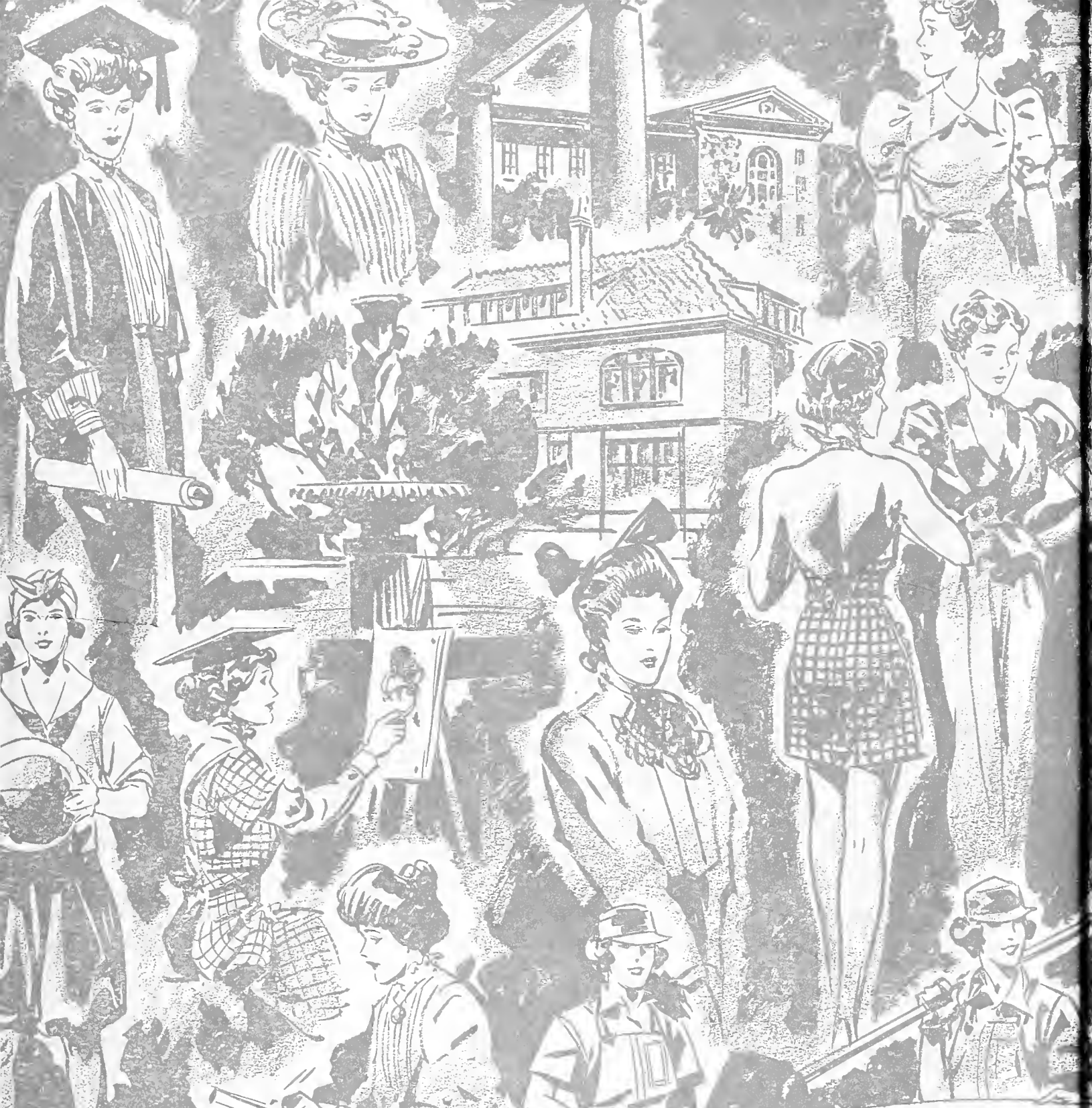

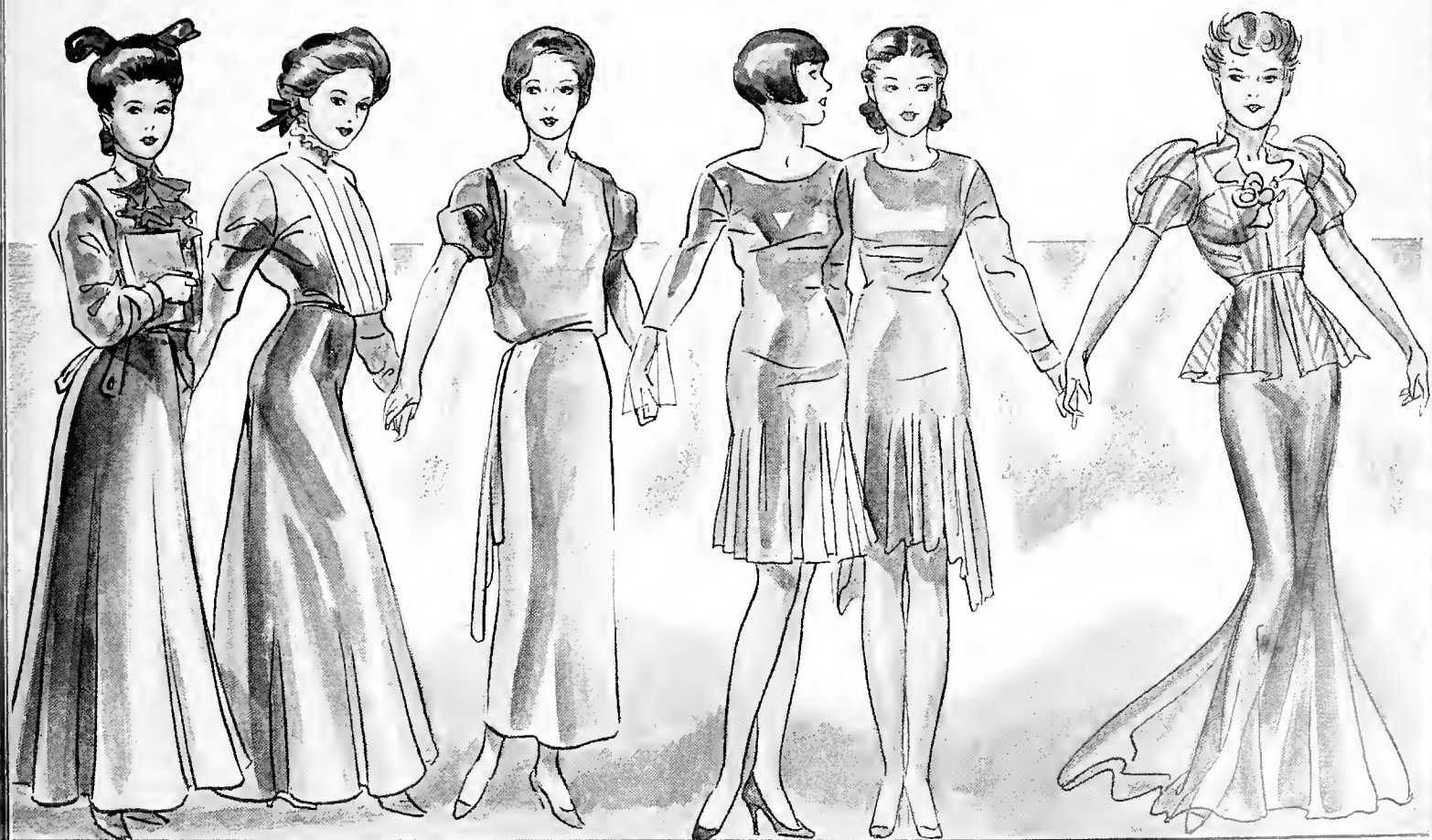

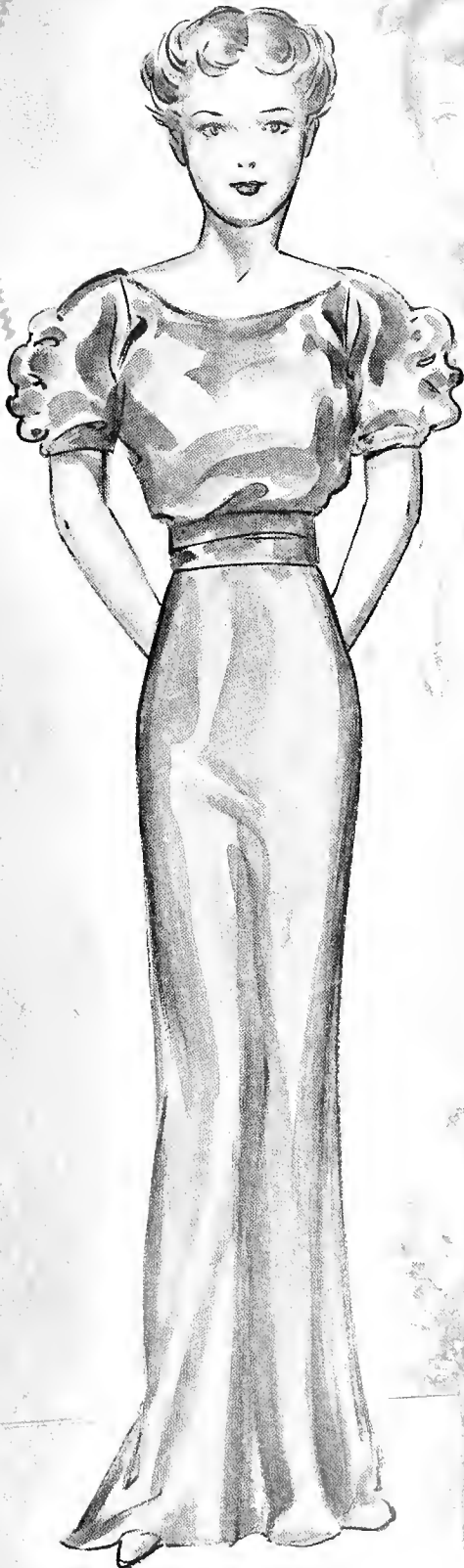

In its 1936-1937 session, Tulane University completed another memorable chapter in its enviable history. During the 103 years of its existence, Tulane has ascended to the pinnacle of educational institutions in this country.

Under the efficient direction of the newly appointed Acting President, Robert L. Menuet, not only were 39 new members admitted to the faculty and the enrollment increased by 10 per cent, but the physical plant of the University has been immensely improved. An academic dormitory at the rear of the campus has been remodeled into the new Social Science Building which houses the School of Social Work and the departments of economics, history, journalism, political science, psychology and sociology. The facilities of the College of Law have been expanded in Dinwiddie Hall, formerly the new Science Building, as have those of the Departments of Geology and of Botany and Zoology.

The 1936-1937 session has marked the celebration of the 50th Anniversary of the H. Sophie Newcomb College of Tulane University. Wednesday, December 16, 1936 was celebrated as memorial day for Harriott Sophie Newcomb, daughter of the founder. Among the celebrities who delivered speeches at Dixon Hall the evenings of December 14-16 for the official anniversary celebration were: Dr. Alice Hamilton, professor emeritus of the Harvard Med-

ical School; Mr. Thomas Craven, famous art critic and lecturer; and Dr. Brant V. B. Dixon, president emeritus of Newcomb. The semi-centennial committee, adeptly supervised by Miss Anna E. Many, provided many other delightful festivities, among which were a buffet luncheon in honor of the professors emeriti of Newcomb College and a half-hour program over radio station WSMB.

On the College of Law were focused the eyes of the legal profession when it launched the Tulane Livingston Centennial, October 27-31, commemorating the 100th year since the death of Edward Livingston. Mr. Livingston, legal scholar, writer and statesman, was responsible for Louisiana's maintenance of her Civil Code. Dean Emeritus Roscoe Pound of the Harvard Law School spoke on each of the four evening programs, October 27-30, in Dixon Hall. The audience marveled at his rare memory, inasmuch as his delivery was complete without the use of notes. His lectures were of such a nature as to be intelligible and extremely interesting to the many non-legal members of his audience. Another tribute to the prominence of Tulane University's College of Law and to its worthy commemoration was the presence of Associate Justice Henry T. Lummus of the Supreme Court of Massachusetts. Justice Lummus spoke on two occasions, the morning of October 31 and the same night at

a dinner in honor of Dr. Pound. The evening of October 30, the College of Law awarded honorary doctorates to Dr. Pound, Associate Justice Lummus and Ralph J. Schwarz, a prominent local attorney. Not only did the commemoration afford the students of the University an excellent opportunity to reflect upon the immortal words of Edward Livingston, but also to give ear to the "greatest legal genius of modern times"—Dr. Pound.

