BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Tuesday, September 7, 1993 - 2:00 p.m.

The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco met in regular session on the above date with President Angela Alioto presiding.

CALLING THE ROLL

Dear Supervisor Alioto and Members:

I am returning File 13-93-28 regarding the opposition to any changes in the existing immigration laws with my veto.

I strongly oppose any acts that would scapegoat or lessen the rights of our residents including recently arrived immigrants who live in this city and state. We must, as a community unite against the anti-immigration hysteria perpetuated by ignorant individuals and organizations. I am proud of San Francisco's ethnic and cultural diversity and we should all be reminded, with the exception of Native Americans, that we are all immigrants to this country We must never forget the many social, economic and cultural contributions of immigrants which made this city and the country the best in the world.

As you know, my parents were immigrants from Ireland and I grew up in an immigrant culture. Therefore, I understand the importance of immigrants to this city and county and I am extremely sensitive to the needs of our immigrant population. I cherish my culture and the opportunity to maintain my cultural heritage in this city.

In regards to the increasing anti-immigrant sentiments and backlash on our residents, I am requesting that the Human Rights Commission and the Hate Crimes Unit of the Police Department give special attention to any anti-immigrant activities and report to me and the Board of Supervisors on a quarterly basis. Any physical or emotional harm to individuals is not to be tolerated, especially if it is based on anti-immigrant activities.

Although I share your concerns on anti-immigrant hysteria and xenophobia, I am concerned that this resolution is too broad of a policy statement instructing both our state and federal lobbyists to oppose all immigrant/refugee related legislation. As you know, the City and County of San Francisco has procedures whereby specific state legislation is reviewed and approved for advocacy through the State Legislation Committee. In addition, prior to any formal position on specific federal legislation, the appropriate direction is given by resolution of the Board of Supervisors. To do otherwise, would result in a lack of guidance to our lobbyists and would not, in my judgement, be effective in dealing with state or federal legislators.

Futhermore, I believe legislation of this breadth should have been referred to the regular committee and hearing process. Short of the need to advise our lobbyists very quickly of the City's position on a pending bill, this type of very broad policy instruction should, in my opinion, be the subject of public hearing.

I would be pleased to sign the proposed resolution without the instructions to our lobbyists to oppose unspecified changes to immigration law. I am forwarding with this veto message a resolution on this subject, which, if adopted by the Board, I would sign into law. I request the Board calendar this resolution for hearing as soon as possible.

I concur with the editorial point of view in the Examiner stated that the Board "read and debate each separate bill before it makes up the city's mind. I also concur with the Chronicle's editorial opinion that it is "wrong to make political hay out of the issue." At the same time, the newspaper recognized the need for" reasonable law-making to cope with the problem" and urged a" meeting of the minds. "between the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors.

I am proud to work towards that "meeting of the minds" and look forward to developing policy position on specific immigration law proposals.

By Supervisor Conroy, that City Attorney prepare resolution urging the State and Federal governments to cooperate with the City on its anti-graffiti efforts by keeping their properties in San Francisco graffiti free and urging San Francisco State and Federal representatives to participate in the City's anti-graffiti efforts by seeking government funds to assist in fighting graffiti.

By Supervisor Conroy, that City Attorney prepare ordinance to impose a requirement that signs be posted wherever aerosol paints or other liquid substances capable of defacing property are sold (similar to Daly City legislation).

By Supervisor Conroy, that City Attorney prepare legislation to amend the regulations governing the awarding of monies from the Neighborhood Beautification Fund.

By Supervisor Migden, that City Attorney prepare ordinance to extend Subdivision Code Section 1396, the annual limitation on the number of condominium conversions, to December 31, 1995.

By Supervisor Shelley, that City Attorney draft charter amendment for the June 1994 ballot which would do the following:

Eliminate fares for Municipal Railway, except cable car service, and create a special pass annually renewable for San Francisco residents to use on cable cars;

Raises the utility users tax to a percentage that would raise enough money equal to the amount raised by Municipal Railway in fares during the 1992-93 fiscal year (estimated at \$40 million; to be determined through discussion with Municipal Railway, Public Utilities Commission and Controller):

Eliminates the total number of employees at Municipal Railway by the number of people estimated to be currently employed in activities related to fare collection:

Requires the percentage of utility tax contribution to the Municipal Railway budget remain constant at the initial (94-95) level.

By Supervisor Maher, that City Attorney prepare resolution requiring the Department of Defense to clean the toxins from the Bayview Hunters Point Shipyard to a level that is in compliance with residential standards before the City takes title of the land.

By Supervisor Conroy that City Attorney prepare resolution urging San Francisco-based media (such as radio and television) to join the anti-graffiti effort by sponsoring public service announcements aimed at graffiti education, awareness and eradication once the City's anti-graffiti program is ready to expand.




