& & PREFACE. & &

N THE summer of 1894, I conceived the idea of tracing my ancestry, prompted by the loving remembrance of my dear father, long since gone to his reward

Through all my childhood days from earliest recollection, we lived in Rockville, Conn.; about twenty miles from Monson, Mass., and very often father would drive over there to spend Sunday, and he always took me with him.

It was a great treat to me to go to grandpa's, and now, after forty years, the vision comes to me:

The old house on East Hill,* the large front room used as parlor, dining room, sitting room and kitchen, with its immense open fireplace with the old swinging crane on which the cooking was done, and the big pantry with shelves loaded with pans full of milk and rows upon rows of delicious looking cheese.

Then when we went to bed in the spare room, I could hardly climb into the bed, it was so high; but, when I did get fairly in, I sank down almost out of sight in the feather bed, although not so deep but that I could see the four big bedposts looming up half way to the ceiling.

These visions of my grandfather's home, coming to me in mature years, together with fond recollections of my father's pure, unselfish life, devoted to his family, created a desire to know something more of the King family, its early history and ancestral blood, not that I expected or wanted to find that we were of so-called noble birth, with armorial bearings and coat of arms, but believing and hoping to find a strain of honorable, honest, though humble ancestry, whose records would bear investigation, I commenced to look up data.

I knew that my grandfather Roswell King was one of eight children of William King and Hannah Lamphear, and thought that perhaps the descendants of his seven brothers and sisters would be interested in getting a full record of the family, and formed my plan to get a complete record of all branches of the descendants of William King and Hannah Lamphear King, up to date, and also to look up the ancestry of this William King and his wife Hannah Lamphear, and arrange the matter in systematic form for easy reference.

I found early in the search that I had undertaken quite a task; the early records of New England settlers are very incomplete and broken, except in the

case of a few of the prominent families, and the descendants of William King number several hundred, and those now living are widely scattered.

To get the address of those now living, and secure their full family record, together with records of parents and grandparents, have necessitated a large amount of correspondence, but I have kept working at it, and little by little have succeeded in getting very complete and full records of the descendants of William King through his children:

Total, 225 families; 383 descendants now living.

Probably there are no descendants living of either 1 Wills or 5 John, but it is probable that there are descendants of 2 Walter now living, although I have been unable to locate any.

Of the descendants of the other five children of *William King*, I have obtained complete records of every one, and have taken great care to secure accuracy.

In getting this early history of our ancestors, I have had the privilege of access to the library of the Connecticut Historical Society, Hartford, Conn., where may be found a wealth of genealogical information.

It has also been my privilege to spend a week in Boston, and in the old historic towns of Plymouth, Scituate and Marshfield, examining ancient records of Plymouth Colony; there may be found the original writing and the signatures of our ancestors, all of whom left an honorable record, although not any of them were prominent in military affairs of Plymouth Colony, yet some of them were prominent in the early church and town affairs.

I have also found valuable matter in town history of Palmer, and of Brimfield, regarding the King family and families allied by marriage.

Originally, Monson was a part of Brimfield, as was also Wales. Monson was incorporated as a district in 1760, with all the rights of a town, excepting a representative in the legislature; this right was conferred in 1775, and the first town meeting was held December 29th of that year.

Palmer is an older town; it adjoins Monson on the north. William King had business interests there; two sons and two daughters married and resided there.

The family records of seventh, eighth, ninth and tenth generations have all been obtained from those now living, and in all the correspondence I have been met very cordially, and nearly all have expressed much interest in the work.

Without such interest and help, it would have been impossible to have gotten complete and accurate records.

Charles Oscar Thompson, M. D., of Boston, who is much interested in genealogy, and especially in this work, having married one of these King descendants, has been of great service to the author in his search of ancient records. His help and encouragement are hereby gratefully acknowledged.

'Tis fifty years ago to-day
That I first beheld the light of day;
Half a century left behind

Introduction.

WE can not offer a line of distinguished names, yet, in collecting and attempting to preserve the genealogies of these families, we have been led to feel an honest pride in being able to trace our descent from the fathers of New England, the men (and women, too), who shared in the perils and hardships of founding and defending this country, and now let us hold in memory the patriots of 1676 in their struggle for existence, equally with the patriots of 1776 in their contest for liberty.

We would have been glad to have traced our descent from the Pilgrims who came in the "Mayflower," 1620, but our ancestors came so soon after (1633-5) that we can indulge in the honor of descent from the founders of New England.


It may be that William Clift, 1670, or the wife of Samuel Wills, 1640, or Rebecca ———, wife of John King, 1677, were descended from the Pilgrims who came in the "Mayflower," but owing to loss of records, we have been unable to determine the immigrant ancestor of these three.

The chart on the following page shows at a glance the different lines of the ancestry of *William King* and of his wife *Hannah Lamphear*, who located in Monson, Mass., 1770, and also shows the different branches of their descendants to 1897—225 families, 572 names.

Of these descendants there are 383 now living (1897), and this work contains the address of each, nineteen states being represented.

In these 225 family records, which are complete and authentic, names of the parents of the husband or wife of the King descendant are given in all cases, and in many cases their ancestry is given for several generations, making a very complete work of the ground covered. Over 1,000 names, other than the descendants of William King, are contained in the index.

"History of Scituate" from its first settlement, published in 1831, by Samuel Dean.