Another noteworthy advancement during the 1936-1937 session was the enlargement and increased repertoire of the three main musical organizations of the University—The Tulane Band, The Tulane Glee Club, and The Newcomb Glee Club, each of which is under the able direction of Maynard Klein. The Tulane Band, having more than doubled itself in size, now consists of 92 newly uniformed men. The Tulane Glee Club, possessing a repertoire which would permit it to sing a capella choral music one evening and negro spirituals the next, has evolved into an organization of 60 highly trained male voices. The Newcomb Glee Club has more than upheld the worthy precedent which it has set during the many years of its existence. Each of these organizations has performed a complete schedule of concerts and has been heard several times over the various radio stations of New Orleans. When the Tulane and Newcomb Glee Clubs,

accompanied by the Tulane Band, sang the University's Alma Mater during the half at the Homecoming Football Game, the onlookers beheld the finest spectacle ever before witnessed at such an observance.

Mention here must be made of the tremendous increase in the display of school spirit. Several bonfires followed by parades did much to amplify the Tulane and Newcomb cheering sections at the various athletic events. The Tulane Gym was filled to capacity for all the basketball games and boxing matches. It is our belief that such moral support did much to accentuate the extremely successful athletic teams which the University enjoyed during its 103rd year.

Space does not permit further enumeration of the many highlights of the 1936-1937 session. The editors sincerely trust that this brief outline will call forth the entirety of a signal year, during which Tulane University has maintained its status as one of the finest centers for educational enlightenment.

On February 24, 1937, the Board of Administrators announced the election of Dean Rufus Carrollton Harris, A.B., LL.B., Juris.D., LL.D., of the College of Law as President of the University, effective June 9, 1937. Paul William Brosman, A.B., LL.B., J.S.D., was elected to succeed Dean Harris in the College of Law.

Based on pure democratic principles and sound in theory and practice, Tulane's system of student government has served its constituents for 22 years.

The system has been steadily improved and adapted to changing conditions and now operates under the Constitution of The Associated Students of The Tulane University of Louisiana, adopted in 1933.

The present constitution provides for the administration of student affairs by a Student Council, comprised of six members elected annually by popular vote from the various student bodies of the University, and a Graduate Manager of Student Activities, employed by the Council to provide continuity and insure businesslike conduct of student affairs.

Members of the 1936-37 Student Council are Wiltz C. Ott, President, representing the Colleges of Arts and Sciences; Herman F. Flowers, Vice-President, College of Commerce; Charles D. Marshall, Secretary, College of Law; Robert P. Lockett, College of Engineering; Joseph W. Weaver, School of Medicine; and Leila S. Werlein, Newcomb College.

J. H. Randolph Feltus, LL.B., is Graduate Manager of Student Activities, having succeeded Calvert G. deColigny, B.B.A., in March, 1935. Ann Pendergast succeeded Arlene Zink Martin, B.A., in November, 1936, as secretary to the Graduate Manager.

The Student Council functions as a board of directors in student business affairs, meeting bi-weekly to consider problems of administration and policy, assisted by the advice of the Graduate Manager.

The constitution provides that the Graduate Manager shall act as agent for the Council in all matters, act in an advisory capacity to all students and extra-curricular organizations on the campus, follow directions of the Council, keep all records and accounts of financial transactions of all organizations and activities drawing funds from the student fee, and provide for the establishment annually of a calendar to contain all important activity dates.

The student fee, compulsorily paid at registration by undergraduates in all departments other than Newcomb College, supports financially most of the student activities, including, in part, the publications. The aggregate fees exceeded \$16,000.00 in 1936-37 and an additional \$15,000.00 was also handled through the Student Activities Office. Accurate records are kept relative to these funds and the accounts are audited by the University auditors annually.

This marked the 32nd year of "The Hullabaloo."

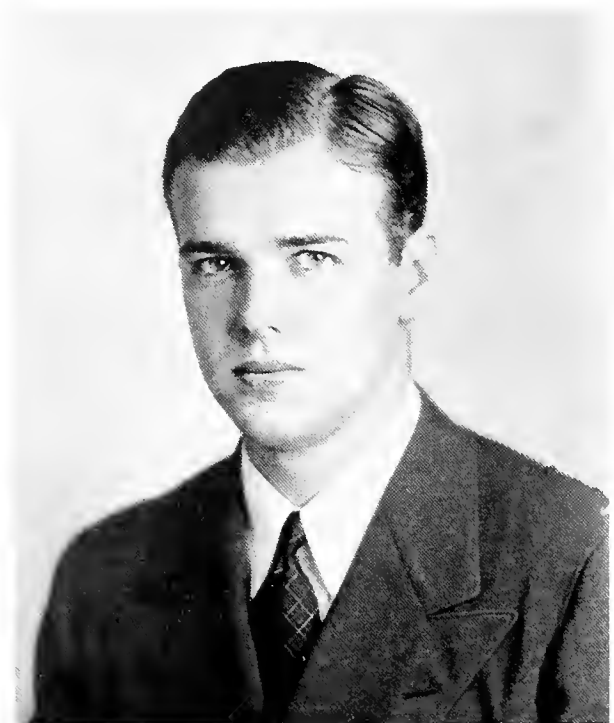

The Board of Editors pride themselves upon their use

of the comparative method, believing that to reveal the praiseworthy qualities as well as the shortcomings of different systems of law and of judicial technique is an effective check upon the tendency to accept any one system as just and immutable. This method is of particular importance in Louisiana, where the civil and common law have long vied in a struggle for preeminence.

Since its foundation in 1929, as the successor to the SOUTHERN LAW QUARTERLY, the TULANE LAW REVIEW has gained prominence both in the United States and abroad as a leading journal of civil and comparative law.

Although most of the student material published in the TULANE LAW REVIEW is written by members of the Board of Editors, articles are selected solely upon the basis of merit. The pages of the REVIEW are open to all contributions that meet its standards of scholarship, research, and expression.

TULANE *Moot Court Competition*

The Moot Court system in the College of Law is especially designed to train students in the preparation and argument of cases. Technical training in research, brief-writing and forensics—ordinary tools in the trade of a lawyer—form the foundation of the moot court work, but the system gives in addition an even higher type of training.

The moot court rule abolishes the system of precedents and compels argument of cases on their merits. The student must weigh the social factors and must concentrate upon the functioning of the rule of law. This freedom makes the moot court an excellent laboratory for the testing and comparison of the older theories that the law is deductive, formal, and arbitrary, with the newer theory that the judge exercises a directive force to make law conform to social needs.

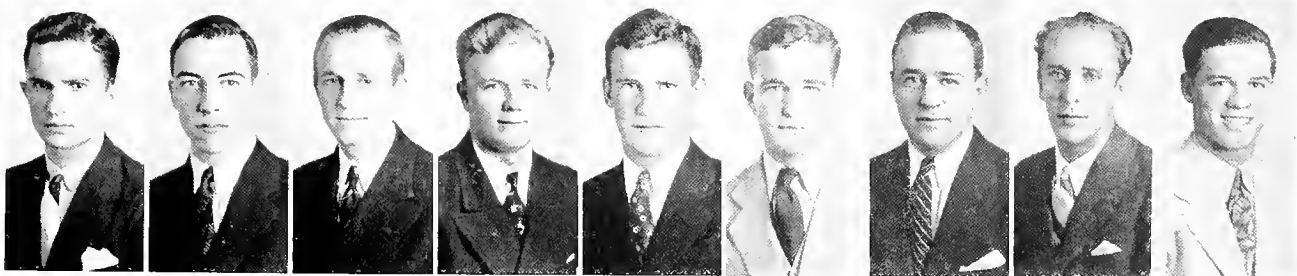
The Moot Court Competition at Tulane was patterned after that of the Ames Competition at Harvard. Originally the club

system of competition was used, but in order to encourage individual participation and incite a keener competitive spirit, a system of team competition was inaugurated three years ago. During the current year, the Board of Advisers has extended its services in framing trials for any seniors desiring them, whether in the competition or not, and further has devised a new system of scoring. The success of these innovations is attested by the keen interest and fine spirit of participants.

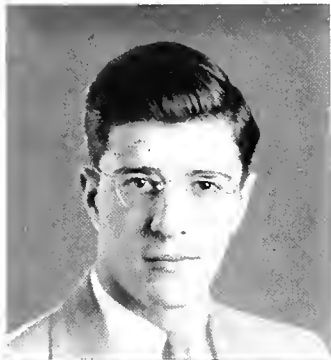
The entire management of the Tulane Moot Court system is committed to the above-mentioned board, consisting of second and third year students selected on the basis of scholastic standing, acting with the advice of a faculty committee. The purpose of student management is not only to attend to all details of the competition but also to develop a sense of public responsibility.

In the academic year of 1935-36, the Tulane Moot Court Competition was won by Raymond Kierr and Alvin Zander.

Realizing the need of a means of expression to compensate for the lack of a department of dramatics and public speaking in the University, a few ambitious students in 1922 combined to form a dramatic club on the campus. After hard work by students in successive years of existence, a permanent organization was established at Tulane. Today, the thriving Dramatic Guild, numbering some fifty-odd members, could hardly be recognized as having its origin in such a small beginning. The policy of this pioneering group has continued, all presentations being staged entirely by student members; they design, build and paint the sets and handle the business affairs, as well as participate in productions. The only outside aid comes from the director, who casts the performers and supervises the rehearsals. For the 1936-1937 season, the Guild was most fortunate in obtaining the services of Mr. Val Winter as director. Mr. Winter has both directed and played on the legitimate stage throughout the United States, and is best known for his performances in leading roles at Le Petit Théâtre du Vieux Carré in New Orleans, his latest vehicle being "20th Century."

This year saw the inauguration of the Radio Players, a group within the Dramatic Guild which presents monthly plays and skits over radio station WDSU. Through this medium the Guild

proper has become widely known, and it is a distinct advantage to members who do not have time to participate in full-length plays, but who are sufficiently interested in dramatics and radio work to "learn the ropes" of both without entailing too much time that might be used for study. The Radio Players have broadcast two successful plays to date, "The Battalion Invisible" and Dickens' "Christmas Carol," both of which caused much favorable comment from many sections of the country listening to the programs.

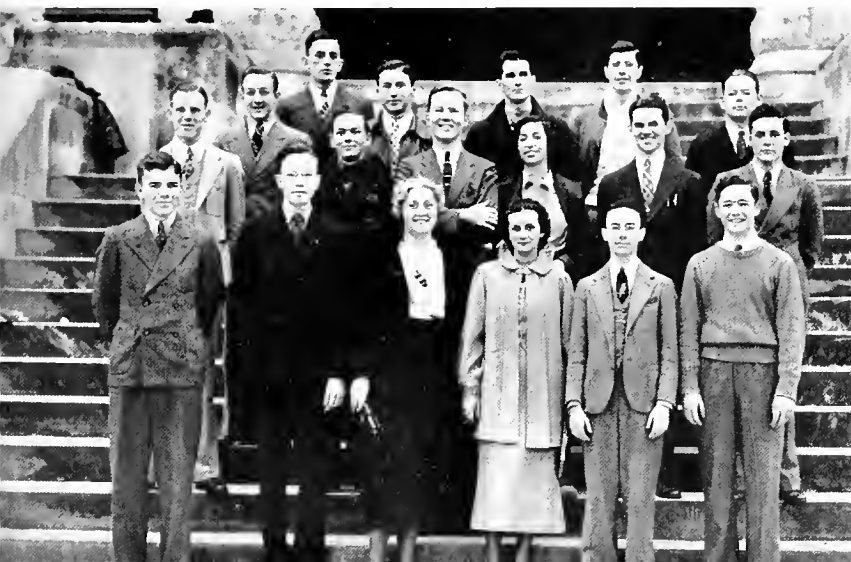
On March 29, of last year, the Dramatic Guild closed its season with a presentation of A. A. Milnes "Dover Road," a three-act comedy dealing with the eccentricities of a middle-aged English gentleman who had a yen to see everyone happy. His method of solving the marital difficulties of two couples who are stranded in his lonely home on Dover Road during a foggy night in late November will long be remembered by the small but appreciative audience who witnessed the play.

