

New Bedford Sept. 2^d 1839

Monday night.

Dear Aunt Mary,

The enclosed

prochage I sent off in the midst of
the storm Friday to go to Boston in
the ^{next} morning by Miss Kewhall, but
the weather was so bad she did
not go, & will stay now till Wednes-
-day, so this afternoon I went up
& got it & shall send to you by the
stage — Send Lizzie her note & cafe
the first chance & explain to her
why I send by the way of Weymouth,
for if you read the note to her, you
will see that I put it into her care
to get the bundle to you — Saturday
I staid at home all the afternoon
doing up muslins & was much
pleased with my success. Spent the
evening at the Doubleday's — Sunday
Sept 1st 173 Went to the Orthodox church

all day dined with the Emersons. Mr
E gave me the chass Ab & the Emancipa-
-tor, the new organization acknowledged
the receipt of \$188.45 into their treasury, they
dont say since when, I concluded from
the beginning, though it seems to me
they must have received more.

Leibel Berman is appointed agent
among the cold people. I wonder
they did not appoint Professor Andrews -
I send you Anne's letter which I received
saturday night - keep it, as I want
it when I come home - I want to
see Maria's lines "The Boston Controversy"
& the Lovejoy sonnet, Abby Asyood
will come down Saturday so if
you want to send me anything
get it to Isaac Asyood's store friday
night & it will come safe - I
shall write to Maria wednesday
asking her to send me these by
abby with Ann Perry, letter & L Pugh's
& Wrongs. By the way the more I
read this valuable little work the better

I like it - I read it all over this afternoon
for William Goodell - chon day & today
I have been making calls - Called
upon Mrs Snow, the Peabody's (who
were engaged) & divers other places
too numerous to mention. Heard
that Francis Jackson had been
in town - about rail-way business -
I should like to have seen him -
I am in very good spirits now
preparing to come home the second
week in October - but more of
that by & by - Tell Lucia &
Emma to write to me, or I will cut them off
with a shilling - Best love to
all, excuse haste for it is near
12. I shall expect my usual
letter from you. It is a great
comfort to feel sure of a letter -
ever thine W.

you need not send Maria the
letter to her in the bundle. It is no
consequence. I shall write by Mrs
Newhall wednesday to her -