This book is rich in authentic matter pertaining to the first years of Plymouth Colony. Although a history of Scituate proper, yet it contains much about Marshfield and other adjoining settlements, and also something of the history of the first two generations of our ancestors, the Kings, the Wills and the Claps, they being among the early settlers and land owners of Scituate and Marshfield, and prominent in the early church and town affairs. We quote from its valuable pages, as follows:

"Scituate was one of the earliest settlements in New England; it took the lead in population, and bore an important part in the civil and military affairs of Plymouth Colony.

"The first settlers came in by way of Plymouth (previous to 1628), and some of them were of the first ship's company.

"There was a large access to the settlement in 1633, which company came in by the way of Boston, with Mr. Lothrop, their pastor.

"Previous to 1640, most of the population was from the County of Kent in England, but about the latter date, many came in from Hingham, Dorchester, Watertown, Weymouth and Nantasket, at which places they had resided a few years; many of these were from London, and more perhaps from Dorsetshire, England.

"Though migrations have been constantly making from this early settlement, yet we have noticed some remarkable periods of those migrations; for example: In 1640 to Barnstable, when nearly half the population departed. In 1650 to York and its vicinity. In 1658 to Barbadoes. In 1670 to Rehoboth and Swansey. In 1690 to Norwich, Conn. In 1710 to Newport and Scituate, R. I."

First Generation.

Elder THOMAS KING.

born in England, 1614.

In June, 1635, at the age of 21, he sailed from London in the ship "Blessing," in company with Mr. William Vassall, age 42, and his family; also on same ship was Suzanna King, age 30, who may have been aunt, or sister, of Thomas. (See note 1.)

Mr. Vassall was the son of a London alderman, and one of the few wealthy men who early came to America. He visited Plymouth Colony in 1630, and decided to return to England and bring his family and some friends and settle in Scituate. He and Thomas King were friends, and they may have been related by marriage. (See note 2.)

Thomas King built his house a few rods south of Mr. Vassall's, on top of the hill at Belle House Neck; he united with the Scituate church, February 25, 1637-8, and the same year married Sarah ----; their children, all born in Scituate, were:

Wife Sarah died June 6, 1652, and he married Jane Hatch, March 31, 1653, widow of Elder William Hatch, and was chosen to succeed him in Second church. She died the same year (1653). The name of his third wife was Anne. It is surmised that her name was Anne Sutliffe, by the reading of the will of Deacon Thomas King, 1711.

Elder Thomas King died in Scituate, September 24, 1691, a. 77. His will, dated 1691, gives "to wife Anne and daughter Sarah Bisby land at Gravelly Beach; to grandsons John and Thomas Rogers, £10 each. Item: it is my will that Robin, my negro, be set free and receive of my estate, a bed and £5 in money. Item: to son Thomas King, fr, all my property not otherwise disposed of, in New and in Old England.

"Thomas King, Ir., appointed executor. Witnesses, John Cushing, John Cushing, Jr., Joseph Cushing."

Note 1.—Barnabus Davis, one of the ancestors of Hannah Lamphear, came in same ship, at the same time.

NOTE 2 .- Mr. Vassall returned to England in 1646, and afterwards settled in the West Indies, on a large estate he owned there. (See Scituate history.)

Second Generation.

Deacon THOMAS KING.

son of Elder Thomas, born in Scituate, June 21, 1645.

He succeeded his father as a man respected in the church and in the community, and acquired considerable property. He married, April 20, 1669, Elizabeth Clap, of Scituate, daughter of Deacon Thomas Clap, born in Dorchester, England, in 1597, and came to this country with his wife Abigail, in 1633. He died in Scituate, April 30, 1684, a. 87. He was a deacon in the Scituate church, and was the ancestor of the distinguished President Clap, of Yale College. His father was Richard Clap, of Dorchester, England, 1550 to 1600.

Note 3.—Regarding 5 John King (son of Deacon Thomas), born 1677, "Dean" says, he married Sarah or Hannah Whiton, of Hingham.

In the "Foster Record," published in 1889, by F. M. Hawes, Somerville, Mass., which contains twelve pages of records of the descendants of 7 Ichabod King, one of whom married into the Foster family, the statement is made that 5 John King (son of Deacon These). Thomas) is supposed to have married Sarah Whiton, or Wheaton, of Hingham, in 1706.

He was living in Marshfield when his father died (1711).

In "History of Hingham," Vol. 11, page 408, it says of the Whiton family, Hannah married John King, 1706.

The above statements misled the writer, and caused him much trouble and expense to find the facts in the case, and through the liberality of Dr. C. O. Thompson, of Boston, the writer visited Boston and spent more than a week in sifting this matter, as follows: In town records of Hingham, July 8, 1706, marriage of John King, of *Plymouth*, to Hannah Whiton, daughter of James and Abigail Whiton, of Hingham.

In Suffolk county probate records, Vol. 24, pages 103-4, the will of James Whiton, of Hingham, probated June 25, 1725, mentions five sons and three daughters, one daughter, Hannah King, of Plymouth (the name is spelled Witon in the original will). The writer

then visited Plymouth and found the following records:

Deborah Briggs, widow of Captain John Briggs. (See appendix for record of this Briggs family.) She died May 15, 1711. Her daughter Deborah Briggs married 8 George King.

