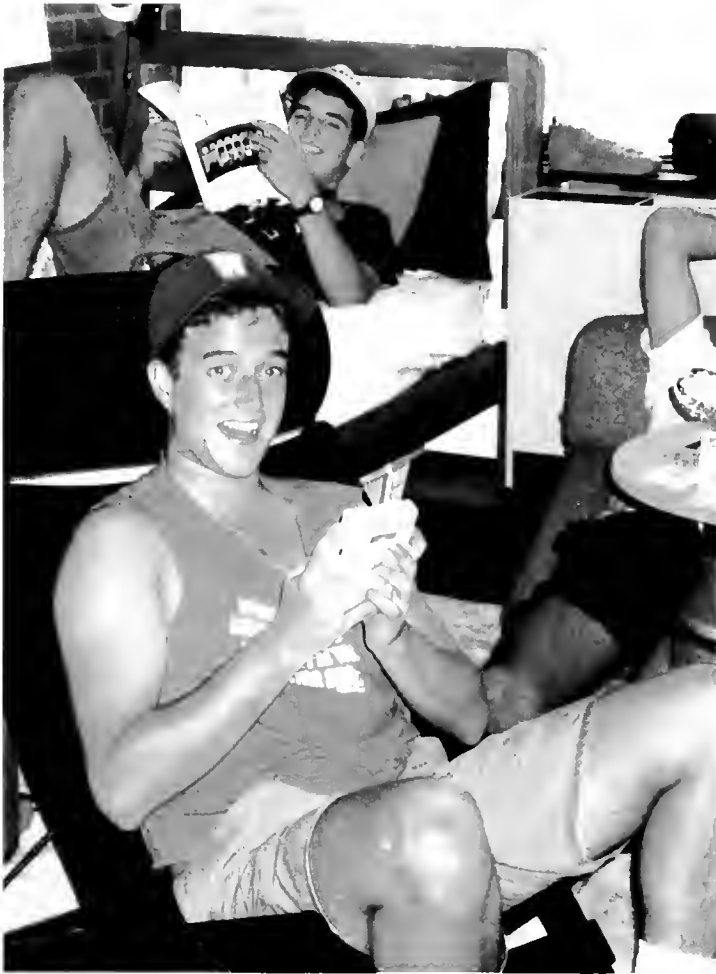


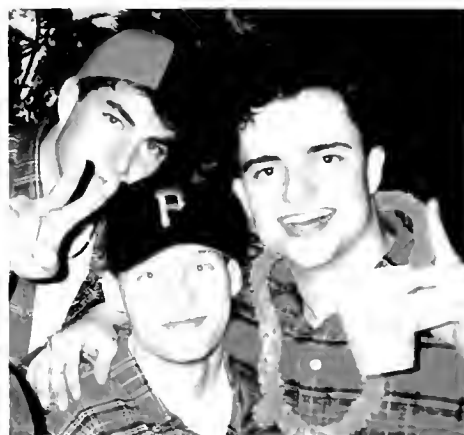


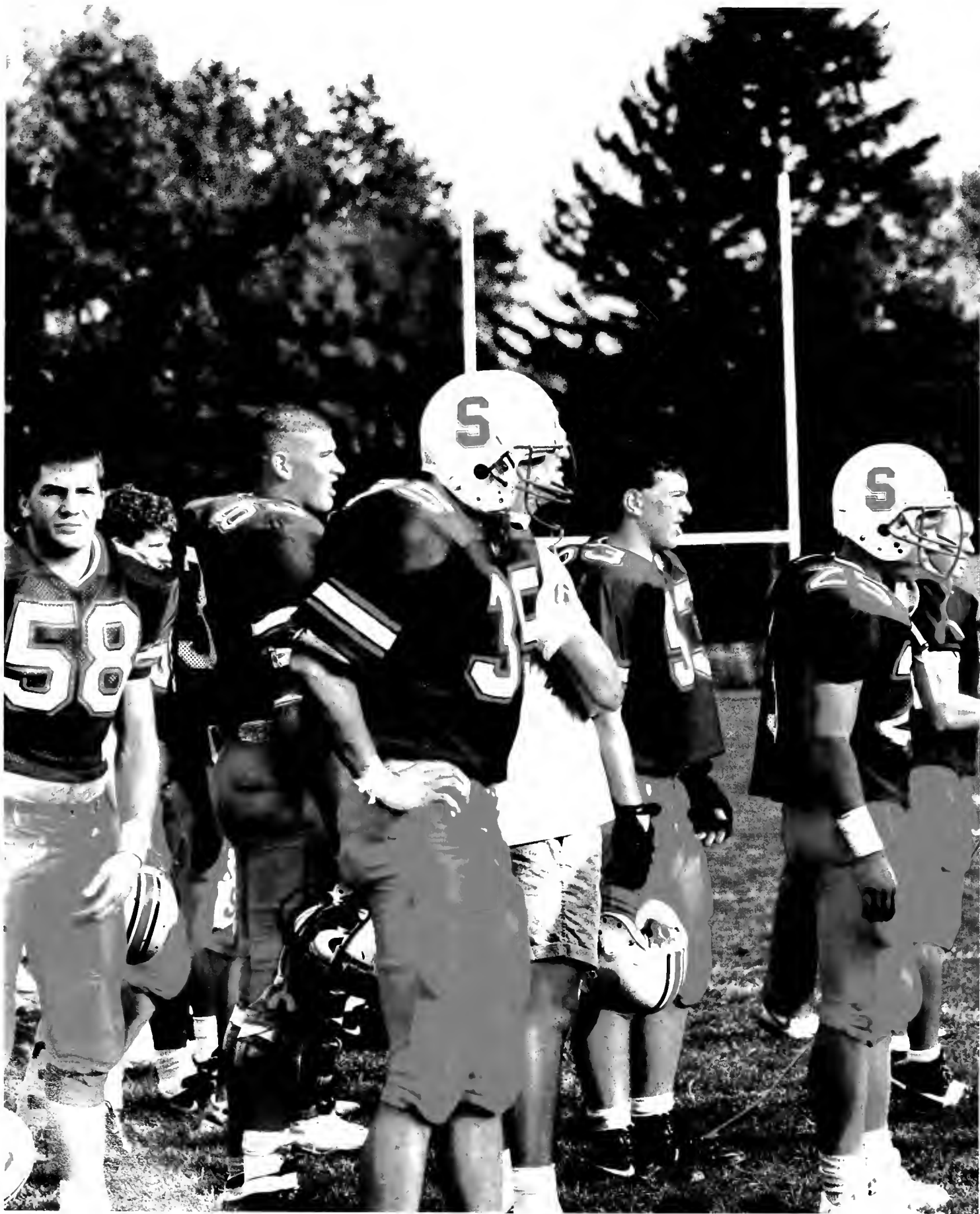


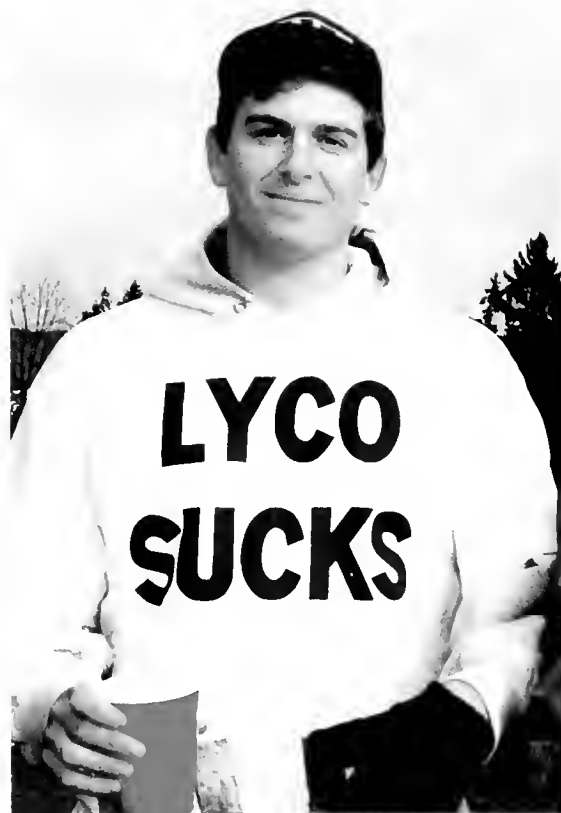


