



Honorable Board Members:

Regrettably, I am returning the attached ordinance with my veto.

Enhancing the business climate, creating new jobs and increasing income is a major priority of my administration, and I was looking forward to the creation of a broadly representative Business Advisory Commission to help advance that goal.

Such a commission, in my view, should represent small and large businesses both downtown and in the neighborhoods.

To be truly effective, however, such a commission must be fully accountable and held totally responsible for its actions; and, therefore, must report and be responsive to the Mayor's office. To divide its membership between persons appointed by the Mayor and others by the Board of Supervisors would dilute accountability, divide responsibility and deny the commission the singleness of purpose required for it to be truly effective.

As with Police, Fire, Planning and other important commissions, I firmly believe in the principle that the buck stops with the Mayor. I want a strong, cohesive Business Advisory Commission, and to divide its membership would be bad public policy, bad management and bad for the City.

It remains my hope that we can adopt an ordinance creating a commission that would infuse new and expanding vitality into our economy. To that end, I am transmitting herewith a new ordinance which I hope the Board of Supervisors will consider as an amendment of the whole.

This ordinance retains the basic provisions of the original Business Advisory Commission Ordinance, however it creates the Commission pursuant to Charter Section 2.101 which empowers this Commission in the same manner as if created by charter amendment. Its mission remains unchanged. The number and criteria for commission members also remain unchanged. The substitute ordinance does, however, provide the Business Advisory Commission with an executive director, who shall act as department head and is authorized to carry out the Commission's activities as directed by the Commission. It also requires that a portion of the first appointed commissioners be selected by the Mayor from nominees submitted by the Board of Supervisors and designated business organizations.

The primary difference between this substitute ordinance and the original is that the Business Advisory Commission will now be endowed with the powers and authority of a commission like every other City commission. I believe this enhances the role of the Business Advisory Commission and gives the business community the voice that it wants.

I very much want a close and collaborative working relationship with the Board, and urge you to refer both my veto and this substitute proposal to committee for public hearing.

[State of the City] State of the City Message by Mayor Frank M. Jordan.

The Mayor appeared and began his State of the City statement as follows:

State of the City October 19, 1992

"President Shelley, Members of this Honorable Board, and fellow citizens of San Francisco. The City Charter requires that I report to you on the State of the City.

I do so with mixed emotion – trepidation at the desperate state of our national economy – and optimism that, San Franciscans, we can overcome adversity.

Monday, October 19, 1992

Never since the Great Depression of the 1930's has the City faced a more grim and troubled fiscal crisis.

But, at the same time, we face the exciting adventure that, by working together, we can maintain a high level of public service - police on the streets, clinics and libraries open, parks in bloom and public transit within easy reach of every San Franciscan.

To be sure, we will have to trim and cut back on some of the more costly levels of service.

Tough decisions are inevitable - and, in cooperation and consultation with your honorable Board - I am prepared to make them."

The Mayor focused his speech on the budget and also discussed efforts to help the homeless, provide health care for AIDS patients, police on streets and keeping the Giants baseball team in San Francisco. He pledged to keep a close working relationship with the Board of Supervisors and closed his statement with a brief tribute to Supervisor Harry Britt, who is leaving the Board after 14 years.

The Giants shall use good faith efforts to have entities that provide the Giants goods or services under contract to the Giants agree in those contracts that the contractor will provide Domestic Partners of its employees health benefits on the same terms and conditions as provided to other spouses of its employees. As used in this paragraph, two persons shall be deemed "Domestic Partners" if the following conditions are met: (1) both persons share the same principal place of residence; (2) both persons share the same basic living expenses, are financially interdependent and are jointly responsible for each other's common welfare; (3) the persons are not related to each other in a way that would bar marriage in California; (4) the persons considered each other as live partners; and (5) neither person has had a different Domestic Partner in the six months preceding the date in which they first apply for eligibility for health benefits under a plan made available in satisfaction of the requirements of this paragraph __."

- b. The Giants agree to participate in and contribute financially to an employer partnership with the proposed Pilot Year Round Disadvantaged High Risk Youth Employment Program to develop meaningful employment opportunities both in and around the Giants and the Stadium and throughout the City.
- c. The Giants recognize the importance of identifying and developing young, academic and executive talent among the economically disadvantaged youth of our community. Giants agree to create, possibly through the Giants' already existing Giants Fund, a minority student internship program. The goal of this program would be to develop a pool of economically disadvantaged youth interested in and committed to learning the ways in which a professional baseball franchise and business operates.

- d. The Giants agree to set-aside not more than 250 seats on at least four occasions per year dedicated for fund-raising purposes to non-profit community programs in the City and County of San Francisco. The games selected and the seats set-aside shall be chosen by the San Francisco Giants Community Advisory Committee in conjunction with the Giants. The Giants will administer this program in conjunction with the San Francisco Giants Community Advisory Committee and will exercise reasonable efforts to promote and advertise this program.
- e. The Giants agree to form a Community Advisory Committee consisting of thirteen members, representing each of the nine Bay Area counties, and including four additional members selected from a list of nominees forwarded to the Giants by the San Francisco Board of Supervisors. Said Committee will include, but not be limited to, residents representing the diverse neighborhoods and ethnic groups in the City and County of San Francisco. It shall be the function of this Committee to advise the Giants of their implementation of their obligations under this agreement and to further advise the Giants on steps they may take to enhance the quality of life of all citizens of the City and County of San Francisco with particular emphasis upon disadvantaged minority youth.
- f. The Giants shall, at the end of each calendar year, issue a report to the Board of Supervisors specifying how they have complied with each of the lease obligations detailed in sections one through five above.

The Giants shall select those organizations and entities that shall receive the tickets from among the lists presented by the Mayor and from other organizations and entities that apply for the tickets. The Giants shall give to the Mayor of the City a monthly report that details the distribution of the tickets through the end of the preceding month. The tickets shall be reserved seats located in upper reserved stands. The Giants, in consultation with the Mayor, shall develop a distribution plan for these tickets. The plan shall include provisions for publicizing the availability of the tickets and how to apply for The Giants will prepare an application form for the tickets that will be available no later than April 1 of each The Giants shall notify recipients reasonably in advance of a game of the tickets that will be available to that recipient. The Giants may require recipients of unused tickets either to return the tickets to the Giants or to destroy them. The tickets will be printed with a face value amount, but if marked by the Giants as complimentary tickets for use in satisfaction of the Giants' obligations under this paragraph, the tickets will be deemed to be of no value for the purposes of calculating the Giants' obligations, if any, to pay rent or taxes to the City.

c. It is also agreed that each calendar year the Giants will give the Commission 7,000 complimentary tickets to be used by children, youth and seniors who are involved in Department programs. Such complimentary tickets provided to the Commission will be in the upper reserved sections. The games and locations of these 7,000 tickets will be mutually agreed between the General Manager and Giants. In addition, it is further agreed that a reasonable number of complimentary tickets, not to exceed twenty-four tickets per game, will be provided to the City on request."
