Dear Kevin:

I am returning with my veto file number 97-94-41, an amendment to the Administrative Code increasing the allowable personal property of General Assistance recipients. At a time when all other counties in California are drastically cutting their G.A. levels, this legislation sends the wrong message.

In February of this year, the Board substantially increased the allowable asset limit for G.A. clients from \$25.00 to \$345.00, a 1,380% increase. That increase has only been in effect for a little over six months. Determining whether it actually results in long term savings requires more time. In the short run, it costs the General Fund an additional \$65,000 annually. To increase the asset limit to \$500.00 without any proof that it will in fact help get people off of G.A. is fiscally irresponsible.

San Francisco works hard to maintain its G.A. grant level at \$345.00 per month. Unfortunately, surrounding counties are decreasing theirs to the \$220.00 range. There is a real danger that further easing of the requirements for G.A. eligibility will result in a growing case load in San Francisco. A growing case load would increase the pressure to lower San Francisco's G.A. grant to more closely match surrounding counties.

In closing, I want to commend you and Supervisors Hsieh, Kaufman, Leal and Migden for your vote against this legislation.

Dear Supervisor Shelley:

I am returning with my veto the Board's ordinance amending the annual appropriation ordinance regarding the mandatory direct rent payment program (file no. 101-95-2.2).

While everyone supports the implementation of safe guards to ensure the MDRP program is administered in a way that is sensitive to the clients needs, this ordinance purposely creates unrealistically high hurdles that effectively make it impossible for the program to move forward. The Department of Social Services, the Social Service Commission, and the contractor, Catholic Charities, are taking appropriate steps to make this program meaningful for the clients and cost effective for the taxpayers.

The MDRP program was approved by the voters at the November 1994 election. Since that time, DSS has acted in good faith to address the legitimate concerns the Board has expressed. It seems a majority of the Board has responded by engaging in any and all tactics that delay the implementation of the MDRP program. It would be far more productive, and far more respectful of the will of the voters, if the Board worked with DSS to ensure that the MDRP program is implemented as soon as possible in a way that helps stabilize the lives of people who receive General Assistance benefits and are homeless. One of the primary purposes of G.A. is to provide for essentials, including housing, clothing, food and hygiene. The MDRP program merely ensures that G.A. benefits are used for their intended purpose.

I am returning this legislation with my veto because it seeks to effectively prevent the MDRP program from being implemented by placing undue burdens on DSS. These undue burdens will not ensure a well administered program; they only interfere with the will of the voters to implement the MDRP program.

Dear Supervisor Shelley:

 ${\rm I}$  am returning with my veto the Board's approval of a liquor license at 2241 Chestnut Street. My reasons for doing so follow.

While this is technically a new license, it is for all practical purposes a transfer of a business from one census tract on one side of the street to another census tract on the other side of the street. The new location will triple the square footage of the old pub, increasing noise, congestion, and the

other disruptions to quality of life that come with increased alcohol sales and consumption in a neighborhood. The increased burden on the quality of life becomes evident when one considers that even though census tract 128 should only have 13 on sale liquor licenses according to formulas established for the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control there are already 58 licenses.

The resolution states that the individual occupants of the residences that fall within the 100 foot limit established by state law do not object to the issuance of the license. The law does not state, however, that approval by existing occupants by itself decreases the requirement to maintain the right to quiet enjoyment of the nearby residences for those who may occupy the space in the future. Additionally, while the Planning Department has determined that a pub is permitted at this location, their determination is not that a pub must be placed there, nor is their determination necessarily made in coordination with the other considerations for the issuance of a liquor license.

Finally, the issuance of this license is strongly opposed by the surrounding community. Since this resolution was passed by the Board of Supervisors, my office has received numerous requests from a variety of neighborhood residents stating that the neighborhood is already saturated with liquor licenses, and expressing a genuine concern about the negative impact this license will have.

Considering the increased size of the building, the already high number of licenses in the neighborhood, the need to maintain the quiet enjoyment of nearby residences, the strong opposition by the people who must live with this establishment daily, I can not agree that the issuance of this license serves the public convenience and necessity.
