JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS.

FIRST DAY.

WEDNESDAY, December 2d, 1874.

The Thirty-Eighth Session of the North Carolina Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, convened in the Edenton Street Methodist Church, in the city of Raleigh, at 9½ o'clock A. M.

Bishop E. M. MARVIN, President.

The Conference was opened with religious services, conducted by the Bishop.

By direction of the Bishop, the Secretary of the last Session was directed to call the roll of the clerical members, when nearly all answered to their names, few being absent.

On motion of J. W. Lewis, B. Craven was elected Secretary.

On motion of J. P. Moore, the bar of the house was fixed on a line with the third window.

On motion of E. A. Yates, W. H. Bobbitt, A. W. Mangum, H. P. Cole, J. B. Bobbitt and R. W. Best, were appointed a Committee on Public Worship.

On motion of J. P. Moore, the Presiding Elders were appointed a Committee to Nominate the Standing Committees.

On motion of R. G. Barrett, the Examining Committees were appointed a Committee to Nominate the Committees of Examination for the next four years.

On motion, M. V. Sherril, T. A. Boon and J. W. North, were appointed a Committee on Memoirs.

On motion of A. W. Mangum, it was ordered that the daily sessions of this Conference shall commence at 9½ o'clock A. M. and adjourn at 1½ o'clock P. M.

On motion of E. A. Yates, it was resolved that the examination of character should be with open doors.

On motion of Paul J. Caraway, a special committee of three was appointed on the Constitution of the Board of Missions.

P. J. Caraway, W. C. Gannon and F. H. Wood, were appointed on said committee.

A communication from Rev. T. O. Summers, D. D., Book Editor, directed to the Secretary of the Conference, was received. Also, a communication from Rev. T. O. Summers, Secretary of the General Conference, containing a resolution passed by the General Conference, proposing a change in one of the general rules, was received and read.

On motion of E. A. Yates, the resolution was made the order of the day for Thursday, at 11 o'clock A. M.

A communication from the Secretaries of the General Board of Missions was received, read and referred to the Conference Board of Missions.

A communication from Rev. A. H. Redford, D. D., Book Agent, was received, read, and on motion of C. C. Dodson, was referred to the Committee on Books and Periodicals.

S. D. Adams, Presiding Elder of the Fayetteville District, announced that John Buie, a local preacher on the Cumberland Circuit, had been charged with immorality, tried according to discipline, and expelled from the Church, and that his credentials were surrendered to the Conference.

Dr. Burkhead, J. W. Hays and Dr. Closs, appeared as counsel of Bro. Buie, presented a communication, which was read, asking an appeal.

The appeal not having come by regular notification to the Quarterly Conference, according to discipline, on motion of E. A. Yates, it was granted by the Conference.

On motion of Dr. Moran, S. D. Adams was respectfully requested to deliver to the Committee all papers and documents touching the case, in his possession.

Question 1st was taken up, "Who are admitted on trial?"

Joseph W. Shackford, of Granville Circuit; Nathaniel M. Journey, of Trinity Circuit; Jeremiah F. Craven, of South Guilford Circuit; Wm. S. Roan, of Mt. Pleasant Circuit;

John T. Gibbs, of Onslow Circuit; and James W. Randle, of Magnolia Circuit, all having been recommended by their several Quarterly Conferences, according to discipline, and having been approved by the Committee of Examination, were admitted on trial.

Question 12th was taken up, "What traveling preachers are elected elders?"

John T. Bagwell, Joseph J. Renn, Augustus A. Boshamer, Lemuel H. Gibbons, Andrew M. Long and Hugh F. Wiley, having passed the examination of character, and having been approved by the Committee of Examination, were elected elders.

Question 10th was called, "What local preachers are elected deacons?"

James B. Floyd, of Granville Circuit; Brecken Dixon, of Portsmouth and Ocracoke, and Gray C. Garris, of Keenansville Circuit, having been duly recommended by their Quarterly Conferences, were elected deacons.

Question 14th was taken up, "What local preachers are elected elders?"