Deacon Thomas King died Dec. 1, 1711. His will, dated Nov. 5, 1711, gives "to my son Daniel the homestead (on Belle House Neck) of Elder Thomas King, deceased, he to allow my daughter Anne to live in the house. The said Daniel to pay twenty-five shillings annually to my mother-in-law, Anne Sutliffe, etc.

"To my son John King, to him, his heirs and assigns forever, all my farms or tracts of upland and meadow land in the town of Marshfield, on which the said John King now dwelleth, with the houses standing upon the A farm, and also all my lots and allotments in Scituate divisions, and the common lands in the town of Marshfield aforesaid, with the privileges and appurtenances thereunto belonging. He the said John King, his heirs or assigns, paying out of his own proper estate, to my executor for and towards ye payment of ve legacies herein given ve sum of twenty one pounds, and also ve sum of twenty five shillings to be paid to my said mother in law yearly, and every year during her natural life.

"I have already paid to and settled upon my son Ichabod, lands of con-

siderable value. I give him no other portion here.

"I give to my son George, all my lot of land where I now dwell, and the house and buildings standing thereon, &c., &c. Said George his heirs and assigns forever, to pay to my said mother in law, twenty five shillings, yearly and every year during her natural life, and to pay to my executor, for, and towards payment of legacies herein given, the sum of sixty nine pounds.

"To my daughter Mercy Winslow £30.

"To my daughter Anne £30. To my son Ichabod, &c., &c.

Inventory of personal estate, £274."

The town of Plympton was set off from Plymouth in the year 1707.

June 3, 1735, John King, of Plympton, and wife Hannah, convey to Eleazer Whiton,
of Hingham, "land given by our honored grandfather, to our honored father James Whiton of Hingham late deceased, and given to said Hannah by her father James Whiton last mentioned.

These records prove, beyond question, that: "Dean" and "History of Hingham" and "The Foster Record" were in error, in stating that 5 John King, son of Deacon Thomas, married into the Whiton family. He married Rebecca and lived in Marshfield, and Hannah Whiton, of Hingham, married John King, of Plymouth, in 1706, son of Samuel King, and the next year, that part of Plymouth was set off and called Plympton.

son of Deacon Thomas King, of Scituate, born 1677.

There also appears to have been a daughter Anne between Thomas and Elisha, by the probate records, Vol. 6, pages 184-5-6: "July 10, 1732, George King, chosen guardian, by Elisha, son of John King, late of Marshfield, and Anne, sister of Elisha, both being now under 21 years of age and over 14, and also Thomas King, now over 14 and under 21, brother of the above mentioned Elisha and Anne, has chosen Samuel Tilden, Jr., for guardian.

"Samuel Tilden, Jr., appointed guardian to Elizabeth King, now under

14 years of age, sister of the above mentioned children."

John King and Rebecca - were evidently married in 1702 or 1703, but unfortunately the marriage records of Marshfield are lost entire from 1702 to 1709, which leaves us no clue to who Rebecca was.

John King, senior, died 1721, a. 44, and his widow Rebecca married Stephen Stodder, of Hingham, Dec. 9, 1727. She survived Stephen Stodder,

who died 1753. (See "History of Hingham.")

In 1709, Nov. 22, Vol. 9, pages 97–8, probate records, agreement between John King, of Marshfield, and Israel Hatch and Samuel Silvester, division of lands purchased in partnership. Witnesses: John Briggs, Sarah Silvester.

In 1720, May 9, Vol. 15, page 138, John King, of Marshfield, conveys

land to John Wadsworth, of Duxbury.

In 1721, May 5, Vol. 4, pages 293-4-5, the will of John King, of Marshfield: "I give to my dearly beloved wife Rebecca King, ye sole use and improvement of all my real and personal estate, during ye whole term of ten years next after my decease, for her own support and bringing up of ye children, and at ye end of ten years next after my decease, I do give and bequeath unto my wife Rebecca King, ye sum of one hundred pounds, to be first levied out of my real estate, and likewise a third part of my moveables that shall be then left. She shall have the first choice, which part, together with ye hundred pounds, she shall have at her own disposal forever. And likewise my mind and will is, that, my wife Rebecca King shall have the use and improvement of my dwelling house and barn and garden and well, with wood for her fire, upon ye land, during my widow. And likewise my mind and will is, that after ye end and term of ten years next after my decease, that all my estate, both real and personal excepting what I have above given to my wife, shall be equally divided among my children then surviving, and also by these presents, constitute, make and ordain, my dearly beloved wife Rebecca King my sole executrix. (Signed) John King.

Fourth Generation.

JOHN KING. Jr.,

born in Marshfield, 1704.

1 JOHN KING, JR., who married Mary Clift, Jan. 30, 1730, had children as follows (Marshfield town records):

In the records of Second Congregational Church of Marshfield, which commence in 1738: "On Dec. 16, 1740, the pews in the church newly erected were sold at auction, and *John King* bought the 10th pew, being the corner pew in the men's end, for £34-0-0, and later on, in June, 1741, when they had erected a number more, the hanging pew over the men's 'stares' was sold to Mr. Joseph King for £12-10-0.

"In 1744, it was voted that Joseph King be collector for the year ensuing."

Dec. 12, 1747, Vol. 39, page 148, (Plymouth county deeds.)

