Published in 1917, King Coal exposes the grim working conditions in the coal mining industry in the western United States in the early 20th century. As in his earlier work The Jungle, Sinclair expresses his socialist viewpoints from the perspective of a single protagonist, Hal Warner, caught up in the schemes and plots of the oppressive American capitalist system. The book itself is based on the 1914-1915 Colorado coal strikes. (Wikipedia)
