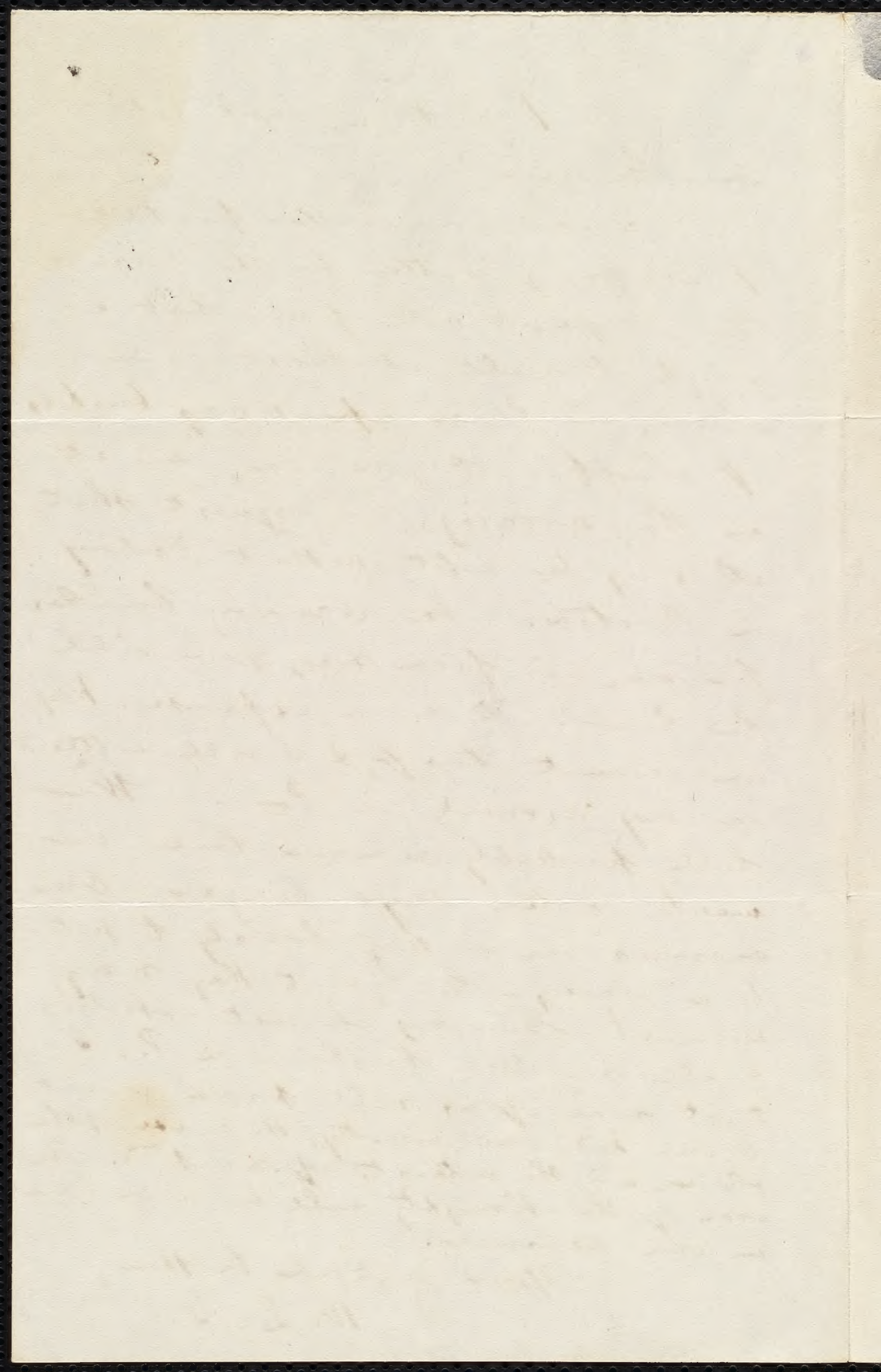


7 Brooklyn, Sept. 1, 1835.

Dear George -

I send you another package of incendiary matter for the Liberator. Hope it will prove hot enough to melt at least one chain, and burn up many bushels of chaff. If you can, send it in the morning, and request that it may be left without delay in Boston. In receiving bundles for me, and from me, you will be liable to some expense. Keep an account thereof, & I will settle it on my arrival in P. We shall probably remain here a week or ten days longer. Our enemies are working bravely to put down slavery - God grant they may succeed! Give my choicest affections to all my dear brethren in P.; & trust none of us will prove recreant to our God, our country, the cause of the slave, and the interests of mankind. The arm of the Almighty will be made bare in our defence.