Division of lands left in common to John King, Jr., yeoman; Joseph King, cordwainer, and Rebecca King Lapham, when the estate of John King, their father, was settled; reference is made to settlement with the other children, namely: Thomas, Elisha, Elizabeth and Anne. On previous page is conveyance of Benjamin King, of Hingham, to John King, Marshfield, Dec. 1, 1747, of land, being his share in the division of that part of their father's estate which was left to Thomas, Elisha and Elizabeth, "children and heirs of my said father John King deceased, which said children are also deceased."

July 21, 1747, Vol. 40, page 53, (Plymouth county deeds.)

Conveyance of homestead and lands in Marshfield, "to Israel Rogers for eleven hundred and five pounds, in good bills of the old tenor;" mentions land he bought of brother John Hall & Jerusha Hall.

(Signed) JOHN KING & wife MARY KING.

Mary Clift, who was the wife of 1 John King, Jr., of Marshfield, was born in Marshfield, 1710. She was the daughter of William Clift and

Lydia Wills, b. in Scituate, 1676, d. 1761 (see note 4); granddaughter of Samuel Wills, b. in Scituate, 1640; great-granddaughter of William Wills, b. in England, 1598, who came to America, 1638, settled in Scituate, and was a freeman there in 1639. (See Dean's History of Scituate.)

"The same year he purchased 'Tongue Island' and adjacent marsh of

John Cooper, and here erected his house.

"The island now bears the name of 'Wills Island."

"He died in 1688, age 90. His will, dated 1683, gives 'to son Samuel all my estate, he to maintain his mother Lucy during her life,' Lucy, the widow, deceased 1697.

"There were but two children of William Wills: Samuel, born 1640, and Lydia, baptized 1645, who became the wife of Deacon James Torrey. Samuel left no son. His daughter Lydia married William Clift, of Marshfield, in 1691."

In the probate records of Plymouth county is the following: "May 22, 1724, Lydia Clift, widow of William Clift late of Marshfield appointed guardian to her daughter Mary Clift, now under fourteen years of age," and it appears that Mary had two brothers, William, Jr., and Samuel.

The widow, Lydia, afterwards married Isaac Hatch, and had Isaac, Jr., and Josiah.

Wills Clift died intestate, 1732.

The John King, Jr., who married Mary Clift, and had William King, born April 5, 1740, at Marshfield, removed to Norwich, Conn., in 1747, after selling his lands and homestead in Marshfield.

The land records of Norwich, Conn., contain the following: "Robert Kinsman, Jr., of Norwich, conveyed to *John King*, of Marshfield, county of Plymouth, province of Massachusetts Bay, New England, in 1747, sixty-two acres of land with buildings standing thereon in Hanover Society Norwich, Conn., for £1,000 in bills.

June 1st, 1763, John King sold to his son William

Same day and year gives " 13 "

August 22d, 1765, John King sold to his son " 6 " for £35.

March 3d, 1766, " " Nathan Bushnell, Jr., 30 " with buildings thereon."

In 1767 we find it recorded: Josiah Eames, of Norwich, Conn., mortgages to *John King*, of Amenia Precinct, Dutchess County, province of New York, land and buildings in Norwich, Conn.

In an old account book of *William King*, running from 1761 to 1791, now owned by Henry A. King, of Springfield, Mass. (a great-grandson), are several pages of running account with Nathan Bushnell, Jr., years 1761 to 1766, also an account with Robert Kinsman.

We infer from the above records that: John King removed to Amenia, Dutchess County, N. Y., after selling the last parcel of land in Norwich in

Note 4.—The graves of William Clift and his wife Lydia are marked by headstones in the old cemetery at Marshfield (seen by the writer). There are many other gravestones there bearing the name of Clift,

1766, and we have caused to be made a very thorough search of all records of Dutchess County, and early history of Amenia; also church records and burial grounds in Amenia and surrounding neighborhood, but have failed to find the last resting place of *John King*, or any account of settlement of his estate.

The clerk of Dutchess County writes: There were no records of births, marriages and deaths kept there, previous to 1847.

"Therefore resolved by this assembly, that the memorialists and all such as live within the aforesaid lines and boundaries above described, exclusive of Samuel Lovet, Joseph Bushnell, *John King*, Jacob Fuller, David Longbottom, Jonah Birchard, Jonathan French, Nathaniel Clark and John Smith, Jr., and their estates, shall be and they are hereby constituted and declared to be a distinct ecclesiastical society by the name of Hanover."

1762 to 1767. Vol. 12, page 169.

"Upon memorial of Joseph Bushnell, *John King*, Jonathan French David and James Longbottom, all of Norwich, living within the limits of the Society of Hanover," &c. (A petition to belong to the ecclesiastical society of Hanover.)

On the church records of Hanover Society, Norwich, 1761 and 1763, this same matter appears, with the additional record that *John King* paid to the society £15 in addition to the sum already paid for the support of the ministry and school.

There is also a record of birth, June 21st, 1770, Benjamin, son of Thomas and Mehitable King. (This Thomas was probably 2 Thomas, b. Marshfield, 1736, son of *John*, elder brother of our *William King*. (See appendix for more of Thomas.)

In Colonial Records, 1772 to 1775. Vol. 14, page 66.

"Resolved by this assembly, that the consideration of the following petitions and memorials, now depending before this assembly, be continued to the next session of the same."

