Dear Debora

I got to town very well Saturday

so many - write if you want any particular

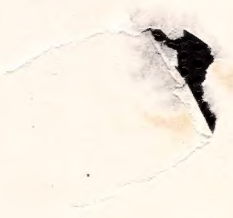
books and if they are in I will get them
