Dear Madam

The Cork Ladies Anti-  
Slavery Society have much pleasure  
in sending you the contributions  
of this year - they regret that they  
are not more valuable - but nearly  
all the members had to work for  
two local Bazaars which took  
place this year - They are also sorry  
that the articles will arrive so late -  
but for a misunderstanding about  
the packets, they would have gone  
earlier -

Some persons who have  
been applied to, have asked  
what alteration has been caused

by the Bazaar, in the state of  
feeling in the United States - This  
they would readily see by reading  
the A. S. papers - but if it would  
be admissible into the little  
Bazaar Gazette, perhaps it w<sup>d</sup>  
do good - We shall hope for a  
good supply of the Gazettes -  
we send them to all our Contrib-  
utors when they arrive - we are  
differently circumstanced from  
our Dublin friends - we have no  
persons who give large sums of  
money - therefore we are anxious  
to keep up the interest in the  
city and each year get new members  
- some must each year be lost -  
We had hoped this year to send  
out a large piece of Berlin wool  
work but it is not nearly

finished - Should the Rochester  
Bazaar succeed this year, we feel  
it would only be our duty to send  
something to it also. J. Douglass  
was the means of getting us many  
of our active members - but from  
many causes Boston is the place  
where the bulk of our contributions  
will go - You have always had the  
burden to bear of pro-slavery  
opposition - but you all their  
evil thoughts were fixed -

sending, and requesting you will  
give us any hints about the  
kind of articles you most
