Jamaica

Dear Brother,

New York, Jan. 8/47.

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I am just advised of an opportunity for
Phil'd can therefore write a few lines. We were sorry you could not stay
longer at Haiti, but your health is paramount to anti-S. matters. Mr Whiting
has paid yr draft of \$100 for Haiti. Messrs Renshaw & Hovey went on a
tour into N.Y. to raise money for the brethren in Jamaica I have got about
\$378. I have requested Mr Renshaw to write out that this can be drawn for
at 30 days sight. We were wd hope R & H. would have continued in the
field until several thousands of dols were raised for the W. I. (Mr H. is still
soliciting funds in R. I.) but on the appearance of No 2 of the Amer. Missy
Mr R. was quite excited, said it was an attack on the Board, he wd
resign his agency. The brethren at Jamaica would separate themselves from
us, he requested the W. I. Com. was dissolved &c &c. He is so impul-
sive, so fearful of widening the breach between the Board & our Socy, thinks
it so important to apologize for our conduct rather than vindicate it,
that I think he wd do as mere hurt than good. He made poor
work as temporary editor of our paper & as Cor. Secy. These offices he
resigned when he went out with Dr Hovey. He is now in winter
quarters at Phil'd.

As you may suppose the Washington
project has taken up a great deal of my time & does still. Dr Bailey
& family arrived at N. Dec 21st. L. S. Noble is Publ. agent. You
remember him I suppose. He was formerly a merch' at Albany
& has for a year or more lived in this City. He is about 40, a Bap-
tist, a fine looking man, with good address & thorough principles. No
printer at N. would print the paper for us. But all the were willing
to do the office work & a contract has been made with them. We were
obliged to have new type cast for us & send on. We had also to pur-

chase a new Naper press (\$1650) & office furniture. The type
print &c are at W. Dr B & Mr N. had to leave 3 offices they
taken, as the owners backed out from the bargain. At length
found an office of an abo. near the Patent office, for 3 years, &
the owner declares that they shall not leave, that if the office is
demolished the corporation shall pay for it &c. Some difficulty
was apprehended at first, but now they do not think there will
be tumult. The paper was to have been published yesterday.