In William King's account book (before referred to) is an account with Samuel Lovet, 1762; also with James Longbottom, 1764, and Jonathan French, 1765, and "father King," 1767.

From the foregoing data we have a clear and authentic record of the ancestors of William King.

I., 1675, d. Jan. 29, 1728, married June 15, 1696, Experience Reed, b. Norwich, Ct., 1675, Feb. 27, great-granddaughter of George Lamphear, of Westerly, R. I., 1669, d. 1731, Oct. 6.

On record Feb. 23, 1732, Samuel Lincoln, and Experience, his wife, formerly wife of Shadrach Lamphear, of Stonington, Ct., for love to our children, Oliver, Ann, Prudence, Experience and Mary Lamphear, of Westerly, R. I., and Solomon and John Lamphear, of Norwich, Ct., and Hezekiah Lamphear, of Lebanon, Ct., deeded to said eight children 48 acres of land in Westerly, R. I., which Shadrach Lamphear (former husband) had possessed.

The above matter relating to the Lamphears is gleaned from "Genealogical Dictionary of Rhode Island," and from "Savage" Vol. III. See also Ancient History of Norwich, Ct., page 157.

From the Reed Family Genealogy, also spelled Reade, Read, Reid.

John Reed, of Rehoboth, Mass., 1643, one of the first settlers, and one of those who received land in the original distribution, probably born in England (see history of Rehoboth), had a son Josiah, born in Rehoboth, who married Grace Holloway, of Marshfield, November, 1666, daughter of William Holloway.

They removed to Norwich, Conn., and had a daughter, Experience, born February 27, 1675. She married Shadrach Lamphear, 1696.

From the Stephen Palmer Genealogy.

Thomas Palmer came from Rowley, Brough, Yorkshire, England, with twenty other families and landed in Salem, Mass., in the autumn of 1638, the winter being spent there and in Boston. In the spring of 1639 they founded the town of Rowley.

Samuel Palmer, son of Thomas, was born in Rowley, 1644. In 1671 he married Mary Pearson, born 1651, daughter of Deacon John Pearson, and Dorcas, his wife. John Pearson was one of the first settlers of Rowley. He built and operated the first cloth mill in America. (See history of Rowley).

Thomas Palmer (twin), son of Samuel, born in Rowley, 1684, married in Charlestown, 1710, Sarah Davis, daughter of Hopewell Davis and Sarah Boynton, his wife. She was a daughter of John Boynton and Eleanor Pell, daughter of Joseph Pell, of Boston.

Thomas Palmer and family removed to Norwich, Conn., in 1724, where his daughter Mary Palmer married Solomon Lamphear, Feb. 28, 1738-9. Deacon Samuel Palmer, father of Thomas, also removed to Norwich in 1724 and purchased land there which has ever since remained in the family, five generations in direct line having been born at the old homestead.

Solomon Lamphear and his wife Mary Palmer had twelve children: Mary, 1739; Lucy, 1741; Hannah, 1743; Solomon, Jr., 1745; Jedediah, 1748; Samuel, 1750; Jedediah again, 1753; Mary again, 1755; Sarah, 1757; Ruth, 1761; Ruby, 1763; Elisha, 1765.

Mary, b. 1755, was probably the Mary who married Nehemiah Holt, 1782. (See Holt Genealogy).

From Charlestown, Mass., History and Genealogy.

Barnabus Davis came from Ipswich, England, in ship "Blessing," July, 1635, age 36 (see note); he was a tallow chandler. His son Hopewell Davis was in the great Narragansett war, 1676. Barnabus and son Hopewell were part owners of Bunker Hill, since of historic fame.

Sarah Davis, daughter of Hopewell, married Thomas Palmer, 1710. (Charlestown records contain much more of this family).

NOTE.—Elder Thomas King came in the same ship, at the same time, with Barnabus Davis.

WILLIAM KING,

born in Marshfield, Mass. (the home of the illustrious Daniel Webster), in 1740; removed with his father, when seven years of age, in 1747, to Norwich, Conn.

There, he received his education and learned his trade. There, he married *Hannah Lamphear* when 25 years of age; she being of Puritan stock. Her ancestors were among the first settlers of Norwich and Stonington, Conn.; and of Westerly, R. I.; and of Rowley, Rehoboth, Marshfield and Charlestown, Mass.

Their first child, Wills King, was born in Norwich, Conn., in 1766, and shortly after that the young couple went to Monson, Mass., on horseback, and located in the south end of the town, near the Stafford, Conn., line. It is recorded that their second child, Walter, was born in Stafford, Conn., in 1769. A year later they removed to nearer the center of Monson, in what was known as the "Munn district," and which farm has ever since been known as the "King place."

The following matter is taken from "History of Palmer," published 1889:

"IVilliam, son of John King of Norwich, Conn., was born in 1740, married Hannah Lamphear in 1765. He was a cooper by trade, and worked at his occupation four years in Norwich. His father bought a tract of land in Monson and gave the deed to his son William. The consideration in the deed was love and respect, he being a dutiful and obedient son.

"In 1770 he settled in Monson and worked at his trade in connection with farming and the manufacture of potash, which afforded him good profits.

"In 1793 he came to Palmer and bought the Quintin hotel, which had become a poor dilapidated building, and soon built the hotel that is now occupied by Mr. Trumble as a private dwelling.

