

Boston Jan 29. 1840.

Dear Brother,

The money was deposited in the Suffolk Bank of this city, & a certificate of deposit sent to Mrs. Winer, so that she might get it from the Andover bank, accompanied with a request that she would advise you of its receipt. I will write her this morning, informing her of the fact & inquiring whether she received it, & when I get her answer, will forward it to you. I thought this the better way, so that if she did not receive it, I may look after it, at once.

Pray write me what the status quo of your committee is since the meeting, & what you intend to do. The account in the Emancipator is all Hebrew-Greek; & we have not heard a word from Torrey or H. Blair.

We are anxious to know just how things
stand. Pray give us an interpretation.
