I have spoken of Taylorism. The

become of us. If the influence of certain
good men can do it we shall be put
down. Pending for Corbels awakening
opposition & suspicion. By forcing
called on me yesterday & since we
must not break Holliston to pieces
but we should if a Pittman man
come there - intimating that I should
break them to pieces - that I had been
officious. I told him if he would
not tell tales I would undo the whole
budget. & then stated that I was asked
to go there myself & decline but told
them of a friend - that therefore I was
not obnoxious to the charge of officiousness
- so you see we had a talk - He
said moreover that Taylorism was in-
numerous & should be called by the
