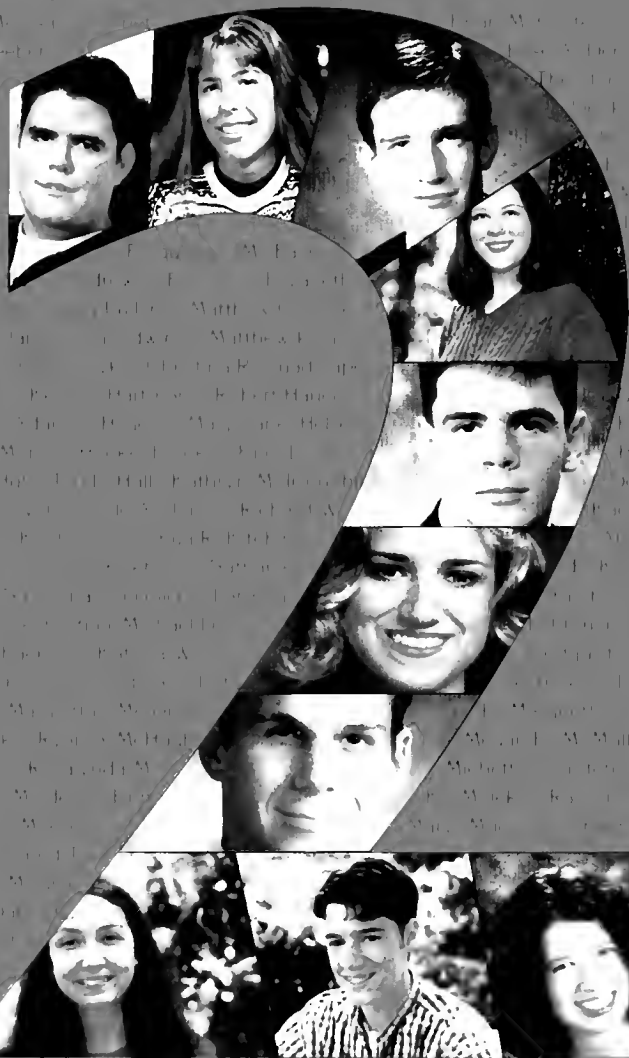

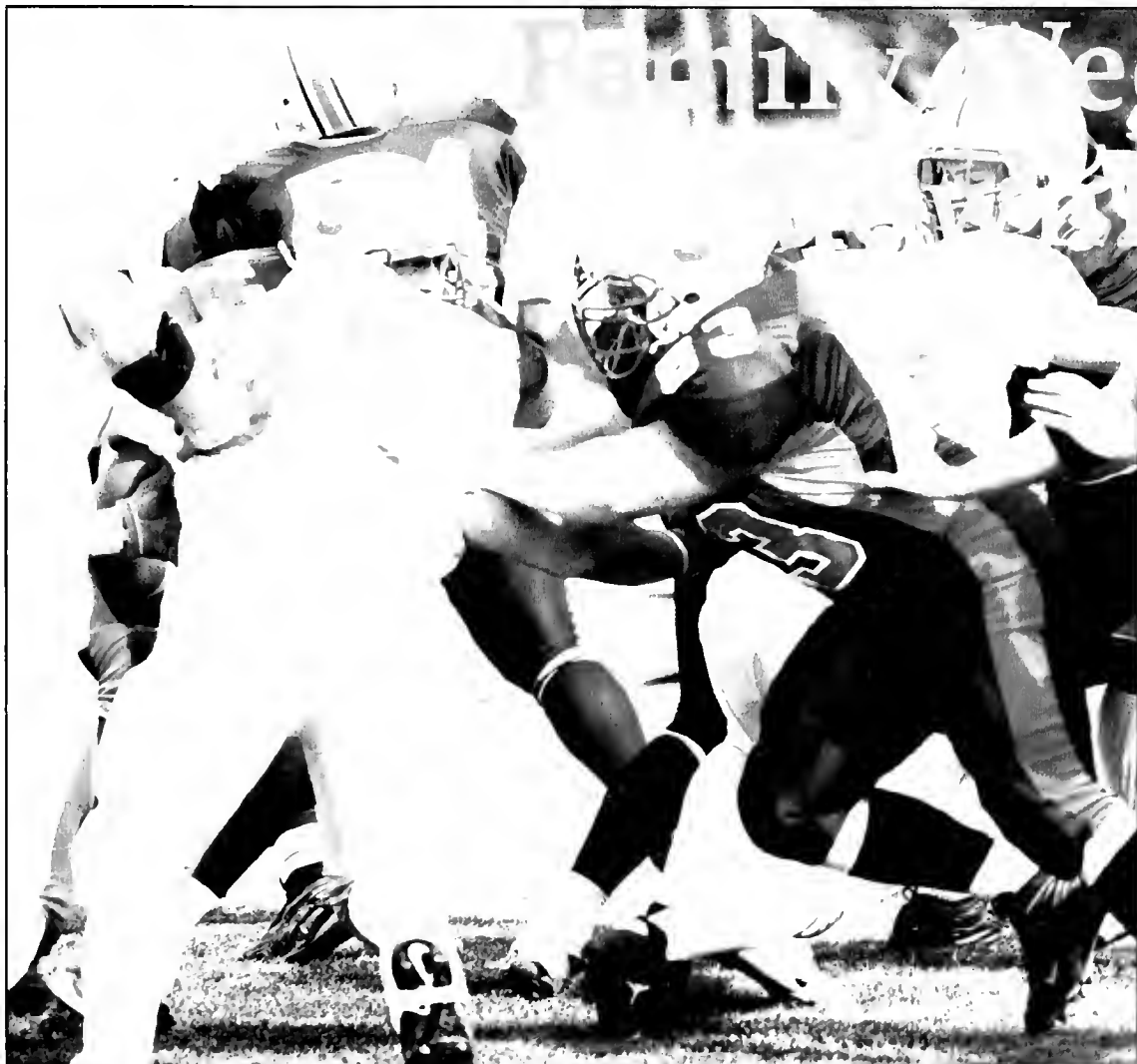