"He also bought the Duncan Quinton farm, north of the old center.

"In 1801 he gave the hotel property to his son John, the farm he gave to his son Wills. Amasa and Roswell settled in Monson on the old homestead

"In 1793 a saw mill was put up on Wigwam brook by William King, Thomas Quinton and others, each partner to share the income in proportion to his stock. The result of the venture is not known.

"William King served in the Revolutionary war as one of the minute men. Enlisted Sept. 26, 1777, in Captain Reuben Munn's company, Colonel Elisha Porter's regiment; discharged Oct. 12, 1777; detached to join General Gates's army for 30 days at the northward."

The following testimony is furnished by his grandson, William King, now living in Monson, 81 years of age:

"During the winter season he made casks for holding potash. In the spring he collected ashes from the farmers and manufactured potash, transporting the product by team to Norwich, Conn., about 40 miles, where there was a ready market for it at one hundred dollars per ton. Then he would purchase supplies of sugar, molasses, tea, codfish, rum, etc., in quantity, and trade it at home for ashes, etc., thus making two profits, showing the traditional Yankee trait."

COPY OF WILL OF WILLIAM KING, OF MONSON.

[The original is on file at the Probate Office, in Springfield, Mass., together with the inventory of the estate.]

"In the name of God Amen. I William King of Monson, in the County of Hampden, and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, and being of sound mind and memory, blessed be Almighty God for the same, do make and ordain, and publish this my last will and testament, in manner and form following: (to wit):

- "(1) I give and bequeath, to my beloved wife, Hannah King, one good horse, two good cows, all my household furniture, all monies, and obligations, which I shall or may be possessed of, at my decease; the same being subject to the payments of all my just and honest debts, and funeral charges, and the several legacies hereafter named, to be used and improved by her during her natural life, and at her decease to be equally divided betwixt my surviving daughters; also the south room, and chamber over the same, in my dwelling house, and the bedroom at the south end of the kitching in said house, and such privalidges in the kitching and cellar of said house, and yard room about said house, as shall be sufficient for her comfort and convenience; also the use and improvement of one-third part of my farm, situate in Monson as aforesaid; both in quantity and quality if she stand in need of; the same to be used and improved by her during her natural life.
- "(2) I give and bequeath to my sons, Amasa King, and Roswell King, both of Monson aforesaid, the whole of my farm in said Monson, on which I now live, containing about two hundred and seven acres, to be divided between the said Amasa and Roswell, by a dividing line in the following manner; (to wit): Beginning at a stake and stones, in the west line of aforesaid farm, ninety-seven rods, from the southwestern corner, of said farm; thence east four degrees north seventy rods, to stake and stones by the highway; thence south four degrees east twenty-three rods, to a stake and stones the easterly side of said highway; thence east four degrees north eight and one-half rods, to a black oak stump; thence a straight line to the southwest corner of Mut (?) Meadow, so called.

"I give and bequeath to the said son Amasa King all the lands south of the above mentioned division line, together with the buildings thereon; also the one-half of the meadow, called Mut Meadow, being the south part of the said Meadow, to be divided by a line running east and west through the same, reserving the privilige of a road to the brook, running through said Meadow, and one rod over said brook below the dam, for the use and privilige of water, and which priviledge I give and bequeath to the said Roswell King, to have, and hold; the same, to them the said Amasa and Roswell their heirs

and assignees forever; subject to the incumbrances of what I have before given to my beloved wife Hannah King.

- "(3) I give, and bequeath to the said Roswell King, all that part of my aforesaid farm, which lies north of the division line aforesaid; being that part of said farm on which the said Roswell now lives, together with the buildings thereon; also one-half of the aforesaid Meadow called Mut Meadow; being the north part of the same to have and hold; the same to him, the said Roswell, his heirs, and assignees forever, subject to the incumbrances of what I have before given to my beloved wife Hannah King.
- "(4) I give and bequeath to my son Walter King, the sum of one hundred dollars, to be paid to him by my executor hereafter named, in one year next after my decease.
- "(5) I give and bequeath to my son Wills King, the sum of two hundred dollars in money, to be raised out of my personal estate, to be paid to him by my executor hereafter named, in one year next after my decease.
- "(6) I give and bequeath to my son John King, the sum of one dollar, to be raised out of my personal estate, and to be paid him, by my executor hereafter named, in one year next after my decease.
- "(7) I give, and bequeath to the heirs of my daughter, Polly Moulton deceased, the sum of fifty-five dollars, to be raised out of my personal estate, and to be paid to them by my executor hereafter named, in one year next after my decease.
- "(8) I give, and bequeath to my daughter Sally, wife of Martin Sedgwick, sixty dollars, to be raised from my personal estate, to be paid by my executor hereafter named, in one year next after my decease.
- "(9) I give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy, the wife of Samuel Shaw, one hundred dollars, to be raised out of my personal estate, to be paid by my executor hereafter named, in one year next after my decease.
- "(10) I give, and bequeath to the aforesaid Amasa King, all my farming utensils of every kind whatever.
- "(11) I give, and bequeath to the aforesaid Roswell King, all my cooper tools of every kind whatever.
- "And I do make, ordain, constitute, and appoint, my son Amasa King sole executor of this my last will and testament, and I do utterly disclaim and revoke all and every will or testament heretofore by me made. In witness whereof, I the said William King, have hereunto set my hand, and seal, to this my last will and testament, this seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord, one thousand, eight hundred and fourteen.





