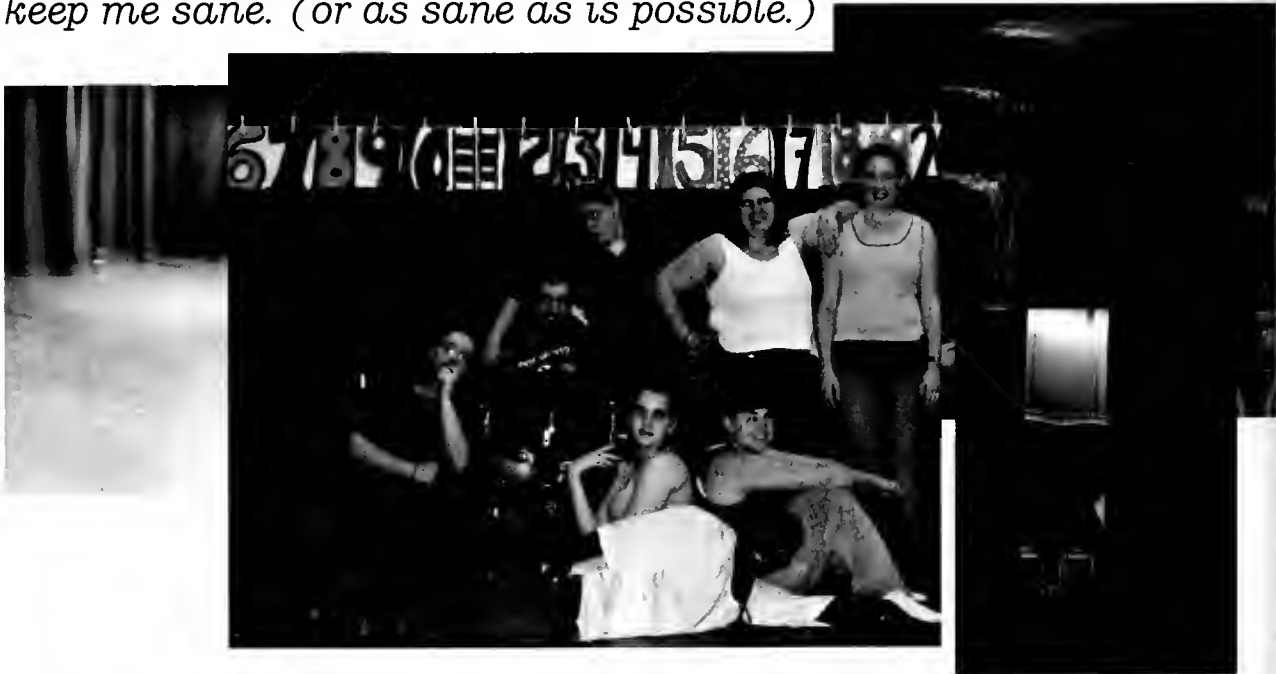


A Note from the Editor (with help from God)
