

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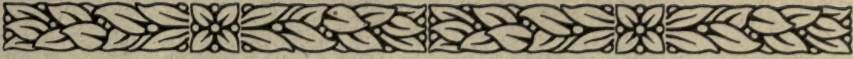
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## PREFACE

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THE renowned American book-lover and collector H. Walters published, as our readers will remember, the catalogue of his fine collection of about 1500 incunabula (1) which is now being as widely consulted, in the study of books printed in the fifteenth Century,

as Hain, Copinger, Proctor and Reichling etc. In the preface of his catalogue Mr. Walters concludes as follows: « We should be indeed pleased to think that, when some day, some one will undertake the final enumeration, which M.lle Pelletchet called 'The Golden Book of the Printers of the XV<sup>th</sup> Century' not only would France, Germany, Italy and England be called upon to contribute editions, but that America also might be in possession of at least one missing abroad, and thus contribute its mite of information ». His desire has not only been quickly accomplished, but it has been greatly surpassed because the contribution offered by America to the general catalogue of incunabula is very considerable, as appears from the « Census of 15<sup>th</sup> century books owned in America ».

published by the Bibliographical Society of America. The introduction which precedes the catalogue, is most interesting because it gives information on the origin and development of the collections of incunabula on the other side of the Atlantic. The interest in these monuments of the printing art was stimulated by the gift in 1898 of the collections of the well known bibliographer W. A. Copinger to the Public Library of Philadelphia. — When the Librarian Mr. John Thompson (1894-1916) was entrusted with the task of cataloguing the Library, he had the idea of proposing that a general inventory of all the incunabula in existence in the U. S. A. should be made. This idea was carried out at once by Mr. C. Alexander Nelson of the Columbia University Library in New York, who began the research of all the Incunabula owned by New York Libraries. From the first report of the work completed so far published in October 1899, it was found that 30 of the Libraries and owners of incunabula had sent 879 titles. In 1902, the number reached 33 public and 20 private Libraries with 2417 titles, in 1905 the list of six new collectors were added, with 71 additional titles. And at last it has reached the total of 169 public and 246 private collections, with more than 6640 titles and 13200 copies; on an average therefore, there are in America two copies of each incunabulum. The « Census » lets us know not only all the XV<sup>th</sup> Century books collected in America but also the Libraries in which they are found. This is the chief value of the book and we congratulate sincerely all those who have brought out the publication so useful to all who are interested in the history of the printing art in general and of palaeotypes in particular. The word « Census » itself tells us that it is not a question of a descriptive catalogue, but only of an inventory; the compilers have naturally limited themselves to this, in order to avoid useless, long and minute descriptions already published elsewhere, and also because the general and definitive catalogue of the Incu-

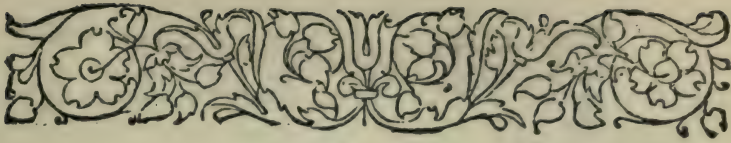
nabula will be published by the « Kommission für den Gesamtkatalog der Wiegendrucke » which has already prepared the material for it, after long and tedious researches by tried bibliographers, and can make use eventually of the Census to fill up any gaps. With this Catalogue which describes also several editions not yet recorded by any bibliographer i. e. of which our examples are the only known ones up to date, we hope to make it easier for America to enlarge the number of incunabula which is to-day scarcer than ever before, because so much in request in every country; and we feel confident that this work of ours, for which we receive in advance so much approbation, will be appreciated by the Institutes, Collectors and Bibliographers of America to whom this list is devoted.

