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INTRODUCTORY.

HE main purpose of this book is to record the genealogical history of John Alden of Ashfield, Mass., and Hanover, Chautauqua County, New York, and of his descendants.

The data for this history has been gathered from records in family Bibles, personal letters from those acquainted with the facts regarding their own branch of the family and from the compiler's own knowledge. In some cases an authority has been given, but generally it has been considered unnecessary.

One who attempts to follow any line of our family in the first two hundred years after 1620, will find many obstacles to overcome. In the first place it is a poor New England town, especially in Plymouth and Bristol Counties, Mass., that cannot count among her inhabitants, past or present, a number of Aldens of the same given name, especially Johns, Josephs, Davids and Ebenezers.

I began my research with only the knowledge that my great grandfather's name was John Alden, that he was born about April 3, 1770, and came from Ashfield or Buckland, Mass.; also that there was probably a Merrill intermarriage. We found that the records in Hampshire County, Mass., had been destroyed, and for years we wrote to different Aldens in New England, but none of them could find "Our John." In June. 1908, we employed Mr. W. O. Taylor, an experienced genealogist, of Orange, Mass., to assist in the search. After one year of work, writing hundreds of letters and searching the records in various New England towns, he found the desired records at Stafford, Conn. We are especially indebted to him.

To this history a brief account of John⁷ Alden's six Alden ancestors and their immediate families is prefixed, to connect him with John the Pilgrim, and as a matter of interest to readers not familiar with the subject. This account is based on such authorities as were immediately available, original research not being practicable nor deemed essential to the present purpose.

The works consulted were Governor Bradford's "History of Plimoth Plantation," Dr. Ebenezer Alden's "Memorial" The Descendants of Eliab⁵ Alden by Dr. Charles⁷ Henry Alden; The Descendants of Polly and Ebenezer Alden by Ebenezer⁸ Alden and Dr. Henry⁸ Shaw.

The lack or incompleteness of early records is much to be regreted, yet not surprising. There must have been little opportunity, in the hard struggle for existence by the Pilgrims, for careful note of current events and genealogical data. Nor was exactness always observed in the records made. Ten ways of spelling "Alden" have been noted. This want of exactness may have extended to statements of age, and perhaps accounts for some puzzling discrepancies.

The small number above and to the right of the

given name indicates the generation, John the Pilgrim being John¹.

An index of names, including those of persons who married or descended from an Alden is appended. Some interesting records will also be found in the closing pages.

In closing this labor of filial love and devotion, which has involved much work of a very pleasing nature, and listening to the stories of those aged ones who are hastening to join those whose memory we seek to perpetuate, we lay down the pleasing burden in the hope that in some degree we shall seem to the reader to have served faithfully the cause in which we are interested.



made at Plymouth, July 6, 1682, in which he stated he was then aged 83. He was one of the signers of the "Compact" on board the Mayflower at Cape Cod, November 21, 1620, and landed with the other passengers at Plymouth in December.

Governor Bradford, in his "History of Plymouth Plantation," wrote: "John Alden was hired for a cooper at South Hampton where the ship victueled, and being a hopeful young man, was much preferred, but left to his own liking to go or stay when he came here; but he stayed and married here."

It may be that John Alden joined the Pilgrims from love of adventure, and that, as Goodwin in his "Pilgrim Republic," page 566, suggests, Priscilla Mullins was the chief inducement for him to remain; but whatever his motive at first, he early identified himself with them, and through a long life was a devoted and useful member of the colony. For forty-three years he was a Governor's Assistant, being at times First Assistant and Deputy Governor; for thirteen years he was Treasurer of the Colony, and for eight years Deputy to the General Court, sometimes filling several offices at once. He was a member of the Council of war of the Colony for eight years.

About 1623 he married Priscilla, daughter of William and Alice (——) Mullins, who with this daughter and young son Joseph had joined the Pilgrims at South Hampton. William Mullins died March 3, 1621, and his wife and son shortly after, during the sickness which proved fatal to half the Colony, the first winter and spring.

Tradition represents Priscilla to have been very beautiful in her youth, and John also was a comely person; and considering his other accomplishments, it is not surprising that when he was sent by Captain Standish, after the death of his wife, to solicit her hand in marriage, she preferred the messenger to the message.

