

# DEPARTMENTAL STUDENT PRIZES AND AWARDS

---

In addition to the awards of the College of Engineering, several departments of the College have their own awards. Some, like the Baker Award in Civil Engineering, are of long standing. All are a source of pride to the department and of honor and prestige to the recipient. Departmental awards are presented at different times throughout the year and come from widely varying sources. Funds have been created as memorials to departed faculty and students, to recognize outstanding achievement and scholastic ability and to encourage interest and effort in a particular research area or industry. The funds are supported by donations from friends and relatives of the one being memorialized, from friends of the University, from industry, and from alumni.

## **AIR CONDITIONING, REFRIGERATION, AND HEATING AWARD** **Mechanical and Industrial Engineering**

The Air Conditioning, Heating, and Ventilating magazine awards the Handbook of Air Conditioning, Heating, and Ventilating to a senior who has displayed outstanding interest and proficiency in the area of environmental control. The selection is made by the faculty, and the recipient's name is placed on a plaque located in the Mechanical Engineering Building, and a certificate is given to each winner.

## **CHICAGO CHAPTER OF THE AMERICAN SOCIETY OF AGRICULTURAL ENGINEERS HONORED MEMBER SCHOLARSHIP AWARD**

of the Chicago Chapter of the American Society of Agricultural Engineers to a sophomore or junior student enrolled in agricultural engineering.
