




PREFACE.

THE following index embraces all the regular city documents which have been numbered and bound together at the end of each year, from 1834 to 1908, inclusive. They are arranged in alphabetical and chronological order. Previous to 1834 very few documents were printed, and, as they were not numbered nor bound together, it would probably be impossible to make a complete collection at this time. The first Mayor's Address which appears among the regular documents is Samuel A. Eliot's, delivered at the inauguration of the government of 1838. The first Fourth of July Oration is Jonathan Chapman's, delivered in 1837. The Auditor's "Twenty-second Annual Report" is contained in the volume for 1834, and the list of reports is complete from that date. The Municipal Register begins with the year 1841. The Annual Report of the City Marshal [see Police and Watch] was printed in 1834. The next printed report does not appear until 1849. From that date the list is complete. Reports on the correctional and reformatory institutions are nearly complete from 1834 to the present time. The first annual report of the Superintendent of the Lunatic Hospital was printed in 1840. First among the numerous documents relating to the introduction and distribution of water is Loammi Baldwin's report, made in 1834. The only report of any value upon the question of water supply, made previous to that date, was Professor Daniel Treadwell's, in 1825. Mr. Nathaniel J. Bradlee's history of the waterworks, printed for the use of the city government in 1868, and Mr. Desmond FitzGerald's supplementary history, printed in 1876, are not included among the numbered documents.

The changes that have been made in departmental designations have necessitated some changes in topics which are generally indicated in footnotes and cross references.

The appendix to this volume contains a list of city publications not included among the numbered documents. The list is classified and arranged in chronological order, and copies of most of these publications may be found at the Public Library.

PROCEEDINGS.

Since July, 1868, the proceedings of each branch of the City Council have been published in some newspaper and from the type a certain number of copies have been printed and distributed to members. Each meeting being kept separate and beginning with a new page, there is an unusual percentage of blank pages in the volumes when gathered together and bound. The reports are nearly *verbatim*, the reporter being allowed to condense his notes while preserving the sense of the remarks. The volumes are as follows:

The size of the page was increased to about $6\frac{1}{2}$ by $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches; since that date the Register has maintained about the same size page and a general uniformity of subject matter.

Note.— The "Rules and Orders of the Common Council" were first published in 1822, and were continued annually till 1841, when the title was changed to "Municipal Register." I will therefore follow out to the end the bibliography of the Register. The list of members of the City Council for each year was given; and in 1843, for the first time, a consolidated list was inserted, giving all the members from 1822. This list, with the necessary changes, was printed in 1845, 1846, 1848 and 1849, the members from each ward being grouped together. In 1850, for the first time, the City Council for each year was printed collectively, in the style which has since been followed.

In 1843 a most inexplicable confusion was made in respect to Wards 8 and 9. The list puts all of the members from Ward 8 who served prior to 1839 (when there was a new division into wards) under Ward 9, and those from Ward 9 under the head of Ward 8, and this error for the years 1822–1838 was continued in the Municipal Register through the issue for 1890. It has been corrected in the tables given in the "Catalogue" printed in 1891 and noticed hereafter. I cannot explain this idea, because although Wards 8 and 9 did in 1843, in a measure, exchange numbers, yet the boundaries of the new wards varied quite essentially from those formerly existing.

new wards varied quite essentially from those formerly existing. These lists were carefully revised in 1890 by C. W. Ernst, Esq., and again by Frederick E. Goodrich, Esq., and quite a number of errors were corrected. The principal corrections to be made in the Registers as issued are, in 1827, Ward 4, Quincy Tufts to be substituted for William R. P. Washburn; in 1835, Joseph H. Hayward to be added as an alderman; in 1837, Ward 6, George W. Bazin to be struck out and Jonathan Chapman inserted; in 1839, Thomas Richardson to be removed from the aldermen and Samuel Quincy inserted, and in Ward 7, Elbridge G. Austin to be added; in 1843 the contested seats in Ward 1 are shown; in 1844, Ward 3, John Snelling to be dropped and James Boynton substituted; and in 1863, Ward 3, Nicholas J. Bean added.

The lists of the City Councils of Roxbury and Charlestown were first added to the Boston Municipal Register in 1888. The city of Roxbury published its Register annually, the first being for 1846–47, then 47–48, 48–49, 49–50, the Council being organized on the first Monday in April. February 12, 1850, an act was passed changing the

date to the first Monday in January, and the members for 1850 only held office for nine months. A new Register was printed for 1850, and thereafter in every year including 1867, when Roxbury was annexed to Boston. The Registers for 1855 and 1858 contain a view of the birthplace of Warren; that for 1859 has a portrait of Warren; that of 1860 a portrait of Gen. Henry A. S. Dearborn, the second mayor; and that of 1861 a portrait of Hon. Samuel Walker.

The city of Charlestown seems to have issued comparatively few editions of its Register. I have seen or have been informed of "The Rules and Orders of the City Council," etc., for 1847, 84 pages; the "Municipal Register" for 1848, 113 pages; and the Municipal Register for 1849, 18 pages (apparently only a supplement). In 1850 (108 pages); 1851 (28 pages); 1852 (120 pages); 1853 (28 pages); 1854 (16 pages); 1856 (141 pages); 1858 (16 pages); 1859 (18 pages); 1863 (42 pages); 1864 (161 pages); and 1870 (192 pages), the Register was issued. Those for 1850, 1852, 1856, 1868 and 1870 contain rules, ordinances, special laws, etc.; those for 1853, 1854, 1858, 1859 and 1863 were probably only supplements. I am informed that no other editions were published. The city documents were issued annually in bound volumes, the latest being dated in 1872.