Elisha J. Eudailey, of Madison Circuit, having been duly recommended by his Quarterly Conference, was elected an elder.

Question 5th was taken up, "Who are re-admitted?"

Thos. W. Smith, of Cokesbury Circuit, having been recommended by his Quarterly Conference, according to discipline, was re-admitted.

The Bishop announced the following Committee to try the appeal of John Buie, viz: J. H. Wheeler, Chairman; C. M. Pepper, T. A. Boon, R. A. Willis, W. C. Gannon, L. W. Crawford, Z. Rush, J. R. Brooks, J. F. Smoot and W. D. Lee.

On motion of B. Craven, C. C. Dodson was elected Assistant-Secretary, and V. A. Sharp, Financial Secretary, and J. D. Paylor, Secretary of Statistics.

On motion of R. S. Webb, J. T. Bagwell was put in the place of W. C. Wilson on the Committee of Examination for the first year.

Rev. D. A. Long, of the Christian Church, was introduced to the Conference.

The Conference then adjourned with the benediction by the Bishop.

SECOND DAY.

THURSDAY MORNING, Dec. 3d, 1874.

Conference met at 9½ o'clock, Bishop Marvin in the chair, and was opened with religious services conducted by M. L. Wood.

The roll was called.

On motion of R. O. Burton, the calling of the roll was dispensed with for the remainder of the session.

The following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, The last General Conference of the M. E. Church, South, thought proper to pass a new rule upon the subject of Temperance, and submit it to the Annual Conferences for ratification or rejection; and

WHEREAS, This Conference has failed to give it the requisite majority, therefore,

Resolved, That it is the sense of this Conference that its rejection of the new rule is not to be construed as favoring the immoral use of intoxicating liquors; and that the general rules, and especially the New Testament, furnish sufficient law to every good pastor to enable him to punish all real offenders.

Dr. Wilson presented a report from the Trustees of Greensboro Female College, and also from Rev. Dr. Jones, President of the Faculty.

The reports were read, and on motion of J. W. Lewis, were referred to the Committee on Education.

E. A. Yates presented the certificates of ordination of William Bryant, of Wayne Circuit, and surrendered the same to the Conference.

B. Craven stated that the certificates of ordination of John S. Long and L. W. Martin were surrendered last year, but that notice thereof had not been given in the minutes.

Rev. W. M. Robey, President of Davenport Female College, presented a report from the Trustees of said College.

The report was read, and on motion of B. Craven, was referred to the Committee on Education.

Question 7th was taken up, "Who are the deacons of one year?"

James Willson, F. D. Swindell, E. Howland, James Mahoney, William B. Maness, and R. M. Brown passed the examination of character, were approved by the Committee of Examination, and were passed to the studies of the fourth year.

R. F. Bumpass and T. P. England passed the examination of character, but failed to be examined, and were continued in the studies of the third year.

The Bishop announced that the class to be received into full connection would be called to-morrow, and requested the Conference to observe the rule of discipline by preparing for the occasion with fasting and prayer.

Question 20th was called, "Are all the preachers blameless in their lives and official administration?"

The Elders on the Raleigh, Hillsboro, Greensboro and Salisbury Districts passed the examination of character.

Question 18th was taken up, "Who are superannuated?"

J. C. Thomas and J. D. Buie were placed in the superannuated relation.

L. L. Hendren, Agent of Greensboro Female College, presented and read his report, which was, on motion of B. Craven, referred to the Committee on Education.

On motion of B. Craven, it was resolved that when we adjourn, we will adjourn to meet at 3½ o'clock this afternoon, for the purpose of taking statistics.

The Bishop appointed I. T. Wyche to preside over the afternoon session.

The Conference then adjourned with the benediction by the Bishop.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Conference met at 3½ o'clock, I. T. Wyche in the chair, and was opened with religious service, conducted by Daniel Culbreth.

The Conference then proceeded to take the statistical and financial reports.

The call of the Conference having been completed, the Conference adjourned with the benediction by the President.

 THIRD DAY.

FRIDAY MORNING, Dec. 4th, 1874.