Some interesting facts about the Mullins family

[&]quot;As he warmed and glowed, in his simple and eloquent language, Quite forgetful of self, and full of the praise of his rival, Archly the maiden smiled, and, with eyes overrunning with laughter

Said, in a tremulous voice, 'Why don't you speak for yourself,

are known. William Mullins made a will just before he died, which was sent back to England by the Mayflower on her return, to be probated at Dorking, in the County of Surrey, his former residence. This will shows that the testator had left behind in England a son, William Mullins, Jr., and a married daughter, Sarah Blumden, and provides "Also if my son William will come to Virginia, I give him my share of land." After his father's death William Mullins, Jr., came to this country with his daughter Sarah, and resided in Duxbury. Sarah was born about 1621, married successively Thomas Gannett of Duxbury, William Saville and Thomas Faxon, both of Braintree, surviving her last husband seventeen years. Her father died in Braintree, February 12, 1673. ("Mayflower Descendants," Vol. I, Page 230:—Vol. VII, pages 37 and 179.)

After a few years to obtain more land, John Alden, with Captain Myles Standish and others, moved a few miles northward from Plymouth and founded Duxbury. Part at least of his land is still owned by Aldens, and the site of his well is pointed out, near the "Old Alden House," built during his lifetime, and has always been owned and occupied by one of his descendants. It is now owned by "The Alden Kindred of America," and a meeting of the Association is held there each year.

He died in Duxbury, September 22, 1687, but it is not known where or when Priscilla died, nor where either of them is buried. Goodwin in "The Pilgrim Republic," page 542, says that they were both present at the burial of Josiah Winslow in 1680, but gives no authority. John's Bible and several documents with his signature are preserved in Plymouth Hall at Plymouth.

John Alden left no will, having, it is supposed,

distributed his real estate while still living, but an inventory of other property and the settlement of his estate by his son Jonathan, the administrator, dated June 13, 1688, are recorded in Plymouth. They are transcribed in "Mayflower Descendant," Vol. III, page 10.

Bradford, in his History, already quoted, wrote thirty years after the landing of John and Priscilla, "who are both living and have eleven children." Owing to lack of early records, the exact date and order of birth of these children, and even the names of several are in doubt and can only be inferred from collateral data. The following list is believed to be as complete as can be made at present:—

I. Elizabeth, born about 1624, as she died May 31, 1717, in the 93rd year of her age. She married Dec. 26, 1644, William Paybody of Little Compton, R. I., and was an ancestor of Henry W. Longfellow. They had 13 children. One died young.

II. John, the "Captain," mariner of Boston, born about 1626, as his gravestone gives age as 75 at his death March 14, 1902. He married Elizabeth Everell Phillips Apr. 1, 1660. He was an houored member of the Old South Church, Boston. His antique slate headstone is imbedded in a side wall of the porch of the New Old South Church. They had 13 children. Several died young.

At some dates prior to 1646, the following children, it is surmised, may have been born, completing the number to eleven. Of these very little is known:—

SECOND GENERATION.

Joseph Alden, son of John¹ and Priscilla (Mullins) Alden, farmer, was born in Plymouth about 1627. He was one of the early settlers of Bridgewater in 1654, on the land granted to his father, which lay near the Historical Society's building in the present town of West Bridgewater. He married Mary, daughter of Moses and Sarah (——) Simmons, or Symonsen, Moses having come from England in the ship Fortune in 1621.

Joseph died in Bridgewater, February 8, 1697. The ground where he was probably buried is known, but the grave is not marked. Copies of his will and of the inventory of his estate are preserved in the Plymouth probate records, his wife and son John being named executors. The will, etc., are transcribed in "Mayflower Descendant," Vol. VI, page 71, and will be found in the appendix to this volume.

According to a genalogical letter written by John⁴ Alden in 1801, his grandfather Joseph² had three sons and three daughters, and two of the daughters married Snows of Weymouth. (Letter given in "Mayflower Descendant," Vol. VI, page 110.) The list is as follows, the sons in the order given in the will:

Joseph, second child of Joseph² and Mary (Simmons) Alden was born at Bridgewater, Mass., "about 1667;" he was married in 1990 to Hannah, daughter of Daniel Dunham of Plymouth, Mass. Resided at South Bridgewater, Mass., where he was a deacon in the church. He died Dec. 22, 1747; one account says "January 22," and another says "December 22." His widow died January 13, 1748. FIFTH GENERATION.

