

Letter to the Editor:

We, the undersigned, deal daily with the consequences to the city's failure to develop effective plans and efficient systems to address the problems of its needlest residents.

It is therefore with enormous disappointment that we find San Francisco's opinion-shapers and policy-makers so grossly misinformed about its homeless problem, generally, and the proposed General Assistance reform package specifically. It is particularly disturbing that both media editorialists and public officials are relying on County Welfare Department "experts" who are largely responsible for the human and economic disaster that now constitutes the city's homeless "program".

These same "experts" have reinvented the Poor House approach to poverty by using flea-bag hotels run by for-profit operators without contracts while gradually reducing the number of General Assistance recipients. While many cry out for pilot programs demonstrating effective solutions to the homeless problem, local "experts'" have systematically dismantled acclaimed support service programs successful in moving people from the streets to self-sufficiency. Meanwhile, the absence of a comprehensive, coordinated approach has forced our agencies to deal with increasingly complicated, unnecessarily costly problems.

San Francisco proclaims itself Number One in serving the homeless. However, while San Mateo County acquires permanent housing as transitional living facilities, our County's "experts" continue to waste millions of dollars annually on a program that amounts to little more than a series of one-night stands. These "experts" have consistently presented inaccurate information to the Mayor's Homeless Planning Council, frustrating ten months of effort by those of us trying to develop the kinds of written plans and policies that cities like Portland have had for years.

Perhaps the most misleading of the many myths that surround the city's approach to this issue is the alleged "magnet effect" by which the "experts" argue that homeless nation-wide are drawn to San Prancisco. A researcher from the National Academy of Science found that the mayors of twelve of the thirteen cities recently visited made the same claim.

We are extremely disturbed that these same "experts" have apparently been successful in using misrepresentation and

exaggeration to undermine extremely watered-down reforms in their own systems. Of even more concern is the failure of those considering these issues to look beyond the "experts" self-serving arguments and consult with those of us whose professional experience and opinion strongly contradict theirs.

Explanation of Vote or Statement of Supervisor Walker

Supervisor Walker requested that the Journal of Proceedings reflect her reasons for voting "no" on the foregoing issue as follows:

"I do not know, having neither enough knowledge nor enough information, to know with cerainty whether the decision to strategically deploy major components of the country's naval defenses at various locations around this country is good or bad, wise or foolish. That is not the basis of my opposition to homeporting the Missouri battle group of San Francisco. The fact that the Missouri group will add to the nuclear presence in the Bay Area in disturbing, but I believe that there are already many nucelar powered and equiped machines deployed here and that the San Francisco Bay Area is now a prime target in the event of ward. So while I may not agree with the Defense Department's decision to place the Missouri here, and while I don't like the idea of the Bay Area being a target, nor the presence of nuclear materials nearby, those arguments are not a primary basis of my opposition. They are, of course, factors in a bigger picture.

My fundamental problem is this: San Francisco, time and again,. has taken positions opposed to military buildup and/or increased miltary spending, especially at the expense of domestic and social needs. This has expressed itself in many and varied ways over the last decade; not the least of those being the Proposition V "Jobs with Peace" vote taken in 1978, and the Proposition N in 1980 which was a policy statement in support of an end to U.S. miltary intervention in Central America. As well, over the last two decades San Franciscans have expressed themselves at the polls in support of candidates for local, state and national office who advocated reductions in the Pentagon's budget.

The issue is indeed complicated. The Missouri and its attendant fleet, especially the "big Boat" itself, are a symbol of increased defense specning. The ship was hauled out of mothballs, refitted and rehabilitated at costs in excess of a 100 million dollars (and I expect that that number is conservative). This at a time when millions of older Americans are barely surviving on fixed incomes which are rendered miserly small by the raging inflaction of the last several years. As well, we have growing numbers of our

citizens wandering this land without homes, thousands of which are in San Francisco and the Bay Area. They are on the streets or in any number of expensive social service, health and/or criminal justice programs. Our schools toter on the edge of ruin; people flee the cities because the cost of housing is so high. I am unable to reconcile the federal expenditure of millions, perhaps billions of dollars for an increased defense in the light of these glaring needs. The federal government has drastically reduced revenue sharing, community development block grants, funding for transit, and etc...They have altered health and medicare regulations in ways which make sick and needy people more dependent upon the states and cities/counties for basic survival. There is something fundementally wrong with this entire equation.