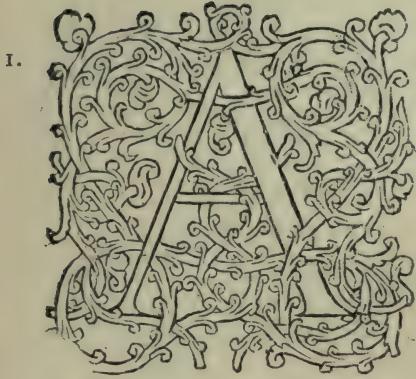

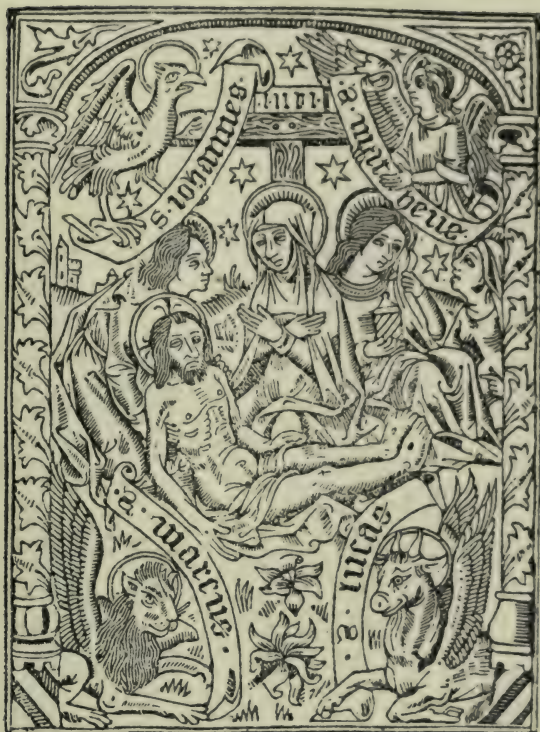

Very important document of the Catalan language. The verso of the last leaf, blank, is full of contemporary notes.

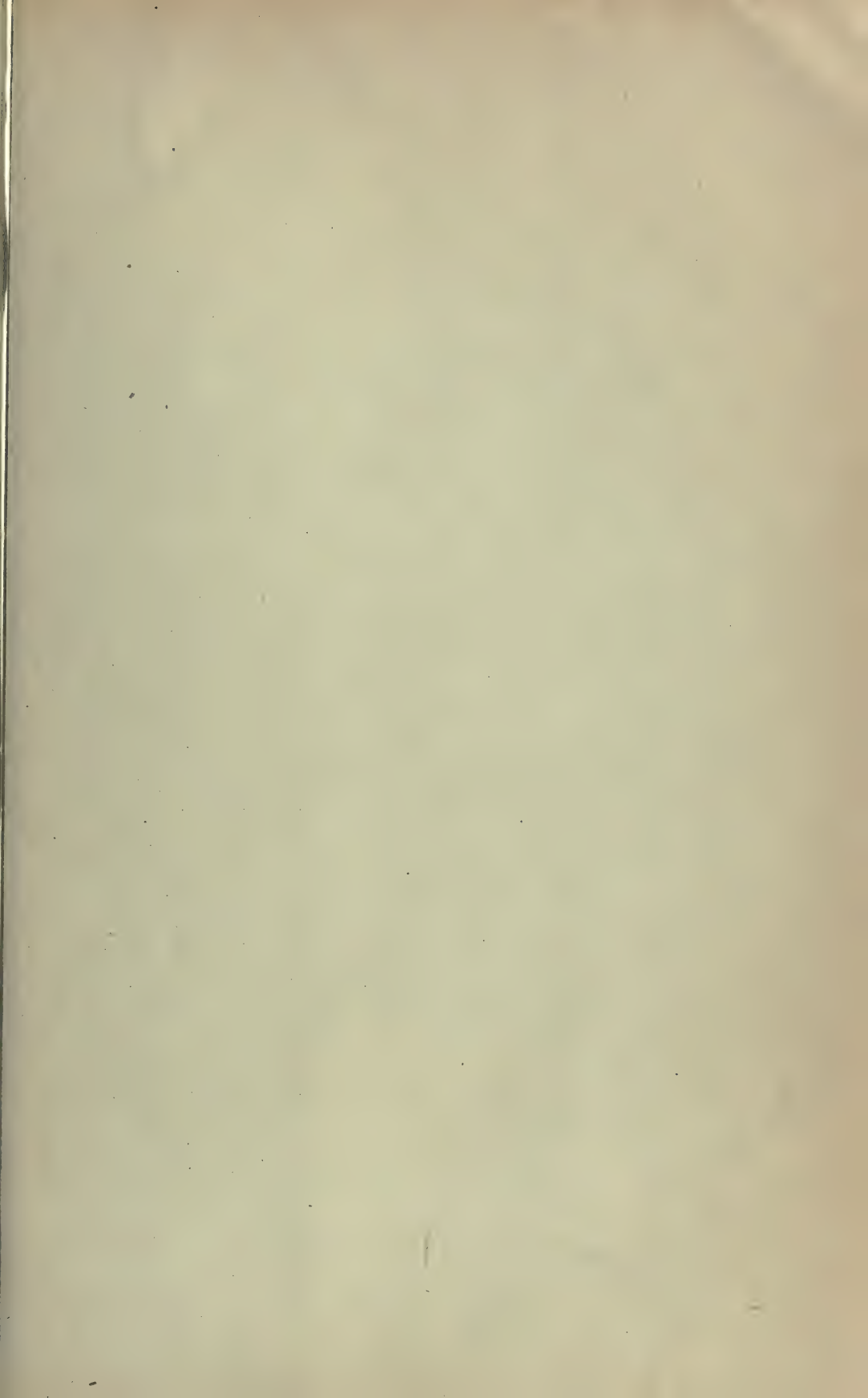
