

Waterloo Nov. 1. 1847.

Dear friend,

A letter, dated Albany, 29th, rec^d. to day from Frederick Douglass, says - "I have just rec^d. a letter from Mr. Brooks, Cleveland, stating that Mr. Garrison is well, and thought to be out of danger. He will probably leave Cleveland in a few days." This is cheering intelligence to thy friends - in which my family participate with lively feeling. - We conclude that by the time thou reaches Waterloo thou wilt need a little rest, and hope thou wilt stop and afford us the opportunity of dispensing it, so far as we may, under our roof. Should it be impossible for thee to do so, be so kind, if thou wilt admit, to advise us by letter of the time thou wilt be likely to pass in the cars, that we may at least have the pleasure of taking thee by the hand.