Jonathan, oldest child of Eleazer⁴ and Martha (Shaw) Alden was born in 1721 at Bridgewater, Mass. Mitchell in his "History of Bridgewater, Mass.," and the "Alden Memorial," states that "he married in 1742 1793, Experience, daughter of Nathaniel Hayward, went to Greenwich, Mass., where he died, aged 80 vears, and his wife died there in 1809." The Alden Memorial says "Jonathan, second son of Jonathan,5 married Mary Merrill of Stafford, Conn." This seems to be all that has been published concerning the above Jonathan. The Stafford, Conn., Town Records however show that this Jonathan⁵ Alden settled first at Stafford, and there had recorded the children given below. One Jonathan of Stafford, Conn., bought of Jonathan Edson of Ashfield, Mass., June 10, 1766, one hundred acres of land in Ashfield belonging to right of Lot 26. This was either Jonathan⁵ or his son Jonathan6 who married Mary Merrill, and I think it was the latter. Jonathan⁵ Alden bought of Thos. French of Conway, Mass., Sept. 16, 1767, Lot 83, in Conway, containing 166 acres; he was then of Stafford. Jan. 24, 1769, he bought of William Powers of Greenwich, Mass., for one hundred pounds a certain tract of land in Greenwich, "about 90 acres." He was still "of Stafford," but in 1870 he was of Greenwich, Mass.," when he deeded to his son Amos Alden of Enfield, Conn., 50 acres of his lot in Conway, another 50 acres he had sold to Eleazer Alden of Bridgewater. The remainder of his land in Conway he sold in Oct., 1778, to James Sanderson, and was then "of Greenwich."

The date of his death has not yet been found, the Town Clerk of Greenwich, writes that "the old records are not very complete, some being lost," and that "he

could not find the name of Jonathan Alden anywhere on the records of births, marriages and deaths." A more thorough search and communication with some of his living descendants, might reveal the record of when and where he and his wife died. The children below with birth dates, I find recorded at Stafford, Conn., the other two are from the Alden Memorial.

SIXTH GENERATION.

Jonathan, second child of Jonathan⁵ and Experience (Hayward) Alden, was born June 6, 1747, and is so recorded on the Town Records at Stafford, Conn.. which also show, page 128, that Jonathan Alden, Jr., was married there to Mary Merrill, March 30, 1769. And in the same book, page 22, it is shown that they had a son John born "April 3, 1770." Nothing further is known for a certainty concerning this Jonathan⁶ Alden. A more exhaustive search might develop much more. The probable theory based on certain facts that are matters of record in the towns of Ashfield and Conway, Mass., is as follows: The town or church records of Conway say that "--- Alden died of fever Jan. 7, 1772." The town records of Ashfield state that "widow Mary Alden was married at Ashfield, Dec. 3, 1772, to Moses Hayward of Conway, by the Rev Jacob Shermin." Now it seems quite probable that this "widow Mary Alden" may have been the Mary Merrill who married 1st Jonathan6 Alden, that he died in Jan., 1772, and she left with one, and perhaps two

young children, married 2nd this Moses Hayward. This theory is strengthend by the fact that Jonathan Alden did not dispose of all his land in Conway until after 1772, and as his son Amos did not settle there it is quite likely that his son Jonathan did. Be that as it may, it is certain that Jonathan and Mary (Merrill) Alden had one son named John, the father of John Merrill Alden.

OHN⁷ ALDEN, only known child of Jonathan⁶ and Marry (Merrill) Alden was born at Stafford, Conn., April 3, 1770, (see Town Record, page 22.) He was of Ashfield, Mass., in 1792, where he was called John the 2nd to distinguish him from John⁶

Alden the son of David⁵ of Ashfield. He was married at Goshen, Mass., March 8, 1792 to Tabitha McNitt, (Town Records of Goshen, Mass.) She was, it is believed, a daughter of widow Martha McNitt of Buckland, Mass., where, it is stated by his descendants, "his son John Merrill Alden was born Nov. 16, 1793." Mr. Alden did not remain in Massachusetts but a short time after his marriage. A granddaughter writes that "her mother, Eunice (Alden) Putney, was born at Augusta, N. Y., (Oneida Co.,) in 1805;" and the History of Oneida Co.. N. Y., in a brief sketch of the

town of Augusta, (page 87) says, "The first house built in Augusta for white persons was erected in 1793, and John Alden commenced a clearing the same year." He removed from there to Hanover, Chautauqua Co., N. Y., about 1808, where he died Sept. 8. 1813. His widow is said to have married again. They had 5 children. (See eighth generation.)