Conference met at 9½ o'clock A. M., Bishop Marvin in the chair, and was opened with religious service, conducted by W. S. Chaffin.

The Journal of the morning and afternoon sessions of the second day, was read and approved.

A collection was taken up to buy a new Conference Journal, and to pay other incidental expenses of the Conference.

On motion of E. A. Yates, the Secretary of the Conference was directed to publish 3,000 copies of the Minutes, and a collection was taken up to pay for the publication.

On motion of B. Craven, J. B. Bobbitt and A. W. Mangum were appointed to assist the Secretary in the publication of the Minutes.

Rev. J. J. Carden, of the Denver Conference, was introduced to the Conference.

On motion of B. Craven, Prof. O. W. Carr was elected Recording Secretary.

Dr. T. M. Jones, lay delegate from the Greensboro District, and W. D. Smith, from the Fayetteville District, were announced present.

Question 2d was taken up, "Who remain on trial?"

L. J. Holden, N. S. Norton, L. E. Stacey, P. F. W. Stamey, W. H. Watkins, W. H. Cuninggim, D. P. Goode and J. C. Smith passed the examination of character, were approved by the

Committee of Examination, and were passed to the second year.

N. G. Whittington, J. R. Scroggs, C. A. Gault, M. W. Boyles, J. M. Lumley, and L. W. Pigott, passed their examination of character, but failed to pass their examination, before the Committee, and were continued in the first year.

Question 5th was taken up, "Who are discontinued?"

W. N. Conoly was discontinued.

Rev. Dr. Pritchard, Pastor of the Baptist Church in this city, was introduced to the Conference.

Question 4th was taken up, "Who are admitted into full connection?"

Jesse H. Guinn, Philip Greening, L. Sandford, T. A. Coon, and W. C. Norman, passed the examination of character, were approved by the Committee of Examination, were examined by the Bishop, in open Conference, according to discipline, and were admitted into full connection.

Question 8th was taken up, "What traveling preachers are elected deacons?"

Jesse H. Guinn, Philip Greening and T. A. Coon, were elected deacons according to discipline.

Question 14th was taken up, "What local preachers are elected elders?"

Wm. H. Thompson, a local deacon of Alamance Circuit, having been recommended according to discipline, and having certified his belief in the doctrines and discipline of our Church, was elected an elder.

Hezekiah Farrow, a local deacon of Mattamuskeet Circuit, having been recommended by his Quarterly Conference, and having professed his belief in the doctrines and discipline of our Church in open Conference, was elected an elder.

E. D. Hoover, a local deacon of Washington and Greenville Circuit, having been recommended by his Quarterly Conference, and having certified his belief in the doctrines and discipline of our Church, was elected a deacon.

Question 5th was taken up, "Who are re-admitted?"

Jeremiah Johnson, an elder, of Rocky Mount, having been recommended according to discipline, was re-admitted.

Question 1st was taken up, "Who are admitted on trial?"

Leonidas L. Nash, a local preacher of Roanoke Circuit, having been recommended according to discipline, was admitted on trial.

Question 12th was taken up, "What traveling preachers are elected elders?"

Wm. B. Maness having passed the examination of character, and having been approved by the Committee of Examination, was elected an elder.

B. Craven presented and read reports from the Trustees and from the President of Trinity College. The reports were referred to the Committee on Education.

B. B. Culbreth, Agent of Trinity College, read his report, which was referred to the Committee on Education.

A letter from Rev. D. A. Long, of the Christian Church, was read, asking that fraternal messengers should be sent to their next Conference.

On motion, H. H. Gibbons and B. Craven were appointed.

Question 20th was taken up.

All the remaining elders of the Conference passed the examination of character.

Question 16th was taken up, "Who are located this year?"

R. S. Moran and W. R. Furgerson were located at their own request.

Question 18th was taken up, "Who are superannuated?"

On motion of W. S. Black, John Jones was superannuated.

Question 27th was taken up, "Who are supernumerary?"

On motion of Dr. Closs, I. H. Hill was continued in the supernumerary relation.

