

Weymouth. Nov 15. 1840.

Dear Deborah, Sunday night  $\frac{1}{2}$  past 10

I have rec'd back yr packages  
I think you have done well - I shall not be  
able to send in Nandy's shoes if they don't fit  
tomorrow as I must carry this to Miss K. before  
she is up. Lucia likes her gown much &  
wants a favor of Emma. She wishes E. to send  
out her new gown tomorrow night as a pattern  
for her & she will return it Tuesday if possible.  
Mrs Clark will cut Lucia's but L is afraid to  
trust her without a pattern - She will be  
careful of it as of new laid eggs. Jeremy may  
come in to the Convention, but I shall not I  
believe - Keep an account of any good  
things & send me word - Tell E. I sent her letter  
to Mary. I meant to have written more but it  
is late - Naaman White has just gone from here  
he came prepared & would fight on non resistance.  
I have not had such a Sunday night dispute  
since Meredith went away. I ask the dear  
Soul's pardon for naming him & Naaman together.  
All are about as usual. Nandy as good as  
can be & the sea caly of all hearts. Jeremy must  
not come out Tuesday but we shall kill the pig there
