CSQCEHANNA CNIVERSIGY Lad its begimning as Misnionary Institute, the corner-stone of which was hid on september 1, 1858. The founder was the Reverend Dr. Benjamin Kurt\% an eminent divine of the Lutheran Chureli of his day. The school was established to supply the need for more ministers. From this origimal motive, it has broadened its seope to include the preparation of young men and young women for all honorable vocations in life, never ceasing to cmphasize the necessity of the Christian ethic in all true education.

In $189+$ its corporate mane was changed to susquehama liniversits. Born in faith, organized and promoted through prayer, it has grown steadily to its present strength.

Since then Susquchana laversity has made remarkable progress. In 1858 Selinsgrove Hall was the only building on the campus, and now the University includes many fine buildings: Selinsgrove Hall, Hassinger laall, Gustavus Adolphus, Seibert Lall, the Alumni Gymasium, the Thiversity Laundry, a modern steam heating phant, the Conservatory of Music. Charle Stecle Science Hall, Faculty Homes, and a new library.

Susquehama Cniversity is beautifully situated on an devation, just outside the borough limits of Selinsgrove, about one-half mile from the west bank of the Susquehanna River. Overlooking one of the mont seenic sections of the historical valley, the site itself is of remarkable beanty, being only a few miles below the confluence of the North and Went branches of the Sunquehanna River. It commands an outlook of more than ten miles of the great ralleg, so rich in Indian legend, and the wooded hills of Xorthumberland Countr, just beyond the river.

Sclingerove is quite accessible from every section of Pemmerlania. An electric railway connects with Sunbury, five miles away, which is in important railroad center of Pennsyrania. It is within a radius of fifty miles from Harrisburg, Lewistown, Williamsport, and the larger towns of the anthracite coal regions.

With these deseriptive detailn concerning the life. development. and growth of Susguchanna l'niversity one can more fully understand and appreciate her present existence.

'The 1930 eleven had a rather mediocre year gaming two victories, two

ties，and four defeats．The team functioned remarkably well between the two twenty－yard markers，but once the Crusaders worked the ball into scoring position they secmed to lack the final punch．

Susquehannas：football squad was rather small，consisting of thirty－three men．Of this number，eleven were Freshmen，and seven were lettermen from the past year．On the line．Winters，Extrom，Gaman and Auchmuty proved to be stone－walls to the opposition．These veteran forwards broke through the opponents＇line time after time，either to throw the opposing ball－earriers for a loss or to open up a hole for our men to go through．Witkop and Berger were also main－stays on the line and played a good game all season．Auchmuty has the distinction of being the only three－venr Varsity football letterman remaining for the 1931 team．In the backfield，Aloser，Scott， and Glem were the remaining experienced men with the former two being the most outstanding．Moser was the greatest fullback to ever don the Orange and Maroon．He could pass，kick，or slice through the opponents＇line at will． Whenever an extru yard or two was to be had，if Moser was called upon，you could consider it aecomplished．He missed only one placement kick after touchdown all season．Scott started the year as quarterback and was later changed to half．Inder his leadership，the Crusaders won their only two victorice and tied another．He conld pars．receive，and run the conds with mommy ability．The longest run of the season for the Orange and Maroon was made ly this diminutive quarterback．His ability to diagnose the proper play in a tight situation was also one of his dominating factors on the fiede． Ghem aho played a consistent game in the backfield．He did most of the passing and the kicking for the team．

The managership of the 1930 tean was capably filled by Herbert Schmidt and Nevin Dorshemer．This wan the first year that there wan ever a co－ mamagership in football．The managers had to take care of the business end of the foothall season．They should be commended upon the efficient mamer in which they arranged tripo，took care of efmipment，and other duties．

Moser seored 21 of the points for the Crusaders and was one of the outstanding phayers of the game. On the line, Auchmuty. Berger. Winters and Witkop stood out over the rest. It was in this game that Warren Wolfe, playing end, had his shoulder dislocaten, which put him on the bench for the remainder of the season.

Perhaps the most disantrou phayer to Wagner wan Scott, playing quarterback. Time and again his brilliant headwork, combined with merring ability to decide the best thing to do at the right time save the Orange and Maroon a decided advantage over the Wagner eleven. Not onty this bat scotty made consistent gains around the ends.

On Saturday. October 11. Surpuchanna phayed Haverfort at Haverford. and the game ended in a seorelese tie.

This game was a punting ducl between the two elevens. The number of first downs was held to a minimm for both teams.