On motion of W. S. Black, the Bishop was requested to return Dr. Deems to the Church of the Strangers in New York.

The Conference then adjourned with the benediction by the Bishop.

FOURTH DAY.

SATURDAY, December 5th, 1874.

Conference met at 9½ o'clock A. M., Bishop Marvin in the chair, and was opened with religious services, conducted by P. J. Caraway.

The Journal of the third day was read and approved.

The Committee to nominate the Committees of Examination for the next four years presented and read their report, which was adopted, as follows:

Question 6th was taken up, "Who are received by transfer from other Conferences?"

The Bishop announced J. J. Carden, of the Denver Conference, and J. C. Crisp, of the South Carolina Conference, transferred to the North Carolina Conference.

The Committee on the Bible Cause presented their report, which was read and adopted, as follows:

The Committee on the American Bible Society beg leave to report, that after a careful consideration of the subject referred to them, they unanimously concur in recommending to the Conference the adoption of the following preamble and resolutions :

WHEREAS, The noble object and aim of the American Bible Society is the circulation of the holy scriptures, without note or comment, among all

nations and in all languages, so that according to the sure word of prophecy the word of the Lord may have free course and be glorified in the conversion of the world; and whereas, we know of no other agency so well and so wisely adapted to the accomplishment of this good design,

Resolved 1st. That as a Conference, composed of Christian ministers and lay delegates from the Churches within our bounds, we renew our hearty unreserved endorsement of the American Bible Society, and earnestly urge all our people to make liberal contributions to aid and encourage it in carrying forward to its completion the heaven-designed purpose for which this Society has been organized.

Resolved 2d. That we will pray without ceasing, and labor without intermission to promote the prosperity of the American Bible Society, regarding it as the practical if not the actual realization of that apocalyptic vision disclosed to St. John in the isle of Patmos, wherein he saw an angel flying through the midst of heaven having the everlasting Gospel to preach to every nation and tongue and people.

Resolved 3d. That we very gladly recognize the Rev. C. H. Wiley as a man and a minister eminently qualified by gifts, grace and usefulness, to represent the cause of the American Bible Society in North Carolina, where he has been so well and so favorably known for many years; that we therefore cordially approve of his appointment as superintendent of the work in our State, and thereby assure him of an honest welcome to our Churches and Conferences, our hearts and homes, whenever and wherever he shall find it convenient to visit us in behalf of the interest of the American Bible Society.

Conference met at 9½ o'clock A. M., Bishop Marvin in the chair, and was opened with religious services, conducted by J. W. Lewis.

The Journal of the fourth day was read and approved.

Question 9th was taken up, "What traveling preachers are ordained deacons?"

The Bishop announced that on yesterday he ordained Jesse H. Guinn, Philip Greening, Thomas A. Coon.

Question 11th was taken up, "What local preachers are ordained deacons?"

James B. Floyd, Brecken Dixon and Gray C. Garris were ordained on yesterday.

Question 13th was taken up, "What traveling preachers are ordained elders?"

John T. Bagwell, Joseph J. Renn, Augustus A. Boshamer, Lemuel H. Gibbons, Andrew M. Long, Hugh F. Wiley and William B. Maness were ordained on yesterday.

Question 15th was taken up, "What local preachers are ordained elders?"

William H. Thompson, Hezekiah Farrow, John H. Anderson and Edmund D. Hoover were ordained on yesterday.

Paul J. Caraway, Chairman of the Committee on the Constitution of the Board of Missions, presented the following report, which was read and adopted, as follows :

The Committee on the Constitution of the Board of Missions, submit the following.

PAUL J. CARAWAY.

CONSTITUTION OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS.

ARTICLE 1. The Board shall consist of twenty members, to be elected quadrennially by the Conference.

ART. 2. The officers shall consist of President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer, to be elected by the Board quadrennially.

ART. 3. The President, and in his absence, the Vice President, shall call meetings of the Board, preside over the same, and sign all drafts on the Treasurer by order of the Board. He shall also procure speakers for anniversary occasions.