# St. night

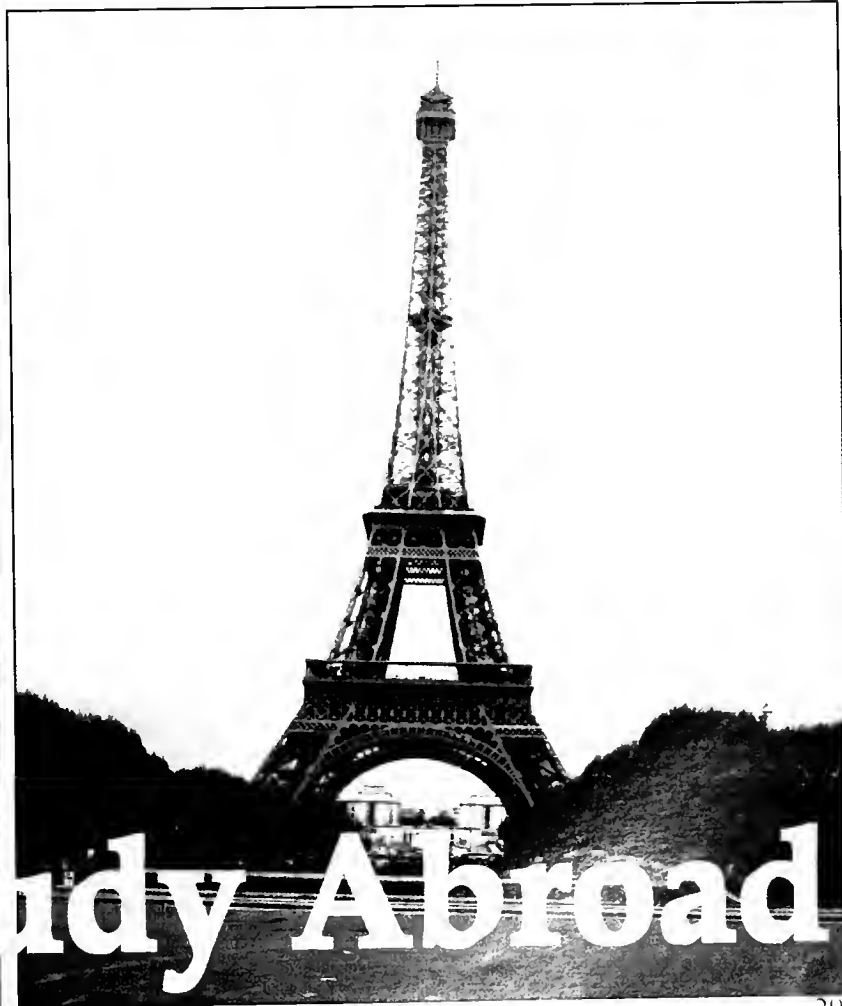

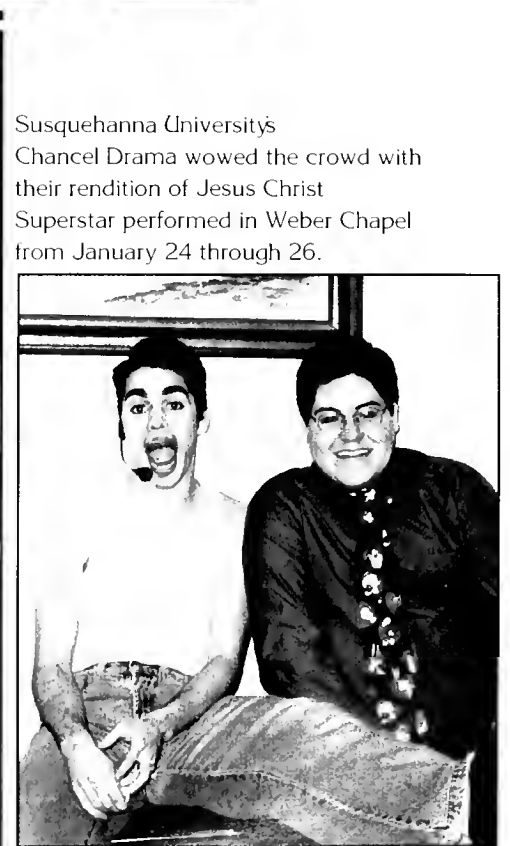

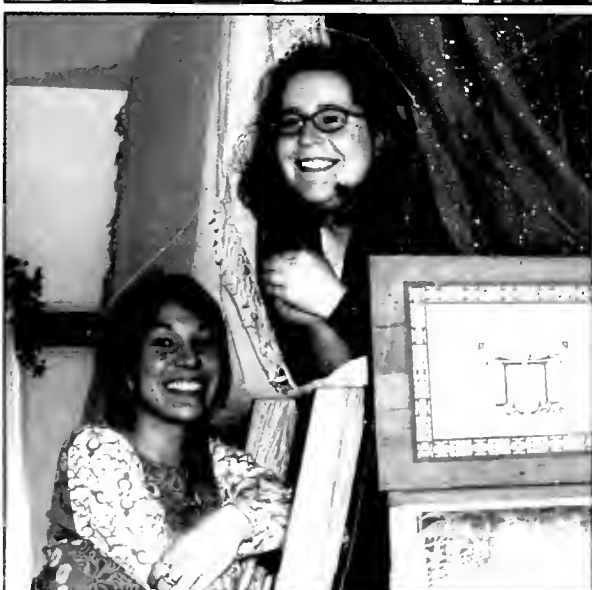






# Seniors' Advice to Underclassmen!
