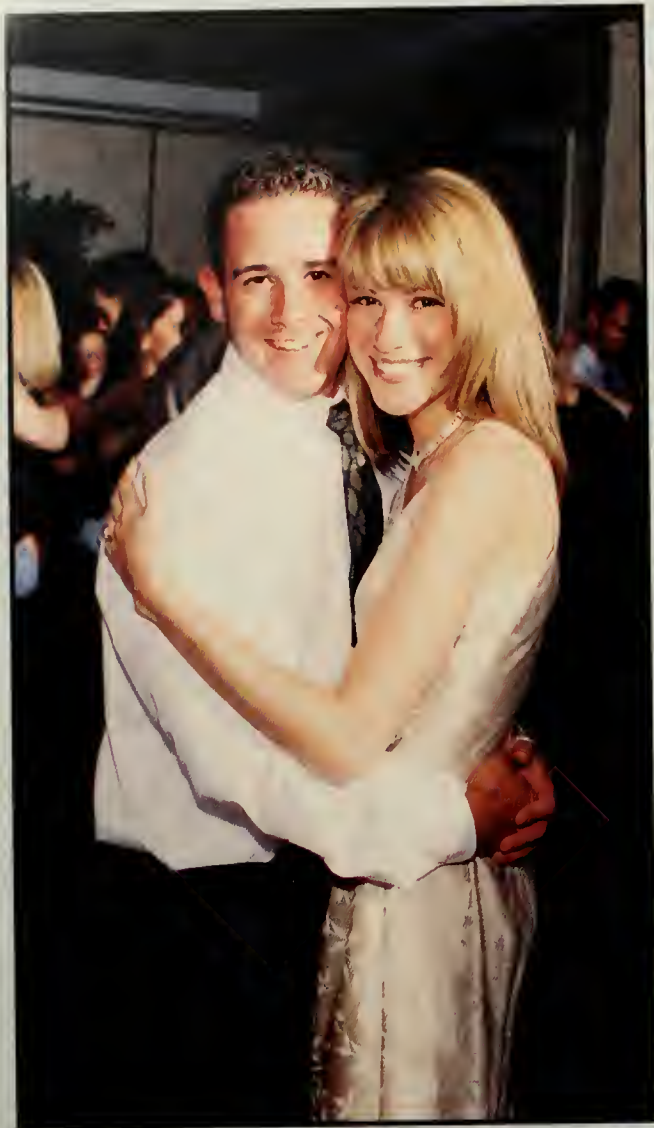
ANNUAL DINNER DANCE

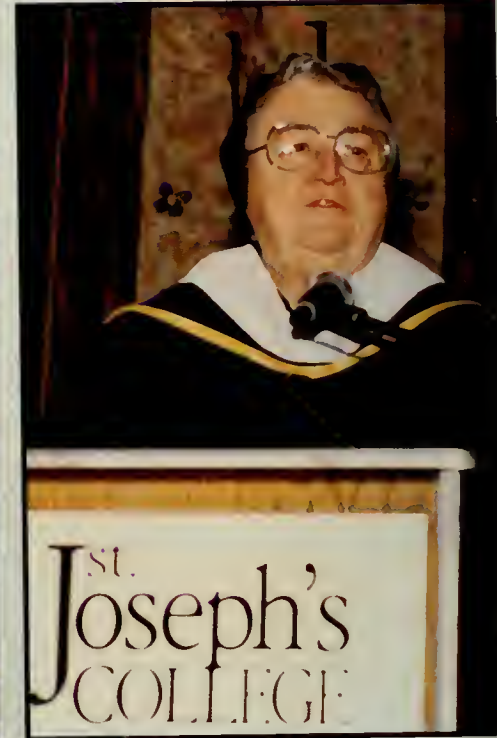


We can . . .

On Saturday, the 6th of February, 1999, St. Joseph's College held it's 80th commencement; and for the second time honored it's mid-year graduation.

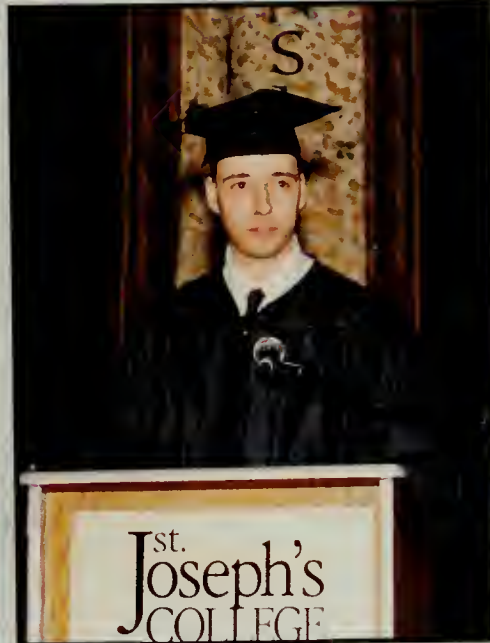

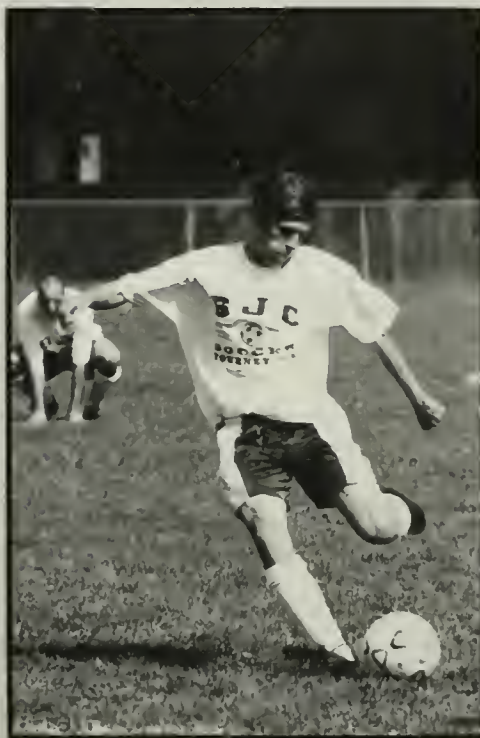




Men's Soccer