ART. 4. The Secretary shall record in a book to be kept for the purpose, all proceedings of the Board, receive reports from the missionaries, and prepare a report on the condition of missions for publication.

ART. 5. The Treasurer shall receive all money collected for missions by the Conference, and keep a correct account of the same. He shall remit all money collected for Foreign Missions to the Treasurer of the General Board, and pay out the money collected for Conference Missions on the drafts of the President.

ART. 6. All missions shall be established, continued, and appropriations made for the same on recommendation from the Conference and by a majority of the Board.

ART. 7. Each missionary shall furnish the Board with a report of the statistics of his mission with the amount collected for his support in addition to the appropriation made by the Board.

ART. 8. Vacancies occasioned by death, resignation or otherwise, shall be filled by the Board.

A communication from the Local Preachers' Conference for North Carolina was read and referred to a Committee consisting of R. O. Burton, Dr. Closs, E. A. Yates, James Southgate and J. W. Tracy.

J. B. Martin read a communication from Bishop Bebee, of the Colored Methodist Episcopal Church in America, conveying the kind regards of himself and his people to the North Carolina Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South.

Responses were made to the greeting by Dr. Closs, E. A. Yates, Bishop Marvin and Dr. McFerrin, all cordially endorsing Bishop Bebee, Bishop Miles, and the Church over which they, with other Bishops, presided.

The Committee on Education presented and read their report, which was adopted, as follows:

The Committee on Education submit the following report: We think it unnecessary to consume time with statements as to the importance of the subject. We take it that every member of the North Carolina Conference is fully sensible of his personal obligations to do all in his power to advance the educational interests of the Church. We rejoice to be able to say, that Methodism is taking her place in the front ranks of those who guard with anxious eye this great auxiliary to the spread of "the truth as it is in Jesus." † We desire to call special attention to two things. *Methodists must educate their children at Methodist Schools.* As a Church we must be a unit in this view of the subject. † And again, to effect this we must keep pace with the advancing steps of the age in which we live. Our standard must be high, thorough and profoundly consecrated.

TRINITY COLLEGE.

Trinity College is emphatically the male Methodist College of North Carolina. There are Methodists enough in North Carolina to fill its halls even to overflowing. One or two new pupils from every field of labor within the bounds of this Conference would swell its numbers to an extent that would entirely relieve its pecuniary embarrassments and enlarge its prosperity to that of the most successful Colleges in other States

We recommend the following resolutions:

Resolved 1st. That the Bishop be requested to appoint an agent for Trinity College.

Resolved 2d. That this Conference pledge its earnest co-operation with this agent.

Resolved 3d. That we increase our efforts to enlarge its patronage and usefulness.

GREENSBORO FEMALE COLLEGE.

This cherished institution appeals to us with the most tender consideration for our patronage and support. It too ought to be filled with our

daughters. Female education is not second in any respect in its vital importance. Educated christian women are the safest guardians of our pure and holy religion. A few men now carry the burden of debt necessarily contracted in erecting and furnishing its ample and elegant buildings. They have high claims to our sympathy and to diligent effort on the part of Methodists in North Carolina to afford them speedy relief.

We recommend the following resolutions:

Resolved 1st. That the Bishop be requested to appoint Rev. J. A. Cunningham agent for Greensboro Female College.

Resolved 2d. That we do most heartily appreciate the efforts of the Trustees and the sacrifices of those who have advanced money to complete and equip the College, and will do all we can to co-operate with the plans of the Trustees and agent to relieve the College of all indebtedness.

Resolved 3d. That we increase our efforts to enlarge its patronage and usefulness.

DAVENPORT FEMALE COLLEGE.

This College is located in the western part of our work, and has been in successful operation for many years. It is "beautiful for situation" and claims a liberal share of our patronage.

We recommend the following resolutions:

Resolved 1st. That the agency of this institution be continued.

Resolved 2d. That we extend to the agent and Trustees our sincere co-operation in their efforts to relieve the College of debt.

