JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Monday, May 1, 1995 - 2:00 p.m.

The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco met in regular session on the above date with President Kevin Shelley presiding.

CALLING THE ROLL

The meeting was called to order at 2:07 p.m. On call of the roll, the following Supervisors were noted present:

COMMUNICATION

The Board received communication from the Mayor requesting the Board of Supervisors reconsider its action on the Resolution concerning contracting out the parking citation data entry services as follows:

Dear Mr. Tavlor:

In accordance with Charter Section 2.302, I am requesting that the Board of Supervisors reconsider the Proposition "J" Resolution (File 25-95-2) allowing the Department of Parking and Traffic to contract for parking citation data entry services. According to the Budget Analyst, Mr. Harvey Rose, the savings to the General Fund will be \$150,000 annually and there will be no lay-offs of personnel if this Resolution is approved.

The Department of Parking and Traffic took over the function of parking citation data entry in November, 1993 along with a number of other functions previously performed by the Municipal Court. As part of the transfer, 17 new SEIU positions were created to handle new duties required by law and the Department was able to accommodate employees laid off from other departments in its new Citation Division.

In March, 1994, the Controller determined that data entry of parking citations could be performed by a private contractor at a lower cost to the city than with city forces. The decision to investigate contracting this service was based on two factors: the increasing number of hand and wrist injuries resulting from old data entry equipment and the high cost of replacing equipment to prevent further injury. Specifically, the Department spent \$20,000 in fiscal year 1994-95 to purchase adjustable tables and chairs for each workstation and the cost to upgrade computer terminals to VDT ordinance standards will be an additional \$20,000.

In April, 1994, the Department met with SEIU Local 790 representative Lawanna Preston at which time she expressed her concerns regarding the continued employment of the data entry operators. She also indicated that Local 790 would not oppose the Department's request to contract the service if all employees were placed in alternative positions.

Since that time, the Department of parking and Traffic has placed all 10 data entry operators in other

SEIU represented positions within the department. Currently, the affected employees are working as 1404 Clerks and one is an 8214 Parking Control Officer. Through these efforts, these employees have faced no break in service to the city, are earning higher salaries, and have promotive opportunities they would not have had as 1720 Data Entry Operators.

If this Resolution is not approved, the Department will be forced to hire and train new data entry operators to fill the currently vacant position, or alternatively demote the existing groups of employees back to their previous positions. Additionally, the Department, on recommendation from the Blue Ribbon Task Force, has proposed to purchase hand-held automated ticket writers in fiscal year 1995-96 which will eliminate the need for manual data entry while reducing citation errors. If data entry is to be performed by City forces, these employees will be facing lay-offs in as few as six months after they are hired. By contracting data entry services, no lay-offs will be necessary and the contract will be simply phased out as hand-held ticket writers are phased in during the 1995-96 fiscal year.

Again, I urge you to reconsider the Proposition "J" Resolution allowing the Department of Parking and Traffic to contract for parking citation data entry services. No city employees will be laid off and the General Fund will be increased by \$150,000 annually.

Statement of Supervisors Ammiano, Leal and Migden

Supervisor Kaufman read into the record the following statement on behalf of Supervisors, Ammiano, Leal and Migden explaining why they aren't here.

"Mr. Board President, fellow Members of the Board, Department Heads and staff, and our constituents and friends in the Sunset District:

Times Change. There was a time when meetings of the Board of Supervisors were only held in City Hall, away from the neighborhoods that make our City truly great. Happily, times change, and now the Board will hold its first ever meeting in the Sunset District. Although we could not be here with you tonight, please know that our thoughts are with you and we are anxious to hear about the issues you will raise tonight during the public comment portion of this meeting.

Times have also changed for the nation's lesbian and gay community. There was a time when gays and lesbians were routinely shunned by government officials and institutions. However, tomorrow we will join a delegation of 45 openly lesbian and gay elected officials from throughout the United States in a meeting with senior level Clinton Administration officials inside the White House. This meeting will mark the first time in history that a group of openly lesbian and gay elected officials have been invited to the White House. San Francisco will be well represented at this meeting. In addition to our attendance, Community College Board Member Leslie Katz and School Board Member Angie Fa will also participate in this historic meeting.

Our discussion with Administration officials will include issues vital to the lesbian and gay community — AIDS funding, civil rights issues and employment rights. In addition, we will receive briefings and will engage the Administration in discussions involving issues important to all San Franciscans, including reproductive rights, the federal budget's impact on the delivery of vital services at the local level and the protection of the Federal Budget for the National Institute of Health.

We look forward to reviewing the video tape of this meeting, and to hearing the concerns of our constituents in the Sunset. Whether the issue is the expansion of retail outlets in our neighborhoods or a waste treatment facility or a glut of parked cars with for sale signs, we are eager to work with the Sunset community to make San Francisco government more responsive to all its citizens.

Dear Supervisor Shelley:

I am returning with my veto the Board's resolution urging that the Mandatory Direct Rent Payment (MDRP) program not be implemented.

The MDRP program is the result of a ballot measure I placed on last November's ballot as Proposition N. The voters passed Proposition N fully expecting that it would be implemented. Now the Board is engaging in tactics designed to thwart the wishes of the voters. The Board's interference with the voter's mandate is disrespectful to the democratic process on which we rely for peaceful governance.

Proposition N never promised to house every person who claims to be homeless. It will house an additional 640 people who currently have no housing. If there are not enough rooms for every homeless person, those for whom a room is not available will still receive their regular monthly G.A. check. Additionally, individuals who do participate in the program will have access to social workers and will be given tenants rights, helping to stabilize their lives.

San Francisco continues to pay one of the highest G.A. grants in the state - \$345.00 per person (plus almost \$100 in food stamps). Proposition N seeks to help people who are homeless gain shelter and ensure a wise use of public funds. There is nothing unfair or inhuman about expecting people who receive grant funds for shelter, food, and hygiene to be required to use those funds for their intended purpose.

There is no additional cost associated with the MDRP program. In fact, if the will of the voters is to be denied, it will require more money for G.A., not less. I urge the Board to do the right thing, to be respectful of the voters wishes, to exercise fiscal responsibility, and to allow the MDRP program to move forward immediately.
