The Female Antislavery Society of this place, understanding that you are an Agent of the American A. S. Society, have requested me to solicit a visit from you to Lecture on Slavery. They are anxious to have you come soon. This Society recently formed consists of about Twenty Members. A Lecture would undoubtedly increase its numbers and stimulate them to greater exertions in the cause. Will you please write to me immediately on the reception of this, accepting this call if possible, and naming the day and hour when you will arrive in the place. I understand they are wishing to have a Lecture and a Society formed at Micham Pillage about 3 miles distant also at Lebanon and Coventry. Should <sup>you</sup> come this way perhaps you <sup>will</sup> conclude to Lecture at these places commencing here.

We the undersigned inhabitants of this Pillage do hereby express our ardent wishes, that you will accept the above invitation to visit this place. We deeply deplore the situation of 2,000,000 of our fellow beings, dragging out a miserable existence, in these United States, under the brutalizing yoke of Slavery, and feel it our duty to bear decisive testimony against this cruel and execrable sinful system of Oppression. We are determined to use all means within our power consistent with Christianity, to restore to our coloured brethren their rights as men. To this end we propose forming a Male Antislavery Society and think that if you can visit us we shall do well to meet at that time for said purpose.
