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

The Taunton Labor Area consists of the city of Taunton and the towns of Berkley and Raynham.



<u>Table 1</u> Population and Labor Force Participation Rate, by Sex, by Minority Status

This table contains estimates of 1979 Population based on the 1970 Decennial Census. Hispanic people are included in both white and non-white categories. There may, therefore, be some duplication as Hispanics may be included in either the white or black population count. (Data for white, except hispanic; black except hispanic; and hispanic, black and hispanic, white are not currently available.) The second item details the total minority population. The labor force participation rate was obtained by dividing the number of people in the labor force by the population, 16 years or older.

<u>Table 2</u> Labor Force Status, by Sex and Race, Noninstitutional Population 16 Years or Older

This table contains labor force, employment, and unemployment estimates (annual average) for calendar year 1979 (the most recent available data). The information was obtained by extrapolating data for minorities and females from the 1970 Census. The labor force is the sum of employment and unemployment. The unemployment rate equals unemployment divided by the labor force.

Tables 3 and 3A Occupations of Employed Persons by Sex and Minority Status

These tables present numerical and percent distribution of employed persons by major occupational groups and selected sub groups. Table 3 presents the numerical distribution and Table 3A, the horizontal percent distribution. The sources of the data are the Summary Manpower Indicators, prepared by the Lawrence-Berkeley Laboratory from the 1970 Decennial Census adjusted as follows:

Occupational distribution for the current employment estimates is based on Occupational Projections 1976-1985. The racial component for each occupational group is based on the percentage distribution in the 1970 Census. State distributions are readjusted to the annual average Current Population Estimates.

Table 4 Selected Characteristics of the Insured Unemployed by Last Occupation, Sex, Race and Age

This table presents selected demographic characteristics of the insured unemployed (unemployed, insured under state programs). This table may be used for information about the broad occupational group, sex, race, and age of the experienced unemployed.

<u>Tables 5 and 5A</u> Occupations of Job Applicants, by Selected Characteristics in Job Service Offices of the Division of Employment Security

Table 5 details, by broad occupational category, the sex and minority status of the job applicant. Table 5A is an expansion of Table 5 to include, by selected occupational groups, the sex, age (youth and older worker categories) and veteran and minority status of applicants in Job Service Offices of the Division of Employment Security.



Occupational distribution for the current employment estimates is based on Occupational Projections 1976-1985. The racial component for each occupational group is based on the percentage distribution in the 1970 Census. State distributions are readjusted to the annual average Current Population Estimates.
