Dear Friend

The undersigned, committee of arrangements, earnestly request you to be present at the New England Anti-Slavery Convention, to be held in this city, on the 28th of the present month, at 10 o'clock A.M. in the Marlboro' Chapel.

The committee extend this invitation at the present time, under a peculiar sense of the importance of your presence to aid us in the deliberations of the convention that the cause of emancipation may receive a new impetus.

There has not been, since the note of emancipation was first sounded, so much need of wisdom, prudence & brotherly love, in our deliberations as at the present time, that those arrayed against the interests of our cause may have no occasion to rejoice.

Subjects of a practical bearing relative to the cause of emancipation will be brought before the convention.
