Seven points! All that stood between the Crusaders and another undefeated seasan. However, this point spread was accumulated in two games, and for the first time in the five year reign of Jim Garrett, the Crusaders last more than one game in a single season. Nevertheless, the Crusaders rolled to a fine $7-2$ record and piled up 232 points, almost three times that of the opposition. Displaying their usual rugged ground attack and, on occasion, a brilliant passing game, the Crusaders racked up seven impressive victories.

The first of the seven came at the expense of Randalph-Macon in the annual Sunbury Kiwanis Charity game, 42-0. Lead by fullback Bill Galbraith, who scored three touchdowns on runs of three, seven and one yards, the Crusaders ran unmercifully over the visitors from Ashland, Va., as they piled up 344 yards rushing while holding Randalph-Macon to a - 3 yards on the ground. The Crusaders took the opening kickoff 73 yards to score with Galbraith going over from the three. They came right back again on a 70 yard scoring pass from Sam Metzger to Garcia Reed. Sophomore Tom Rutishauser took a lateral from Metzger and went 23 yards for another score early in the second quarter and Galbraith added a fourth touchdown on a seven yard run. After being held scoreless in the third period, Galbraith and quarter-
back Charlie Greenhagen iced the game in the fourth quarter with runs of 1 yard and 43 yards respectively. Bill Galbraith was named the outstanding offensive player of the game while Randolph-Macon tackle Bill Baumeister was the top defensive player.

The team next traveled to Marietta, Ohio, to meet the Marietta Pioneers who provided some tough opposition with a great passing game. The Crusaders drew first blood early as Barry Plitt recovered a stray football on the Pioneer 42 yard line. With Galbraith and Larry Erdman lugging the pigskin, the Crusaders moved to the 10 where Sam Metzger circled end for the touchdown. Erdman added the two point conversion and $S$. U. led 8-0. The Pioneers came right back to score after recovering an Erdman fumble on a 10 yard pass to halfback Len Randlof. Bob Wolfarth kicked the paint and the score was 8-7. Following the kickoff the Crusaders marched down the field to score on a 1 yard run by Erdman. Marietta fought back to score with 6 seconds left in the first half on a five yard pass play. The kick was blocked and S. U. led at halftime 16-13. Opening the second half, the Crusaders put together a 75 yord scoring march which ended when Bill Galbraith blasted aver from the five. The big play in the drive was a 21 yard pass from Metzger to Reed. Dennis Johnson returned the kickoff to the 50 and from there the Pioneers moved to

the 1, where Johnson went over for the score. Galbraith put the game away for S. U. when he scored from the six. Galbraith added another TD late in the game scoring from the one. Final score: 36-19.

Returning home the following week to meet the inspired Larries of St. Lawrence, the Crusaders left the field at halftime trailing 7-6. The only $S$. U. score coming on a 3 yard jaunt by Galbraith. However, the Crusaders fought back with two touchdowns in the final quarter to gain a 22-7 victory. Galbraith scored his second TD of the game early in the fourth quarter plunging over from the one, capping a 53 yard drive and later Larry Erdman dashed 52 yards into the end zone following a fumble recovery. In this game Bill Galbraith boosted his national small college scoring leadership up to 48 points.

Juniata provided the opposition for the Homecoming Day game with the traditional Goalpost Trophy up for grabs. The Crusaders provided the large crowd with a stirring second half rally which brought home a 36-17 victory. After trailing $14-8$ at halftime the Crusaders launched a blistering ground attack which subdued the fired up Indians. With Erdman, Vignone and Galbraith leading the way, each with over 100 yards rushing for the game, the Crusaders hung up 4 TD's in the second half, while holding Juniato to a FG. Erdman scored twice in the second half on
runs of 62 and 8 yards, Galbraith once on on 18 yard run and John Vignone added an 8 yard run to complete the scoring. Bill Galbraith scored the only touchdown in the first half on a 1 yard plunge.

The next stop for the unbeaten Crusaders was Lexington, $V_{a}$., where they stopped the Generals of Washington and Lee on their home field for the first time in six years, 28-0. The Crusaders piled up 22 points against the outmanned Generals in the first half and went on to add six more in the second half. Four men did the S. U. scoring in this game as Larry Erdman, Sam Metzger, Richie Hirsch and John Vignone each scored on 6 yard runs. Richie Hirsch played an outstanding game both offensively and defensively by blocking a punt, which led to the first TD, by scoring a TD of his own in the second quarter and by picking up 42 yards rushing.

After five straight victories, the Crusaders now faced the team which has beaten them twice in the last three years, and the Upsala Vikings almost did it again. After intercepting a Metzger pass at the Crusader 38, quarterback Joe Valenzano moved his team in for a score on a pass to end Len Pierson. Later, after an interception on the 10 yard line by John 'Vignone, the Crusaders drove 90 yards to score, with 40 seconds left in the half. Sam Metzger scored on a 5 yard run to cap the drive. Galbraith put S . U.
in the lead to stay when he scared from the two in the third quarter. However, Upsala provided the Crusaders with quite a scare when with 3:50 left in the game Sam Metzger fumbled deep in his own territory and Upsala recovered. Rich Hirsch saved the day when he pounced on a loose ball at the Susquehanna 3 yard line ta end the game.

Then disaster hit. The eighth ranked team in the country before the game, the Crusaders just couldn't get going against a good Alfred team. With sophomore halfback Tom Quinn leading the wry with two touchdowns, Alfred squeaked by S. U., 18-16, to end a 14 game winning streak for the Crusaders. The only bright spot in the game was an 85 yard kickoff return by John Vignone in the fourth quarter. Larry Erdman had the other S. U. score when he scampered 9 yards into the end zone in the first quarter.

Following the disastrous defeat the previous week to Alfred, the Crusaders came back to romp over a hapless Geneva College, 26-0. The Crusaders capitalized on three pass interceptions and a fumble to gain the victory. Larry Erdman gained 145 yards in rushing to highlight the victory.

Just as Geneva had handed the game to S.U. the week before, so too the Crusaders fumbled away
the game at Youngstown. Youngstown scored early an a recovered fumble in the end zone. Midway thraugh the third quarter, Youngstown struck again, this time on a 70 yard TD scamper by halfback Joe Ceremuga. Finally the Crusaders came to life in the final period but it was too late. Larry Erdman capped a 63 yard drive early in the fourth quarter with a 1 yard run. The attempted conversion failed. Then Bill Leshnock booted a 32 yard FG to give the Penguins a $17-6$ lead. After Vignone had returned the kickoff to his own 34, Larry Erdman broke off tackle for 52 yards to the Youngstown 12. Three plays later he scored from the two. The Crusaders were given a final chance to win when Bill Gagne recovered a fumble. The Crusaders drove to the six yard line where they also fumbled to end the drive and the game. Larry Erdman broke the alltime Susquehanna rushing record in this game with 2,156 yards for 4 years topping Larry Kerstetter's total of 2,101 yards set last year.

All in all the season was very successful, with the new rushing record and the gaining of national ranking for the first time. Coach Garrett now faced the task of replacing the 15 graduating seniors for next season.