The advantages of admitting students free to Dramatic Guild productions were evidenced for the first time on December 5, 1936, when the largest audience since the unforgettable "Front Page" saw a polished cast open the new season with "The Intimate Strangers," under the direction of Val Winter. Mr. Winter's influence was clearly evidenced throughout the performance, as the actors moved through their roles as though created for them. A highly involved story of two young people who have been thrown together in a deserted railway station develops into a grand round of laughter and intrigue when the hero attempts to discover the heroine's age. Remarks she has made have led him to believe she is not all that she appears, and his subsequent discoveries provoke many hearty—and some sympathetic guffaws from an appreciative audience.

Distinct moves to the fore have been made in the Guild in admitting students free on presentation of their student books; combining with Newcomb Dramatic Guild; and forming the Radio Players, a group which already has proven its inestimable value though scarcely past the "baby" stage in development.

Again Tulane completes her year of sports, and the name of this university has been associated with some mediocre and a few truly great accomplishments on the playing field, court and ring. It was a year marked by one major disappointment and several outstanding successes.

On the gridiron, that famous string of early-season victories will not be soon forgotten, and will remain in the minds of the Wave's loyal football fans almost as long as the three defeats suffered by the team "surely headed for a bowl game."

In the world of tennis, Ernie Sutter made history by carrying the Olive and Blue to the National Intercollegiate Championship, while the rest of the team appeared creditably against City Park, North Carolina, and other selected teams.

Basketball failed to produce any championship, but the fighting Greenies broke through eight consecutive years of wins from L. S. U. to receive the respect of the conference at last.

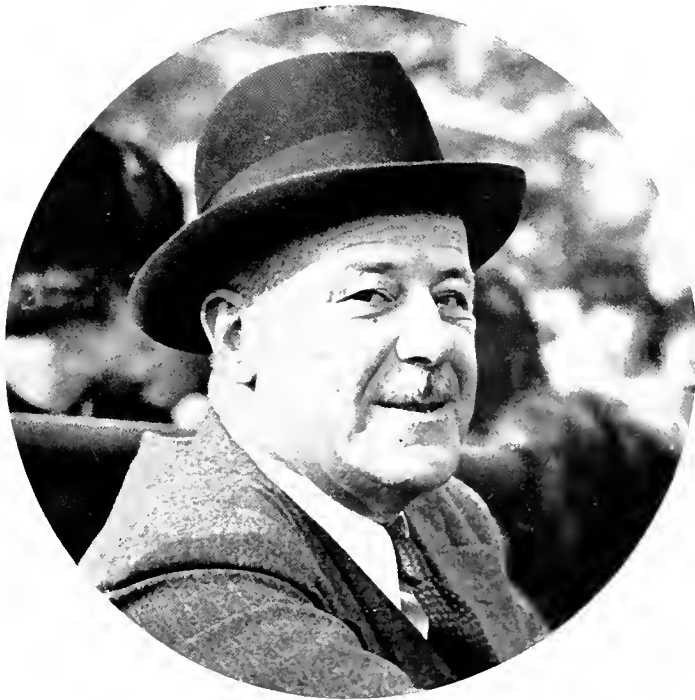
A bright light in the sports calendar of 1937 was the winning of the Southeastern Conference Boxing Championship for the second consecutive time by the Wave mitteam. Consisting chiefly of Newlin, Phillips, Brocato, Manteris, Gamble, Dirmann, and Jaubert, the boxers dropped one meet to Alabama, drew one with L. S. U. and breezed through the rest victoriously.

On the cinder path, the Wavemen ended a usual track season, losing the two meets, and taking few honors. No lack of fighting spirit kept the cindermen and Fritz Oakes from a championship, but a tragic lack of good material prevented Tulane from producing a winning track team.

The freshmen footballers, in spite of not winning either of their games with Alabama or L. S. U., represent a lot of new and strange material, and should turn out a first-class first string varsity this year.

In frosh basketball, too, the boys from here and there have been doing nicely, and the work of Bodney, Jumonville, Ott, and Oelschlager was particularly significant.

This last year was one marked by the acquirement of an old son of Tulane, and quarterback of the 1932 Rose Bowl team, Lowell P. Dawson, as head coach replacing Ted Cox. More power to you "Red," and you, too, TULANE.

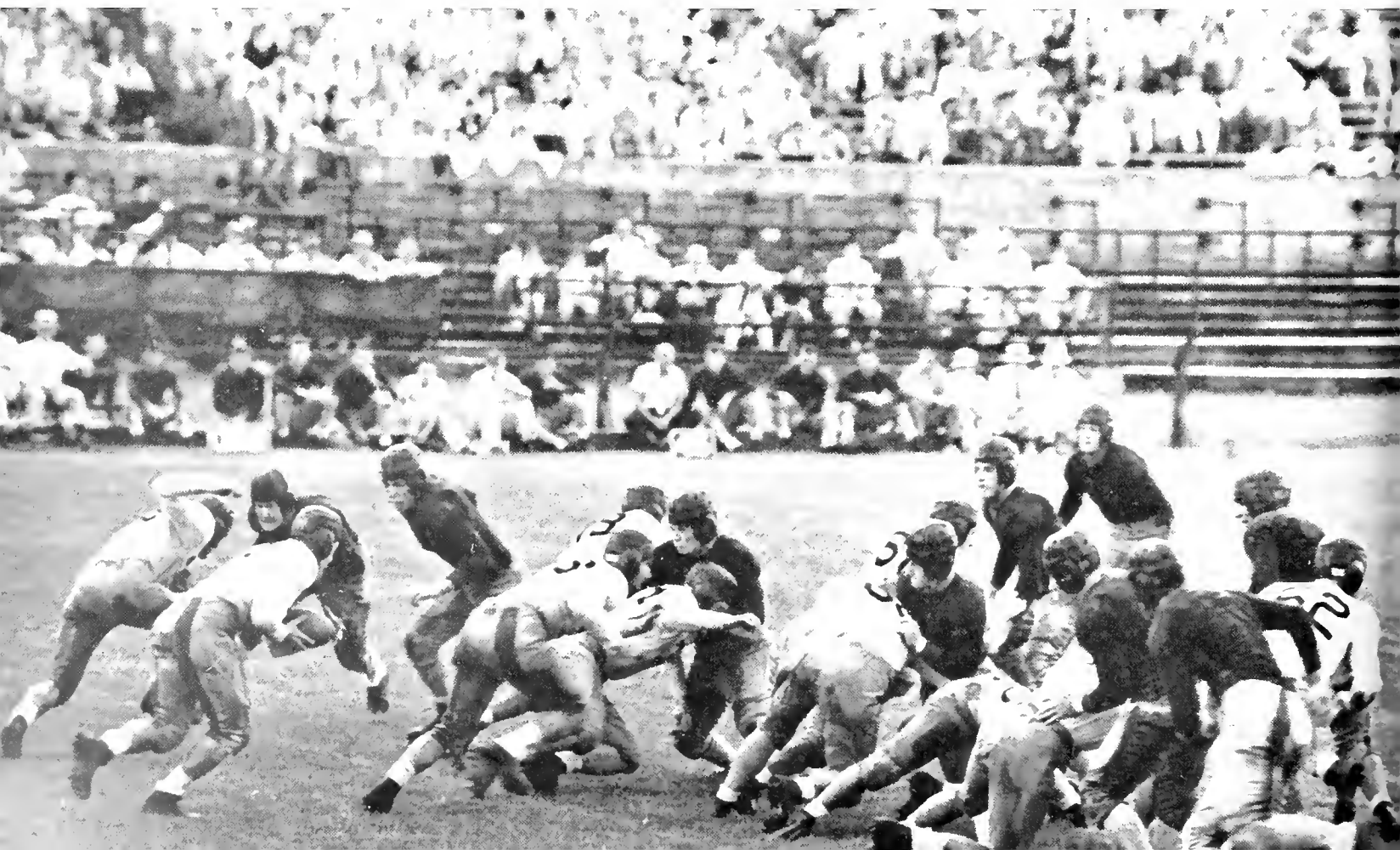
WHAT A DIFFERENCE A POINT MAKES!

What was the big reason? Bucky Bryan, the man who came back was the difference. What did Mr. Bryan do? He did not have a chance to play the first half, but in the second half, he only did three things—(1) threw the touchdown pass to Ralph Bond (2), made a sensational tackle in the open when Bradley was touchdown bound (3), out-averaged the great Ray Hapes from scrimmage. With all that, he was just one of a fighting band that took the play away from a bigger and more experienced eleven. Ole Miss was fast below the knees and slow above the neck and big all over. Ole Miss made more first downs, made more yardage. But with Sophomore Quarterback Ralph Bond calling them like a master, Tulane won. Why?—because it fought its heart out individually and collectively. Bill Moss was a great leader and a great player, and little Porter Tull was 170 pounds of concentrated fury out on the field that day. "Dub" Mattis, making his debut, played a stout game, as did Norman Buckner and Normal Hall, who withstood a withering fire at the center of the line.

John Andrews bronchoed into the line, and there was no end of consternation in the Rebel camp when big John ran the ends. It was a wonderful game. Ole Miss had no alibis, nor could they have been of any consequence, for joy prevailed at old Tulane, and "Gloomy Red" Dawson was smiling a great big smile.

ALL FOR NOTHING!

Even Red Dawson came through with another of his sardonic smiles, when Auburn's mighty potent Plainsmen were battled to a scoreless tie.

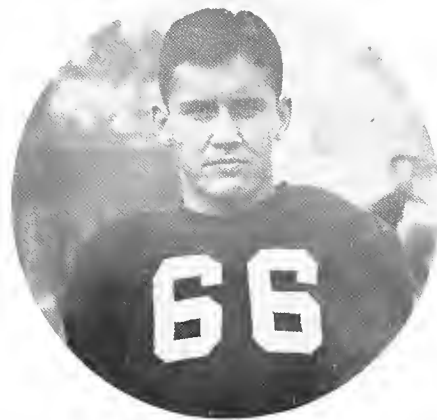
It was a bitter fight and a beautiful game. The line play on both sides of the torrid scrimmage was magnificent. "Doc" Schneidau and Fred Preisser were battling in there at end, but Auburn's Joe Eaves and Hamp Williams were equally hard-to-handle fellows, too.

The center play was excellent. Gilbert, the incomparable, was a defensive tower in the Auburn secondary. Porter Tull played bang-up ball for the Greenies.

The game was featured by many "almost" touchdowns and by Wilton Kilgore's famous "referee" play, in the course of which the referee couldn't get out of Kilgore's path and slowed up the fleet Plainsman fullback just enough for a Tulanian to drag him down from behind.