ANCESTORS OF ELIAS COOLEY.

Benjamin Cooley and Sarah his wife, date and place of birth unknown, one of the first settlers of part of Springfield, Mass., called Longmeadow. Came from England about 1643. He had eight children. We give only the line of Elias Cooley, who married Sarah Alden.

Obadiah, son of Benjamin and Sarah Cooley, born Sept. 27, 1646; died Sept. 3, 1690; married Rebecca Williams Nov. 9, 1670. They had 7 children.

Obadiah Cooley, son of Obadiah and Rebecca Cooley, was born Aug. 1, 1678; died Oct. 6, 1764; married Dorcas Hale, Jan. 22, 1702. They had 6 children.

David Cooley, son of Obadiah and Dorcas Cooley, was born at Springfield, Mass., Jan. 27, 1812. His wife's name was Margaret, but maiden name unknown, as also the other family history except:—

Abner Cooley, son of David and Margaret Cooley, was born at Palmer, Mass., Aug. 17, 1752. Married Maria Chapin, Oct. 16, 1783. He was a revolutionary soldier. In 1806 he removed to Chautauqua Co., N. Y. Died April 30, 1832. They had 5 children.

Elias Cooley, son of Abner and Maria Cooley. married Sarah Alden.

ried Harry Henshaw and moved from Chautauqua Co., N. Y., to Athens Co., Ohio. Her husband did not live many years. They had no children as far as I can

ascertain, and I have been unable to get the date of her death, but it was some years after the death of her husband.





These are to publish and Declare to all whome it may concern that I Joseph Alden sen^r of y^e Town of Bridgewater in y^e County of Plimouth in New england being of sound judgment and memory Do ordain and make this my last will and Testament in manner following my Immortal Soul I do Humbly Resign into y^e mercyfull hands of Almighty God my creator hoping through y^e merits and meditations of Jesus Christ to obtain pardon and salvation. My Body I commit to y^e Earth from whence it was to be Decently Interred at y^e Discretion of my executors and the rest of my christian friends. And as Touching such worldly estate as God Hath Blessed me withal I Dispose of it in manner and form as followeth.

Imps I Give to my son Isaac fifty Acres of Land which he lives upon, further I Give him Ten acres more which I gave him liberty to take up: more Ten acres of Swamp more two acres of upland which he hath taken up in Liew of the uplands belonging to Coasten Kitchen meadows, one Acre more of meadow at Byroms hole which he hath hitherto enjoyed more I give to him Half my meadow lott in Byroms hole In consideration whereof my Will is that he allow to my son Joseph Three acres out of the aforementioned ten acres of Swamp further I give to my son Isaac Half of my sixty acres of Land between Byroms hole and the Sawmill All which Lands abovementioned I Say I Give to him and to his heirs and Assigns for Ever.

WRITTEN AND SIGNED IN THE CABIN OF THE MAYFLOWER.

In the Name of God, Amen:

We, whose names are underwritten, the loval subjects of our dread sovereign lord, King James, by the grace of God, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, King, defender of the faith, etc., having undertaken for the glory of God, and advancement of the Christian faith, and honor of our King and Country, a voyage to plant the first colony in the northern part of Virginia, do, by these present, solemnly and mutually, in the presence of God and one of another, covenant and combine ourselves together into a civil body politic. for our better ordering and preservation, and furtherance of the ends aforesaid: and by virtue hereof to enact, constitute and frame such just and equal laws, ordinances, acts, constitution and offices, from time to time, as shall be thought most meet and convenient for the general good of the colony; unto which we promise all due submission and obedience.

In witness whereof we have hereunder subscribed our names, at Cape Cod, the 11th of November, in the year of the reign of our Sovereign lord, King James, of England, France and Ireland, the eighteen, and of Scotland, the fifty-fourth Anno Domini, 1620.

John Alden was hired for a Cooper, at South-Hampton, wher the ship victuled; and being a 1. hopfull yong man, was much desired, but left to

his owne liking to go or stay when he came here; but he stayed, and maryed here.

John Allerton and Thomas Enlish were both hired, the later to goe m^r of a shalop here, and the 2. other was reputed as one of the company, but was to go back (being a seaman) for the help of others behind. But they both dyed here, before the shipe returned.

There were allso other 2. seaman hired to stay a 2. year here in the country, William Trevore and one Ely. But when their time was out, they both returned.