Only one of Roswell's descendants served in the war of the Rebellion, 1861-5, 3 Albert J. King, son of 3 Harvey King.

After the death of his wife, Roswell lived alternately with his sons, Harvey and Henry, but the last years of his life were passed with his daughter, Sabrah Ann Carter, at Middletown, Ct., where he died.

It is a noticeable fact that all of 7 Roswell's children (excepting one daughter, Morania) located away from Monson, and none of the descendants are living in the town, while all of 3 Amasa's children married and settled in Monson and all of the grandchildren were born there, and at this time (1897) there are nineteen of Amasa's descendants living in Monson.

3 HARVEY KING,

when 18 years of age, went to Monson Center, and worked for Amos Norcross, who kept the hotel. The stages running between Springfield and Boston stopped there for breakfast, and Harvey soon became a stage driver between Monson and Springfield. After his marriage he settled in Southbridge, keeping the hotel; in 1849 he removed to Holyoke, and in 1851, to Rockville, Ct., where he established stage lines, first running to Hartford, in connection with his brother, Roswell M.; then securing mail contracts, he put on stages to Vernon Depot, Tolland and Warehouse Point. He also had control of all express between Rockville and Hartford. In 1862 the Rockville railroad was built and the days of the stage coach were numbered. He then devoted his remaining years to improving his farm, two miles out, still retaining his residence in the village, on St. Bernard's terrace, which he purchased in 1856. (See engraving opposite page 7.) In 1878, by reason of pecuniary losses, he sold this property and removed to the Coggswell homestead, Prospect street, and died there, 1881.



APPENDIX.

The following article, published in "The Youths' Companion," September 12, 1895, expresses a sentiment well worth cultivating, and it seems proper to give it a place in this work.

STUDYING OUR ANCESTRY.

The New England Historic-Genealogical Society celebrated its fiftieth anniversary in Boston recently. The progress of this society and its vitality are proof that our people have a growing interest in the study of their lineage. The society's great collection of town and county histories and family genealogies is consulted by thousands of persons every year in search of missing links in the family record. has become a sort of American College of Heraldry, or as near an approach to that institution as we are likely to have.

The family coat of arms plays no part in this genealogical revival; we attach little importance to insignia which are accorded such fictitious value abroad. count for nothing at all in a land of equal opportunities. Who our grandparents were is itself a question of minor importance in comparison with what we ourselves

But it is possible to carry indifference as to ancestry too far. The person who does not know the names of his grandparents lacks at least one element of good citizenship. He has no pride in the part his own people, however humble, have played in the development of our institutions.

The study of genealogy teaches two lessons, at least. One is that the lives, the labors and the sacrifices of every family contributed a share toward the shaping of our institutions. Another is, that our ancestors all started even in the race, and

pedigree counted for nothing.

Most American families begin their genealogical tree with the stout-hearted immigrant who crossed the ocean, forgetting to bring his family record with him. His oversight it is impossible to make good in most cases, and it is of no great consequence in any case; but from the date of his arrival it ought to be possible to trace the lineage of every family. Wherever it can not be done, the family or public records are defective or destroyed.

The trouble and perplexity occasioned by these defects should teach every family, every township and municipality the importance of making and preserving the records of births, marriages and deaths. An astonishing negligence still prevails in these matters, which coming generations will deplore, and for which there is no

excuse.

The study of the family genealogy is profitable and entertaining. To trace back the links in the chain of descent suggests an approximation to universal kinship. The progeny of the original New England families has multiplied upon the face of the earth like the locusts of Egypt. In New England itself, throughout the middle states, in the great northwest, every new generation commingles the blood of families not allied before.

The progenitors of every person directly represent four families in his grandparents; these four families widen out into eight in the third generation; and so continuing by geometrical progression until in the eighth generation, which will cover the American genealogy of the majority of our native-born citizens, it contains an array of two hundred and fifty-six direct ancestors, the accumulation of about

two hundred years.

Each new family introduced into the pedigree has generally consisted of numerous branches; marriage has carried their blood into hundreds of other families, and created for each descendant of every family a collateral kinship that becomes like the sands of the sea. Intermarriages temporarily arrest the widening of the circle; mathematics is halted by other difficulties if it seeks to count the kinship. But we can not be sure that the stranger who jostles us on the street is not a blood relative, more or less removed.

The genealogical tree is thus a veritable banyan, and its roots bind us to the present as well as the past. To know its trunk branches is all that is possible to most of us; but that is enough to lead us far into the nooks and crannies of early New England life, and to open up to us the inner history of the beginnings of our social and political structure. From a better knowledge of our family history will come a fuller appreciation of the privileges and blessings of to-day.

Tradition says that 4 William King's brother 2 Thomas, born in Marshfield, 1736, removed with his father to Norwich, Conn., in 1747, and became a sea captain. The following item, found in "Ancient History of Norwich," would seem to confirm the tradition:

"In January, 1782, Captain Thomas King sailed for the West Indies in a new sloop. On the voyage a tropical storm and a hostile vessel came bearing down on him at the same time. In striving to escape the enemy, he was upset by the hurricane and his sloop left a total wreck. He and his men were taken off by the British and carried prisoners to Antigua."