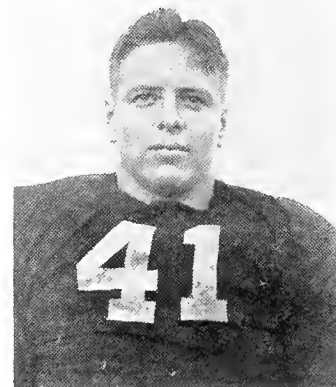
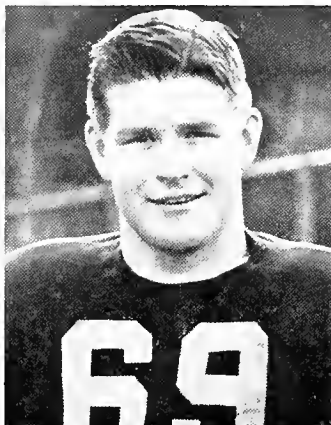

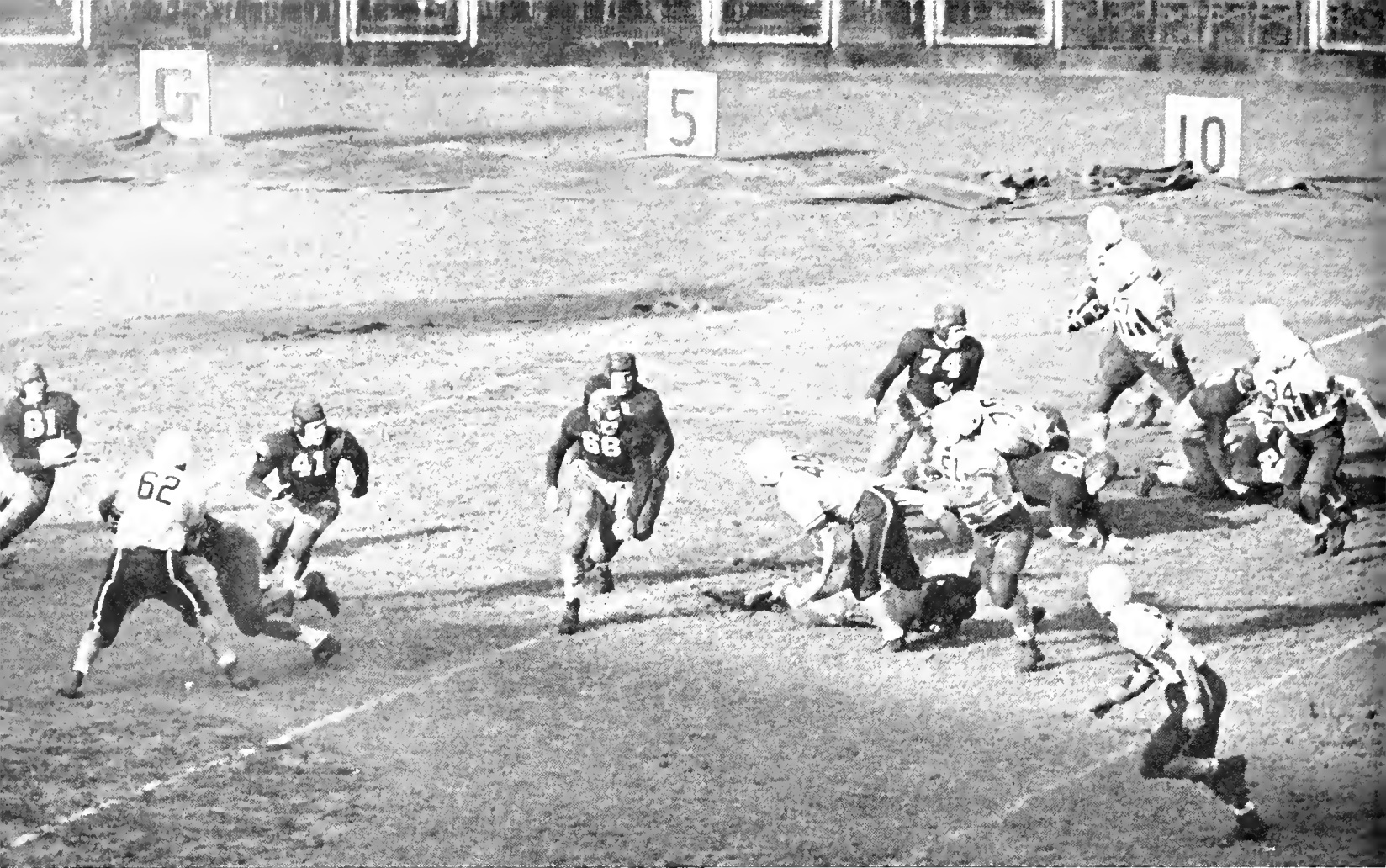

Came next Saturday and "Bud" Parker's up-state company of "Cowboy" Hohmann, "Grandma" Stone, et al. These Gentlemen were fresh from a bracing 10-0 victory over Baylor's Bears, and Stone was the boy picked to prove that Tulane's effective pass defense against Auburn's twenty-one attempted passes and against everything Mississippi had to offer, was sheer luck.

"Grandma" fared no better. He tried sixteen passes, completed but five, and those were of little consequence. Stone did give the crowd a quick breath though, when on the opening kick-off, he took a lateral from Hohmann and raced to his own 45 before Bryan, the last man between him and "Journey's End" snagged him.

Tulane's forwards caught on to him quickly though, and few and far between were the occasions when the Gent ball-toters were not rudely interrupted by Miller, Schneidau, Buckner, Preisser, Hall, and others.

The game marked the first time that Tulane's offense was in the spotlight and was the first real hint that Tulane was going to go places. 21-0 was the final score.

COLGATE SWAMPED!

Mr. Local Football Fan did not go to New York to see the Wave perform, but now he certainly wishes he had, pawning his ticker if necessary. He did listen to the broadcast however, and it is said that he took three aspirins when Colgate's Raiders with the greatest of ease, early in the first quarter, ran up six points.

The fact that the Raiders still enjoyed the six-point lead when the quarter ended did not make him feel much better, but the handwriting was already on the wall before the period ended. Early in the second quarter, Tulane wound up an air attack with a pass for a touchdown, Captain Bill Moss putting the Greenies in front with a fine place-kick.

From then on the Greenies were never doubtful, and at the end of the game were just as superior as twelve first downs to Colgate's six showed.

"Fearless Freddie" Preisser played a beautiful game, offensively and defensively, and Cameron Gamble on the other end was a wild-cat on the defense.

Noel Loffin was the boy who really went to town, however. It was his day to go and he went. He steamed through center in a most convincing manner, and, before the fourth period had hardly gotten under way, he personally drove down the field, turned a game into a rout by rattling off two touchdowns in almost as many minutes. This made that canny Scott, Andy Kerr, wonder if Minnesota would have been any tougher.

"Little Minnesota" is what the amazed New Yorkers called the Greenies, and Mr. Football Fan noted that Tulane's football stock was soaring in the National Ratings.

Here it was, only mid-October, and Red Dawson had given Tulane an offense that matched their now nationally famous defense. Tulane had become synonymous with hard running, devastating blocking, sure tackling, and pass defending plus. The eyes of the nation were upon them. They were now properly on the spot. At any rate the conflict with the Tarheels of North Carolina next week was acclaimed the acid test, and Mr. Football Fan looked forward to the answering of two questions which still persisted, "was it luck"? and "is it really power"? After the first four minutes of play there was no longer any doubt.

Never was there a team that looked better. The same blocking that thrilled New York was in effect, and without a flaw, the powerhouse backfield of Loffin, Bryan, Mattis and Andrews, battered down the field, drew in the Tarheel pass defense and then tossed a long pass down to Schneidau who was downed but 3 yards from the well-known pay dirt.

Here Andrews behind beautiful line blocking, rifled through the hole, and there it was. "Simple, wasn't it," said Mr. Fan, and just as simple was Bill Moss' conversion.

The Tarheels stiffened at this point, and carried the conflict into Wave territory until about the middle of the third quarter, their fine work ending with a blocked punt resulting in a Tarheel touchdown. AN OMINOUS WARNING!

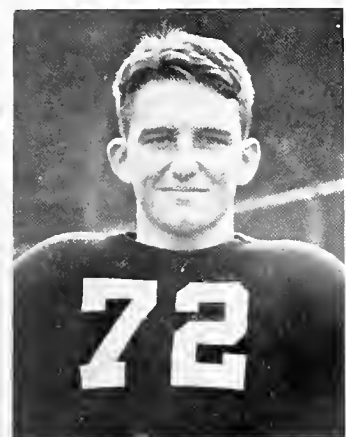

Bond and Bryan open a hole for "Big Noel" Loffin against North Carolina.

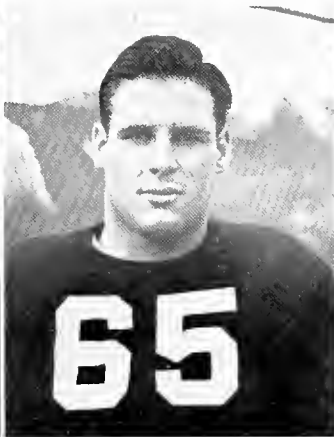

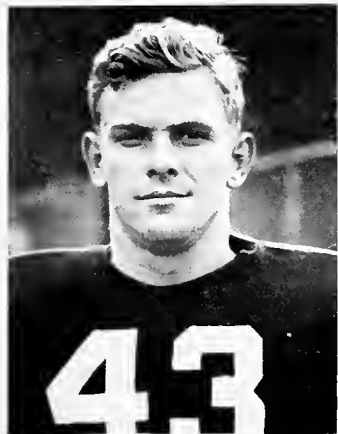
of Wave Alumni for Georgia University was to meet Tulane in their Homecoming celebration.

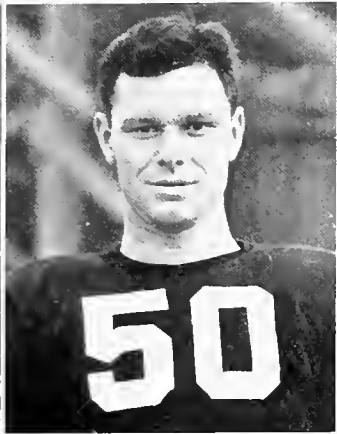

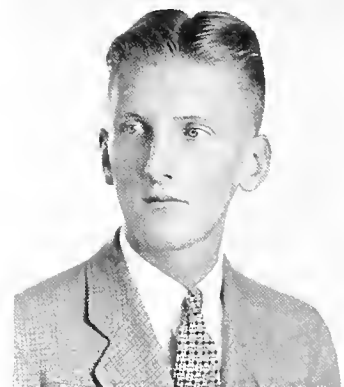

Sewanee's Mountain Tigers came next, and whatever hope they had of winning was promptly extinguished by a fighting Tulane eleven, struggling to get back in championship form once more. They were mercilessly beaten by the Wave to the tune of 53-6.

The victory was a very costly one however, as Bucky Bryan received in the first quarter the injury which kept him out of the L. S. U. game. Four of Tulane's touchdowns were made on passes and four on runs. Jerry Freidrichs and Cameron Gamble were on the receiving end with Bob Dexheimer throwing most of them. Rupert Colmore, Sewanee's All-Southern tackle, played a bang-up game. Tulane's offense was very effective and was a good indication that the Wave would be on a return to form for the L. S. U. game.

BIG TIGER!

With the loss of "Bucky" Bryan and "Dub" Mattis, mainstays of the early season, but with the slogan "sixty minutes is not long to fight," Tulane's Wave went North to meet L. S. U.'s mighty Tigers in their own lair.

The Greenies, decidedly the underdog, caught the Tigers at their peak and raring to show the world exactly what they had. They swamped the Greenies, 33-0, before the largest crowd in Louisiana's history, but the score was not indicative of the game.

The Greenies, to a man, fought with rare gameness every minute of the game. It was too much power that told the story. Bill Flowers was great, turning in his usual stellar performance. The Tigers worked on the principle that it only takes one to do it, and every Tiger score was the result of a long pass or a long run and not a consistent march.