Therefore, beyond the moral and/or ethical arguments, the final arguments over homeporting must be couched in what, if any, economic benefits accure to the City and the Bay Area. The Mayor's Office, the Controller's Office and the Board's Budget Analyst, in a joint statement on the economic benefits of homeporting concluded that there was no significant negative and there was possible gain but that their numbers had a variable or margin of error of 40 to 50%, OR GREATER. Were the Board to proposed entering into a contract with a private firm for any good or service with that range of potential error we would be propertly pilloried by the business community, the press any any other right thinking entity. Why is this any different? In this disputed, and in fact meaningless MOU, the City agrees to significant up-front costs of several million dollars for streets, transit, and housing this year, with a continuing equal committment for the next several years. Where is the money for these "improvements" going to come from? Any at what cost to us, with no committment from the Navy for even so much as one job and no requirement that they act as responsible landlords to the many small businessess and artists who currently occupy the property?

Our borrowing from Peter to pay Paul budget balancing act of the past years has caught up with us, and we, unlike the federal government, <u>must</u> have a balanced budget. The money will have to come from somewhere. Additionally, I believe that the way the people of the Bayview and Hunters Point are being used is inexcusable. They are now told that services and improvements which have been promised for years will not be forthcoming unless, UNLESS The Missouri and its fleet is homeported in San Francisco. Outrageous!

A major point of difficulty and importance to me is environmental. Issues as to the efficacy, cost and wisdom of the dreging which must accompany the Missouri are a long way from resolved, as are the serious questions of suitable future uses of the land given its history and current tests which indicate substantial toxic problems. If, in addition to the current fragile environment of the Bay and Delta, moves by Southern California to grab more Northern California water are successful, which is quite probable, then we must not knowingly take steps for a short term gain that may prove disaterous on a very broad scale in the future.

The final argument is the political one. Why are we in such a hurry to do this now? There will be a new mayor, and a new Board

within the next year. As well, there will be a new President who may have quite a different agenda for this country than the current one. We must husband our resources and engage in some serious long term planning for ourselves as a part of the region before taking the steps to make ourselves a Navy base. There are too many questions as yet unanswered, entirely too much manipulation by the Mayor and the Navy for any reasonable person to feel comfortable. The only encouraging thing about this entire debate is that the MOU is not enforceable and does not become even marginally effective until the EIR has been completed and certified. The vote on the MOU is soley to demonstrate to Congress that San Francisco's Board of Supervisors now support homeporting (on a 6 to 5 vote) whereas in its previous vote on this issue the Board of Supervisors did not support homeporting by a 6 to 5 vote and so I expect the back and forth will continue. Frankly, I don't think the Pentagon gives a damn what San Francisco thinks, if they want that boat here, they will put it here no matter what anyone says or thinks.

This has been but round one in a fight that will be protracted. We must look at the question from a distance and for the long term; we must not be stampeded for someone's immediate gratification. The dangers reclining in this homeporting question are critical. Mayor feinstein calls those of us who oppose this MOU "naysayers". To say "No" I will not be stampeded into a vote that sets this City on a path which I believe is not only wrong and contradictory to our established public policy but more importantly irresponsible in that the total economic benefits to be reaped in jobs and more money in our local economy are highly questionable. navy enlisted personnel do not have large spendable incomes. A real study of the loss of small business and the opportunity ti develop new and creative businessess in the area has yet to be done. There has not yet been a real cost/benefit analysis.

I cannot conclude this statement without noting that should the Navy bring its war ships to our city, our history of tolerance and our current practices of trying to bring an end to discrimination towards any individual or group will be properly seen as two-faced. If the MOU is a contract the Navy must play by the same rules as any other contractor; if it is not a contract then what we are asked to do here today is worse than cynical. I think it is wrong to vote for this MOU — and it is just plain wrong-headed to vote for it today. It should be tabled or sent back to committee until further research and study has been completed."

Recess

At the request of President Walker, the Board recessed at the hour of 5:23 p.m. to convene in closed session pursuant to Government Code Section 54956.9(b)(2) to meet with the City Attorney to determine whether significant exposure to litigation exists.