Resolved 3d. That we increase our efforts to enlarge its patronage and usefulness.

WHEREAS, Convenient and well furnished parsonages, tend in a high degree to promote the usefulness of the pastor and the well-being of his family; therefore, be it

Resolved 1st. That every preacher is earnestly requested to give speedy and special attention to the repairing of all damaged church property within

his charge, and that in the erection of new edifices he look well to the construction and location of the same.

Resolved 2d. That the trustees of church property, be, and are hereby requested to give earnest attention to the important work committed to their care, that they be prompt in holding meetings, and ready to furnish the pastor or to the Quarterly Conference, and all information concerning deeds, by whom given, where and when recorded, and by whom held.

The Committee on Books and Periodicals presented their report, which was read and adopted, as follows :

In submitting their report your Committee would express their deep appreciation of the benefits arising to the Church by the circulation of our Church literature. We rejoice to hear through the reports of our agents and editors, of the material increase in the circulation of books and papers during the past year, especially in the North Carolina Conference. And believing, as we do, a sound religious literature to be an invaluable, if not indispensable adjunct of the christian ministry, we feel that we cannot too strongly commend the efforts of our preachers and people to give to all our publications a wide circulation.

We therefore recommend the passage of the following resolutions :

Resolved, That there shall be no abatement of effort on our part to circulate our books, and meet the wants of our publishing house on the one hand and of our people on the other.

Resolved, That we pledge anew our hearty support to the Nashville *Christian Advocate*, *The Missionary*, our Sunday School publications, the *Raleigh Christian Advocate*, as the organ of the Conference, and the *Quarterly Review*.

Resolved, That we heartily approve of the action of the editor of the *Raleigh Christian Advocate*, in associating with him as co-editor, Robt. T. Gray, Esq., so well and so favorably known to the readers of that paper.

Resolved, That we appreciate more deeply than ever the ability and zeal of the editors of the *Raleigh Christian Advocate* in their interesting efforts to meet the wants of the Church within the bounds of our Conference.

Resolved, That we respectfully request the re-appointment of Rev. J. B. Bobbitt as editor.

The Committee on Sunday Schools presented their report, which was adopted, as follows :

The Committee desire respectfully to submit the following for your consideration:

Your Committee have been greatly embarrassed in this work, for the lack of full and accurate information in regard to the Sabbath School interest; the statements of the Presiding Elders having been general rather than in detail, and the statistics of the Conference not yet sufficiently full to furnish all the facts in the case.

We find reported for the current year 155 schools, containing 24,534 scholars. These have 27,293 volumes in their libraries. These partial statistics indicate a fair increase both in the number of schools and scholars over last year; and we also think there has been improvements in the methods of conducting and of teaching. Of course we feel grateful for this evidence of in-

creased prosperity, yet we are profoundly impressed that the Sabbath School in the bounds of our Conference is not accomplishing half for God and the Church that it is capable of doing. It should yet multiply itself, its resources and by better methods of organization and instructions largely augment its power for good.

After considering the matter carefully, your Committee are satisfied that the two great wants of the Sabbath School now are warm, comfortable houses and a sufficiency of competent teachers. Especially is this the case in rural districts. With a view to supply this want, we respectfully present the following preamble and resolutions:

WHEREAS, In the judgment of Conference the future success and prosperity of the Church depend largely upon the proper religious training of the children; and

WHEREAS, We recognize the Sabbath School as an invaluable adjunct to the family and Church, and believe its teachings the best safeguard against the many dangerous ISMS that are now flooding the country; and

WHEREAS, We believe that no outlay of energy and capital will so speedily yield so large returns as that expended in this department of the Church, therefore, be it

Resolved 1st. That this Conference do urge upon every preacher, immediately on going to his appointment, to make an effort to supply every Church with a good stove and a Sabbath School library, and make such other improvements as may be necessary to the comfort of the children.

Resolved 2d. That we regard it the binding duty of every member of the Church, both lay and clerical, to faithfully carry out the provisions of the *Discipline* and organize Sunday Schools wherever ten pupils can be secured. And we also urge our preachers and intelligent laymen to organize Bible classes wherever it be possible, and teach these classes on Sundays or week day nights, with special reference to their becoming teachers.

