
# DEDICATION

# OUR SEAL



Last fall at an opening meeting of the Yearbook committee, it was suggested that we needed something to interpret the spirit of Jamaica Plain High School—something which would represent the school for all time: a symbol of Jamaica Plain High School. Many suggestions were offered, but a seal was finally determined upon. This was to be significant, and consequently had to be authentic, in accordance with the traditions of Jamaica Plain. A competition in the school ensued and, finally, a Seal Man was discovered.

The Seal Man cast about for several weeks, looking in the libraries for books mentioning Jamaica Plain. These were scarce and remarkably dusty. No mention was found of a seal. The Seal Man was worried. The case seemed hopeless, but "it is always darkest before dawn." One bright morning, the Seal Man proceeded to City Hall where he in-

vestigated the library of the Statistics Department. From there he climbed to Beacon Hill and into the home of the Sacred Cod, only to be lost among the various offices. After the guide had set him straight, he found his way into the library of the State House. It was really a very interesting library; it had the original logbook of Governor Winthrop, but there were no papers of incorporation for Jamaica Plain, and no official seal.

However, he did discover some very interesting information about Jamaica Plain: "A country seat, farming, situated in the center of gently sloping hills. Healthful (death rate low). Originally called "Pond Plain" (1667). At the time Cromwell captured the island of Jamaica, in the British West Indies, the name was changed to Jamaica. It is undoubtedly a slander upon the good people of this locality to assert that it derives its name from their fondness for Jamaica rum—and that they preferred it *Plain*."

The Seal Man was in a tight spot. The only thing left was to get hold of something original as an official seal. After wracking his brain, he had a bright idea of looking up the coat of arms of the Eliot family, so influential in early Jamaica, and for whom this school was first named. In the library he found this, so it became the foundation for the seal of Jamaica Plain High School.

Our seal has a significance, of course. The elephant's head is taken from the crest of the Eliot coat-of-arms and symbolizes strength, dignity, and prowess. The band on the shield represents, in heraldic symbolism, a plain, while the wavy lines represent water. These, too, have significance because the original name Xaymaca, given to Jamaica by the Arawak Indians found on that island by Columbus, is supposed to imply "an overflowing abundance of rivers." Instead of the family motto, we have placed "H. Jamaica Plain S." on the heraldic ribbon.

The seal has been modified to fit the ring structure and all future classes will use this seal, since it has been adopted as the official seal of Jamaica Plain High School.

We hope you like it.

# "AMERICAN VARIETY, 1941"






# FRENCH CLUB




Because of the great amount of snow in our vicinity, the member were able to ski frequently at Schoolmaster's Hill, Bacon's, and Commonwealth Country Club.


Another close one went by the board when Hyde Park nosed our Jamaica 1-0, and the South Boston game was "snowed out".





# LIBRARY CLUB

In 1926 the Library consisted of several book-filled cabinets distributed in various rooms. Pupils wishing to take out books borrowed from the teacher in charge of that particular cabinet. Miss Campion took care of study periods and spent her study periods in the Library.

In 1928 Miss James, Graduate of Simmons College, entered as Librarian. The Library was started by gathering books from all the cabinets and placing them in the Library. There were four principles which Miss James stated in her report four years later.

- (1) The Library was to fit into the very life of the school.
- (2) It was to be a place of order and beauty.
- (3) It was to be of service to all teachers and pupils in the school.
- (4) It was to connect the school with outside agencies through which further education or advancement in life could be achieved.

Records of attendance, circulation of books and registration of cards have been kept through the years and are on file. Two of the activities the Library carries on are taking part in Book Reviews and decorating and publicizing Book Week. One of the most spectacular and pleasing features each year is the Christmas decorations of the Library. This custom carries out to the highest extent the ideal of beauty as set down as a principle for the Library's development.

The Library Club consists of a corps of girls who help during their free time. Their efforts are and have been rewarded, through the kindness of Miss James, by various excursions. Some of the places visited are The Wayside Inn, in Concord, The Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum, and The Boston Public Library.
