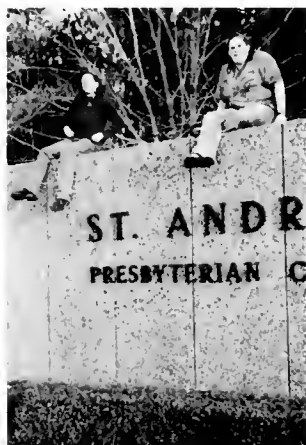

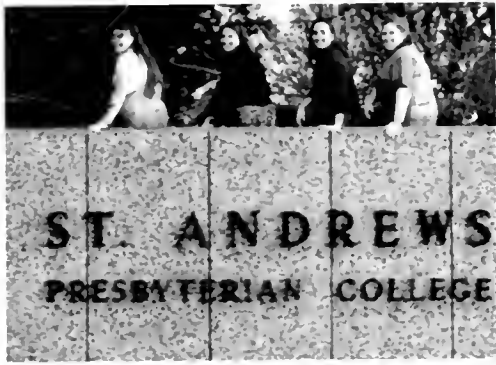


After some debate on where to put the ladder we finally found a relatively safe place to put the ladder. First there was one . . .

Dr. Alexander began his long career at St. Andrews in 1961 and is now regarded as the Distinguished Professor of Philosophy and Religion.

Dr. A graduated from Davidson College in 1950 and went on to receive degrees from Louisville Theological Seminary (1953), Harvard University (1957), and Princeton Theological Seminary (1961).

He has been an Army Chaplain, a college wrestler, and even a wrestling coach.

"Historian of Philosophy and just about everything else," is the way that one of his colleagues describes him.

A linguist of six different languages, an avid traveler, a dabbling archaeologist, a racquetball player, and reading are a few of his hobbies.

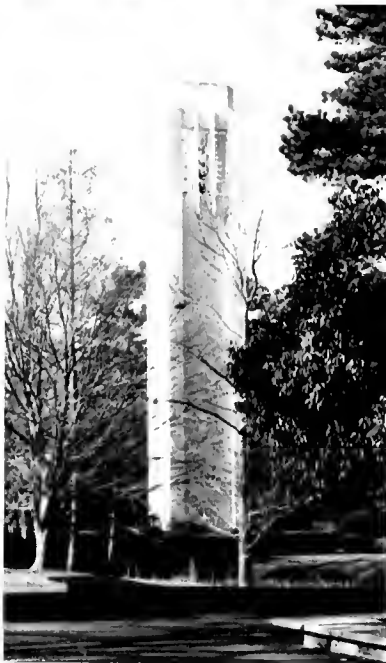
















# What can I say . . .