SIXTH DAY.

TUESDAY, December 8th, 1874.

Conference met at 9½ o'clock A. M., Bishop Marvin in the chair, and was opened with religious service, conducted by B. T. Blake.

Leave of absence for a short time was granted to the Joint Board of Finance.

Rev. J. W. Wellons, of the Christian Church, was introduced to the Conference.

R. O. Burton, Chairman of the Committee to whom was referred the communication from the Local Preachers' Conference, read their report, which was adopted, as follows:

The committee to whom was referred the address of the Local Ministers of North Carolina, submit the following:

To the Local Ministers of the North Carolina

Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South:

REV. AND DEAR BRETHREN:—Grace, mercy and peace be multiplied unto you. Your address to us in Conference assembled, has been received through your committee, and it is a new source of pleasure, and excites our gratitude to God, conveying as it does, the evidences of your devotion to that discipline and doctrine which makes us one; and by which we are rendered efficient in building up the church of Jesus Christ. We appreciate your docility of mind, which asks of us any suggestions which may render your body more useful in the great work to which you propose to direct your energies. We regard your body of ministers as co-adjutors to the itinerant ministry, and hope always to find you harmoniously co-operating with them, and zealously holding up their hands, and faithfully proclaiming the Gospel to the perishing. You will allow us to congratulate you on your emulous aim to elevate the standard of ministerial qualification for usefulness; and we hope that with unwearied effort you will strive to make yourselves "workmen that need not be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." Allow us to recommend for your study and acceptance the course of study prescribed for the itinerant ministry. We suggest the wisdom of re-pressing the up rising of any feeling or the perpetration of any act which would disturb the fraternal harmony which we so much prize, and is so conducive to the weal of the church of God. We hope that in the future, as in the past, in the love and fellowship of Jesus, you will faithfully perform that service suggested in the Book of Discipline, and we pray that the blessing of the Godhead of the church may rest upon you all.

The Committee on Memoirs submit the following report :

REV. CHARLES EDGAR LAND was born in Spartanburg, S. C., on the 8th of May, 1833, and died in Monroe, N. C., October 21st, 1874, aged 41 years, 5 months and 13 days. He made a profession of religion and joined the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in Columbia, S. C., in 1857, under the ministry of the Rev. H. C. Parsons. He connected himself with the South Carolina Conference in 1858, and was ordained deacon by Bishop Paine at Columbia, S. C., December 16th, 1860, and elder by Bishop Early at Spartanburg, S. C., December 14th, 1862.

He was an acceptable, effective and useful itinerant minister for thirty years; serving the following charges respectively, viz: 1859-'60, Waccamaw Mission; 1861, Black River Mission; 1862-3-4-5, Lancaster Circuit; 1866, on account of the unsettled state of the country at the close of the war he was left without an appointment; 1867-8, Dallas Circuit; 1869, Rock Spring Circuit; 1870-71, Pleasant Grove Circuit. He was transferred in the territory, transferred from the South Carolina Conference by the General Conference of 1870, and remained in the North Carolina Conference.

On account of the state of his mind he could leave no dying testimony, but the epistle of a well spent life leaves no doubt that he is now reaping the reward of a good and faithful servant. His funeral sermon was preached by his Presiding Elder, Rev. J. S. Nelson, from Phillipians 1: 21, after which his mortal remains were consigned to the silence of the tomb, to await the resurrection of the just. He leaves a wife and six children, the most of them small, quite in a helpless condition. They appeal, silently, but eloquently, for comfort and support to the church which he so faithfully and efficiently served. May the "Father of the fatherless, and the judge of the widow," grant them the consolations of the Gospel and the sustaining power of His grace in this sore affliction and sad bereavement. May they follow him as he followed Christ, so when called from the scenes and associations and sufferings of life, they may have a happy reunion above, a blissful home in heaven, and form an unbroken family in the kingdom and everlasting glory of God.