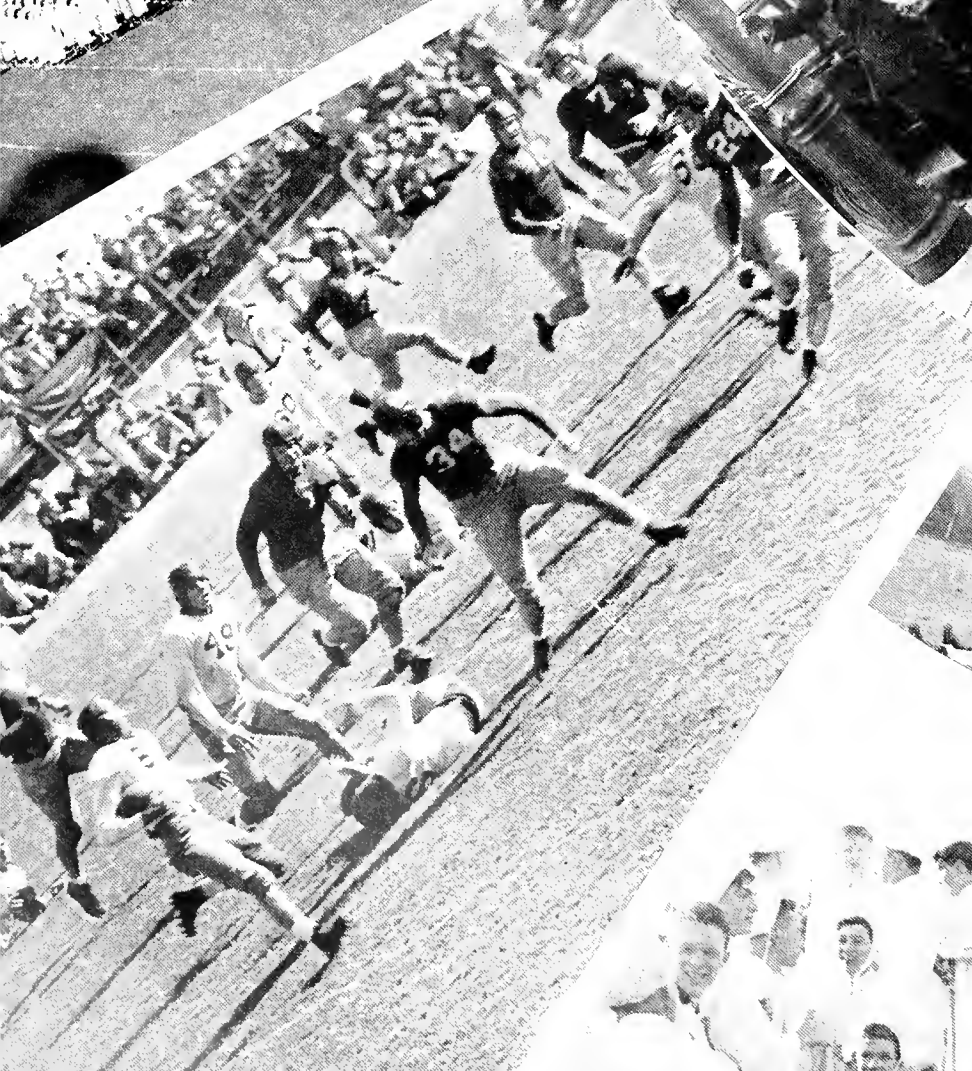
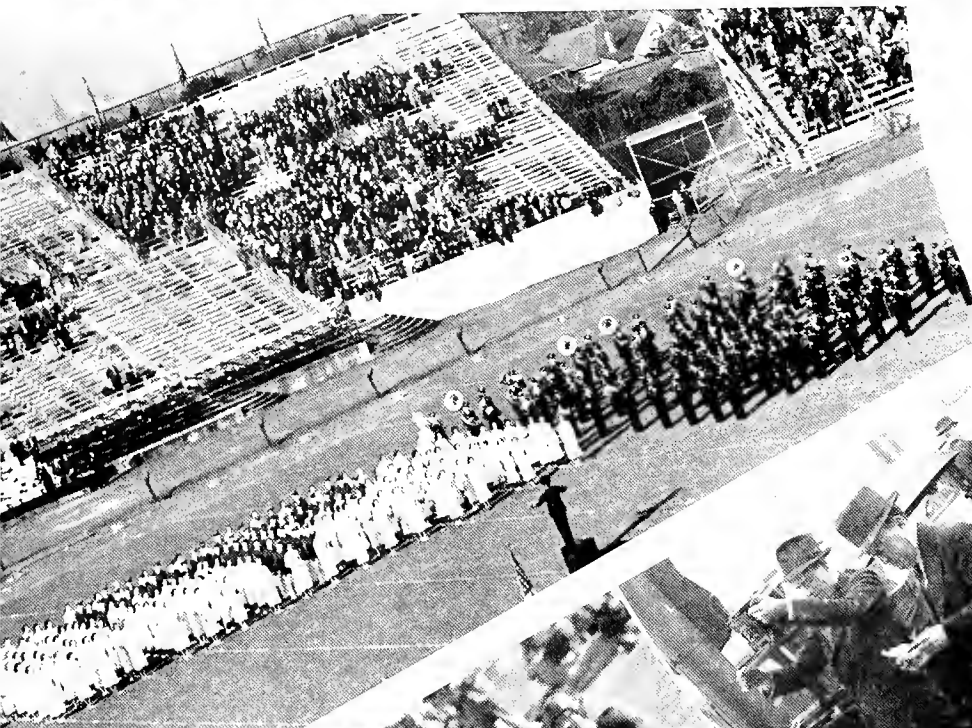
The game was an excellent one despite the score, and all Tulanians went home greatly pleased with the fight shown by the Wave and impressed by the might of the Tigers.

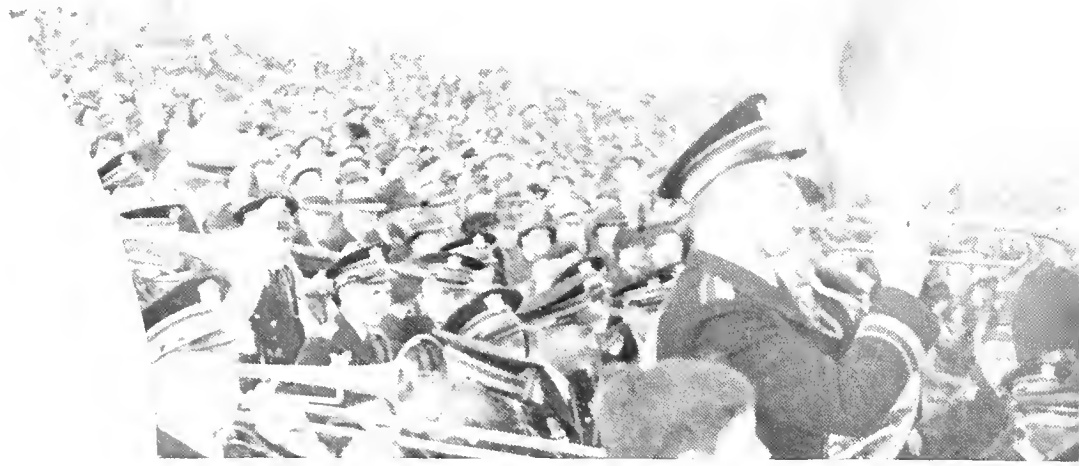

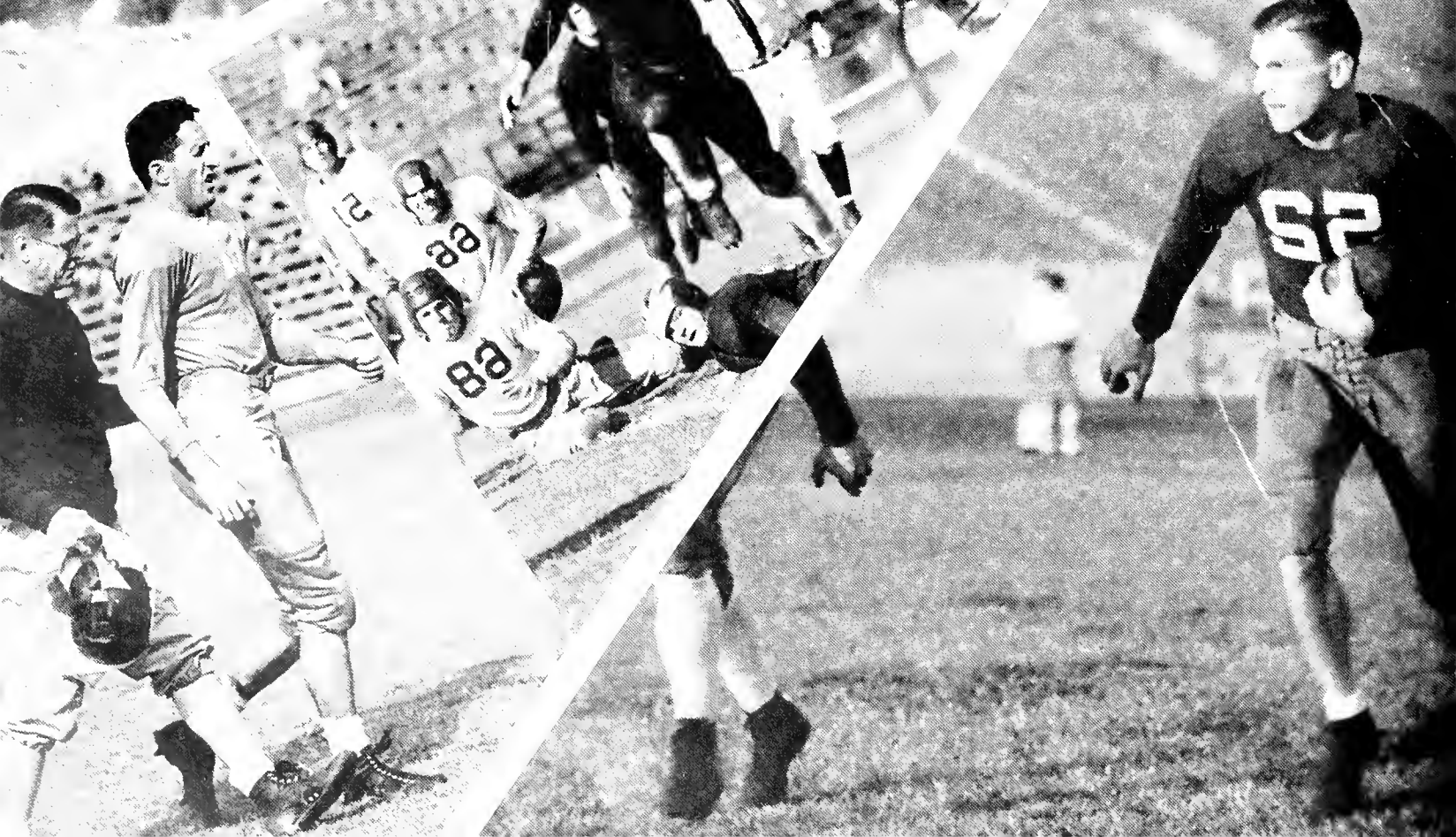
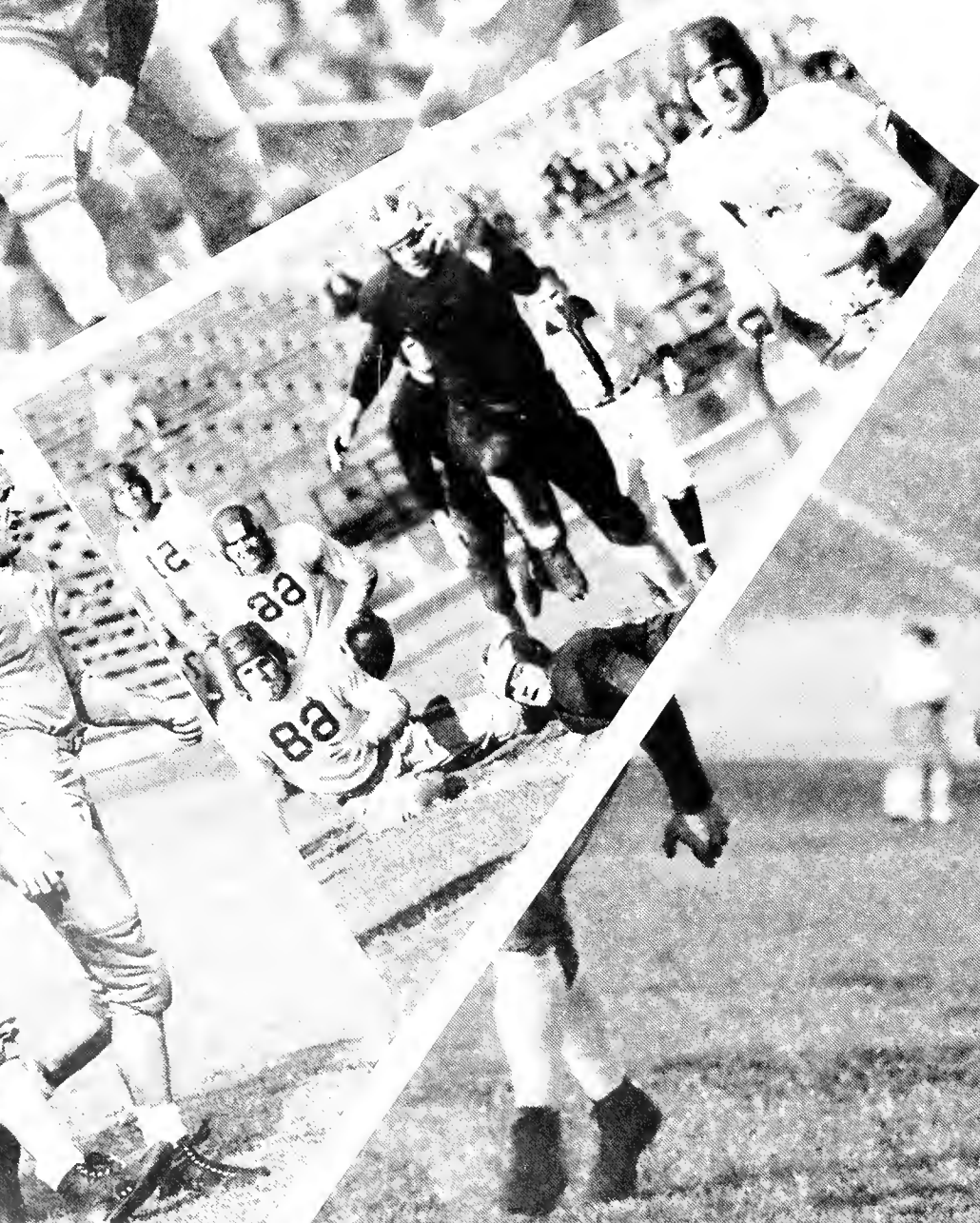

BASKETBALL *at the University*

What with a Varsity which played winning basketball and a Frosh that could give the Varsity plenty of trouble, basketball, this year, has come into its own at Tulane.