These being about a hundred sowls,² came over in this first ship; and began this worke, which God of his goodnes hath hithertoo blesed; let his holy name have the praise.

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And seeing it hath pleased him to give me to see 30. years compleated since these beginings; and that the great works of his providence are to be observed, I have thought it not unworthy my paines to take a view of the decreasings and increasings of these persons, and such changs as hath pased over them and theirs, in this thirty years. It may be of some use to such as come after; but however, I shall rest in my owne benefite.

I will therefore take them in order as they lye:

Mr. Carver and his wife dyed the first year; he in the spring, she in the sommer; also, his man Roger and the litle boy Jasper dyed before either of them, of the commone infection. Desire Minter returned to her friends, and proved not very well, and dyed in England. His servant boy Latham, after more than 20. years stay in the country, went into England, and from thence to the Bahamy Islands in the West Indies, and ther, with some others, was starved for want of food. His maid servant maried, and dyed a year or tow after, here in this place.

His servant, John Howland, maried the doughter of John Tillie, Elizabeth, and they are now living, 15. and have 10. children, now all living; and their eldest daughter hath 4. children. And ther 2. doughter, 1. all living; and other of their children mariagable. So 15. are come of them.

Mr. Brewster lived to very old age; about 80. years he was when he dyed, having lived some 23. or 24. years here in the countrie; and though his wife dyed long before, yet she dyed aged. His 4. sone Wrastle dyed a youge man unmaried; his sone Love lived till this year 1650, and dyed, and left 4. children, now living. His doughters which came over after him are dead, but have left sundry children alive; his eldest sone is still liveing, and 2. hath 9. or 10. children; one maried who hath a child or 2.

Richard More his brother dyed the first winter;

4. but he is married and hath 4. or 5. children, all living.

Mr. Ed: Winslow his wife dyed the first winter; and he married with the widow of Mr. White, and 2. hath 2. children living by her marigable, besides

sundry that are dead.

One of his servants dyed, as also the litle girle, 8. soone after the ships arrivall. But his man, Georg Sowl, is still living, and hath 8 children.

William Bradford his wife dyed soone after their 4. arrivall; and he maried againe; and hath 4. children, 3. wherof are maried.

Mr. Allerton his wife dyed with the first, and his servant, John Hooke. His sone Bartle is maried in England, but I know not how many children he hath. His doughter Remember is maried at Salem, and hath 3. or 4. children living. And his

- 8. doughter Mary is maried here, and hath 4. children. Him selfe maried againe with the doughter of Mr. Brewster, and hath one sone living by her, but she is long since dead. And he is maried againe, and hath left this place long agoe. So I account his increase to be 8. besids his sons in England.
- Mr. Fuller his servant dyed at sea; and after his 2. wife came over, he had tow children by her, which are living and growne up to years; but he dyed some 15. years agoe.

John Crakston dyed in the first mortality; and about some 5. or 6. years after, his sone dyed; having lost him selfe in the wodes, his feet became frosen, which put him in a feavor, of which he dyed.

¹Captain Standish his wife dyed in the first sick-4. nes, and he maried againe, and hath 4. sones live-

ing, and some are dead.

Mr. Martin, he and all his, dyed in the first infection not long after the arrivall.

Mr. Molines, and his wife, his sone, and his servant, dyed the first winter. Only his doughter 15. Priscilla survived, and maried with John Alden, who are both living, and have 11. children. And their eldest doughter is married and hath five children.

Mr. White and his 2. servants dyed soone after ther landing. His wife maried with Mr. Winslow 7. (as is before noted). His 2. sons are maried, and Resolved hath 5. children, Perigrine tow, all living. So their increase are 7.

Mr. Hopkins and his wife are now both dead, but they lived about 20. years in this place, and had 5. one sone and 4. doughters here. Ther sone became a seaman, and dyed at Barbadoes: 1. doughter dyed here, and 2. are maried; one of them hath 2. children; and one is yet to mary. So their in 4. crease which still survive are 5. But his son Giles

4. crease which still survive are 5. But his son Giles is maried, and hath 4. children.

His doughter Constanta is also maried, and hath 12. 12. children, all of them living, and one of them married.

Mr. Richard Warren lived some 4. or 5. years, and had his wife come over to him, by whom he had 2. sones before dyed; and one of them is 4. maryed, and hath 2. children. So his increase is 4. But he had 5. doughters more came over with his wife, who are all maried, and living, and have many children.

