ted by the same publisher;
a copy of which I will take
the liberty of sending you; tho'
you have not ordered it.
I trust you will find the
letter to Mr. Schaffner whom
I believe you very well
know, that he may see
the unblameable influence of
the slave - which is his
Chief of course; and that

his friends may be convinced
by ocular proof of what other
wise would be incredible.
an abstract statement of
the depth of Yankee mean-
ness would not be compe-
hensible to an outside
European; you must give
him a line & let him meas-
ure the abyss for himself.
I will write a letter which
will do to accompany the
book & will help to illu-
trate the story of and his
friends this American ab-
ject of his great picture. It
will teach him what per-
haps he did not know be-
fore that the Yankees'
Christ ignores niggers.