The Frosh competed in the Senior A. A. U. competitions for the first time in recent years, and as a result, there was action at Tulane Gym several times a week. There was a big increase in attendance and school spirit over the year before, and the Greenies rewarded their supporters by playing scrappy and interesting ball.

Striking a winning combination of two fast breaking forwards, a center that can get the jump, and two guards that do just that, Coach Ray Dauber sent a fine squad against 'Bama in the opening game.

Tulane showed fight and class, took an early lead, and never was headed, winning easily by a 33-21 count. Nathan Cotlar, Pete Brechtel, "Boisey" McCloskey, and Dietrich Neyland starred for the Greenies in this auspicious opening, with Cotlar, playing in his first game as first stringer, standing out. Cotlar showed a keen eye for the basket and displayed some nice floor work. He tied with Brechtel for scoring honors with nine points.

Tulane's defense was of a particularly fine calibre, "Shorty" Sneed's field goal being the only one the Tide could garner in the first half. It was only after Neyland was ejected on fouls that the Tide, led by Estes, the big center, and Shoemaker, of football fame, began to score; but Pete Brechtel's fine one-handed shots, featuring the second half, kept the Wave in front throughout.

The second game of the series was a nip and tuck affair which kept the stands on their feet throughout.

'Bama evened the series in this encounter, 28-27. A belated Tulane rally just barely fell short.

The Greenies leaped to an early lead, and their defense, which seemed even more impenetrable than that displayed the evening before, held the Tidesmen at bay for a short while. However, 'Bama was not to be denied, and while the Greenies were missing a number of crisp shots, Alabama overcame the lead and was ahead at the half by 18-12.

The Wave's offense, though not as effective as in the previous game, was still characterized by fast breaking and nice floor work. Pete Brechtel and Nathan Cotlar again led the Greenie scorers, this time sinking eight points apiece. Pete broke for the basket nicely, his left-handed shots counting four times, and "Longboy" Neyland played a fine center game, the big boy showing plenty of hustle and a fine brand of guarding.

Captain McCloskey and "Huck" Lockett gave the Tide forwards plenty of trouble and it was "Boisey" who barely missed a long shot just as the game ended with the Wave one point behind. The series showed that, without a doubt, the Wave was going to be no walk-away for anyone's team.

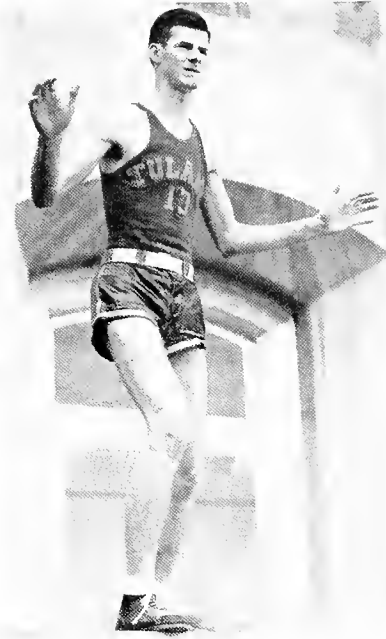
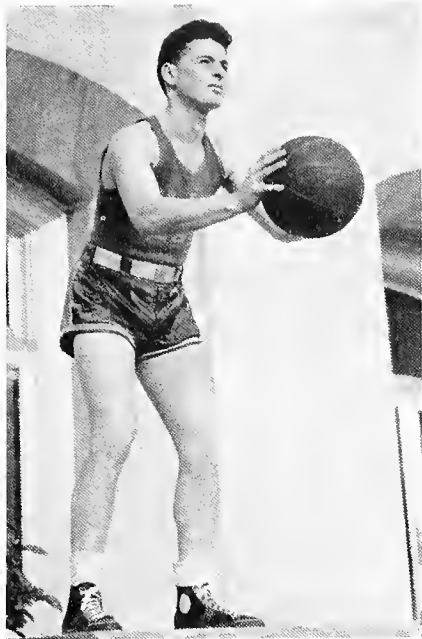

Captain "Boisey" McCloskey led the Greenies and appeared the fiery little spark-plug as much as ever. The score was 43-35.

GREENIES TAKE S. L. I., 37-30

Romping over the Southwestern Louisiana quintet, the Greenie basketmen scored their third victory of the season, and looming as a possible contender for conference honors, they won, 37-30.

The second stringers, composed of Carrere, Gorman, Ericson, Ray, and others, played a large part of the game, but it was chiefly Cotlar and McCloskey who put on the steam when it was necessary, and provided the winning margin.

WAVE WINS OVER TECH

Tulane continued to breeze through their next opponent, the Louisiana Tech from Ruston, winning handily by the score of 44-25. Tulane seemed out for blood, and the crowd was greatly pleased by the roughness of the game. However, in spite of the rough work, the Greenies showed some improvement over their earlier games, especially in passing and shooting. Neyland showed himself to advantage at center and Lockett played a fine, fast game at guard.

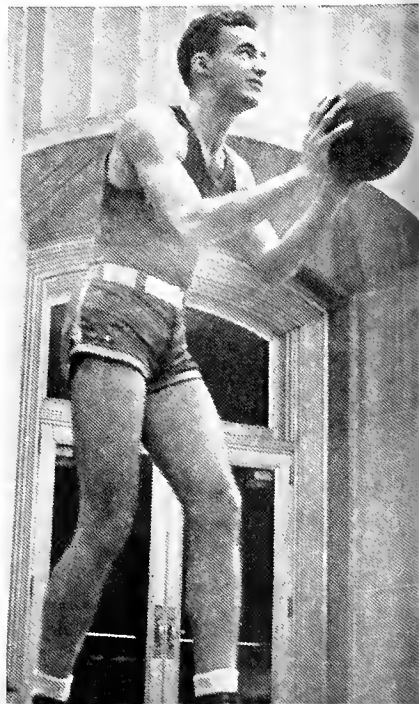

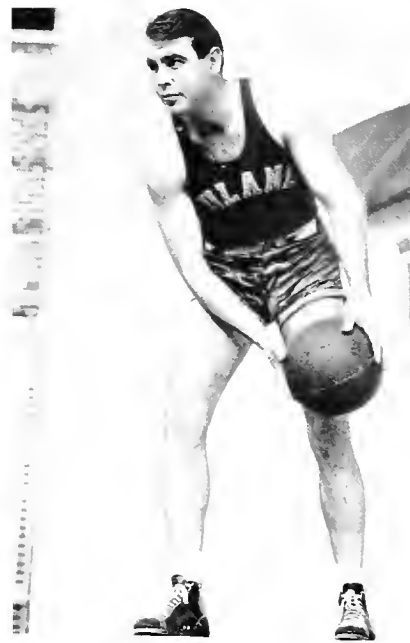


WAVE TAKES ONE, DROPS ONE TO KENTUCKY

Playing raggedly the first night, and frequently throwing the ball away, the quintet dropped the first game of the last two to the State team, in spite of frantic efforts on the part of Cotlar and Brechtel.

With a "do-or-die" attitude in his last collegiate game, Captain "Boisey" McCloskey led his pack of Greenies on the Tigers with undiminishable fury, and assisted by "Huck" Lockett, also in his last game, took the Bengals for a ride for the whole of the game. Score, 31-37.

"Skyline" Neyland secured the tap nine times out of ten, and his hard fighting teammates put it to good use, beating the Tigers for the first time in more than five years.

Ray Dauber, giving birth to his first public smile, watched his boys romp down the court, making up for any previous losses during the season. In fine form, but completely dumbfounded, the Tigers watched interestedly while Cotlar, Lockett and McCloskey sank goal after goal.

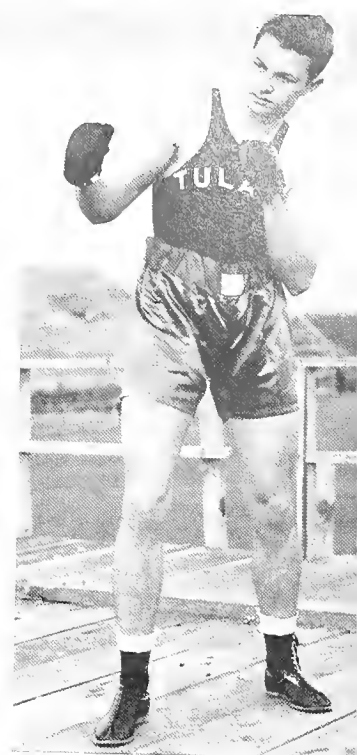
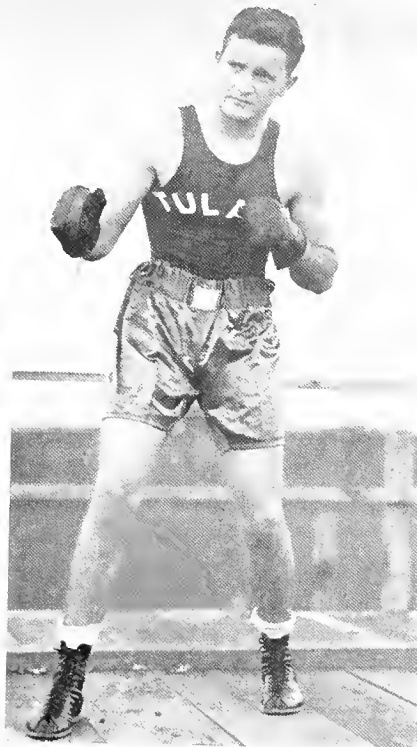
GREENIES TROUNCE OLE MISS 5-3

Floyd Newlin, making his 1937 debut, scored a sensational victory over the highly touted Marshall Goldberg. Maroun's successor stepped inside the Rebel's left hooks with sharp rights to score repeatedly and win easily. Ray Medlock evened it up by stopping Claude Cullinane in one heat, and Johnny Farese outslugged Tulane's Billy Peak to gain a close decision and give Ole Miss a 2-1 lead. It was shortlived, though, as George Manteris won over Johnny Cook to tie it up again.

Bucky Bryan suffered his first loss at the hands of Steve Wilkerson. Popular as ever, even in defeat, Bucky fought hard all the way only to bow to a superior boxer who kept on top of him, refused to let him get set, and met his rushes with a stream of jabs from an educated left which kept Bucky off balance throughout. Wilkerson looked like the best the S. E. Conference has produced in a long time.

Calvin Benedict fought a smart fight to take over Bill Robinson and tie up the score again. Much smaller than his foe, Benny slipped the big boy's jabs and scored with heavy rights to the body which had Robinson hanging on at the bell. Cameron Gamble looked his best in technically kayoing Clarence Forbes with one stiff right to the head in the first round.

