H. Clewell (731) lives in Waverly, Iowa, and is employed at marble works.

Account of Clewell Family Reunions.

During the spring of 1903, the compilers of the Family history saw and felt the advantage of a Family reunion. They expressed their opinions to some who were anxious about the success of the history with a view to create a sentiment for the reunion till the following year. Instead, a sentiment in favor of immediate action arose so strongly that in June a preliminary meeting was held at Nazareth, Pa., and the following officers elected; president, Lewis B. Clewell, of Bethlehem, Pa.; vice-presidents, Rev. Lewis P. Clewell and Bishop J. M. Levering, both of Bethlehem, Pa.; secretary, W. D. Seyfried, of Bethlehem, Pa.; treasurer, Harry E. Clewell, of Nazareth, Pa.

So enthusiastic were those in attendance at this meeting which was attended by ladies as well as gentlemen, that the date for the reunion was fixed for August 26, 1903, when the first reunion of the Clewells should take place. The Rev. George F. Bahnson, then pastor of the Schoeneck Moravian Church, extended an invitation to hold the first reunion at the religious altar of the progenitors of this large family. The invitation was cheerfully accepted and committees on arrangements and music were appointed. The former consisted of Harry E. Clewell, chairman, G. A. Schneebeil, Ephraim Loux, Stephen Trein, Eugene Stocker, Edwin Clewell and Tilghman Fehr and the latter of Stephen Trein, Ellis Schneebeil and Tilghman Steiner.

The president was also empowered to appoint a committee to be known as the Executive Committee which consisted of Monroe Clewell, Oliver L. Fehr, Edwin Clewell, Walter Clewell,

James H. Fehr, Francis G. Fehr, William A. Siegfried, John J. Clewell, William H. Friebely, Ephraim Loux, Thomas B. Clewell, Martin Clewell, G. A. Schneebeli, Oliver A. Clewell, O. B. Desh, Thomas D. Clewell, A. S. Bishop and A. B. Fehr. The committees and the officers immediately began the planning for the reunion and to make it a memorable day for those who should attend.

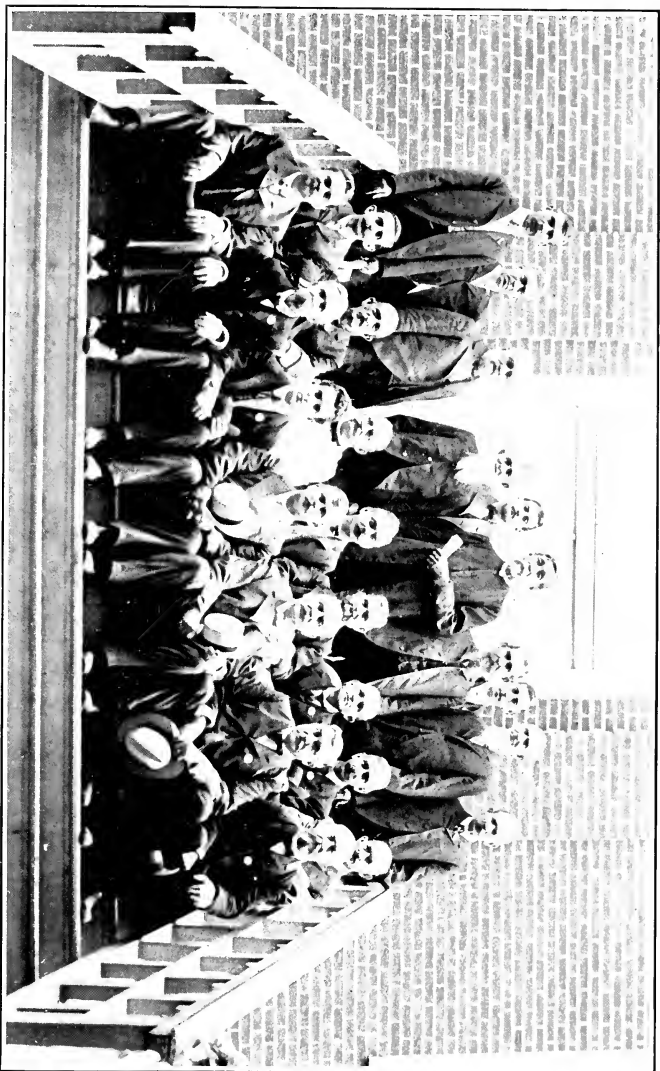
The historians had gathered at this time about 400 families and to them were sent invitations with the request that they should extend the invitation to others who were likely to belong to the descendants of the Clewells and by the responses received by the secretary it bid fair to assure a large crowd.

