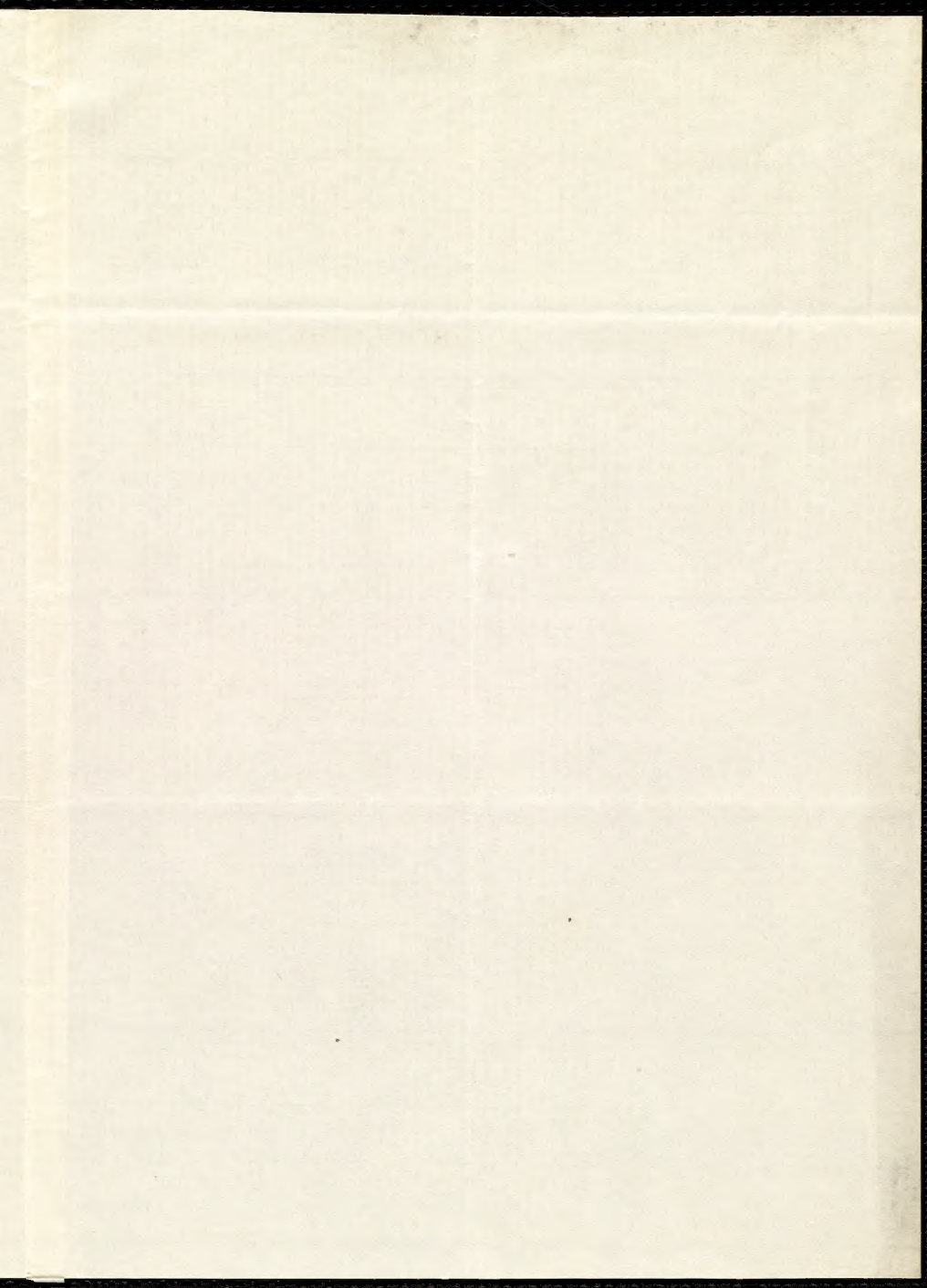
Dear Mother
