24 to 17, in-
cluding ten republicans
in the majority.
The Anti-Slavery

Antoine had not become
so sluggish, this could
not have taken place.
Cannot you help to
revive it?

The practical meas-
ures are to clean
the statute - book of
all support of slavery.