There was something peculiarly appropriate in celebrating a reunion near the spot where the ancestors had lived and worked. Many came from a distance to meet with the scenes of their childhood and the friends whom they had left as they went forth into the world. Others who were ignorant of the fact that all Clewells in America were closely related to each other came on a mission for information and identify.

The early hours of August 26, the date of the first reunion, promised a bright and sunny day with a mild atmosphere and as early as seven o'clock did the young and old begin to assemble in the village of Schoeneck. The graves of the deceased members on the cemetery were marked by a white silken streamer with the letter "C" stamped upon it in bronze while the graves of those who were connected with the family through marriage were marked by a blue silken streamer.

The grave of Mother Clewell (Stamm-mutter) as well as the graves of her two sons, Franz and George Clewell were more elaborately decorated with streamers and floral tributes.

The celebrating spirit was evident among the crowd as it gathered and registered on the blanks prepared by the committee and by ten o'clock fully 800 members and relatives of the family were wearing the button with the following inscription. "First Reunion, Clewell Family, 1737, August 26, 1903. So surprising was the attendance that it may best be illustrated by the following incident. The president although hardly able to be present on account of ill health stood gazing down the road

toward Nazareth when he was accosted thus: "Ai! Ai! Lewis was lustch du gemocht! Guk! die gonsa welt kum't yo noch da Clawelda reunion!"

At 10 o'clock, a trombone choir consisting of Messrs. John J. Reinheimer, Carl Seyfried, William H. Trein, Sydney Beitel, Samuel Ruth, Stephen A. Trein and Harry Kellar announced the beginning of the programme from the belfry of the church by rendering a few of the familiar and beautiful Moravian tunes after which the people gathered in the orchard back of the church where a platform and seats had been erected. Rev. Lewis P. Clewell delivered the opening address in which he pointed out the objects of the reunion: first, to promote devotion; second, information; third, inspiration; and fourth, association. Rev. William Oerter of New Dorf, Staten Island, led the devotional exercises after which the president, Lewis P. Clewell offered a few remarks on the history of the Clewell family in America and deplored his inability to do justice to the occasion on account of his illness.

The address of welcome was ably and appropriately delivered by Rev. George F. Bahnson. He emphasized the sterling qualities in the characters of Madame Kuechle and her two sons, Franz and George Clewell, and extended the warm hand of friendship to the descendants in coming home to the religious shrine of the ancestors. Rev. Robert E. Clewell of Hopedale, Pa., responded. He spoke of the prolific family-tree and offered words of praise for the devotion of the many to their ancestors and extolled the virtues and patriotism of the fathers and reminded his audience of the future and its responsibilities. Other brief addresses followed after which a business session took place when all the officers were re-elected except Harry E. Clewell who declined and was succeeded by William A. Siegfried and a resolution passed to have a second reunion within the next year. During the noon hour the sextette gave a delightful concert while many took luncheon which the Sisters' Union of the Schoeneck Church had furnished.

At two o'clock the people again gathered in the orchard to listen to the historical sketch of the family and to hear the secretary's report which gave full information as to the extent of the family and the work accomplished on the history. Rev.

