ILLINOIS 1964 MINERAL PRODUCTION BY COUNTIES

W. L. Busch

The value of minerals produced in Illinois in 1964 amounted to 618 million dollars, the second highest annual value ever recorded for mineral production in the state. The record high value of 631 million dollars was established in 1962. The value of minerals produced in Illinois is given by commodity for 1963 and 1964 and by region for 1962 through 1964 on page 2.

A brief review of Illinois mineral production by commodities in 1964 shows that the value of fuels - crude oil and its associated products and coal amounted to 67.1 percent of the value of all minerals. Stone products, including crushed stone, cement, and lime, contributed 16.4 percent of the total mineral value, and clay products accounted for 8.3 percent. Sand and gravel furnished about 6.5 percent, and the combined value of fluorspar, zinc, and lead was about 1.7 percent.

Ninety-eight of the 102 counties in Illinois reported mineral production for 1964. Four counties, Fayette, Cook, LaSalle, and Fulton, each produced more than thirty million dollars worth of minerals for the year. Franklin, St. Clair, Marion, Williamson, Christian, White, and Lawrence Counties each produced between twenty and thirty million dollars worth of minerals. In addition, nine counties reported mineral production ranging in value from ten to twenty million dollars.

The tables of this report, listing the counties within regions, show how much each county contributed to the state's total mineral production value for 1964. Illinois county and regional outlines are shown by a map at the end of this report. In some cases it has been necessary to combine the mineral production of neighboring counties in order not to disclose confidential production information.