All in all, the match was probably the best in the history of Tulane boxing. The crowd was large, and the fights so good that, judging from subsequent results, the Ole Miss Match can go down as marking a new trend in intercollegiate boxing—certainly in the South.

TULANE BEATS MISSISSIPPI STATE 7-1

Carl Inman and Cameron Gamble were more the topic of conversation than the other fights and matches put together, so we treat their battle first. There was greater diversity of opinion over the decision in favor of Gamble than in any college fight in years. All agreed, however, that it was a grand fight in which Gamble gambled his straight right against Inman's left hook, and won, in a close decision.

It took just so sensational a fight to overshadow the one between conference champ Moon Mullins and Jaubert. A good right hand floored Warren early in the first round for a nine count, but he not only got up to carry the fight to Mullins the rest of the match, but had things all his own way in the last round. Mullins' early lead was too great to be overcome, however.

All the other Greenies, Newlin, Harris, Brocato, Keenan, Bryan (by default), and Dirmann won their fights handily, Harris fighting best in trouncing the good Brent Murray.

WAVE BOWS TO ALABAMA AT ALABAMA 6-2

Joe Brocato won his fight and actually got the decision, as did Jaubert for his forfeited victory. Reports out of Alabama said the decision against Manteris was unfair, and similar things were heard about the verdicts against Phillips, particularly, and Dirmann. Gamble lost his first one to Paul Cusimano, Newlin to Jerry Burke, and Bryan bowed to Cy Canzoneri.



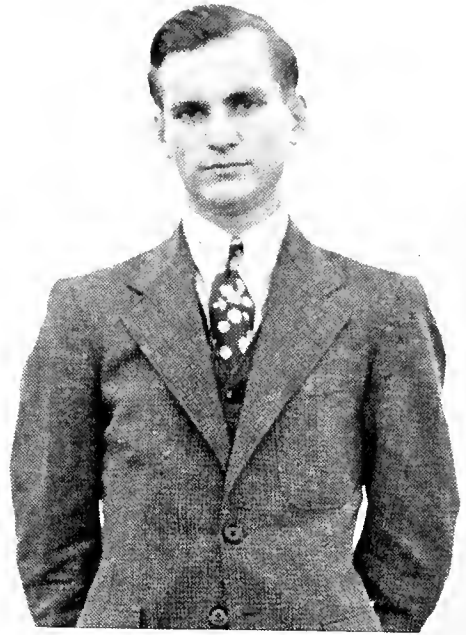

But Louis Phillips got only the worst of it when given a draw with Ed Ketcham. Most of the local newspapers and a majority of the crowd thought Phillips' left hand had piled up a safe margin of victory. But they KNEW that Brocato had won the fight he wasn't given, and hence put on the now celebrated quarter-hour Bronx cheer that was quieted only by Coach Monk Simons' appeal to act gentlemanly. Monk urged the crowd to keep the peace even "if we've got to fight for it," which is what Monk did immediately after leaving the ring at the conclusion of his appeal to stop the Coliseum tactics.

George Manteris fought a great, if losing, fight against the Bengal Bomber, Fred O'Banion. George had the bomber on the verge of exploding when he gave out in the third round and blew a good lead. Bucky Bryan did a comeback in whipping Chester Carville, but Johnny Dirmann kissed the canvas three times before they stopped his fight with J. L. Golson in the first round. Gamble came through with a well-earned decision over Jim Riseden and Jaubert stopped L. S. U.'s Mr. Baur in the first to tie up the affair.

SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

For the second time in the two years that Claude "Monk" Simons has been at the helm, the Greenie boxers won the conference title. The tournament was held in the Tulane gym March 5 and 6.

Joe Brocato successfully defended the lightweight title he had won in 1936, and Champ Gamble still answers to that name, although this year he moved up a notch to take the light-heavyweight crown. Added to the ten points gathered by these boys were the six earned by runners-up Louis Philips and Warren Jaubert. The great comeback by Philips and the rapid rise of Jaubert speak well of Coach Simons' fine coaching job.

George Manteris, the other returning champ from '36, was eliminated in a first round bout by Florida's Mr. Long, who went on to the welter title. Floyd Newlin, Bucky Bryan and Johnny Dirmann were all eliminated in the semi-finals, the conquerers of Newlin and Bryan going on to the title in their respective classes.



TRACK AND FIELD

Hampered by lack of material and apparent lack of enthusiasm amongst the student body in general, Coach Fritz Oakes' track team made, none-the-less, a very creditable showing.

The early season featured especially the fine work of Captain Howard K. Smith. He repeatedly out-hurdled everything in these parts and was rewarded for his efforts by a trip to the Texas Relays in Austin. Here he reached the finals, only to bow to such "name" hurdlers as Sam Allen of Oklahoma Baptist and All-American Bill Wallace of Rice. The next week, however, he came back in the Southwestern Relays to cop first place in his specialty. A touch of grippe weakened him for the Alabama meet and, though leading most of the way, his strength gave way at the three-quarter mark and he finished second, for the third time in their three meetings, to Slim Edwards. But after winning his specialty against L. S. U. a week later, he came back in the Southeastern Conference meet at Birmingham to beat his thrice-conqueror, Mr. Edwards, and finish but four yards behind the sensational Forrest "Spec" Towns, whom he pressed that day to a 14.1-second performance.

Smith's comeback was typical of the whole team. In the first meet of their season, at Lafayette, a team of Harry Dart, Jimmy Davis, H. M. Waugh and Bill Henderson won the 440-yard relay, finishing second in the half-

mile. The mile relayers, Billy Payne, Bob Lockett, Frank Lewis and Hugh Payne, finished second to Southwestern.

A month later, in the only local meet with a conference foe, Tulane bowed humbly to Alabama, score 72-45. Of fifteen events, the Greenies won four and tied in another. Stanley Lodriques vaulted 12 feet 3 inches to get a tie with Alabama's Bill Sheridan, and Henderson, Billy Payne, Ray Nussbaum and Nellie White won, respectively, the 220-yard dash, the low hurdles, the discus throw, and the broad jump. Nussbaum also took a second place in the shot, as did Sam Freese, with 173 feet, in the javelin, Bill Nichols in the high jump, Jim Mooney in the mile, Lockett in the half, and Bill Monroe in the two-mile run.

L. S. U. beat us a week later by almost an identical score, 73 to 44. Billy Payne ran a good quarter to beat Treadaway of L. S. U. for one of our three first places. Smith won the highs for another, and Noel Loffin supplied the day's biggest feature by tossing the javelin 176 feet 4 inches to beat the conference favorite, Stevens. Noel had just taken a day off from spring football practice to step out as a track star, and added a second place in the high hurdles to boot. "Rabbit" Henderson ran two very good seconds in both sprints, and finished third in the broad jump in which "Nellie" White placed. The only other second was taken by Bill Nichols in the high jump.

The lone team victory came in the last meet of the

season, when, paced by Neile White and Billy Payne, Tulane won the Junior Southern A. A. U. championship. White covered 45 feet 7 1/2 inches to take down top honors in the hop, step, jump, and added three more points with a second place in the broad jump. Payne, running the 400-meter hurdles for the second time in his career, clipped 4.7 seconds off the record of 60.4 seconds, but his time was not allowed because of his having knocked over two hurdles. A third place in the 200-meter lows concluded Billy's point gathering for the day.

George Kohl brought in five points with a second place in the 200-meter hurdles and a tie for second in the high jump. Ray Nussbaum's second in the discus throw and fourth in the shot netted four more points toward the Greenie total of 55 1/2, which was good enough to insure a five-point winning margin over the North Texas Teachers College. Five other second places clinched the title, however. Most sensational among these was Tom Payne's exciting 400-meter dash in which he lost by a hair's breadth to Loyola's Fred Generos in the excellent time of 49.5 seconds. Noel Loftin, J. Knight, Stan Rodrigues, and H. M. Waugh were the others who placed. A fourth in the discus and a third in the javelin accounted for Sam Freese's contribution of three points.

Two-point winners were Bill Kirchem and Frank Lewis, each showing in hurdle races, Hayward Vincent, third in the pole vault, and Henderson, with two fourth places in the sprints. Sam Barthe, Craig Roth and Bill Monroe added one point apiece with various fourth places, and Einar Pedersen tacked on the half-point by sharing a fourth place in the pole vault.

The next day, Saturday, May 23, five Tulanians won places in the Senior A. A. U. Olympic Tryouts. Captain Howard Smith, running a 14.5-second race was fourth in another of Towns record performances. George Kohl won the 200-meter hurdles in a race which found Freshman Sam Barthe finishing fourth. The Payne brothers, Billy and Tom, took down second and third places, in the 400-meter hurdles and 400-meter dash, respectively. Billy ran second only to the Olympic champion, Siats Hardin.

Kohl, a transfer student, is among the best hurdlers in the South, as can be witnessed by his winning the 220 lows in the Olympic Tryouts. Tom Payne looms as the greatest quarter-miler in Tulane's recent track history. The mile relay team of Roth, Barthe, Kirchem, and Payne shattered the record for the event

at the Southwestern Relays at Lafayette, and later beat the Greenie varsity team in a special race. Kirchem and Barthe also showed promise in the hurdles, as did Einar Pedersen in the vault. Joe Hogan and Ainsworth Jordy in the high jump, Bill Monroe in the distance runs, and Percy Stakelum in the sprints.

Others on the 1936 Freshman Track Team included: Paul H. Ramos, Oliver K. Bierhorst, and Ruland Gerth. From this promising group of freshmen, Coach Oakes should be able to obtain some excellent men for the 1937 Varsity.

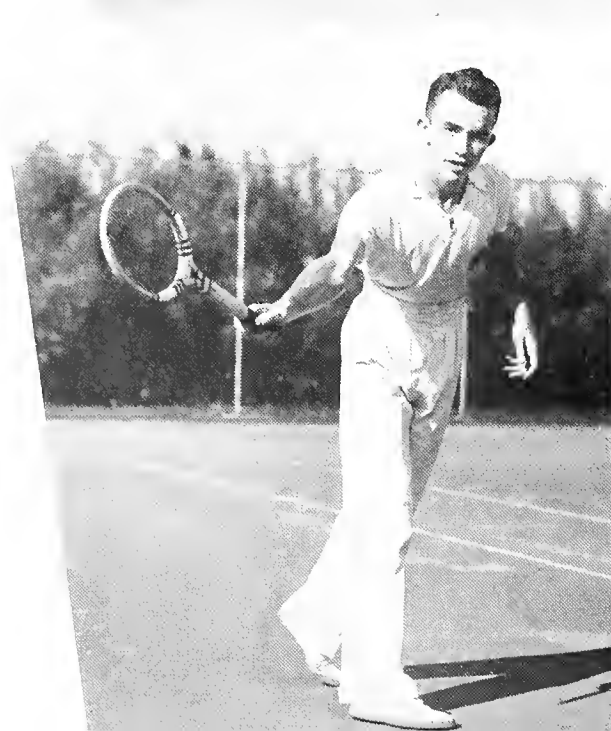


GOLF *at Tulane*

Various men tried out and two matches were played, one with L. S. U. and the other with Louisiana Polytechnic Institute, but in both matches the Greenie entrants were unsuccessful. Two men went to the play-off in Georgia, but neither got very far.

However, George Turpie, the well-known New Orleans golfer, will take over the reins of the team this year, and the presence on the squad of Vincent D'Antoni, who was city champion last year, and Ray Salmen, who is of considerable ability himself, should furnish a nucleus about which to develop a team that should really go places. Here's hoping we are entering upon a new golfing era at Tulane, where golf will take its place along with Tennis as being right down Tulane's line.

The Wave net team, under Paré's and Sutter's leadership, took on the toughest schedule yet attempted, starting with a pre-season tilt against the City Park Club. Ernie Sutter and George Wimberly were responsible for the even showing the Greenies made against a rather tough aggregation. Abbie Norwood teamed with Ernie to take the No. 1 doubles match, cinching a tie for Tulane.