John Billinton, after he had been here 10. yers, 8. was executed for killing a man; and his eldest sone dyed before him; but his 2 sone is alive, and maried, and hath 8. children.

Edward Tillie and his wife both dyed soon after their arrivall; and the girle Humility, their cousen, 7. was sent for into England, and dyed ther. But the youth Henery Samson is still liveing, and is maried, and hath 7. children.

John Tillie and his wife both dyed a little after

they came ashore; and their doughter Elizabeth maried with John Howland, and hath issue as is before noted.

Francis Cooke is still living, a very olde man, and hath seen his childrens children have children; after his wife came over, (with other of his 8. children,) he hath 3. still living by her, all maried, and have 5. children; so their encrease is 8. And his sone John, which came over with him, is mar-4. ied, and hath 4. children living.

Thomas Rogers dyed in the first sicknes, but his sone Joseph is still living and is maried, and hath 6. 6. children. The rest of Thomas Rogers [children] came over, and are maried, and have many children.

Thomas Tinker and his wife and sone all dyed in the first sickness.

And so did John Rigdale and his wife.

James Chilton and his wife also dyed in the first infection. But their doughter Mary is still living, 10. and hath 9. children; and one doughter is maried, and hath a child; so their increase is 10.

Edward Fuller and his wife dyed soon after they 4. came ashore; but their sone Samuell is living, and married, and hath 4. children or more.

John Turner and his 2. sones all dyed in the first sicknes. But he hath a doughter still living at Salem, well maried and approved of.

Francis Eaton his first wife dyed in the generall sicknes; and he maried againe, and his 2. wife dyed, and he married the 3. and had by her 3. 4. children. One of them is maried, and hath a child; the other are living, but one of them is an ideote. He dyed about 16. years agoe. His sone Samuell, who came over a sucking child, is allso

1. maried, and hath a child.

Moyses Fletcher, Thomas Williams, Digerie Preist, John Goodman, Edmond Margeson, Richard Britteridge, Richard Clarke. All these dyed sone after their arrivall, in the general sickness that befell. But Digerie Preist had his wife and children sent hither afterwards, she being Mr. Allertons sister. But the rest left no posteritie here.

Richard Gardinar became a seaman, and died in England, or at sea.

Gilbert Winslow, after diverse years aboad here, returned into England, and dyed ther.

Peter Browne married twise. By his first wife 6. he had 2. children, who are living, and both of them maried, and one of them hath 2. children; by his second wife he had 2. more. He dyed about 16. years since.

Thomas English and John Allerton dyed in the generall siknes.

John Alden married with Priscila, Mr. Mollines his doughter, and had issue with her as is before related.

Edward Doty and Edward Litster, the servants of Mr. Hopkins. Litster, after he was at liberty, went to Virginia, and ther dyed. But Edward Doty by a second wife hath 7. children, and both he and they are living.

Of these 100. persons which came first over in this first ship together, the greater halfe dyed in the generall mortality and most of them in two or three monthes time. And for those which survived, though some were ancient and past procreation, and others left the place and cuntrie, yet of those few remaining are sprunge up above 160. persons, in this 30. years, and are now living in this presente year, 1650. besides many of their children which are dead, and come not within this account.

And of the old stock (of one and other) there are yet living this present year, 1650. nere 30. persons. Let the Lord have the praise, who is the High Preserver of men.

Twelfe persons liveing of the old stock this present yeare, 1679.

Two persons liveing that came over in the first shipe 1620, this present yeare, 1690. Resolved White and Mary Chusman [Cushman], the doughter of Mr. Allerton.

And John Cooke, the son of Frances Cooke, that came in the first ship, is still liveing, this present yeare, 1694; and Mary Cushman is still liveing this present yeare, 1698.

This brief history of the "Mayflower Passengers" was taken from "Bradford's History of Plymouth Plantation."

NOTES.

Jonathan Alden⁵ page 18, was married in 1743, not 1793.

Some of the descendants of Sarah Alden⁸ page 24, say she was born in Vermont. It may be that John Alden⁷ went to Vernont from Oneida Co., N. Y., before he moved to Chautauqua Co. N. Y., but we have no evidence that he did except that this daughter is said to have been born there.

It is probable that Jonathan Alden⁵ and Jonathan Alden⁶ were both Revolutionary soldiers.
