time.

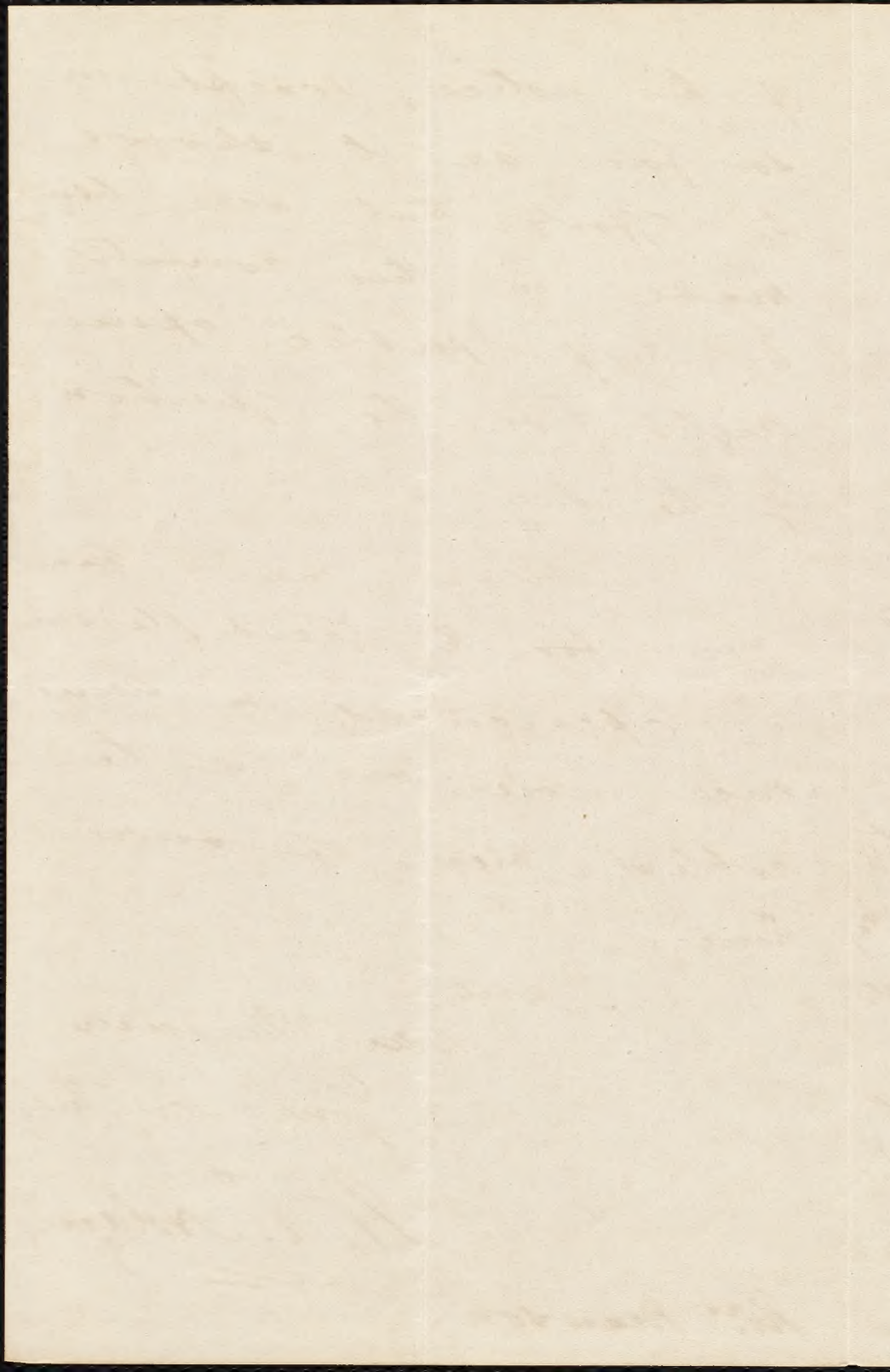
