To the Board of Trustecs of Lebanon I'alley College:
The Finance Committee presents the following report for the year ended June 30, 1939:

Colleges, in common with other institutions, have been affected by the uncertainty of financial and economic conditions during the past year. Incomes have not noticeably increased and collections are not less difficult. The College has been fortunate to be able to operate within its income.

Comparative figures again show an increase in operating profit over last year. The net profit, after deducting additions to plant from current funds, is $\$ 6,357.64$, thereby reducing the accumulated deficit by that amount. This increase has come about even though there has been a falling off of income from three sources, Endownent Income, Gifts and Grants and Miscellaneous Income.

The total income for the year was \$218,211.82, an increase of almost $\$ 7,000.00$, and the expenditures $\$ 208,519.43$, an increase of $\$ 4,668.75$ over last year.

Safe and profitable investment of the Endowment Fund has been the constant concern of the Committee. This is an objective not easily obtainable. It has been the aim of the Committee to maintain a diversified list of bonds and stocks so as to be able to secure a maximum income and the greatest amount of appreciation in value. The investments have been subjected to constant supervision, and changes were made only when a good purpose seemed to be served.

It is the hope of the Committee that by a continuance of this strict supervision and by prompt and judicious changes, as a result, the effects of further interruption of industrial recovery, as far as income is concerned, may be minimized.

## REPORT OF THE AUDITOR

Gentlemen:
I have made an examination of the accounts of Lebanon Valley College for the year ended June 30, 1939 also the balance sheet, profit and loss and relative statements included in the foregoing report of your Finance Committee.

In connection therewith, cash receipts and disbursements for all funds were audited in detail and cash balances confirmed. Notes and accounts receivable were not confirmed but verified, and are shown at book values, with adequate reserve provisions for uncollectibility of the latter. Investments were examined or otherwise accounted for, and are stated in the aggregate at an amount equivalent to the book value of the funds which they represent. Plant additions were determined to be proper capital charges.

Notes payable were confirmed and all other ascertainable liabilities computed and included in the accompanying balance sheet.

In addition thereto, I made a review of the accounting methods of the College and examined or tested the operating accounts for the year, including a verification of the income received from securities, but did not make a detailed audit of the transactions.

Based upon such examination and subject to the foregoing, I hereby certify that the balance sheet, profit and loss and relative statements fairly present, in accordance with accepted principles of accounting consistently maintained during the year under review, the financial position of Lebanon Valley College at June 30, 1939, and the results of its operations for the year ended that date.