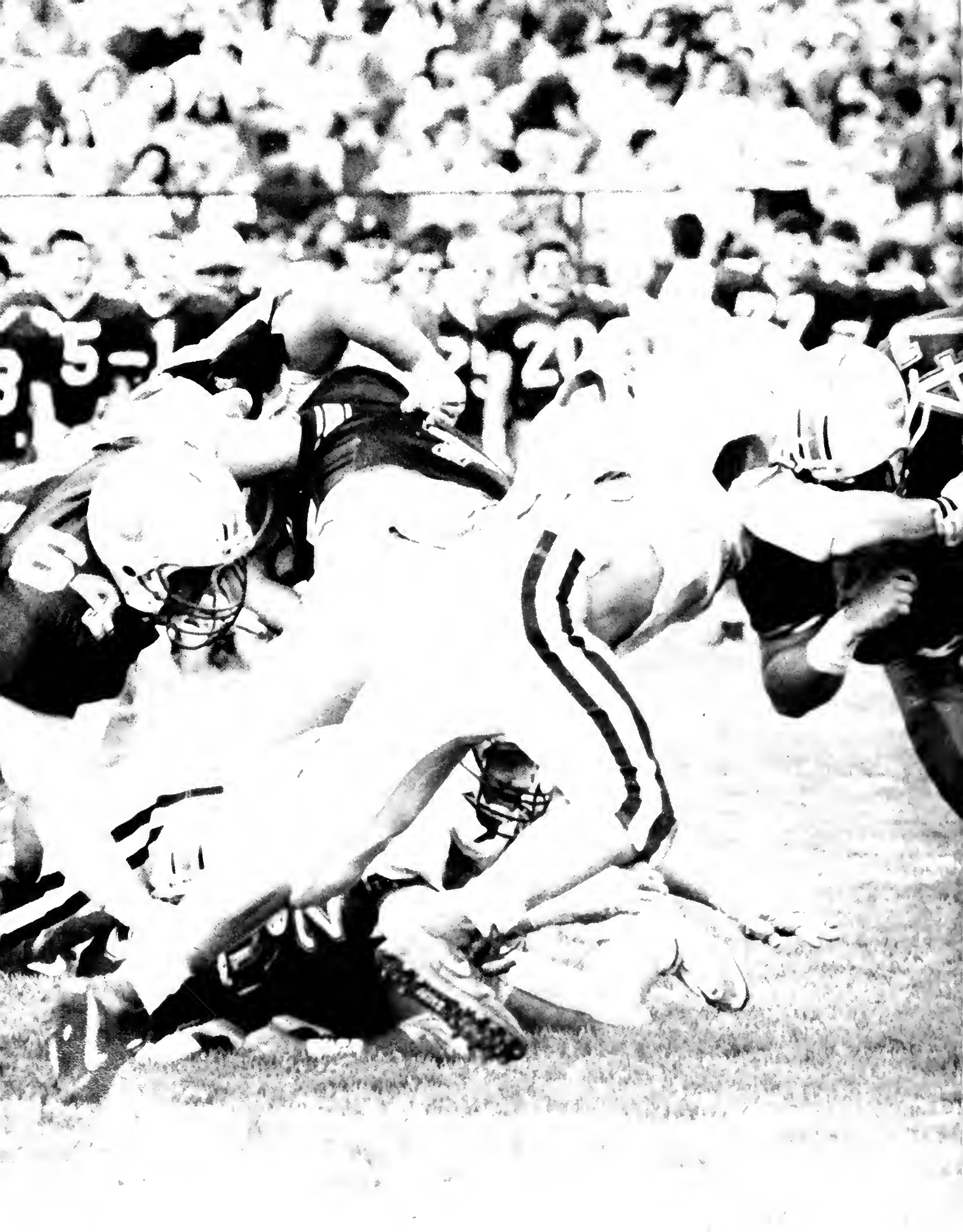












Sports

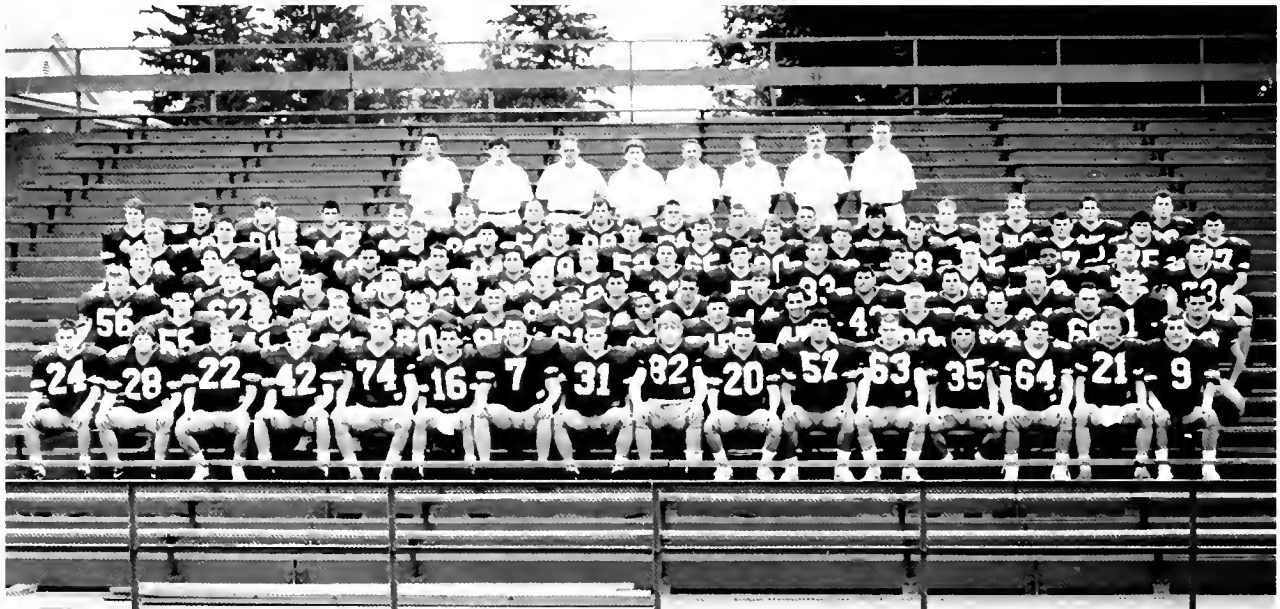

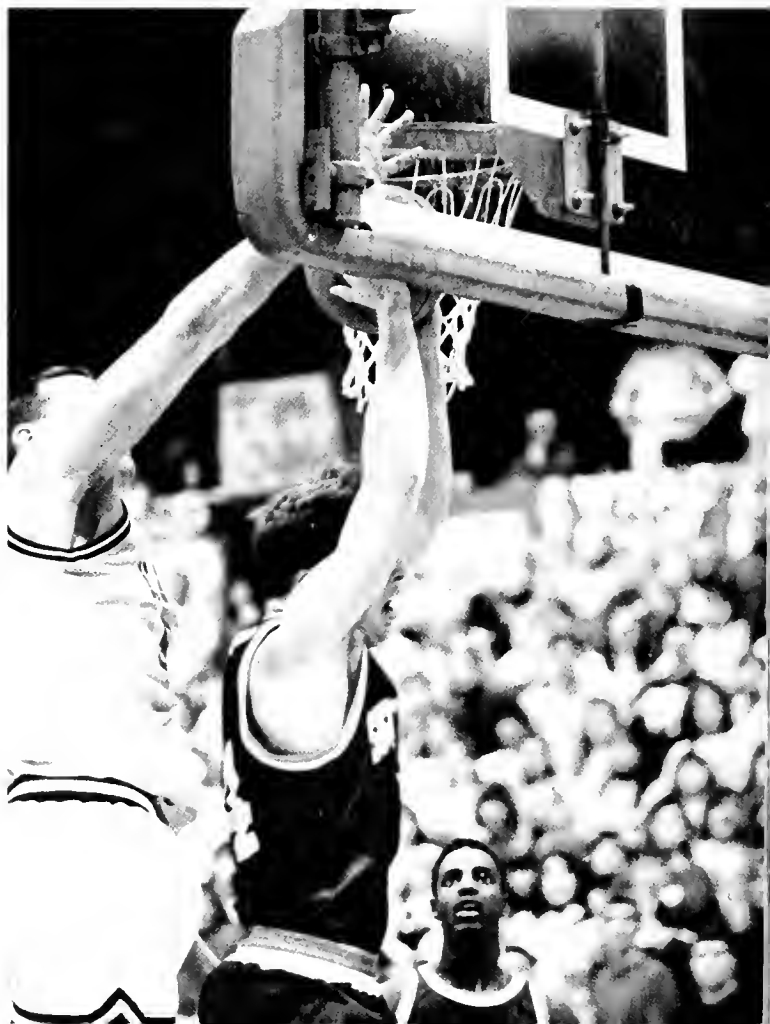
tournament with a 74-71 loss at King's after a memorable run to erase a 30-point deficit.

The team's season ended in the NCAA playoffs after a 67-66 loss to Scranton in overtime at Houts Gym. Hribar was named

MAC-Northwest Coach of the Year.

Team captain **Winter**, the only senior on the team, will probably go down in Susquehanna history as one of the all-time great playmakers. MAC All-Star **Maravalli** became only the sixth woman player at S.U. to surpass 1,000 points for her career, finishing the season fourth on the career scoring list with 1,071 as she led the team.