On church record of Hanover Society, Norwich, Ct., we find this record: Benjamin, son of Thomas King and Mehitable, his wife, born June 21, 1770.

On church records of Newent Society, Norwich, Ct. (which adjoins Hanover), are the following baptisms:

In 1752 a list of the members was put on record; at the close the following entry: "Desirous to be recommended to ye first church of Newent, these: The wife of John King, and Joseph King and his wife." (See note.)

NOTE.—This John was probably the elder brother of our 4 William, born in Marshfield, 1731. The Joseph above referred to may have been a brother of William, or he may have been his uncle Joseph, son of John and Rebecca, born in Marshfield, 1707.

8 George King, died 1754. His will, dated June 30, 1754, gives to wife Deborah, etc., etc. To grandson John James, son of my dau. Rhoda, etc., etc. To my daughter Lydia Cushing, etc., etc. Wife, Deborah King, executrix.—Vol. 13, pages 335–8, Plymouth Probate Records.

The wife died soon, her will dated July 3, 1754 (three days after date of her husband's will).—Vol. 15, pages 36-7.

For more matter relating to this family, see will of Deborah Briggs King, Senior, dated May 7, 1711.—Plymouth Probate Records, Vol. 3, pages 81, 82, 83.

Also, Record of Deeds, Vol. 10, page 441, year 1710. Division of land, showing that the father of the above mentioned Capt. John Briggs was Walter Briggs, who also had two other sons, Lieut. James Briggs and Joseph Briggs, and a daughter, Rebecca Briggs.

MISCELLANEOUS RECORDS.

In the years 1634 to 1638, there were quite a number of persons by the name of King who came to this country, and all from England. From the New England Historical and Genealogical Register, Vol. 14, we find the following list:

Clement King was an inhabitant of Marshfield as early as 1669. We find on record there, Johanna, dau. of Clement King, b. Sept., between 1668 and 1672.

In the New England Historical and Genealogical Register, Vol. 8, page 192, Susanna, dau, of Clement King, died June 19, 1669.

We learn further from "Austin's Genealogical Dictionary of Rhode Island," page 117, that this Clement King was a freeman in Marshfield in 1682, and bought 100 acres of land in Rhode Island, May 20, 1687, and was living in Providence, R. I., in 1688. He died 1694. His widow, Elizabeth, married a Mr. Barnes; she died in Swansey, and appointed her son, John King, of Providence, administrator on her estate.

Clement King and Elizabeth had children besides Johanna and Susanna, namely, John, James and Thomas.

William Kinge, born about 1595, embarked from Weymouth, Dorsetshire, England, March 20th, 1635, with wife Dorothy and five children. He settled at Salem, Mass., where he was made freeman, May 25, 1636, and received grants of land. Five lines of his descent have been traced in the Pedigree of King of Salem, compiled by Rufus King of Yonkers, New York, in 1887.

In the distribution of land in Weymouth:

First distribution, 1642, John King received 10 acres.

John King, by wife Esther, had Fearnot, b. 1655; <u>John</u>, b. 1659, died soon; John 2d, b. 1661; Esther, b. 1664; Patience, b. 1668.

Thomas Bailey, of Weymouth, 1640, d. 1680, had daughter Esther who married John King.—New England Historical Register, Vol. 46, p. 186.

The will of John King, of Weymouth, dated 1691, Vol. 8, p. 40, Suffolk County Probate Records, mentions wife Esther and her father, Thomas Bayley, also two youngest daughters, Patience and Johanna, and daughters Sarah Bogle, Susan and Esther King; sons, Samuel, Hezekiah and John.

Samuel King, by wife Experience, had Susanna, b. 1659; Elizabeth, b. 1662. The will of Samuel King, of Weymouth, dated 1712, Vol. 17, pages 432-3, mentions wife Experience, sons John and Hezekiah, and six daughters, Susanna, Elizabeth, Experience, Sarah, Hannah and Abigail.

Hezekiah King, by wife Mary, had Mary, b. 1679; Abigail, b. 1681; Samuel, b. 1686. The will of Hezekiah King, of Weymouth, dated 1765, Vol. 64, pages 247-8, mentions Jonathan Hollis and his wife Susanna Hollis, and their sons, Simeon, David, Jonathan and Benjamin Hollis.

The will of John King, of Weymouth, dated 1756, Vol. 51, pages 100-1, mentions wife but not by name, gives her his whole estate, and at her decease, half to Jonathan Hollis and half to Thomas Hollis, sons of Thomas Hollis. Item: To A. Holbrook, &c., &c.

What Thomas? Thomas King, by wife Mary, had John, b. 1670; Mary, b. 1673.

Mary, daughter of John King, of Weymouth, married Josiah Chapin, 1658.—New England Historical Register, Vol. 45, page 312.

Dorothie, wife of John King (seaman), deceased, 1652.—New England Historical Register, Vol. 8, page 60.

John King, Jr., mortgages land in Weymouth to Thomas Dyer, 1664.—Suffolk County Deeds, Vol. 5.

John King is mentioned as schoolmaster in Weymouth, 1697.—Weymouth History.

"Savage" says, the descendants of John King (seaman) and John King (planter) have puzzled many genealogists. We can well believe it.

NOTE.—Mr. M. F. King, Portland, Maine, has devoted much time and attention to these Weymouth families and their descendants, and has secured much valuable material.