Moser, Scott, and Glem phayed well in the backfichd, whike Auchmuty and Winter turned in the best resulta on the line fon the Orange and Maroom.

## Alfred

The Crusaders lost one of the toughent game during it, gridiron history of the night of October 18, at Alfred, $7-0$. 'This marked the first appearance of the Orange and Maroon under these conditions and they were greatly handicapped when competleet to play under floodlights.


Susquehama outplayed their opponents in every department of the game. There surely must have been a jinx foating around when a tean can outmmber their opposition, $2 \pi-3$ in first downs and still be on the tail-end of the final score.

The lonc tally was scored on the first phay after the Alfred-men had possession of the oral. Cajptain Staman skirted right end, lerl by good interference, and reached the final marker after a fifty-two yard ann. He then kicked the extra point.

At no time after the first several minutes of the first quarter, when Alfred made all of her three first downs, did she menace the Little Crusaderng goal line. The Orange and Maroon forward wall was charging hard and broke through many times to smear plays before they lit the line of serimmage.
'The Little Crusaders were in scoring position time after time but semed to lack that final punch. The breaks were against them when they tried passes to make the necessary yardage and failed. It may be said that the boys payed the best football of the year and that they were not up against a hetter team, but for some unknown reason they failed to come through with the necessary touchdowns.

It was hard to pick out any outstanding player on the line, for it functioned better than it has any time during the season, but it must be said that Auchmuty phayed a great game at the guard position and it was he, by his fieree charging through the line that spilled many an Alfred phay before it got under way.
lu the backficld, Moser"s brilliant line plunging was a feature, together with Glemn's kicking. Rishel, who payed his first game for the Orange and Maroon, playd a real game at half-back.

In playing the strongest eleven of the year, Susquehanna put up a great fight to hold Irsmus to a $21-0$ score on the I niversity field.
'The little Crusaders put up' an unexpectedly strong fight against the much tooted l'rsinus forward wall. Although heavier in weight, the Bears

failed repeatedly to force their way through the Orange and Maroon line during the entire game. Their only means of attack was either through the air or around the ends. It was during the second period that the Bears opened up with their aerial attack and with the aid of sweeping ent runs, managed to cross the goal line twice before the half ended.

The third quarter found resinus scoring again with the same form of attack. Sterner finally dodged his way around left end from the forty-yarel line to seore the touchdown.

The Orange and Maroon displayed splendid detensive power throughout the game, and it was through one deceptive play and a lucky break that the Indians scored their two touchdowns. The Crusaders" line failed to function on the offensive as it did delensively.

Juniata's first score came in the second period. With the ball on the Orange and Maroon thirty-five-yard line, fourth down, seven yards to go, Harley threw a pass over the center of the line which bounced off the hands of three Suspuehama men and into the arms of Andrews, who fell over the final marker.


The Suspuchanna ncore came early in the last quarter. Moser recovered a fumble in mid-field and with the aid of seott. carried the batl to the fivevard line where the former jolunged throngh the line for a touchdown. Moser and Seott were the big ground-gainers for the Crusaders and ripped off several long runs which proved to be sensational. On the defense, the Crusaders functioned smoothly, considering that this was their first appearance of the year on a muddy field.

Susquehama's valiant Crusaders, exhibiting that fighting spirit for which they are noted, went down to a glorions defeat, after completely outplaying the Cadets from P. M. C. in every quarter except the first. As the final whistle blew the score read $24-13$. It marked the clone of Sumpuchamac: 1930 grid season and the close of the college foothall careers of several of her loval sons who have been luminaries this season.

Led on by Scott and Moser, the Crusaders came back after that disant rous firat period to score two tonchdowns and come dangeronsly near P. M. C.s soal line thrice more. Moser scored all thirteen points.

Moser and Scott made the gane a real battle by their whirlwind offensive. Around the end through the line, with these two playing demons always in the fray. Moser tore large gaps in the opposing line on one play, so that the secondary defense played clone, then without delay the diminutive Sentt tore around the end for a substantial gain. Throughout the entire game these lads were a source of forcing the ball into scoring position, and it is certain that had the breaks turned out a little differently their playing would have been exen more prononnced.

The Crusaders had a oplendid opportunity to seore a third touchdown in the latter part of the second period that a miscalculation on the part of the quarterback kept them from it. With the ball on the Catet's three-yard line and two plays to take it across, he ralled for a pass over the goal line which was incomplete. There was enough time left for the ball to be brought out to the twenty-yard line and Cadet, to make five or six phays before half-time.