T. G. Clewell of South Park, Ohio, read an original poem and followed with a brief address.

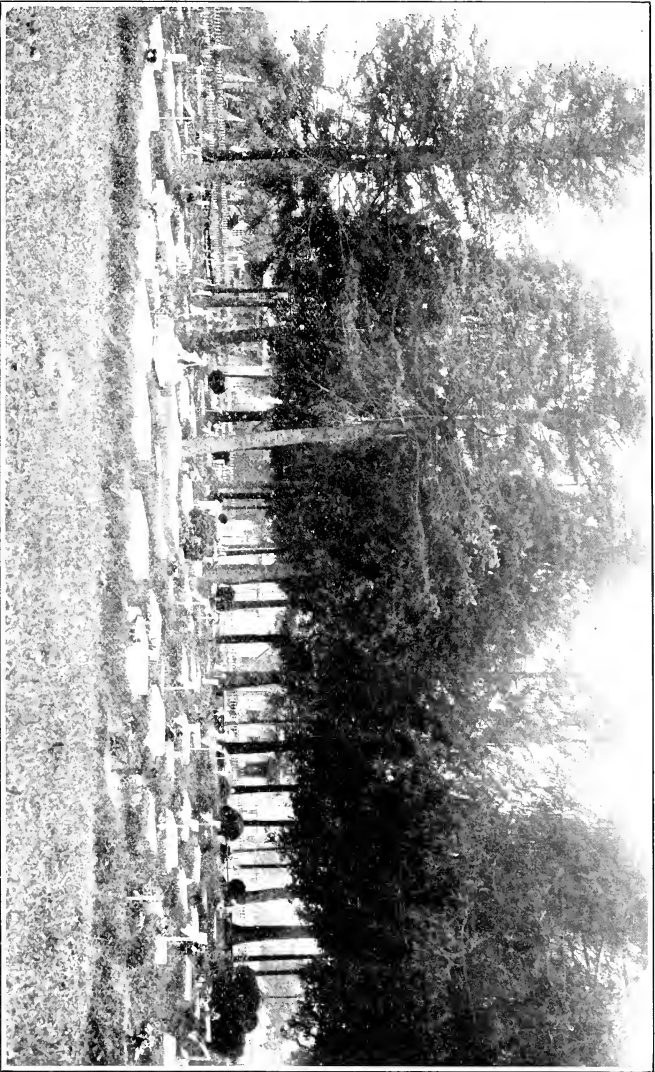
The assemblage then proceeded from the orchard to the graveyard, the trombonists leading where the memorial services were held. Rev. Lewis P. Clewell delivered a masterly address full of inspiration and aspiration and which should be here recorded but his unexpected removal from our ranks left the manuscripts incomplete. Rev. T. G. Clewell closed the programme by a brief address and the benediction.

The reunion was attended by at least 1200 people and all expressed their highest praise for the occasion. The expenses which amounted to over \$110 were met by voluntary contributions.

SECOND REUNION.

The second reunion of the Clewell Family was held on August 24, 1904, in the old historic grove of Black Rock, near Nazareth, and almost within the shadow of the Schoeneck Moravian Church. The day again seemed to be mapped out by Providence for the event. Neither had the interest among the descendants in their reunions abated as was clearly manifested by the gathering crowd. At ten o'clock the president, Lewis B. Clewell called the meeting to order by making a brief address and on account of his feebleness requested O. L. Fehr whom the Executive Committee had selected to succeed the Rev. L. P. Clewell, to preside at the meetings. The devotional exercises were conducted by Samuel D. Luckenbach and W. D. Seyfried. The election of officers resulted as follows: president, Lewis B. Clewell, of Bethlehem, Pa.; vice-presidents Bishop J. M. Levering, of Bethlehem, Pa.; O. L. Fehr, of Easton, Pa.; Monroe L. Clewell, of Easton, Pa.; secretary W. D. Seyfried, of Bethlehem, Pa.; treasurer William A. Siegfried, of Nazareth, Pa.

Mr. A. S. Bishop, of Bethlehem offered a resolution that the next reunion should be held in 1907, the time and place to be named by the Executive Committee. Mr. William H. Clewell of Berwick, Pa., offered a resolution of gratitude to the various committees and officers for their efforts in making the reunion

such a success. The following resolutions were adopted in memory of Rev. Lewis P. Clewell.

WHEREAS, It has pleased an all wise Providence to remove from our midst the Rev. Lewis P. Clewell, a Vice-president of the Clewell Family Reunion, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the descendants of Franz and George Clewell through their Executive committee, desire at this time to record their deep feeling of regret over the loss which we have suffered in his death.

Lewis P. Clewell was called to his eternal rest on Saturday, January the 9th, 1904, to be forever with the Lord whom he so faithfully and efficiently served as a minister of the gospel within the fold of the Moravian church. Especially do we at this time deplore his demise as he was one of the strong men who labored so earnestly to arrange and bring to a successful completion the first re-union of the Clewell family, held last year at Schoeneck.

No labor was too severe, no task too irksome for him when it had reference to the Clewell family. As one of the Vice Presidents of the association he presided at many of the meetings of the Executive committee in an able and impartial manner.

RESOLVED, That we heartily sympathize with his widow and children in their great bereavement.

RESOLVED, That a copy of these resolutions be forwarded by the secretary to his widow, and that they be spread in full on the minutes of the Executive Committee.