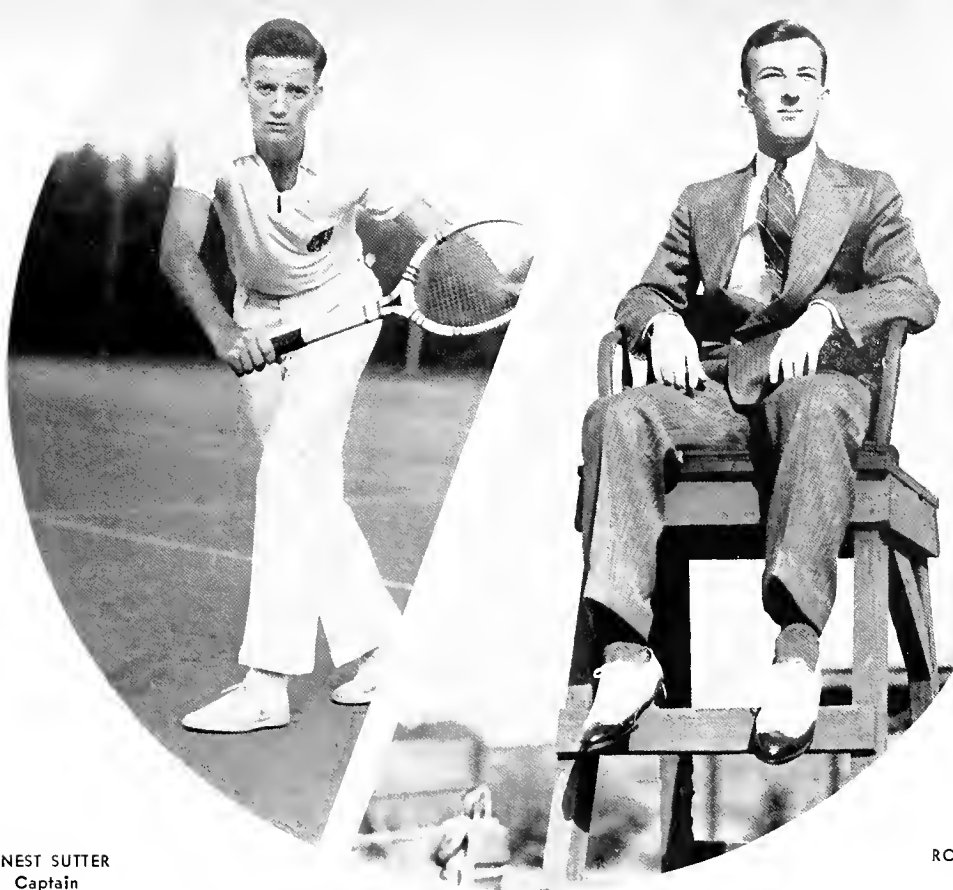
The Greenies slipped in the second warm-up, the New Orleans Lawn Tennis Club, ending up in one of the two defeats of the season. Sutter won his singles match and again with Abbie Norwood won a doubles encounter. These were the only two Tulane scores. The freshmen, however, showing considerable class got revenge soon after by beating the same team by the same score. Cheng, Westerfield and Abrams, who have since made their marks as varsity material, accounted for the singles wins, with Cheng and Westerfield winning over Warren Doyle and Dan Murray, Tulane alumni.

The first match of the regular season against Louisiana Normal put the Greenies in the win column. Sutter coasted through his match with McLean and teamed with

Alabama's Crimson Tide gave the Greenies a little more trouble, but not much. The Tide finished second best in a 4-2 score. Sutter, Doyle, and Wimberly all bested their opponents in close sets. The team of Sutter and Doyle, playing together for the first time won 6-3, 6-2.

Furman offered very little opposition and won only fourteen games in their twelve sets. Thorn made his first appearance this year by turning back Hollowell 6-3, 6-1. Donald Doyle, Red Wimberly and Phelps won easily. Thorn and Sutter took the doubles.

With three wins and no defeats to their credit the team took to the road to engage Rice and Texas in a three-day jaunt. Rice played good tennis before finally losing 4-2. Sutter took Eddie Holden 6-1, 6-2, and Doyle and John Thorn count wins Lorimer and Lederer, respectively. Sutter and Thorn lost their first double match to Cambell and Holden 6-2, 6-3 while Lorimer and Lederer were losing to Doyle and Phelps.

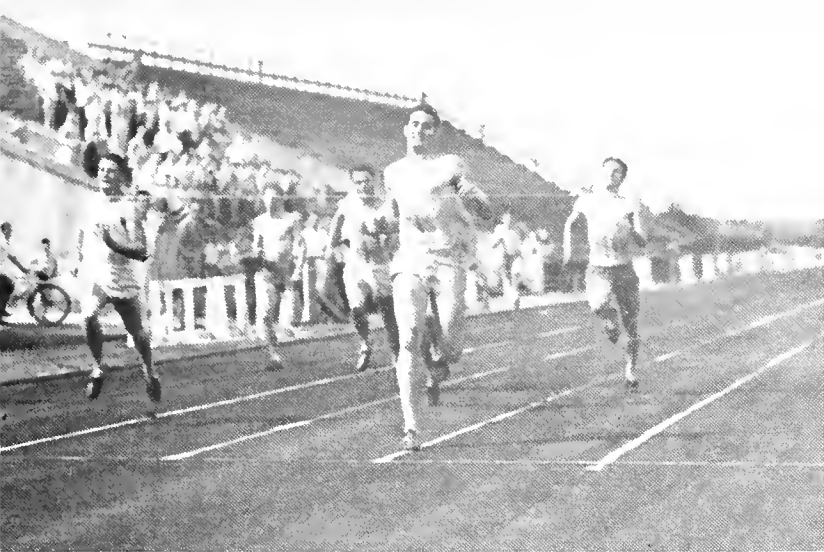
The Texas match was perhaps the most interesting of all the matches on the Wave schedule. The Longhorns proved to be a well-balanced team and administered the only defeat of the regular season 4-2. Sutter continued his fine play by taking the measure of Weller 3-6, 6-2, 6-2. Walthall beat Doyle in the No. 2 singles 6-2, 6-4. Peace beat Phelps 6-0, 6-3, and Smalley beat Thorn 6-3, 6-0. In

the doubles matches Sutter and Thorn beat Weller and Peace 4-6, 7-5, 6-4, Walthall and Smally of Texas vs. Doyle and Phelps of Tulane was won by the Texans 6-2, 6-1.

L. S. U. which was the last team scheduled, seemed to get the full effect of the Waves' comeback campaign. Tulane showed no mercy in taking the Tigers by the score of seven matches to none. Sutter beat Robinson 6-0, 6-1 and Thorn and Doyle beat Ketcham and Sievers 6-0, 7-5, and 6-4, respectively. Phelps beat Collins 6-4, 4-6, 6-4, and Wimberly annexed the only other singles match by outplaying Sanders 6-1, 2-6, 6-4. In the doubles matches Sutter and Thorn beat Sievers and Collins 8-6, 6-0, and Norwood and Doyle beat Ketcham and Sanders 6-4, 7-5.

In the Southern Intercollegiate Championship matches which were held here last May, Tulane won the singles championship because of Ernie Sutter. Bill Byrd of Texas, who was Sutter's opponent in the finals, played fine tennis all through the tournament, but could not survive the steadiness and perfection of Sutter's play. The score was 1-6, 8-6, 6-3, 7-5. In the doubles Sutter and Thorn played their consistently good game but lost in the finals to Burtz Boulware and A. F. Morrell of Georgia Tech 6-1, 5-7, 7-5, 6-3.

Not content with the one championship, Sutter met Ramsey Potts in the National Intercollegiate and after a hard match finally won over the North Carolina boy. Later in the year Potts came to New Orleans and again played Ernie but fared little better as he again was beaten. This conclusively ranked Sutter tops in the intercollegiate ranks.



The field of activity enjoying the greatest popularity at Tulane is intramural sports. Under this classification, are the inter-fraternity, the inter-class, and the inter-school competitions, all of them being under the general direction of Fritz Oakes.

These games are valuable in that they provide for those who are unable to make the varsity teams a chance to enjoy the keen rivalry and healthful stimulus of athletics.

A wide field is covered by these sports, inter-fraternity games including touch football, track, basketball, handball, golf, swimming, tennis, baseball, and bridge.

The traditional Frosh-Soph rivalries each year for the Holmes cup are of widespread interest. Up to date this year the Frosh have pulled the Sophs through the fire-hose in the tug-o-war, and have battled their upper-classmen to a scoreless tie in the football game.

Among the inter-school competitions, baseball is in the lime-light, the Physical Eds capturing the most recent trophy.

Daily the Engineers may be seen playing on the field behind the Engineering Buildings, and the keen sports competitions afforded by the different branches of the Engineering School add zestful recreation to the tedious daily work.

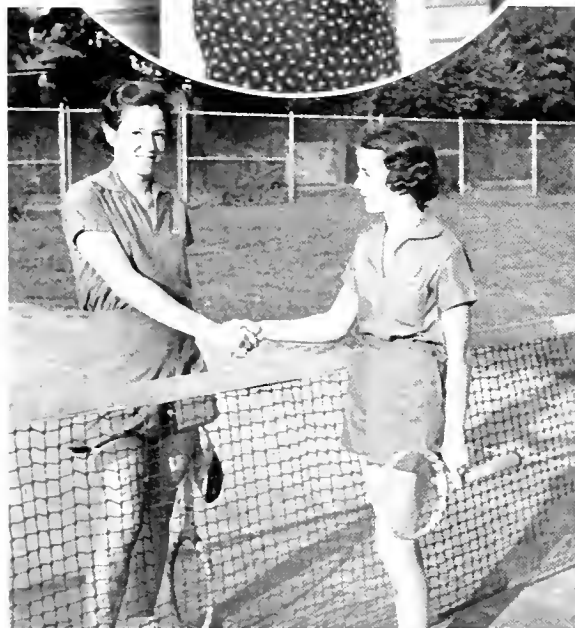
But everyone is not physically equipped to take part in the more strenuous activities. What is done to provide for their enjoyment and help? At the beginning of the year, every entering student is given a thorough physical examination and the type of work best suited to each individual is prescribed. There are correctives for those with postural defects. Many round shoulders and faulty curves have been remedied. It is not only those the Department of Physical Education recommends who take this, for some of the girls are volun-

tarily trying to acquire that poise and balance of walking, sitting, and standing that so few of us have, but so many desire.

Newcomb is ever so considerate of its less fortunate girls—those recuperating from operations, colds, Christmas holidays, and exams—by supplying cots and a gallery for sun baths and restful relaxation during the crowded day.

Everything is not centered around the less strenuous, but nevertheless important, items. In the fall, hockey is one of the popular sports, badminton, deck tennis, archery, and soccer can be elected according to one's abilities and desires. During the winter season, basketball holds part of the limelight with ping pong, bowling, Danish gymnastics, tumbling, apparatus work, and fencing coming in for their share. The spring term is devoted to instruction of enthusiastic tennis classes, badminton, baseball, and volleyball. The swimming pool is busy the year round, what with swimming tests to be passed, badges to be earned, and those extra pounds to be worked off. Dancing is becoming a more popular attraction. Tap is, of course, a favorite but rhythms and folk dancing will be more in demand as time goes on and interest increases.

There is a climax for each of these activities in the form of tournaments, games, demonstrations, and meets. The Athletic Council of the College has charge of class games in hockey, basketball, and baseball. It runs off tournaments in ping pong, badminton, bowling, deck tennis, and tennis. The alumnae are represented as well as the students in these contests, and the "Tennis Tea" after the annual varsity-alumnae tennis match

May starts with the May Day festival given by the Juniors in honor of the Seniors, one of the prettiest and most effective accomplishments of the students. Swimming finishes the year with a course in life-saving, and an informal meet with races and novelty stunts.

The faculty?

Once a year they shed coats, turn up shirt sleeves, and demonstrate their prowess on the baseball diamond in the annual faculty-varsity game. It is surprising how agile they are when it comes to sliding bases and jumping for flies.

The year comes to a close with an event dear to the heart of many Newcomb girls—Trophy Day. In recognition of their spirit and sportsmanship, points are given, which accumulate until they mean an "N," a sweater, a pin, or a blanket. These material things in themselves mean little, but they are a symbol of the fun, cooperation, achievement, and competition that had to be realized first, and will last after the trophies have gone.