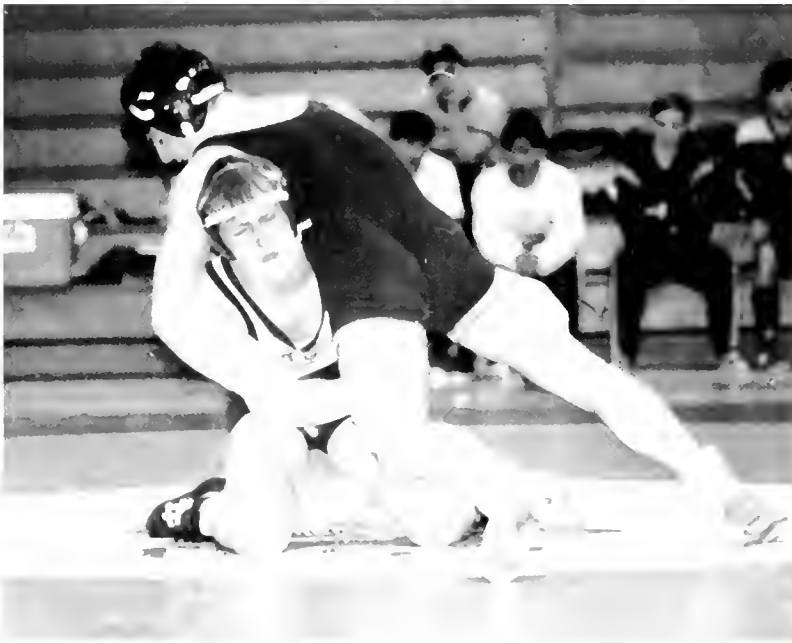

Great Expectations

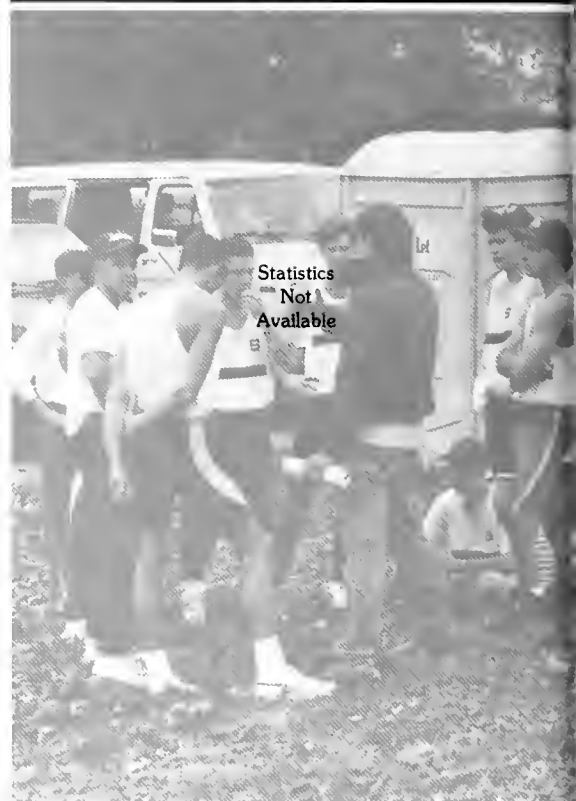

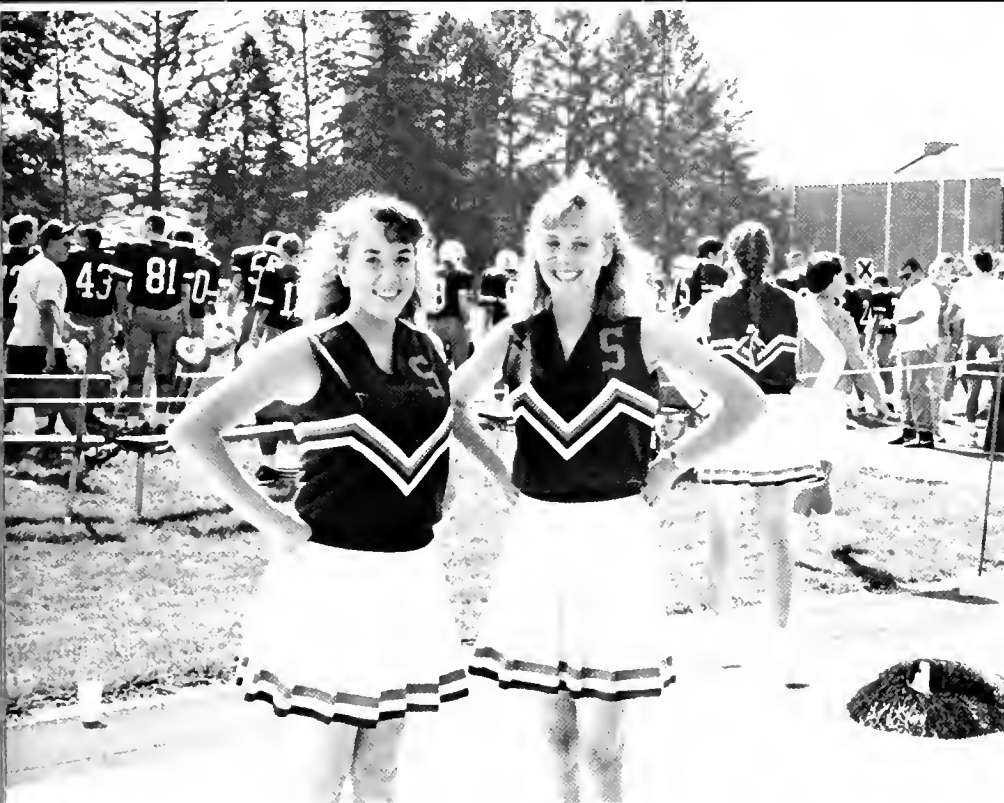
The women also had great success at the Frostbite, taking 12th out of 26 boats in the novice classification. The women just missed an invitation to the Dad Vail Regatta.