The rest of the afternoon was wholly given to social intercourse and the reception of those who came from a distance among whom were found descendants from Ohio, Washington, D. C., Berwick, Pa., Hartley Hall, Pa., Scranton, Pa., Philadelphia, Pa., and other places. Lunch was furnished for those who were not provided with the same and a concert was given by a sextette during the noon hour.

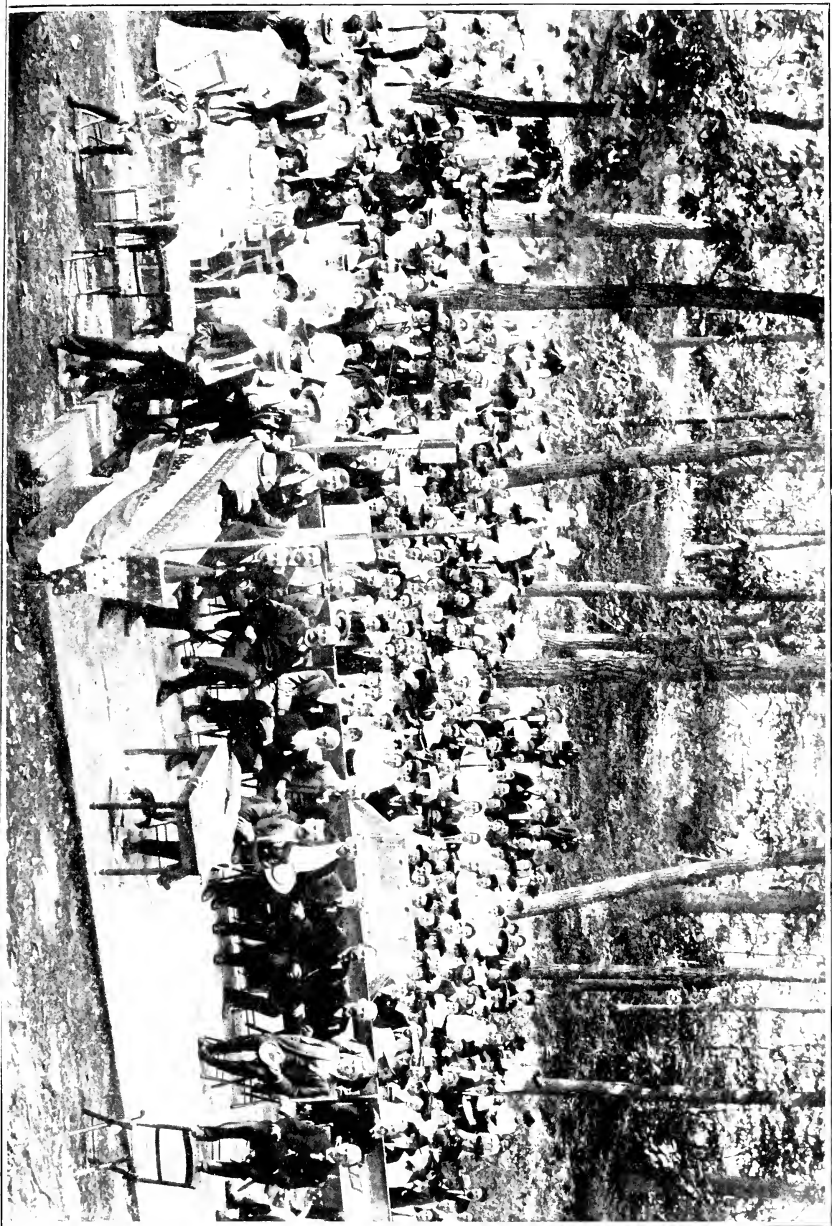
At two o'clock Harry E. Clewell, Esq., of Nazareth, Pa., gave an address of welcome in which he ably pointed out the benefits of a family reunion. A. S. Bishop of Bethlehem, Pa., eloquently responded by emphasizing the fraternal features of reunions and the great satisfaction of meeting friends. He contrasted the reunion of the descendants with the visits that Franz and

George Clewell made to each other with their large families and closed with a Pennsylvania German poem suggestive of the scenes and conditions in those pioneer days.

The secretary's report showed great progress on the history and a much larger family-tree than was dreamed of at the inception of the work. The programme closed with the reading of an original Pennsylvania German poem by the president, Lewis B. Clewell which at the request of the Executive Committee is herewith published.

The collections of the day amounted to more than \$112 and the large attendance which was about 1100 expressed their appreciation of the work of the Executive Committee and officers in words of praise as well as by their liberal contributions. The Executive Committee is composed of the following:
