


















A Winning Season For The Ladies!!





St. Andrews Men's Basketball







St. Andrews Baseball Team

The 1990-91 Baseball Team established a new school record of 26 consecutive victories passing the old mark of 23 set in 1990. A 7-6 loss to Pembroke state snapped the winning streak on March 26. The Knights were recognized for their outstanding abilities by being named in the top 10 of the nation by USA Today's NAIA poll.









St. Andrews Volleyball Team










